THE present market for stocks may be very aptly described as a brokers' market, inasmuch as its movements are about sufficient only to pay the brokers' commissions. Whatever characterizing tendency there may be in it is towards lower prices. A narrow market is not the one the public like, and business cannot be attracted towards it until its movements are guided by strong hands which give some life and excitement to it. While it drifts in this fashion quotations are likely to be lower, and whatever business must be done on the Exchange is likely to be done at lowering figures. Louisville & Nashville and Burlington & have pressed on the market somewhat, and Quincy selling movement can be those two issues a considerable decline all round is sure to follow. There are, too, stories afloat that all is not right with some of the Villard Specialties and some of Inman-Brice-Thomas issues; the latter are certainly selling at figures which proclaim that some time friends are treating them with marked neglect; nor are quotations for the former the most satisfactory. Reports from London are gloomy, and that fact, coupled with a new shipment of gold, even though of a small amount, while Exchange rates are so low, has anything but a reassuring effect. We are, too, approaching the time when this centre is likely to feel the effects of the movement of money to the interior. These effects may not be serious, because of the long-time warning everyone has had. Most bankers have availed themselves of the ample opportunities given them to secure their money sufficient to supply such of their needs as they could foresee for the next few months; but there is likely to be great caution in undertaking new business and

hesitation in advising any large expansion of old for a little time

If the increase of the revenue of a country is an index to prosperity, Great Britain ought at the present time be in a fairly satisfactory condition. The total collections for the last quarter aggregated £21,914,100, against £21,468,600 in the corresponding period in 1890-an increase of £445,500. This is a far better showing than Mr. Goschen anticipated; but it is not likely that the rate of increase will be continued. The condition of trade is not improving, and it is possible that before the end of the year the revenue will lose the impetus it received during the past two years of speculative business activity. On the whole, the best authorities are inclined to believe that the character of the half year has not been such as to encourage anything but great caution. The prices of the principal commodities during that period has been downwards. The "Index Number" of the Economist representing the combined prices of twenty-two leading commodities now stands at 2,187. This is lower not only than at the of the half-year, but also than at time last year; and it is necessary to go back to July, 1889, to find prices at a lower level than at present. The result of movements in prices during the last half-year has been to reduce the "Index Number" by a little over 17 per cent. It is noticeable, however, that while most commodities have fallen in value, food stuffs on the whole have risen-a change due, of course, to the threatened scarcity of European harvests. French government has come forward with an elaborate and complicated scheme for creating a Workmen's National Pension Fund -similar to that already created in Germany. The basis of the project is a daily contribution of five to ten centimes by workers of either sex, to which the employer must add a like sum, and in addition the State would contribute two-thirds of the total subscribed by the worker and employer. Payment is to begin at the age of 25, and is to continue to the age of 55. It is calculated that the payment of 5 centimes per day by the workman and as much by the master, with the addition of two-thirds of 10 centimes by the State, invested at 4 per cent with compound interest, would produce at the end of thirty years a capital representing the value of a life annuity of 300 francs from the age of 55. With a daily payment of 10 centimes the annuity would be 600 francs, the maximum contemplated by the bill. The calculation is made on the supposition that workmen are employed on 290 days in the year. The Berlin market is sinking into a rather depressing dullness, the changes being but few and for the most part for the worse.

THERE is something illusive about a "popular movement," or else the New York Times has been deceiving us. In reading those articles about "public indignation" and the "stern determination of outraged taxpayers," everyone must have felt that the tenantcy of the Elevated Road in Battery Park had at last become a matter of an hour or two, and the moment might arrive at any time when popular feeling, thitherto kept in restraint by the sleepy decorum of the Times, would no longer feel satisfied in expressing itself in fabricated anonymous letters and fake mass meetings, but would burst into revolutionary activity, tear down the elevated structure in the park and vindicate the inalienable right of a few score of tramps, servant girls and time-burdened individuals to an unobstructed view of the architectural marvels of State street. Trivial, fortuitous circumstances have before this proved fatal to great schemes. An inopportune storm played havoc with the Armada, and the recent hot weather and the humidity must have enervated the feelings of the multitude as to the Battery Park "grab," so that they have left Jay Gould a little longer in his ill-gotten position; - and, concurrently, several hundred thousand travelers in the enjoyment of somewhat more comfortable, and somewhat speedier, transportation facilities than would be theirs if the park were wholly given up to the tramps. Even the Aldermen back-slid into a favorable attitude towards the elevated railroad Ogre, and it seems that nothing is now left to the few individuals in the Times office who have charge of the Public's indignation, but to bottle up the winds for a time-Ulysses-like-and make for the sea-shore for their summer vacation. In the Fall there may be a better opportunity for their slightly cherky operations.

THE failure of this last onslaught upon the Elevated Road illuminates that somewhat minates that somewhat vague subject which we hear of from time to time—the "power of the press." For several weeks past all the daily newspapers of the city, with the exception of the Sun, have been foaming at the mouth about the terrible iniquity committed against the 1,700,000 people of this city because the Elevated Road uses a few feet of the border land of Battery Park for the benefit of its patrons. From the "scare lines" one might reasonably suppose that a little revolution was on foot against the Manhattan Company. Petitions were displayed, mass meetings concocted, indignation poured forth by the column. Readers were assured that the popular feeling would no longer tolerate the usurpation of valuable public land by a monopolistic and dark-minded corporation. The Day of Judgment for the Grabbers was announced; and what came of it? A riliculous fiasco. There was not only too little powder for a report, but what there was of it was wet. The whole affair was a demonstration of newspaper impotence and public common sense.

A FTER all the nonsense we have had about the Public and the Manhattan road isn't it time that the newspapers took a really public view of the position which this city and that corporation hold to one another? Years ago this unrestrained antagonism to the elevated roads first showed itself; since then all common sense and all reasonableness have been thrown aside to give place to a narrow and what would be a disastrous prejudice if its full effects were permitted. No one who knows anything of the growth and development of New York in the last decade will hesitate for a moment to assign to the elevated roads the place of one of the chief factors in the progress. The city now has considerably outgrown the capacity of the system which has done so much for it; but the city is in this position to-day: the elevated roads furnish the only rapid transit facilities which it possesses. A new and a better system we know is in the process of construction, or it would be more correct to say is in the process of being planned for; but that better system is yet a long way off, and the old adage recommending the keeping of dirty water until the clean is obtained is applicable to this case. The underground railroad which the Rapid Transit Commissioners promise us will not be in running order for some years to come. In the meantime, what is the best thing for New York to do? To oppose all and every improvement of the present elevated system and submit to a condition of affairs that grows more and more intolerable every day, or would it be better to assist as far as possible the Manhattan Co. to improve their system, enlarge their stations, run longer trains, and develop a third-track service. Any additional privileges needed by the company might be given, not in a reckless manner, but with proper safeguards, and for a just and equitable public consideration. Surely this is a policy wiser than the one of newspaper spite and public prejudice, willing to do anything that hampers the company, even though everybody suffers by it.

MHAUNCEY M. DEPEW, after an annoying delay, has again set sail for Europe. There he will meet his many friends in the upper circles of society, among whom we may not fail to mention the Prince of Wales. Europe's gain is America's loss. We are growing accustomed to Mr. Depew's absence during the summer months, but we cannot grow reconciled to it. Our only consolation under his afflicting absence is a sturdy confidence, based on the experience of past years, that Mr. Depew will not fail to tell us on his return many amusing anecdotes of the ways of aristocrats and the impressions that these curious doings make upon the cultured American gentleman, the finest product of civilization. There is a rare savor to the thought that this representative of republicanism hob-nobbing with dukes and lords, and listening to the feeble drippings of their circumscribed and caste-bound intellects, is well aware that he is gathering rich feast for the fine palates of his republican brethren. It is as if the American people sent their "brightest" and "brainiest" reporter to interview the classes of Europe. Delightful, however, as are the pictures which his departure calls to mind and the anticipations which bis muchto-be-desired return stimulates, it is not particularly of these to which we wish to draw attention at the present juncture. It is only Mr. Depew's relation to rapid transit that we desire to touch upon, and we regret to say that this relation is not so commendable or so promising of product to his fellow-citizens as his relations to the foreign aristocracies. The cloak of illusion and romance with which the papers surround Mr. Depew falls to the ground when he becomes simply the president of a Vanderbilt corporation. He must ever be happiest as an after-dinner speaker and as a subject for interviews.

A SHORT time before he departed he stated to a reporter in his prosaic capacity as president of the Central that his corporation would have nothing to do with any east side rapid transit line. The statement has caused but little comment, not because there is any doubt as to the truth of the interview, but because of some doubt as to the sincerity of the speaker; for it is sometimes part of the duty of the presidents of great corporations to conceal their intentions from the public, and, if necessary, to lie for the sake of so doing. Consequently the declaration forms a basis for interesting speculation. What does Mr. Depew mean when he says the Vanderbilts will have nothing to do with an east side rapid transit line? In endeavoring to answer this question we do not pretend to any telepathic insight into the workings of Mr. Depew's mind, such as some morning journals have of the devious processes of Mr. Gould's intelligence; yet the city's past experience with the Vanderbilt corporations constitutes

a key for one plausible reading of this most perplexing asseveration. Perplexing is the word to describe it, because superficially the Vanderbilts have every interest in controlling a rapid transit line which would bring the lower wards into convenient connection with their trans-Harlem tracks. These tracks drain a large part of the most desirable suburban property to be found in the vicinity of the city—territory which under anything like equal conditions of accessibility would far more popular for residences than either Long Island or New Jersey can ever be. Yet with the southern terminus at Forty-second street their growth must ever be hampered. In the past the Central, the New Haven and the Harlem have not been able to secure anything like the number of commuters which the Pennsylvania and the Jersey Central have secured, for their local service even within the severe restrictions imposed by their southern terminus has been most inadequate. But with a terminus for local service at the Battery, the Vanderbilt corporations could within five years obtain a large and remunerative traffic. If, however, it is desirable for the Vanderbilts to control a rapid transit system from Forty-second street south, the property-owners, not only on the line of the roads north of the Harlem, but also along the proposed route south of Fortysecond street will obtain an equal if not a greater benefit therefrom. In the past the Vanderbilts under such circumstances have forced the property-owners to share with them the cost of such improvements. The owners along 4th avenue paid half of the cost of the open cut in that avenue, just as the owners along the Harlem road are paying half the outlay attending the open cut for that road in the 23d and 24th Wards. May not the Vanderbilts be seeking similar assistance on this new proposed route? And may they not be determined to hold off until they get it? When the route of the Belmont Commission was announced, Mr. Depew took a very different tone as regards this matter, and on several occasions the Vanderbilts have evinced their willingness to seek for plums in the New York rapid transit pie. The explanation of the present stand would seem to be that they intend to hold out for very good

Municipal Lodging Houses.

RECENTLY the Board of Estimates and Apportionment gave a hearing to representatives of the various charitable societies of the city in advocacy of the establishment of a municipal lodging house, and the abandonment of the police station lodging rooms, the disgraceful condition of which has been a matter of notoriety these years. Those in favor of this project claim that it will be a means of reducing trampery and vagrancy, and will at the same time afford decent shelter to respectable men temporarily destitute. In support of this claim the experience of Boston is instanced. We give the facts as gathered by a representative of one of these societies.

Twelve years ago Boston established what is known as the Way-farer's Lodge, and in connection with it a Wood Yard, utilizing for the purpose an abandoned school building and playground. Cots were put in the large and well-ventilated upper rooms, while the lower stories and basement were fitted up as office, kitchen and dining rooms, back rooms, carpenter shops, etc.. and a shed put up in the yard for the protection of the workers and the wood against the weather.

It was then arranged that persons applying for shelter at the police station should be furnished, if not disorderly or suspicious, with a card of admission to this lodge. On entrance here every man is obliged to take a bath. His clothes, if "animated," are subjected to a heat which exterminates the vermin; he is given a clean night shirt and a good cot bed. In the morning he is obliged to do a certain amount of labor in return for what he receives. This labor is either sawing wood or splitting or carrying or piling it when sawed. The work requires from one to three hours. After it is done the lodger is entitled to a breakfast of warm soup and bread. This is practically the whole scheme, though dinners and suppers are furnished to "out of works," usually very few in number, for work rendered. The lodgers are under strict discipline. Any one who refuses to submit to the rules may be taken before a magistrate and sent to the workhouse.

Now, what has been the result? Prior to 1879 there were lodged in the Boston station houses, according to the statement of one of the overseers of the poor of Boston, from 200 to 600 persons per night. Now, the total number of lodgings given yearly is under 30,000, or less than 100 per night. This is exclusive of women, who are sent to another lodging house. And as to the character of those who now apply for the city's shelter, the overseers say: "The crowds that have always thronged the station houses, disturbing their discipline, tainting their atmosphere, and interfering with the more legitimate duties of the department, have disappeared. Tramps who shirk work no longer infest the street by day and night, and the applicants, as a rule, are for the most part persons seeking honestly for employment." The Lodge and Wood Yard have been carried on at a net cost of between \$7,000 and \$8,000 per year, the latter paying into the treasury annually above expenses

about \$2,000. A part of the wood is disposed of to the city, the remainder to the public at market prices.

What should we have to expect of the experiment in New York City? First of all, the cleaning out of those foul holes of contagion in the station houses. Second, the provision of decent shelter to those who under the stress of misfortune need it, and under such conditions as not to destroy self-respect. Third, a decrease in the number of tramps in New York City, and the end of the "revolver" system; and lastly, the removal of the cause of much imposition upon householders under the plea of shelter for the night. There is now no decent place to which the citizen can send the penniless man, and as a result he is either passed or intrusted with a coin which nine times out of ten, perhaps, goes for drink and not for shelter. The establishment of a city lodging house such as proposed would doubtless save to the citizens much more than the amount required for its establishment and maintenance.

Investments-Good and Bad.

LOUISVILLE & NASHVILLE.—The ten per cent. addition to its capital which the Louisville & Nashville Railroad Company is now asking its stockholders to subscribe to at 70 does not seem to be received with unqualified favor. This increase of capital is somewhat calculated to take off the edge of the stockholders' pleasure at receiving a cash dividend. influence on the market for the stock has been bad, weakening the price, if not causing any great decline, and it seems inevitable that with the market as narrow as it is, the portion of the new stock which has to find purchasers must bring the price of all down to its own figure and perhaps lower. This is the only reasoning from experience that can be had year this company issued stock in a similar manner, but at 85, and although there was a broad and buoyant market the price of Louisville & Nashville had, there is every reason to believe, to be supported at the subscription figure and broke that as soon as the new stock was out and the support withdrawn. The company made a good showing for the last fiscal year, having a surplus of \$482,340. It has authority to issue \$2,200,000 of stock besides the \$4,800,000 for which it is now asking subscriptions, and whether all is issued or not, it must keep up the rate of its earnings in order to maintain its dividends of 5 per cent per annumn, and have the balance in hand over and above dividends necessary in the management of so large a property. There are some other reasons beside the narrowness of the market which make the wisdom of this new issue of stock questionable. Net earnings per mile show a tendency to decrease while It has been computed that as a result of the operating expenses increase. issue of \$4,800,000 new stock surplus earnings after paying fixed charges will be increased only about \$16,000, but that estimate is based on the dangerous theory of what has been will be. Still it is singular that the company has chosen a time like the present to ask stockholders to subscribe to its stock, and it will be remarkable if it does not meet the same experience as the Norfolk and Western Railroad Company which some months ago. when its preferred stock was selling at about 55 or 56, offered a block of that stock to its stockholders at 52 only to see the quotations drop to a point below that at which the new stock was offered, at which figure it has not again sold, and it is now quoted between 50 and 51, with very little business done in it. It is singular, too, that if Louisville & Nashville is the good property it seems to be on the showing of the annual reports and has a fair prospect of continuing to be prosperous, the Kentucky Central would not have been bought with stock, as the C. B. & Q. acquired the C. B. & Northern, and as the Atchison acquired the San Francisco and the Colorado Midland, instead of asking the stockholders to go down and into the pockets to pay for the property with cash. The paying of a cash divi end on the outstanding stock, and at the same time making so large an issue of new stock creates suspicion and looks very much like sugaring a disagreeable pill. Still, while looking at the worst features of the case, it is only fair to take the better into consideration and not to forget the remarkable record Louisville & Nashville has made in the last six years, at the beginning of which it only saved itself from bankruptcy by the issue of bonds at almost ruinous rates, which bonds it has since retired, and having worked itself first into a stock dividend payer is now a cash dividend payer.

NEW ISSUES -- Whoever may cast a gloomy look on the financial situation the promoter of new enterprises does not, but comes to the front with all the cheerfulness so characteristic of him. The promoter and his optimism both have their uses, especially in times of doubt and gloom, as the sun to disperse clouds, but it is not necessary to take them too readily any more than to expose oneself to sunstroke. There are quite a number of offers of fortune from the promo er. There are, to say nothing-and perhaps it is best that nothing be said-of the Georgia-Alabama Investment and Development Company, the stock of the Standard Chemical Company, the bonds of the Railway Equipment Company of Minnesota and the stocks of the Trow Directory, Printing and Bookbinding Co. The advantages of the first seem to be based on a theory similar to that of Alaascar, the unfortunate glass merchant of the Eastern story. The Equipment Company, through a well-known house, offers bonds issued at about two-thirds of the value of what appears to be some very expensive equipment. This equipment is leased by the Chicago, St. Paul and Kansas City Railway Company, which is an amalgamation of some other companies which have not had a very satisfactory experience, though lately, in the amalgamated form, making a very good show-The Equipment Company is said to have a capital of \$1,000,000, "of which \$996,500 has been subscribed and paid in cash,"at what rate is not stated. The Trow Directory, Printing and Rookbinding Company make an offer of \$750,000 8 per cent Cumulative Preferred stock and \$250,000 general stock, and accompanies the offer with statements which, if examination verify them, as it most probably will, would make these issues very desirable to investors. The details consist of the nature of the business, the

property acquired and its value, and the result of the examination of the books with a view to show the profits for the last five years, made by a firm of accountants of standing and repute. The Board of Directors of the Trow Company is composed of representative business men.

MINING.—The promoter and capitaliser of mines is to the fore. Paragraphs, not by any means brief, are appearing in newspapers and news sheets, asking why speculators and investors neglect mines for railroad stocks and whether mining stocks are to start the boom? which have been made in mining are strongly brought out. Boston people are particularly anxious that the world should know how much they have made in, or perhaps it would be more proper to say out of, mines. All this is very nice and ingenious, but the object is too apparent. If any one wants to know why mines have, to use the expressive slang of the streets, a black eye, they can be informed that it is because more money has been sunk in them than taken out, and if the speculative and investive world continues in its right mind, the optical discoloration of this line of business will only be removed when mining enterprises can be tested by the same rules as other enterprises, and that whatever may be said to the contrary by those having stocks to sell is not the case now.

ADVANCE CALCULATIONS.—The danger of placing a too implicit reliance on expert calculations was illustrated last week by the Bank Statement. The temptation to forecast results is very great and the endeavors made in that direction are often very laudable, but liable to create disappointment. According to one authority the statement should have shown an increased reserve of about \$1,800,000, and according to another a similar sum, while in scattering opinions the amount varied, but all were for an increase. The fact, therefore, of a decrease of over \$900,000 created much disgust when announced. The moral of this is, take all such statements with a grain of salt, uot excepting those made in this column. A wise man has said, "figures are facts, but there is nothing so deceptive as facts."

Rapid Transit Schemes.

A crowd of indignant Washington Heights and West End property-owners left the rooms of the Rapid Transit Commission yesterday afternoon. A week before they had been told that they would be given a hearing at a meeting which would convene at 1.45 P. M. But when they got there they found no meeting. The solitary messenger informed them that the meeting had adjourned nearly an hour before. The indignant citizens suppressed their feelings and went their way, without having been heard. Later it came out that because Commissioners John H. Inman and Samuel Spencer could not attend an afternoon session, the hour for meeting had been changed too late for public notice, to 10.45 o'clock A. M. Commissioner Inman had come on especially from Atlanta, and Commissioner Spencer from the West, to attend the meeting, but found so many other meetings relating to their private affairs awaiting them that they had to change the hour of the Rapid Transit meeting.

As it was, nothing definite was accomplished. Over an hour and a half was given to the comparison of two plans of construction for the Broadway-Boulevand route. One of them is for a double-decked tunnel with two tracks on a level, one above the other, which will take up comparatively little of the roadway, and the other is for a roadway with all four tracks on a level, which would in some places take up all the roadway to the house line and would require the use of the sidewalk vaults for station The commissioners found it difficult to decide between them. Another perplexing question is where to locate the extension of the proposed east side line through the 23d and 24th Wards. As President Steinway said : "On the west side are the New York Central and Norther roads, and on the east side are Harlem and Suburban roads. These already pretty well supply the residents along their respective lines, as least as far south as 42d street. But there is a lovely section of country about a mile and a quarter wide, and seven miles long, lying between the Harlem and Northern roads, altogether without transit facilities, and without a soul to use them if were there. We could locate the new line parallel with and close to either the Harlem or Northern road and make it pay at once, and the question is whether to do so, or to locate the route along the line of Jerome avenue and help develop this region. Another difficulty is this: The law specifically prohibits the construction of a surface road. Now a surface road could be built for a tenth of what a viaduct or underground would cost, and it seems to be a waste of money to require either of these where there is so much vacant territory to fill up." He said that the commissioners were now considering the propriety and feasibility of previding for a slightly depressed road, and thus getting around the expensive limitations of the law.

He said, also, that in view of the fact that two of the commissioners would have to be away through August it had been resolved to meet next Tuesday and hold long and continuous sessions through Wednesday and Thursday, if necessary, to reach a conclusion with respect both to the plan of construction of the Broadway Boulevard line and the route of the East Side line.

The Condition of Broadway.

The contractor for the cable construction and paving of Broadway scouts the idea that the street will be unfinished when winter comes. He says all the serious obstructions have been overcome, and that from the present forward all his forces have comparatively smooth sailing. In earnest of his statements work was begun yesterday upon two new sections—from 14th to Bleecker street, and from 23d to 17th street. South of 14th street the excavation is being made two-track wide, and while the work is being done the Broadway cars are running through Bleecker and Wooster streets and University place, from Broadway and Bleecker to 14th and Broadway. Traffic is of course seriously interfered with, and shopke-pers and merchants in Broadway are scanning mournfully the scant showing of profits on their current business; but it is a sort of summer tonic they are taking now, which is expected to do them a world

of good when the winter holiday trade sets in. Therefore, though with wry faces, they are swallowing their medicine gracefully.

Upper Ward Improvements Delayed.

One way in which the Tammany members of the Board of Street Opening and Improvement can punish the citizens of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth wards for electing Commissioner Heintz in violation of their wishes, is to ignore their demands for improvements—and this they appear to be doing. There was to have been a meeting of the board yesterday, and a large number of trans-Harlem property-owners were in attendance, expecting to get a hearing on the subject of improvement, of which there were several branches. The Brook avenue improvement; the Third avenue sewer, and several street opening matters needed the consideration and action of the board—but there was no meeting. The visitors waited until it became apparent that there would not be a quorum, and then they left. One of them remarked: "If Purroy had been elected there would never have failed a quorum of the board."

BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

BRICKS.-The usual weekly canvass of the market for Common Hard brings to light nothing of an improved character, so far as values are concerned, at

for Common Hard brings to light nothing of an improved character, so far as values are concerned, at least. On the contrary, the tone seems to be a trifle easier, if anything, than one week ago, and \$5.00 per M is now practically the top figure. Some exceptional lots of stock, possessing special merit in the eyes of buyers, do upon occasion sell higher, but are few and far between, and form no basis for a legitimate valuation, while the majority of buyers are looking for something a little under \$5.00, and are getting a great deal of stock at the shading. Of course, the rates are disgustingly low, and create a feeling of much dissatisfaction on the part of both makers and receivers, but almost the entire body of the trade are frank enough to admit the unpleasant fact, the very few exceptions being found in that unhappy class of individuals, who imagine the contemptible trick of furnishing false quotations for publication is calculated to help the market.

Demand seems to have been good enough and indeed it is understood that the amount of stock actually handled this season to date, in this city, is greater than for the same time last year, but supplies keep coming along and there is always enough and to spare for available custom, with a fine line of quality maintained, and it is the latter feature that keeps values condensed to such narrow compass and robs many makes of the premium or extra full rate they ordinarily command. Considerable stock is still being piled away, though the bulk of purchases are for consumption in one form or another. Just a little more demand for Pales developed this week and fine stock sold as high as \$2.25 per M., but as a rule \$2.00 is all buyers care to pay. There seems to be no let up in the production, good weather keeping matters rushing in full swing and, notwithstanding the quantities forwarded, accumulations at yards are increasing. It is even predicted that as matters are now progressing the sheds will soon be full and shipments made direct from the kilns. That will save one

HARDWARE.-Dealers who make a specialty of the various kinds of builders' hardware are still com plaining over the dull character of trade. So much plaining over the dull character of trade. So much work has been delayed, voluntarily postponed or practically abandoned under the adverse influences of the season, as to greatly curtail the consumption, and the chances are against any revival until fall. It is claimed, however, that production has become adjusted to the outlet and acts as a balance to keep the market steady. No changes in lists at least are announced, and it is said none are contempleted.

LATH.—Receivers are managing to hold their position in first-rate form, and it has proven a strong market, with further gain made on values. Moderate market, with further gain made on values. Moderate arrivals have turned up, and some few cargoes afloat were reported, for all of which custom could be found, and sales were expeditious, with probably a chance for a little more stock, the final rate standing at \$2.25 per M., and some salesmen claiming to ask more. The strike at St. John, of course, is used for all it is worth as an argument in favor of the situation, and is a good one for the present, but the current price is also pretty full, and conservative operators suggest that it may before long prove an attraction to bring in Northern-made lath.

LIME.-A good steady position is claimed and for mer rates quoted. According to current report, buy ers are reappearing in search of stock who were thought to be pretty well supplied, and with arrivals now moderate enough to be controlled without much difficulty, there seems to be a hope of keeping the market in position.

LUMBER.-Generally the pitch of the market appears to be toward a somewhat better tone. A great many yards find business still dragging, and now and then the complaint from dealers is of very pronounced character, but in other cases reports are heard of a considerable improvement in business and exceptionally there are instances where operations were upon a really liberal scale. This improvement is of a cheer-

ing character naturally and there is a natural hope that it will continue and expand, but as yet there has been no marked influence upon the market for bulk lots outside of exceptional cases where supplies are temporarily scarce. Dealers do not refuse to negotiate in quite so general and persistent manner as a short time ago but abandon none of the spirit of caution and as yet refuse to raise the line of bids, more particularly on goods from interior sources, which have been tendered here by an army of agents, and all acting as though fully determined to secure custom. From some sections come reports of probable material shortage in the cut, and the determination of manufacturers to make a contest for fuller rates, etc., etc., but without appearing to care much whether the stories be true or otherwise dealers express a determination to simply take their own time for entering upon fresh investments. All in all, however, the tendency is toward somewhat greater animation, as the evidences point to greater consumption this fall than was expected a short timelago; and in any case there must soon [be some move made toward accumulating winter stocks. The \$1 per car per day demurrage imposed by the Car Service Association is causing some complaint among receivers, and it is thought will have the effect to almost entirely shut off the practice of consigning parcels by rail.

Eastern Spruce, in all general particulars, favors the sellers, so far as immediate trading is concerned. In some of the yards there is a fair stock, but the majority are only seabtily supplied, and if they want renewals they want them quickly. That is conjunction with small offerings of course gives sellers much advantage, and rates can, for the time being, be sustained without difficulty, while there is evidently hope of a further gain. The strike of the laborers at \$t. John, and consequent curtailment of work, together with shutting down of mills in other localities, will probably for some time keep supplies in limited proportion, but many dealer

figures then ruling were the result of abnormal circumstancee entirely independent of natural market influences.

Piling has inclined to a somewhat better tone. No raft stock is expected upon the market, regular arrivals have been moderate, and receivers are certainly talking with greater confidence. They have, as a test, plenty of work already planned and under way, with chances of considerable more, and claims that the accumulation in chains is by no means as full as might have been expected.

Hemlock is not spoken of with much enthusiasm, and some of the ordinarily most cheerful and sanguine operators are considerably given to complain. Quite a large amount of stock, however, was turned into dealers' hands just after the strike, and except in way of placing a few odd contracts, there has not been much done since. Reflecting the attitude of manufacturers, however, agents are asking about former rates, and refusing to urge negotiations.

White Pine is still without any direct or special tendency to become active, but there has been a little more business done under the temptation of low prices. Especially does that hold good on box boards of which Western operators have made free offerings, and in some cases again accepted as low as \$13 per M. Agents, however, are offering other grades comparatively cheap, and buyers who have opportunity to secure parcels suited to their special trade do not object to occasionally picking up an odd lot, especially when delivery will be somewhat distant. Representatives of the Canadian interest are not offering much stock, and insist that the curtailment of make creates a certainty that no extensive supply can become available during balance of the season, and some of them predict higher rates before the close of navagation.

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Yellow Pine, so far as can be learned through the look-wise and say-nothing form of reporting adopted by so many operators, is without much animation. Some few special orders have been boxed on home account, and a little f. o. b, export trade done, but generally buyers are not plenty and demand is that of necessity rather than of choice. Prices remain about as before, possibly somewhat steadier, but all quotations just now might fairly ne considered nominal. There seems to be some hope of fuller call from the railways.

Carolina Pine, according to some reports, might be considered active up to the palmiest days of the market. As a matter of fact, however, there has simply been an increase in the volume of demand sufficient to break the previous dull tone, and sellers reflect their encouragement in making reports in a more pronounced tone of cheerfulness. Rates ruling about as before and pretty steady on standard quality and cut.

Hardwoods, all things considered, are doing fairly well and there seems to be no greater ground for complaint than on the coarser grades of stuff. There is, however, the same general experience regarding the caution and indifference of operators and actual wants; the temptation of some very nice stock at very low rates, or some other special attraction is required to create a showing of interest among buyers. First-class goods are firmly held in pretty much all cases, but without tendency to buoyancy at the moment. From most accounts there will be a pretty good supply of all standard stuff, but some operators predict a scarcity of good plain oak owing to the universal craze for quartering.

NAILS.—The demand has shown no special improvement, indeed, on the whole, the actual deal since our ment, indeed, of the whole, the actual deal since our last fell away somewhat, if anything, and of course there was the usual grumble. On cut nails the tone is easy, but for wire somewhat greater strength is shown, owing to reduced stock at the mills We quote Cut at \$1.65@1 75 per keg for car lots and \$1.75@1.85 per keg for parcels from store, for ircn, and add 5@10c. per keg for steel. Wire, \$2.10@2.15 at mills, and 2.30@2.40 from store.

PAINTS, OILS, COLORS, ETC.-Some little improvement in trade is reported, apparently simply a natural recovery from the suspension of demand at the turn of month, and there must be a great deal more doing to bring affairs uy to a condition of animation. It is, however, hardly likely that buyers will show an inclination to take hold with much greater freedom until toward fall, when the necessity for making accumulations in second hands ordinarily becomes more urgent. In the meanwhile manufacturers, importers and agents are gradually getting their stocks lote shape to the end that they may be prepared for calls made upon them as the interest among buyers commences to expand. Zincs are firm, and at the recent advance in cost White Lead and kindred pigments are well held and selling readily. Association Corroders' rates stand as follows: Lead in oil in kegs and dry lead in kegs, in lots of less than 500 lbs. 7½c. net; in lots of 500 lbs to 5 tons at one purchase, 7c.; 5 tons to 12 tons, one purchase, 5½c.; 12 tons and over, one purchase, 6¾c.; dry white lead in oil 12½ lb. in tin pails, add lc.; in 25 and 50 lb. tin pails, add lc.; and in t to 5 lb. tin cans, assorted (100 lbs. in case) add 2½c. per lb. to keg price. Terms on lots on 500 lbs. and over, note or acceptance at sixty days, or 2½ per cent. discount will be allowed for cash paid within fifteen days of invoice date. To make either of the above required quantities any assortment of packages of white lead, red lead and litharge may be counted. The above quotations are free on board cars or boat at corroding point. Linseed Oil has been selling fairly well, but the condition of the market is unsettled. City crushers have suddenly and unexpectedly dropped the line of cost, and while that action was said to be due to lower rates on material, it is much more likely the outcome of competition from Western makers.
