REAL ESTATE MARKET.

The market presents few features for remark. It being customary to avoid selecting a day during a holiday week for the offering of property, by auction, the sales were limited and unimportant. For the coming week, however, the advertised list of sales, as appears elsewhere, will be unusually heavy. Such property as would probably have been offered for sale during the present week, had no holiday intervened, has been placed on the list for next week, thereby increasing the offerings to an unusual number.

At private contract, Messrs. Lamson & Son report the sale of property on the east side of the Boulevard, extending from One Hundred and Forty-third to One Hundred and Forty-fourth street, comprising fourteen full lots, for \$20,000 cash.

In the mortgage loan market, the interest in reference to six per cent. loans still increases. Since our last issue, the Mutual Life Insurance Company have officially announced that they are now prepared to loan money at six per cent. on bond and mortgage on approved productive real property, upon the basis of present relative values of cash and property, and in our column of mortgages will be found the first recorded loan made by the company at that rate. It is also reported that the reduction from seven to six per cent. will apply to past loans made by the company, provided the security held by the company has not so far depreciated as to become seriously impaired.

The Commissioners of Taxes and Assessments on the 2d day of July transmitted to the Board of Supervisors the assessment rolls of the real and personal estate of the City of New York for the year 1877, as revised and corrected by that Department, and also inclosed a tabular statement exhibiting the aggregate valuation of real estate in the several wards, together with a similar statement as to personal property. The total valuation of such real estate assessed for the year 1877 is \$895,063,933, an increase of \$2,776,918 over the assessments of 1876. The valuation of the personal estate is \$206,028,160; making the total of real and personal estate for 1877 \$1,101,092,093. The total increase of real and personal estate over that of 1876 is \$4,441,381.

The Comptroller transmits to the Board his certificate of the aggregate amount of the final estimate made by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for the year 1877, to wit, \$28,484,269.

In the Building Department, matters are extremely dull and uninteresting. A large proportion of the plans filed during the week were for the construction of tenement houses. On Fifty-eighth street, between Fifth and Sixth avenues, two four-story brown stone front dwellings will be erected at a cost of \$35,000 each. The total estimated cost of new buildings for the week ending July 5th is \$201,050.

BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

BRICKS—No very decided changes have taken place on the general market since our last report. The demand has shown more or less caution, and buyers have seldom called for cargoes until an immediate resale, or a delivery for consumption was well assured, while of course, the holiday has tended to still further reduce the volume of business. The feeling, however, is firmer, and sellers at the close are in a more confident mood with nothing available as low as last week by at least 25c. per M. The accumulation afloat seems to keep within narrower bounds, and is more easily handled, while from the current indications, receivers entertain hopes of a more liberal demand during the present month, especially for good lots of hards. Pales remain in somewhat scant supply, and about steady. Croton Fronts are selling close to supply, and at full former rates. The finer grades of Fronts not very active, but meeting with a little more call. We quote: Pale, per M. \$2.50@23; Hards, Up-Rivers, \$3.75@4.25; Haverstraw bay, \$4.50@5.25; Favorite brands, \$5.50@5.25@2: Fronts, Croton—brown, \$8; dark, \$9; red, \$10; Philadelphia, \$2.25@27; Baltimore, \$34@38. Yard prices, delivery included, \$2@3 higher on ordinary and \$5@6 on fronts.

CEMENT.—The market for domestic is much the same. Nearly all agents are selling stock on shipping orders, and occasionally find it a little difficult to satisfy customers as quickly as required, but there is no actual scarcity. For local use the calls are slow and indifferent still, and seldom exceed the known wants of buyers. On prices \$1.20 is the rate for buyers who insist upon having their favorite brands, but sales are making at \$1.10 in considerable numbers. Foreign in very good demand and steady, but not much inclined to buoyancy, as importers are a little close on competition, and prefer keeping stocks moving on any fair margin.

GLASS.—The demand for foreign has not improved, and generally the market is reported as in a dull, nominal condition, with holders of stock dissatisfied. As a rule the disposition is to name easy terms, even on the most desirable styles, but this fails to attract buyers beyond parcels required for early positive wants, and the accumulations fall away slowly. American glass has some demand, but the movement is by no means free or general, and the market shows few encouraging features.

HARDWARE.—Mail orders have increased somewhat from various quarters, and a few straggling buyers appeared on the market, but business is as yet only in hopeful form. Dealers, however, incline to the belief that, in view of the long period of inactivity passed, the coming purchases will foot up a more encouraging aggregate. The price lists are undergoing revision to a considerable extent. Some of the leading lines of tools have recently been reduced, but the particulars are not as yet made public. Flat head iron, wood screws, are now quoted at 60 and 10 and 5 per cent. discount and 65 and 2½ per cent. discount according to the company. Cabinet locks are offered at 25 per cent. discount, and settlements within 30 days are allowed 2½ per cent. additional.

LATH.—As a rule receivers have not of late been talking in a very hopeful mood, and the market rather lacked tone. So far as arrivals were concerned the amount was not particularly heavy, but the offsetting outlet entirely out of proportion, and this naturally had a weakening influence. Especially was the loss of demand from points along the river, etc.

felt as this had been a sort of safety vent for surplus stock. Since our last, however, the inquiry from local sources has shown a material improvement, and though the receipts were fair, about every thing available appeared to be wanted, and cargoes have sold up closely. The result is a reaction on value, and the rate has advanced to \$1.50 per M., with the tone apparently firm as we close.

LIME.—The general market has undergone no positive change up to the closing of our report for the present week, and values are generally quoted nominally as before with a light business doing. The stocks in dealers' hands, however, are moderate, and receivers seem to think a better demand must soon set in for consumption which must of course increase the sale of cargoes. On prices former rates are retained for the present.

LUMBER.—The market has continued in a very dull condition, with business still further checked this week by the celebration of the National Holiday, and there is little of positive interest to record. Receivers of coastwise cargoes appear inclined to find fault generally, and in some instances assert that matters are as bad as they have ever found them, but disappointment on the sale of a few parcels leads to some exaggeration probably in the attempt to give the tone. The position certainly lacks positively cheering elements at the moment, and any holder compelled to sell could hardly do so except on a low range of values, yet considering the season of the year and the state of trade generally, and more especially on building material, the lumber market is in no worse plight than dozens of others. There is hope, too, that as fall approaches an improvement will set in sufficient to harden values somewhat and move more stock into consumption. In the meantime close attention is being given to the export outlook, and while very little success attends the effort to dispose of full cargoes, small invoices in sufficient quantity go out to make some impressions upon the accumulation of shipping grates.

Eastern Spruce has been plenty enough for all wants with a little stock to spare and the market in a somewhat unsettled condition, though average tendencies were in buyer's favor. Especially was this the case on undesirable sizes, and whispers of sales made recently at a great slaughter are current. First class randoms are even of a somewhat doubtful sale just now, but, by patient and careful search, receivers can occasionally find customer willing to pay a fair rate. Special orders came in to some extent, but not in quality. We quote at \$11@12.50 for random, possibly \$13@13.50 for choice lengths, in small cargo; and \$13@15 for specials, the extreme for extra difficult.

Hemlock shows no very decided change, but is weak under a pretty good supply available.

White Pine has sold to some extent on local account, and as usual mostly on orders for box makers' stock, this affording the principal consumption at the moment. There has also been further inquiries for export to the West Indies, both in the way of original cargo and for filling unemployed freight room, but on South American account the disposition to caution is still further increased by the late mail advices, which fail to afford any encouragement. The stocks on hand are fair in quantity and assortment. We quote at \$16@17 per M. for shippers 8-inch and upwards; and \$17@18.50 for 12-inch do. in bond; \$15@16 do. for common box, and \$14@15 for box, \$13@14.50 for specials, the extreme for extra difficult.

Yellow Pine, according to the advices at hand, has been doing a little better on the primary markets, and complaints were made of a scarcity of vessels, especially for the West India voyage. On local account, however, the demand does not improve, and the position shows a dull, flat, and to a great extent nominal tone. The receipts at this port last month were five million feet according to actual report of cargoes, and of this a large amount is still awaiting sale, with a probability that many parcels could be bought cheap. We quote random cargoes at 18@20 per M.; ordered cargoes, \$20@22 do.; green flooring boards, \$20@22 do.; any dry do. do., \$22@24. Cargoes at the South, \$14.50@16.00 per M.; hewn timber, 24@25c. per cubic foot.

Hardwoods meet with only an ordinary jobbing demand on home account, and are not very active for export, the general market showing a more or less dull tone. About former rates asked, however, and with a small stock on hand the tone is nominally steady. We quote wholesale rates by car load about as follows: Walnut, \$70@75 per M.; ash, \$35@38 do.; oak, \$35@45 do.; maple, \$30@35; chestnut, 1st and 2d, \$30@35 do. do., culls, \$18@20 do.; cherry, \$35@50 do.; white wood, \$24@32 do.; hickory, \$25@30 do. for Western, and \$40@50 for good near-by stock.

At the yards the distribution has been moderate and somewhat uncertain, with no new features developed on the general form of trade. Buyers call for merely such parcels as natural wants may dictate, and continue to crowd closely on cost, with easy terms frequently the result if cash down comes with the bid.

Among the recent lumber charters we note the following: An Am. brig, 404 tons, from Bangor to a direct port in the United Kingdom, deals, 70s.; a Br. barque, 691 tons, from Bridgewater, N. S., to Cork, for orders to the United Kingdom, excluding East Coast Great Britain, deals, 70s.; a Br. barque, 356 tons, from Tusket, N. S., to a direct port in the United Kingdom, deals, private rate; a schr., 351 tons, hence to Port Spain, white pine lumber, \$6 gold; a Br. brig, 266 tons, from Bridgewater, N. S., to Barbados, lumber, \$7 gold; a schr., 240 M. lumber, from Jacksonville to Martinique, \$9 gold; a schr., 135 M. lumber, from Jacksonville to New-London, \$7.50; a schr., 240 M. lumber, from Brunswick to Bath, \$8; a schr., 160 M. dry boards and timber, from Savannah to New York,

\$7 and \$7.50; a schr., 200 M. lumber, from Charleston to New Haven, \$6—an inside rate; a schr., 141 tons, hence to Key West, \$600 and back to Philadelphia, lumber, \$7 gold; a schr., 377 tons, from Boston to Galveston, ice \$2.50, and back from Pensacola, lumber, \$8; a schr., 280 M. lumber from Brunswick to New York, \$6.75.

Late mail advices from Rio Janeiro per Wright & Co. report as follows:

Pitch pine deals.—Remain very flat. The only arrival has been the John Wesley from Brunswick with 282,582 feet, which have been sold at \$2@1000. We cannot now quote over 31@1000 per doz., 3 by 8 by 14.

White pine lumber.—Is steady at 80@90 rs. per foot for broad, and 70@75 rs. for narrow boards. The 212,375 feet per G. M. Jones were sold on private terms.

GENERAL LUMBER NOTES.

The Montreal *Journal of Commerce* has the following:

THE LUMBER OUTLOOK.

The lumber question being of prime importance to our people, we have taken some trouble to ascertain its present condition both here and in the Western States, and we find a state of things existing in reference to the subject which few, we are convinced, now thoroughly realize. The valuable lumber statistics furnished by the Western lumber papers show that the logs consumed last year in the manufacture of lumber and shingles in Michigan, Wisconsin and Minnesota, amounting to some 4,700,000,000 of feet, while the whole stock of logs, both old and new, for this year's cut, if all have reached the mills, amounting to 3,700,000,000. If from this amount we deduct those hung up, and unavailable for this season, said to be over twenty-five per cent. of the entire cut, the supply for this year's consumption will not amount to much over one-half of that manufactured and marketed last year. The consequence of this state of things is already seen; prices of lumber are advancing in most of the Western markets, especially in those of the Mississippi river.

An inquiry into the matters in Canada shows an almost similar state of things existing, especially in our own province, for we find that the logs banked last winter on our two most important timber rivers, the Ottawa and St. Maurice, are only about two-thirds those banked the previous winter; and the number available for sawing not to exceed one-half, while nearly every mill of importance on the St. Lawrence, from this city to Quebec, apart from the St. Maurice mills, will remain idle this year through want of stock.

We have already stated that the logs banked last winter were only about two-thirds of the quantity for the previous year. Even in the winter of 1876 but few logs were delivered when compared with former years, and to show that our lumbermen honestly carried out their arrangement for curtailing the supply—entered into some three years ago—and are now entitled to every advantage to be gained by a short supply, we give a statement of the cut of the Ottawa river for a series of years furnished to a gentleman of this city by one of the most prominent lumbermen of the Ottawa. We are not certain whether the pieces include logs below the "Chaudiere," but, as under any circumstances, the amounts are relatively correct, they will serve our present purposes.

Some 200,000 pieces will be laid up on account of low water, and will not reach market this year.

The Boston market is reported by James & Abbot as follows:

The receipts during the month of June have been in excess of buyers' actual wants, and late arrivals have met with dull sale. Notwithstanding there are twelve hundred buildings being erected in Boston at the present time, and many large factories in process of erection in various parts of New England, and the reported short stock of logs East and West, the prospects for a fair trade in this market in July and August are not very promising, but with light receipts this summer we look for an improved trade. The export demand continues good, and a fair amount of shipments are being made to the West Indies, Australian and African markets. Our latest English advices report both spruce and pine deal dull, and the outlook for higher prices not encouraging.

Havana, Cuba, mail advices report:

White Pine.—Abundant and dull at \$29@30 gold per mille foot.

Pitch Pine.—Light arrivals and wanted, at \$34@35 gold per mille foot.

The London *Timber Trade's Journal* has the following:

LIVERPOOL, June 22d, 1877.

Notwithstanding the general depressed condition of things in Lancashire, and the strikes which are at present so rife in various directions, a fair amount of business continues to be done, and there is little if any diminution in the consumption as compared with sales at a like time in previous years.

Imports from St. John are arriving somewhat earlier than usual, and sales are made ex quay on relatively easier terms. With regard to other woods, prices remain unchanged.

GLASGOW, June 20th, 1877.

There is a little change to report in the timber market here since my last communication. The ship car-

penters' strike and lock out, now so widely known and so deeply interesting to this neighborhood, has not yet terminated.

It is believed, however, that if the men make a concession of a halfpenny per hour from their original demand a settlement will be effected; but as yet they have given no indication of agreeing to do this. Our deal trade which is not so dependent on the shipbuilding as log timber, has been fairly busy, the deliveries from the depot here giving evidence of a considerable demand.

The *Tonawanda Herald* reports the following:

The shipments by the Erie railroad for the week ending June 29th, 180,000 feet; for the season to date, 4,643,000 feet. The shipments by canal for the week ending June 29th, 9,928,452 feet; shipments by canal for the season to date, 45,204,844 feet. Total shipments from Tonawanda for the season to date, 63,869,844 feet.

NAILS.—The demand is not an active one from any quarter, and matters evidently fail to assume satisfactory shape. Rates have been shaded liberally since the opening of the year, but have failed to attract buyers into operations beyond their ordinary wants, and while holders now talk a little more steadily they do not feel much encouragement. The named rate on 10d to 6d is \$2.50 per keg, but this a full selling figure.

OILS.—A slow, careful demand continues, and most of the operations are confined to small jobbing parcels for early consumption. Values only barely steady. Linseed about 65c, 68c from crusher's hands

PAINTS.—Business has been a little variable, some days brisk, and then falling back into a dull sort of tone again, but on the whole the total is fair and the market doing quite as well as most others. Values do not change to any decided extent on standard goods, but some of the foreign styles tend to greater firmness on a rather slight supply available. We find few sales reported this week worthy of record. The call for Paris green has about subsided for the season, and the cost has fallen back to reasonable figures.

PITCH.—There has been no unusual animation, and the market presents few really new features. The amount of stock appears to be kept within the limit of the carrying ability of holders, and this preserves a steady tone on values. We quote at 2.12½ @2.50 for city, delivered.

SPIRITS TURPENTINE.—As a rule holders have shown a steady tone, and values were pretty well sustained. The demand, however, has been rather moderate for consumption. As we close the quotation is at \$23@33c. as to quantity,

TAR.—Much the same general features are reported. The demand not remarkably active, but enough stock moves to fairly balance the arrivals, and prices remain about steady all around. We quote at 2.25@2.37½ for New Berne and Washington, and 2.37½@2.50 for Wilmington.

1st—Q. C. is an abbreviation for *Quit Claim deed*, i. e., a deed in which all the right, title and interest of the grantor is conveyed, omitting all covenants or warranties.

2d—C. a. G. means a deed containing *Covenant against Grantor only*, in which he covenants that he hath not done any act whereby the estate conveyed may be impeached, charged or incumbered.

MISCELLANEOUS.

A GOOD WORKMAN GONE.

Hiram V. Losea, manufacturer of iron cornices, and a prominent school trustee of the Fourteenth Ward, was buried from his residence in Mulberry street, on Tuesday, July 3; and the attendance at the funeral showed the great esteem in which Mr. Losea was held, not only by those with whom he was associated in business for a number of years, but also by the residents of that thickly populated ward. For over thirty years he was foremost in all works of charity, and those of educational

interest, never neglecting the poor, who abound in that vicinity, and his unostentatious manners endeared him to the people generally. It was only on Friday last that he handed various gifts of money to the most proficient boys in the Fourteenth Ward School, so as to give them a chance to celebrate the Fourth, saying he did not expect to be with them on that day. Mr. Losea was also for years one of the designers in the great iron house of the Cornell Brothers, and it is doubted whether there is any one now alive whose talents in this particular line of business are superior to those of the deceased manufacturer.

ORDINANCES OF CITY OF NEW YORK.

An ordinance to amend section 7 of chapter XV. of the Ordinances of 1865, entitled "Of flagging, and laying, and repairing sidewalks and curb and gutter stones."

The Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of the City of New York do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 7 of the above-entitled ordinance is hereby amended, and shall read as follows:

§ 7. No sidewalk, or any part of a sidewalk laid with brick or flagging shall hereafter be taken up, or the brick or flagging removed therefrom, for any purpose whatever, in the Twenty-third or Twenty-fourth Wards of the City of New York, without the written permission of the President of the Department of Public Parks, or in any other part of the City of New York without the written permission of the Commissioner of Public Works, under the penalty of twenty-five dollars for every such offense; but the provisions of this section (unless such work should come within the limits of an ordinance of the Common Council) shall not apply to any person engaged in the necessary repairs of any such sidewalk, the resetting, when necessary, of any curb or gutter stones that may have become displaced, broken or sunken, or the necessary repair or alteration of any coal-slide under any such sidewalk, nor shall a permit for any such purpose be necessary.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

Adopted by the Board of Aldermen June 19, 1877.

Approved by the Mayor June 25, 1877.

ACTS OF THE LEGISLATURE RELATING TO THE CITY AND COUNTY OF NEW YORK.

An Act in relation to the change of grades of streets and avenues in the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards of the City of New York.

Passed June 16, 1877, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. All persons owning lands and premises in the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards of the City of New York shall be entitled to compensation for all damages to their buildings and improvements resulting from the change of the grade of the street or avenue running in front of the lands and premises owned by them, where such grade has been or shall be changed by the Department of Public Parks of the City of New York, or other department or competent authority of said city, in the following cases:

1. Where the original grade has been established by the Board of Trustees of the town of Morrisania, or by the commissioners appointed by chapter eight hundred and forty-one of the laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, or by any commissioners appointed by any act of the legislature of this State, where, in either case, the street or avenue has been graded in accordance with such grade, or where, in either case, the buildings and improvements have been erected or made since the establishment of such grade.

2. Where the original grade has been heretofore established by said department of public parks, or shall hereafter be established by said department, or by any department or competent authority in said city, where the street or avenue has been or shall be graded in conformity to such grade, or where the buildings and improvements have been or shall be erected or made subsequent to the establishment of such grade.

§ 2. Such damages shall be ascertained and assessed in connection with, and as a part of the expense of, the grading of the street or avenue, in conformity with the grade as changed; provided, however, that in cases where the street or avenue has been heretofore graded in conformity with the grade as changed, and an assessment of the expense thereof has been levied and made final, no damages shall be allowed or recoverable under this act, but where no assessment has been levied and made final, damages shall be allowed and be recoverable as hereinbefore provided.

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
