## BULLDING MATERIAL MAREET.

BRICKS.-On Common Hards there has been a somewhat irregular market, but on the flnal result sellers appear to be holding their own first rate, and in some instances feeling very confident over the situation. Soon after our last, arrivals commenced to run up rapidly, and in three days some twenty-eigh put in an appearance rather to the surprise of al hands, but especially so to buyers, who had been led to expect a continued light offering The result was an immediate withdrawal of bids and o ders, to a con siderable extent. and a sort of stand off in expectation that under the heavy accumulation some pressure to
realize would follow. Holders, however, not only reailize would follow. Holders, however, not only
failed to exhibit any great anxiety. but stond out firmly, and we are unaware that even small fiactional shading took place, atd e"entualy buyers finding they were gainiug nothing renewed the demand, cleaned out the offering somewhat rapidly ard restored the former strong and healthy tone with prices Well up to figures ruling at the date of our last report.
