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### MARKET REVIEW.

#### REAL ESTATE MARKET.

The only noticeable sale of the week at the Exchange Salesroom was the partition sale of improved and unimproved property belonging to the Beekman estate, the attendance was large, but the bidding was not spirited, and, after several parcels had been sold to parties in interest, the sale of the remainder was adjourned for two weeks. In the way of private sales, the following are reported: Park avenue, westerly front of block, between Eighty-eighth and Eighty-ninth streets (200x230), for \$99,000; house with lot (24x80), on the southeast corner of Lexington avenue and Thirty-ninth street, for \$19,000, to Dr. Dunn; four-story brick dwelling with lot (25x85.7), on the northeast corner of Park avenue and Thirty-fourth street, for \$19,500, to Dr. Keys; four-story brick dwelling with lot (25x100.5), No. 141 Thompson street, for \$21,500, and the four-story stone front dwelling with lot (25x100), No. 17 East Forty seventh street, for \$42,500, to Mrs. Kate de Forest.

Twenty-two plans, embracing forty-nine buildings, have been filed during the week. The estimated cost of said buildings is \$457,250.

The item in *The Record* of last week, in relation to the connection of the New York Loan and Improvement Co., with the purchase of the charter for the construction of the tunnel under the Hudson River gave active employment this week to a number of reporters on the daily papers, who have interviewed all of the officials of that company that they could find, but the columns of matter written about it have contained nothing new; of course, the officials denied all knowledge of it, so they did the reports of the consolidation of the elevated companies, and more recently the reports about the reduction of the fare from ten cents to five cents. It is the business of the officers of this company to keep property owners in ignorance of their plans, but it is the business of *THE RECORD* to give this information when it is received from authentic sources.

#### BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

**BRICKS.**—The influence of the holiday was still to be observed during the early portion of the current week, the arrivals proving very limited, and cargoes at times difficult to secure. About Wednesday supplies commenced to come forward again with considerable freedom, but as the wants of consumers had in the meantime accumulated, the demand

proved very quick, and full prices were obtained without difficulty. In some cases buyers were anxious enough to pay a little premium on desirable cargoes of both Up-Rivers and Bays; but this was not general enough to establish a positive advance. The market, taken altogether, retains a good healthy tone, and we find the trade in a cheerful mood. For Pales there is not a very heavy demand, but still the supply appears to fairly exhaust itself in meeting the calls made, and full former rates are secured, especially so on fine parcels. The better styles of Fronts from the Hudson River yards are still sold ahead of production, and at former prices, and there is a good average for the higher grades of Front brick. We quote Pale, p. M \$2.50@2.75; Hards. Jersey \$1.50@2.00; Up-Rivers, \$5.00@5.25; Haverstraw bay, \$5.3714@5.75; favorite brands, \$6.00; Fronts, Croton-Brown, \$1.50@9.00; dark, \$8.00@9.00; red, \$9.00@9.25; Philadelphia, \$26@28; Trenton, \$24@29; Baltimore, \$31@33. Yard prices, delivery included, \$2.00@3.00 higher on ordinary and \$5.00@6.00 on fronts.

**LIME.**—There is nothing new reported on this market. Supplies offering have been moderate, and there is little likelihood of any early increase; but as the stock of the principal dealers do not as yet commence to exhaust, the demand is not stimulating. When a change does come, it will in all probability be to a higher range.

**LATH.**—The market has shown considerable irregularity of late with the range, however, a trifle higher than recently quoted. A considerable supply of stock came to hand and met a good demand for a time through which sellers marked the rate up to \$1.45 per M., and at this we have reported to us a number of good sized sales, but very sharply after, and, indeed, upon the same day, from other sources, we learn of transactions, both on the spot and to arrive, at \$1.40, and sellers still willing to listen to bids at the same rate. Size of invoice, place and facilities for delivery and "terms," all tend to make some difference in value, and it also takes a smaller quantity to "fill up" the orders this season than usual. The consumption is good enough and likely to continue, but buyers are seldom inclined to anticipate their wants, and somehow the market does not appear to respond to "bulling."

**HARDWARE.**—The calls made upon the stock are now of a desultory character, and cover merely such parcels as may be required for some unexpected shrinkage of accumulation in the hands of jobbers. It is, however, the "dull season" in the wholesale trade and causes no comment, while many dealers are improving the opportunity to straighten out stocks, and a few are looking over price lists to see if changes be advisable. In a few cases slight variations have been made, but the general tendency is bold, matters about steady on leading lines of goods. The Nicholson and Keystone File Co.'s, in a circular to the trade, state that they will make no change in the price of files during the season, the discount to remain 35 per cent. The former company have issued the following reduced net price list for tools and specialties: Butchers' steels, regular, 10 inch \$5, and 12-inch \$6.50 per dozen; do, patent, 10-inch \$6, and 12-inch \$7.50 per dozen; File cards, \$2 per dozen; file brushes, \$3.50 per dozen; bent riflers, \$2 per box of six; vise file holders, No. 1 \$1, No. 2 \$1.25, and No. 3 \$1.50 each; surface file holders, No. 4 73 cents, and No. 5 \$1 each; stub files and holder, \$1 per kit; extra files, 25 cents each; and machinists' scrapers, kit No. 1, \$1.75 per kit. At a recent meeting of manufacturers of copper rivets and burs it was agreed that on the 1st day of January, 1880, parties who have purchased five hundred pounds, or over, of rivets and burs, of one manufacturer, in the previous six months, may by that manufacturer be allowed a rebate of 5 per cent., provided such parties have not sold at a less price than 50 per cent. discount from List No. 9.

**LUMBER.**—Generally the market remains in pretty good shape, and we hear few serious complaints. Indeed, if anything, the tendency is to run to the other extreme, and some of our dealers entertain quite buoyant expectations. Having reached an apparent turning point they look for immediate liberal recoveries, and the effort is to stimulate matters into speculative form. Luckily, however, there is a conservative and neutralizing element which holds the market to the safe and legitimate influence of actual demand and supply, and while with this the gain on value must prove slower, it will have better and more permanent support. The basis of confidence is readily to be found in the small accumulations in distributors' hands and comparatively limited amounts due on contract, coupled with a more open expression of interest among buyers. The reports since the

commencement of the year of more building to be done, and a revival in manufacturing industry are receiving confirmation daily, and no one, sure of having use for lumber, hesitates at any extent over the current cost. The country, however, has plenty of stock in the hands of holders looking for a market, the moment values work up somewhat, and it is evident that the hardening on price must be gradual, not only to coax the buyer along but to prevent a sudden influx of supplies.

Spruce still finds a fair general demand, and anything that is at all attractive can be placed without much difficulty and at full former rates. Short stuff, however, is not in favor, and we seldom trace out sales at reported concessions without the discovery that the cargo was undesirable in some way. Ordered bills have been fairly active, but the cost still ranges only moderately above first-class randoms. Current offerings are moderate. We quote at \$10.50 @11.25 for random, possibly \$11.50 @11.75 for choice lengths in small cargoes, and \$12.00 @13.00 for specimens, the extreme for extra difficult.

White Pine is plenty enough, either here or close at hand to satisfy all wants with a little to spare, and as competition over the export orders has not abated to any extent values find no good basis for improvement. Taking an average range, however, former figures cannot be materially altered, and there is a sort of nominally steady tone preserved. We quote at \$14.25 @15.00 per M. for West India shipping board; \$17.50 @21.00 for South American do.; \$14.75 for box board; \$16.75 for do. wide and sound, and timber to order at \$35.50 per M.

Yellow Pine has a steady market still, and all things considered, the business is very good. Charter room is scarce and expensive, both on coastwise and foreign account, and this brings cost up beyond limits in many cases and checks operations. The receipts for the six months ending July 1st are 45,137,184 feet, against 38,613,313 for corresponding time in 1878. We quote random cargoes at about \$18 @22 per M.; ordered cargoes, \$22 @24 do.; green flooring boards, \$20 @21 do., and dry do., \$20 @23. Cargoes at the South \$13 @14.50 per M.; hewed timber, \$7.50 @14.

Hardwoods meeting with about the usual demand, both on orders from consumers and for shipment, and the market ruling steady throughout. Buyers continue very particular over quality, however, and none are submitted to full rates except on the most acceptable stock. There is no heavy accumulation here in first hands. We quote at wholesale rates by car load as follows: Walnut \$77 @85 per M.; ash, \$24 @36 do.; oak, \$35 @40 do.; maple, \$30 @35; chestnut, 1st and 2d, \$30 @35 do.; do., culls, \$18 @20 do.; cherry, \$45 @75 do.; white wood, 1/2 and 5/4 inch, \$25 @27.50, and do. inch \$30 @35 do.; hickory, \$35 @45 do. for Western, and \$65 @75 for good nearby stock.

The distribution from yard outside the deliveries on contract is very fair and commencing to grow somewhat. A steady range of values is preserved, as a rule, but desirable cash customers can obtain favors.

#### GENERAL LUMBER NOTES. STATE.

##### ALBANY LUMBER MARKET.

The Argus reports for the week ending July 8, 1878:

We have not any change to note in quotations of pine lumber. We have had a fair trade for July week with the presence since our last report of Southern buyers, including one house from Wilmington. It looks now as if the cost of lumber must increase within a few weeks on account of advanced lake and canal freights. Lake Michigan advises us to the effect that lake freights will further advance in thirty days, and that within that time will be the best to buy, not only in that but in this market. Pine and spruce no doubt are now at the lowest point and an upward movement is counted on as sure. Considerable lumber of spring sawing is changing hands daily in Michigan. Good lots are being picked up as fast as they are offered; choice lots are very scarce and held at an advance. Canada manufacturers are

equally firm, and owing to lessened production have no accumulation of stock. An improved trade may be looked for here arising from increased firmness in other markets. Some large buyers are already beginning to lay in their fall supplies and an increased inquiry is noted here this week.

Buffalo and Tonawanda freights are up to \$2, owing to scarcity of boats.

In coarse lumber we have had a good trade; receipts continue light owing to lack of water at the mills; prospective receipts are also light. Prices are firm, and on some descriptions are higher, and their future movement is only the question of supply.

The receipts of lumber by the canals during the week have been light owing to the break.

The receipts at Chicago from January 1st to June 28th are 458,933,000 feet of lumber, against 365,810,000 feet for a corresponding period in 1878. The shipments, 300,078,000 feet, against 256,609,000 feet.

The receipts of lumber at Tonawanda so far as we have seen them reported during the week, have been 6,812,000 feet; the shipments therefrom by canal, 2,018,000 feet. The receipts at Buffalo for the week by Lake, 4,944,000 feet, and 40 cars by the Lake Shore Railroad.

At Oswego the week's receipts of lumber by lake are reported at 2,105,000 feet; the shipments by canal were 2,374,000 feet.

Freights from Bay City to Tonawanda are placed at \$1.50 per M. feet; from Tonawanda and Buffalo to Albany, \$2.00; from Oswego to Albany, \$1.45. Lake Ontario freights to Oswego, 60c. From Ottawa to Whitehall, \$1.90, and from Whitehall to Albany, 55c.

The Tonawanda Herald says:

Our lumbermen are still experiencing a great deal of trouble in being compelled to wait for cars on the N. Y. Central road, and the result has been disastrous to their interests in many instances.

#### THE WEST.

Special correspondence of THE REAL ESTATE RECORD.

CHICAGO, July 9, 1879.

There has been a fair demand for cargoes at the wholesale docks since Monday, and, though the offerings have been pretty liberal, they have for the most part been placed without much trouble. The attendance of buyers, both local and interior, has been much better than of late, but they have not taken hold with sufficient animation to make business anything more than moderately active. However, the commission men have no reason to complain, and will, no doubt, be well satisfied if the market continues as well supplied with possible customers as it has been this week. In a general way it may be said that there has been no change in prices—certainly, there is no important variation from last week. Most of the transactions are on what are practically private terms, as it is impossible to obtain any quotations which have actual sales for a basis. The market is not any weaker than it was ten days ago, and I am not sure but it is a trifle firmer. Piece stuff of standard quality is held at \$6.12 1/2 and \$6.25, and, if the current reports are to be believed, is selling at these figures. Still, I think some pretty good dimension lumber has changed hands lately as low as \$6. Other varieties of lumber, as well as shingles and lath, have been steady at the prices previously given. In fact, the table of quotations, as printed last week, again represents the market as well as a tabulated statement of prices.

The yard market this week presents no particularly new features. The volume of business continues large enough to be at least fairly satisfactory. That the sales are largely in excess of those for the corresponding time last year, admits of no question. The shipments show a gain every day of several hundred thousand feet, and the general report fully confirms this gratifying indication. The present prospect is that the balance of the summer trade will be better than the dealers looked for. Advices from interior sections state that the consumption is large for the time of year, and, if this is true, considerable stock will naturally be wanted to supply the resulting demand.

Lumber from the yards shows no variation in price. Frequent concessions are made from the quoted figures, but in the main values are unusually steady. Nothing has been done in the way of ad-

vancing the current quotations, and all talk of such a move seems to have died out. Probably the dealers have made up their minds that in view of the ample—not to say excessive—supply which this and competing markets is likely to have, the best thing they can do is to let well enough alone. Taking everything into consideration, it is an open question whether it would improve matters any to agitate the subject. If the report of stock on hand shows the supply to be in good shape as compared with other seasons, it may be possible to do something, but it is not now considered likely that any action will be taken. The Exchange has not yet published the monthly report of stock, so that it is not known exactly how our market stands as compared with last year, but, judging from the statistics of receipts, shipments, etc., available, it seems safe to say that the stock will not be larger than it was a year ago in any event, and there is a chance that it may foot up considerably less.

A survey of the hardwood market reveals no new features of special interest. The demand though somewhat irregular is in the aggregate pretty good, and the dealers are not disposed to make complaints. Trade is not expected to be quite so brisk as at some other times in the season, but it is active enough to give all the hardwood men something to do. Prices remain steady and firm at the range current all the season. There are no indications of any important change, and it is now expected that business during the remainder of the season will be transacted upon the basis of existing values. The receipts of hardwood are fair, and the supply in market is fully equal to the demand, present and prospective.

#### SAGINAW VALLEY.

Lumberman's Gazette Office.

BAY CITY, July 8, 1879.

The week has been one of comparative inactivity, the national holiday breaking the continuity and tending to check operations. A few sales have been made at the market rate, namely, \$5, \$10 and \$25 for new sawn lumber, we hear of no sales below these figures, except for rough stocks. The shipments of the week have reached a good figure, and for the season exceed those of last year to this date. The tone of the eastern market justifies the expectation of continued steadiness in the market here, even if prices shall not advance, of which there are some grounds for hope.

It will be seen by the table that, although navigation opened nearly three weeks later this year than in 1878, the shipments of lumber for the season are some 3,000,000 feet greater this year, while of shingles the shipments have been more than 28,000,000 greater.

The amount of lumber on the river at this time will probably not exceed 175,000,000 feet, even if so much as that could be found.

MINNEAPOLIS, MINN., July 3, 1879.

Much interest has been manifested during the week in the effect of the rain storms of the past ten days on the logging streams as well as crops, because both of these matters seriously affect lumber. They have brought out the St. Croix river drives entire, and they are all safe in the booms. A heavy flood visited the Rum river country, and large crews are at work, with good prospects of securing a large portion of the log crop of that stream. The Black and Chippewa rivers have not been favored with a driving stage, and a large part of the logs on both these streams remain hung up. The total amount rafted out of the Black river is less than 90,000,000 feet, one-half of which will be sawed at La Crosse. The Beef Slough booms have furnished some hundred and twenty-five million feet of logs this year to the river mills. The St. Croix furnishes 175,000,000 feet, 100,000,000 of which will be sawed at Stillwater, and the rest for the lower market; making a total supply for all the mills below

Minneapolis (except La Crosse) of less than 210,000,000 feet, which amount may be increased by floods on the Chippewa and Black, as well as by logs from the upper Mississippi, through the new St. Paul boom. The supply of No. 1 logs is nearly bought and will soon be exhausted at all the markets at fair prices. We note an advance of 50 cents, on Black river Nos. 1 and 2 this week. The demand for timber continues very heavy at all points, and shipments of lumber is limited by the number of cars which can be had. We have no changes to note in prices of lumber, but there seems to be a growing feeling that a little better figures should be obtained on all grades of lumber.

The scarcity of dry uppers is forcing trade into very unnatural channels. The little railway mills are supplying the great manufacturers' yards at the lumber centers of the west. This will probably never occur again. Chicago, for week ending 1st, received 46,000,000, and shipped 16,000,000. She has now received 138,000,000 feet more this year than the published shipments. Many of the Michigan manufacturers are piling their lumber at home in preference to selling at present figures at Chicago. This is simply putting off trouble for both the city and the lumbermen. St. Louis is enjoying a large trade, as will be seen by shipment, while same applies to Clinton, Dubuque and Minneapolis.

*The Lumberman and Manufacturer* has the following on the lumber crop:

The anticipations and figures of the early spring, while they have been realized in part by the most successful drive ever known in the West, now need overhauling and revising, and in some cases modifying. It is true that on the waters of the Mississippi, as well as in Michigan, there has been a much larger supply of logs put in during the last winter than for several preceding ones. There are many other facts which show up to modify the conclusion that there is an overstock, some of which have been overlooked. In the first place, it is customary for the mills in the West to carry over quite a stock of logs to enable them to commence sawing early in the spring, long before the log drives can reach the mills, which usually may be set down as the middle of June. The logs were so nearly all sawed up last year that very few mills had any to commence with this year, and had to wait for the new logs, and it is a reasonable proposition that a month and a half of the sawing season has been lost from this cause alone, or one fourth of the sawing season. This will reduce the lumber supply by very many millions. The fact that there are more logs than can be sawed is apparent, but it should not affect the lumber market, as it is utterly immaterial whether the logs are cut or not, if they are not to be made into lumber. It is questionable whether any mills in the West will exceed last year's sawing, and many cannot reach it. The exceptions will be rare.

A very large share of the lumber that will be sawed will be cut so late that it will not be in condition to ship before it will freeze up. The present and prospective demand will take up all the lumber which can be sawed and seasoned before winter, as the old stocks are reduced to very small figures.

Another big item in the account is that the Black and Chippewa rivers, which are the principal sources of lumber supply, though full, will not probably send out anything like the whole crop cut. After watching the matter closely, we are led to believe that little over half the logs in either of these streams can reach the market or mills this year.

Another item which ought to be taken into the account is this—that many of the logs now coming forward have been “hung up,” or laid in the woods from one to three years, and are so badly damaged that they will turn out but a small amount of merchantable lumber as compared with fresh stock. We have seen some lots so badly used up by worms that they were scarcely worth sawing, while in others the sap is all worthless from rot. This will seriously cut down the amount of lumber on hand at the close of the year.

From year to year the lumber trade of our great valley is passing into the hands of strong firms, companies and combinations, and the smaller mills being weeded out, so that whatever stock is cut can be more easily carried by these high corporations now than at any previous time. Those who have to sell are now getting scarce.

The construction of so many new lines of railway, and the re-pairing of old ones, in the West, will certainly far more than take off any surplus over the amount of lumber produced last year. Leaving out of account the immense territory that will be developed by these and the adoption of more liberal rates of transportation, this enables the West to grasp a much larger area of trade than she has been able to command heretofore.

Of course the principal cause of bright expectations for the lumbermen lies in the enormous emigration to the West and the resulting demand and consumption of lumber. Every avenue of travel is filled, multitudes hurrying off into the great West to make homes. The rush is a matter of amazement to even Western men, who are accustomed to big things in this direction. The harvest of the whole West promises to be more abundant, and a long season of general prosperity seems opening after the long spell of depression.

All these things justify the conclusion that there is no reason for the sacrifices which are being made in order to get rid of a surplus of lumber that does not exist. The regular wholesale markets are being held down and terrorized by the railway mills of Michigan and Wisconsin, which are so scattered that there is no co-operation or understanding among the operators, who are now amusing themselves by seeing how artistically they can cut each other's throats, with the evident intent of finishing up on their own. If the great mills on the Mississippi would shut down for the season, and the proprietors were to go out

into the interior and contract all the cut of the railway mills at present figures to stock their own yards with, they would clear more money than they can by running their mills, and wipe out the last one of the small operators in the two States.

The stock of dry lumber on the Mississippi, from St. Louis to Minneapolis, amounts to about 175,000,000 or 180,000,000 feet, largely odds and ends, which are being taken off at the rate of 20,000,000 feet per week, at least, and being replaced in part by lumber from the Lake Michigan country, to keep the assortment up on the wholesale yards. The railway and interior mills (over 100 in number), from Green Bay to the river, are short of everything above common, which they cannot afford to ship. Chicago holds the key to the situation, and if its lumbermen would manifest a disposition to get and to pay better prices, there is nothing in the whole situation that will prevent an advance upon the present very low prices as soon as the harvests of the West are assured. There will be demand enough and lumber enough to supply it, but we cannot perceive that there will be any vast surplus on hand at the close of the year.

#### FOREIGN.

*The London Timber Trade's Journal* has the following:

LONDON, June 20th.

There is, perhaps, no greater evidence of the demoralization of the open timber market than can be derived from the state of the trade in Sweden during the past month, where the workmen at the sawmills and the shipping wharves of some of the principal ports of that country have been out on strike in a very resolute and even threatening attitude. Such has been the case at Sundsvall, Soderhamn, Hudiksvall, Sandare and other favorite shipping places, inasmuch that the government at Stockholm took the matter in hand as seriously as if it had to suppress an insurrection. Yet all this time the dealers in and around London who attend the public sales have not shown the smallest disposition to bid more liberally for the productions of timber from the ports we have enumerated; but, on the contrary, we are not sure that some of the greatest bargains in those very goods have not been obtained in the teeth of the selling broker's warning that an interruption to the ordinary course of the trade in Sweden had really begun. The trade both in the metropolis and at the outports appear to have treated the news with indifference or incredulity—perhaps thought it was magnified purposely by those interested, or a clever device of the shippers and millowners, by a well prepared proclamation, to induce some alarm on this side that a dearth of sawn goods was probable, and so induce a lively demand for what was already prepared. At any rate, they remained passive, and put their hands in their pockets and kept them there, looking on with the greatest complacency, while Swedish deals of good brands were going ten and fifteen per cent, less than they could be landed here at, even at the late low freights. It is also not unlikely that, while giving its due heed of importance to the strike they yet had no belief in its duration, and now they may congratulate themselves that they have not diverged from the even tenor of their way on account of it, for undoubtedly the strike is virtually at an end, as we learn by the last reports; but we are not sure that it has been crushed without some awkward results, and we look to see its effects later on in the season. Say there was only a fortnight's interruption to the shipment and manufacture, it does not need an actuary to show us that this arrest of trade during the choicest part of the year would lessen the export of the country by a very considerable percentage on the whole season. The Gulf shipping business is in full activity for perhaps about five months, say from the middle of May to the middle of October, about twenty-two weeks, and two of these abstracted from what should be the very busiest time of all will very probably have the effect of curtailing the total export for the season by at least one-tenth part; and that will tell its tale before perhaps our accounts are made up in the fall. If our readers put their estimate at 100,000 loads less of Swedish wood to come into the market, through the interruption caused by this strike alone, they will probably be not very wide of the truth. With trade still depressed dealers here need feel no alarm at this falling off in the ordinary supply, and the chances are prices even at the close of the season will not be materially affected by it.

LIVERPOOL, June 18, 1879.

No indications of any upward tendency in the rates obtainable in this market have yet shown themselves, as some sanguine people have hoped would be the case following the improvement which, slight though it be, has lately shown itself in the general condition of the trade of the country during the past month.

The consumption of timber, etc., continues to be steady, but so small as to make but little impression upon the stocks on hand, and the knowledge that shippers in nearly all wood producing ports, having failed to make the usual quantity of contracts for arrival, are now driven to send their goods upon the market tends still further to prevent any reaction to a better position. This is the case with the North American shippers, who, tempted by low freights, are now sending forward their productions in large quantities, so that every week seems to see a still lower depth, and it would appear that shortly we shall arrive at that stage when the question will be asked, “Where can the goods be placed?” and not as it should be, “What is the best price obtainable?”

It is not necessary to make any particular point with regard to North America, for all the Baltic provinces seemed to be imbued with the same reckless spirit, and what the result to the shippers will be time only can show; at any rate it can only be less or more unsatisfactory.

For fully a year past the timber trade of this port has been an inflated one, and now that nearly all the outlets have been choked up, prices must drop until such times as they have arrived at a point when speculators can step in and buy simply as an investment, holding the goods until better times arrive, for it is quite certain that present rates can neither benefit the first producer, the shipowner nor the merchant who buys.

#### THE PROVINCES.

ST. JOHN, July 10.—The exports of deals from St. John for the six months ending June 30 amounted to 81,433,502 superficial feet against 78,137,301 feet for the same period last year. During the first half of this year there were exported 6,117 tons of birch timber and 2,616 tons of pine timber, against 1,050 tons of birch and 1,924 tons of pine for the same time last year. The vessels engaged numbered 112, of 95,790 tons, compared with 138, of 88,963 tons, last year.

NAILS.—The demand has been moderate from all quarters and confined to a few kegs of standard sizes on most of the orders received. Holders had an ample stock for the call and offered it freely. About former rates are generally named, but desirable customers are understood to have quiet favors shown them. We quote nominally 10d. to 6d., common fence and sheathing per keg, \$2.25; 8d. and 9d., common do. per keg, \$2.40; 6d. and 7d., common per keg, \$2.65; 4d. and 5d., common do. per keg, \$2.90; 3d. and 4d., light, per keg, \$3.65; 3d., fine, per keg, \$4.40; per keg, \$4.40.

Cut spikes, all sizes, \$2.30. Floor casing and box, 75c. above the same sizes of common. Finishing, \$1 above and fine finishing \$1.25 above.

OILS.—For pretty much all kinds the tone has been steady, and sellers not over-anxious to operate. Stocks are under fair control and in strong hands, and while the demand is not quick, owners anticipate a steady distribution. We quote linseed oil, 63@65c. per gallon; lard, 48@50c. for winter; 45@46c. for No. 1, and 41@43c. for No. 2; crude cotton seed, 33@35c., and refined summer yellow do., 45@46c.

PAINTS.—About an average jobbing business is doing for the season and prices do not vary much on the small lots handled. In a wholesale way, however, the movement is dull, and no important revival is immediately expected. On Paris green there is a weak tone, and chalk rules very firm, but aside from this there is no special notable feature.

PITCH.—Only a moderate and uncertain demand prevailed during the greater portion of the time since our last report and the market developed little of interest. Prices much the same. We quote at \$1.75@1.87½ per bbl. for city delivered.

SPIRITS TURPENTINE.—The market has undergone no great change and develops little of interest since our last. Supplies are not excessive and owners refrain from urging the sale of their parcels, but the demand is light and little basis for buoyancy is afforded. As this report is closed the quotations stand about 27@29c. per gallon, according to the quantity of stock handled.

TAR.—Supplies are not increasing and this has a tendency to keep advantage under control of holders. The demand, however, moves slow and in an uncertain manner with buyers seldom anticipating their wants. We quote at \$1.40@1.75 per bbl. for Newbern and Washington, and \$1.60@1.87 for Wilmington, according to size of invoice.
