IT is easy to see that the strength of the stock market is the result of manipulation and it is almost possible to name the hands that are manipulating it. The work is being admirably done, if it were not so it would be impossible to keep New England as high and as strong as it has been for more than a week on a bunch of old stories, or on a mystery which will not explode. The connection of Reading and New England in those stories has had a humorous and appropriate result: the former has been weak while the latter has been strong, from which it may be inferred that the very proper opinion of the public is that the result of close union between the two could only benefit New England. While the manipulation of prices is so apparent the question arises whether the manipulators, designedly or not does not matter, have not chosen an unusually good time for their operations. It is true that reports from railroad centres indicate a good deal of competition and cutting of rates, as well as other adverse features; but there are also signs that negotiations are on foot for the formation of new rate protecting organizations to take place of the old ones, and earnings continue to be large with, of course, the inevitable exceptions. There is also a promise of better things in some other industries which are said, and no doubt truly, to make a fair gauge of general business conditions. The closing down of some of the iron furnaces last summer has at last been following by more encouraging signs in that trade. The change, too, that is seen in the cotton trade is not without influence, and, perhaps more than all, the actual arrival of the beginning of the series of Columbian celebrations is making activity in trade the influence of which must be very pervasive.

OBservers of the political situation in Europe are disquieted over the considerable addition contemplated by the German government to its army. It is proposed, according to semi-official reports, to reduce the period of actual service to two years, though without reducing the legal liability to a longer period, and it is therefore intended to keep 75,000 more men actually in barracks. The artillery, moreover, is to be enlarged, and some other reforms introduced, the object of all being to raise the forces at the instant disposal of the Kaiser more nearly to a level with the forces which might in certain contingencies invade Germany. These changes will involve, it is stated, an increased expenditure of from \$17,000,000 to \$20,000,000 per annum. These statements are accompanied by rumors not so well supported that the Austrian Parliament also will be asked to sanction a large increase in the military expenditure. The gravity of these reported facts arises from the circumstance that both Emperors, if about to ask for increased appropriations, will do so unwillingly. They must know that France and Russia are straining every nerve for superiority in armaments, and that to abstain from equaling them or even to delay in equaling them would be culpable imprudence. On no other ground, it is thought, would the two best-informed persons in Europe on this subject prepare to convince unwilling parliaments by facts and figures that the insecurity is great enough to justify or indeed to compel further heavy sacrifices. Millions of pounds are considered serious things on the continent, and neither sovereign desires to borrow freely or to land his treasury in the position of a

permanent deficit. The dangers indicated by this line of argument are, however, rather for the future than for the present. If they exist the speculators and bankers have not perceived them, for the money-centres remain undisturbed by political menaces. Probably the course of events most carefully to be watched in the immediate future will be the progress of the Austrian currency reform. The time is now approaching for the finance operations provided by the new laws. In order to avoid making too onerous an appeal to the money market all at once, it is commonly expected that the Austrian Finance Minister will postpone his scheme for converting his 5 per cent bonds, and confine his operations just now to a gold loan of 100,000,000 florins for minting purposes. Within the past few weeks the Austro-Hungarian Bank has received 30,000,000 florins, mostly in American eagles, which will help the government out. In the meantime the Hungarian Finance Minister will abstain from a gold loan. He has already hoarded about 50,000,000 florins in gold, and has the advantage of a surplus of 30,000,000 florins on the fiscal year just closed, so that he is fully provided with gold for the Hungarian mint.

THE defeat of the trolley system is practically acknowledged by the officers of the Metropolitan Traction Co. From many points of view this is a matter to be glad about; but it will not be certain that the best interests of the city have been served thereby until it is clearly seen what bearing the defeat has upon our existing facilities. Will it leave us possessed for some years to come of a number of malodorous unsanitary spots where car-line stables are? These "stench blocks" are an unmitigated nuisance in a crowded city like New York. They are offensive to passers-by and are a blight upon property if not a peril to residents. To get rid of these nuisances is surely something to be wished for. We believe that the city would be willing to pay handsomely for relief from these offences; and if any one is inclined to make light of them, we wish he could be compelled to live for a short time opposite or even in proximity to a stable block. August would be a good month for his tuition. It should also be borne in mind that with the removal of the stables would go several hundred horses, and the dirt with which they fill the street—and, in windy weather, the nostrils of people. We believe that men of clean habits would have counted this a gain of some importance. But beyond this, will the defeat of the trolley leave us with the present inconvenient, slow and inadequate surface service, the dingy, badly lit, crowded cars, drawn by painfully overtaxed animals? Will the Metropolitan Traction Co. give us the large, well-lighted cars and the more rapid service which we should have got with the trolley, or shall we have to wait for some years until the company think they are warranted by the amount of travel in adopting the cable system over all their lines, or until the storage battery has been improved into commercial practicability? Now if New York were amply provided with facilities for transportation, if everybody could move about the city speedily and comfortably, we could afford to be very critical and insist upon getting exactly what we want in the matters of additions or improvements to our transit lines. The city, then, would not really suffer if we should sit down and wait until the Metropolitan Traction Company, or some other concern, humored every whim and desire we had. Our circumstances, however, are not of this easy, comfortable kind. We are in an acute stage of congestion. Our facilities for transportation are inadequate beyond exaggeration, and they are vile. The way people have to pack into crowded cars, elevated and surface, in a manner that the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals would prohibit if we were pigs, bodies to bodies, one person breathing the breath of his vis-a-vis, is disgraceful beyond measure. It is contrary to decency, cleanliness, good manners. Add to this the fact that the financial interests of the city are suffering; its growth is checked; the poor are being pressed into closer and closer quarters, expansion is impossible, the city is not building up as it should, and the reader has the situation before him.

THE newspapers have been raising such a hullabaloo over the introduction of the trolley into this city that they have failed to call attention to other interesting aspects connected with the sale of these franchises. The action of the Board of Aldermen, provided the Mayor officially indorsed it, meant only that they would be put up at auction under the provisions of the Cantor Act. Offering them in this way at auction pre-supposes, of course, that there would be a competition, and that it is to the interest of the city that there should be a competition. Yet, these two assumptions, which are required to give any meaning to a public sale of this character, are both probably false. It is not likely that there would be any competition. Some of the connections would be utterly useless to any company that did not own the lines with which the connections were to be made. Others might be of some small value to an independent corporation, but they would be of infinitely greater value to the Metropolitan Traction Company. Notice the consequence of these facts. There is no real competition for these franchises. If any other company started to bid against the

transit company we may be sure that it would be only for blackmailing purposes. But if there is no real competition for the privileges, it is an absurdity to put them up at public auction. The Traction Company can purchase the privileges for any price which it is willing to pay, and the price which it is willing to pay does not, we may be sure, bear a very close relation to the real value of the franchises. On the other hand, the city gains nothing in case there is any competition, because the blackmailing corporation would be careful to work the matter so that either it would be paid to get out of the way or else the roads would not be constructed. The city can gain nothing from such operations. It may be seen from this analysis that a municipality can never obtain anything like the real value of its franchises by offering them at public auction. The principle upon which such a method of sale is based is a totally false principle. It assumes that it is to the interest of the city and the local transit system that the lines of surface transit should be distributed among a number of different companies. This is not the case. The experience of every large city in the country tends to an opposite conclusion. Combination is inevitable and in the public interest. What, then, is to be done? It is ridiculous under such conditions to offer new franchises at public auction; it is dangerous under present conditions to make the price paid a matter for arrangement between some local board and the railway officials. One thing is certain. Some new system must be introduced. The Cantor Act no longer applies to any large city in the State except New York. The whole matter is in an utterly disorganized condition. An intelligent and conscientious Legislature might be depended upon to act.

A Report on Arbitration.

IN 1890 a great strike took place in New South Wales, a strike which directly or indirectly involved nearly every important trade pursuit in the country. Consequently the interests affected were so enormous and the results of the paralysis of industry so disastrous that after its termination people began to seek for some possible preventive or solvent for such disputes. Originally when they were confined to single trades the vital public interests implicitly involved were not fully appreciated. The general introduction of the sympathetic strike, however, and the consequent spreading of the disputes, the counter organizations of employers, and the frequent strikes in industries like railroads, which must go on, have brought into strong light the nature and extent of these implicit public interests. The New South Wales government, in the interest of the public, appointed a commission to investigate the entire subject of strikes and their remedies, and this commission has recently rendered an elaborate report. Although composed half of representatives of the employers and half of representatives of the employes, together with a chairman who was neither, the commission adopted its report unanimously. Throughout it is a strong, discriminating and impartial argument in favor of conciliation and arbitration by the assistance of a State board. Although perhaps not recognizing fully enough the conditions under which arbitrating and conciliating agencies can be successfully employed, yet this report, so far as it has been published in this country, is so fair in spirit and so careful and sensible in its conclusions that attention to some of its details will repay all who are interested in this great social problem.

In the first place the report puts instructive emphasis upon the distinction between conciliation and arbitration. How often do writers on daily newspapers declare that such and such a dispute is not "arbitrable," which means that the dispute is not one upon which a reasonable judgment could be passed. What they really wish to state is that the dispute offers no opportunity for conciliation. The function of a conciliating agency is described by this report as that of getting the parties to a dispute to come to a common agreement voluntarily without any opinion being pronounced upon the merits or any instruction given. The function of arbitration is distinctly to determine the merits and to give a positive decision to be abided by. In every State there should be a board constituted which could combine both of these functions. Such an institution would, in the opinion of these commissioners, stand before the public as a mediatory influence always and immediately available. The majority of disputes would be settled by the preliminary process of having them thoroughly sifted before a board of conciliation. Frequently enough strikes and lockouts occur, simply because the employers and employees are too hasty and resentful to sit down and talk the disagreement over; and the opportunity and habit of discussing such matters openly and fairly under the moderating influence of officials of experience and impartiality would certainly help to settle many disputes without any open rupture. When conciliation has failed, then it is time to use arbitration. The report does not claim that arbitration is competent to settle immediately all industrial disputes, but it claims that decisions can be and often have been given as to industrial quarrels which practically solve the immediate difficulty. It is evident that such a board would be of a great assistance in those trades which already possessed such arbitration machinery as that advised by the National Association

of Builders. The great need of these trade boards has from the start been some unbiased and competent authority, to whom difficult questions could be referred. A State board would provide such an authority.

The report does not propose to make the arbitration compulsory. On this point its remarks are strong and suggestive. It does not entirely reject the doctrine that the State may not legitimately interfere to prevent, if possible, such colossal and demoralizing disputes as those which frequently occur. The public interests involved are so vital and far reaching that the State certainly has jurisdiction. But the report does not recommend that a State board should have, at the present time, the right to insist on both parties to a trade dispute bringing their case before it. Nevertheless, the commissioners are not of opinion that it should be made necessary for both parties to call upon the board to interfere, for the adoption of such a restriction would greatly diminish the usefulness of the board. It admits that to allow one party to set the board in motion would be, to a certain extent, to put compulsion on the other party, because it must either appear or run the risk of having an award given in its absence. But this degree of compulsion in the public interest it believes to be clearly expedient. No quarrel should be allowed to fester if either party were willing to accept a settlement by a State tribunal. The report, however, does not favor the application of compulsion at the close of the arbitration process. The answer to the argument, that if an arbitration court cannot compel obedience to its decisions, it will be useless, is in our opinion conclusive. Experience is almost wholly the other way. In England all trade arbitrations have been outside the law, because the three laws passed for the purpose have been inoperative. And yet, although arbitrations have been very numerous the cases are very few in which decisions have not been loyally accepted. The reason for this is that the decisions have been as fair as could be expected. Then public opinion, which counts for a great deal in matters of this kind, is generally in favor of acquiescing in a decision given after a fair hearing. In the very great majority of cases, the decisions of the arbitrators will probably settle the dispute, and it is not worth while, therefore, for the sake of making compliance universal, to introduce the repugnant element of compulsion. Furthermore, although a court of arbitration might inflict fines and penalties, it could not compel men to work for less wages than they were contented with; neither could an employer be compelled to keep on his business for a lower rate of profit that would in his opinion compensate him for his risk and trouble.

One comment is, perhaps, needed to the above. The report intimates that public opinion has a great deal to do with the efficacy of arbitration; but it fails to give sufficient emphasis to this aspect of the matter. In truth, State arbitration may be suggestively described as the most efficient way possible of making the action of public opinion effective in industrial disputes. Public opinion is in the end the arbiter of such quarrels. Occasionally the victory may go to the stronger; but a victory of this kind is never sustained. If either one side or the other really has a grievance, that grievance will be continually asserted until public opinion, recognizing it, forces the delinquents through public reprobation to act more fairly. The temper of society is a great subduer of individual or class crotchetts and prejudices. But when public opinion is unorganized, it does not act very satisfactorily. It takes too long to make its influence felt; and it is very often deceived as to the facts. The early trades unions in England were obliged for many years to carry on a bitter fight in the teeth of a public opinion that regarded them chiefly as nuisances. Even after the combination of workingmen ceased to be an actual crime, it was long judicially persecuted by a rigorous interpretation of the conspiracy laws under the sanction of public opinion. Finally intelligent Englishmen awoke to some appreciation of the value of the unions, and they were legalized. Since that time, both in this country and abroad, impartial observers have gradually formulated certain general principles in connection with these disputes; and it is time that our laws should recognize these principles. A State arbitration board is the proper machinery for applying and interpreting them. It would have a most important duty in setting the facts clearly before the public—a duty which the newspapers are totally unable to perform—perform it so badly in fact that many organizations, both of employers and employees, now refuse to give information to reporters. Then it could pass on those facts in the light of recognized economic and sociological principles. If the board can be made impartial and intelligent, its decisions would have all the force of public opinion. Such an institution must come into existence very slowly, and almost feel its way into power. In some States, public opinion is scarcely prepared for it; and judging from the failure of our present board to make itself anything but ridiculous during the Buffalo strike, we fear that New York is one of those States.

Investments.—Good and Bad.

Comparisons may, as the saying has it, be odious, and no doubt are when too personally and pointedly expressed, but they can be and are daily made with many useful results. In fact it would create a little surprise if it were thoroughly understood how much the world's activity depends on comparisons for its existence. The critic in art and literature could not exist without them, and in commerce and manufacture there would be no incentive to improvement without them. Comparisons are just now, too, the stock in trade of the politician who, with the zeal of a highly paid advocate, looks abroad only with eyes to see what is favorable to his side of the question. Among other places the political eyes are directed to the United Kingdom as a place where endless argument on both sides of the question of the day can be found, with results that must thoroughly bewilder the citizen who prides himself on a practice of hearing all views. The prospect of certain metal-workers and workers in fabrics being driven to starvation excites in certain quarters a jubilation short only of public thanksgiving, and to hope that the Britisher may be laid low in the dust of his own ruined commerce seems to be a pious as well as a patriotic act. Of course part of this belongs to election fervor and will be repented of after the returns are published next month, but meantime those who have no wish to see the greatest consumer of America's agricultural and mechanical products and the greatest investor in American securities ruined past all hope, may find signs that that day is still distant and take courage.

One of these signs is the report made by the Board of Trade on the railroad business in the United Kingdom for the year 1891, from which it appears that, whatever injury may have been done in certain lines and whatever business recent legislation in this country may have transferred to this side of the Atlantic, the general business of the United Kingdom was last year great enough to permit an increase in the railroad traffic receipts of 2.4 per cent, so that if any feel a naturally human and Christian alarm for the safety and well-being of the United Kingdom as a whole they can find encouragement from this fact and from the reasonable assurance to be drawn therefrom that the people of that country as a whole are still able to afford the luxury of grain grown on the prairies and have some savings to invest in the railroads built to carry that grain to the seaboard. In fact in some respects these English railroad returns compare quite favorably with similar figures found in the last issue of Poor's Manual, collected with the view of giving as far as they could possibly be obtained the results of operating the railroads of the United States for the year 1891. In the case of the returns for the United Kingdom, they are official and cover the whole mileage of the country, while those for the United States are deficient of results on a large mileage, 3,647 miles, which were then incomplete or for other reason contribute no returns. Such as they could have contributed would lessen rather than increase the general results, for the reason that new road while usually burdensome both in cost of capital and operation, does not usually contribute much in the way of returns. The American roads show a larger growth of receipts than the English road, 4 per cent against 2.4 per cent, as may naturally be expected from the fact that this country is still undergoing the process of settlement. Some other interesting points of comparison will be found in the following table, the money figures for the returns of the United Kingdom being reduced to United States currency at the rate of \$4.80 to the pound sterling. The source of the results for the United States has already been stated.

One fact in the foregoing figures cannot escape notice, and that is how much more heavily capitalized the English railroads are than the American. This is due in part to the greater cost of property acquired in the older country, but also more largely to additions to capital which it has been found necessary to make to carry out indispensable improvements, a process that has already begun to a considerable extent on the established roads of this country, not only in the East, as, for evidence, the New York Central's two last loans, but also in the West, where only this year the Atchison had to make extraordinary arrangements for improvements it will have to make for some years to come. Consequently the American security-holder will have in the future to be content to see large increases of railroad capitalization without corresponding growth in mileage. So far as the English figures show this is not a fact to be deplored, because it will be seen that there was paid out on the total railroad capital of the United Kingdom 4 per cent, against 2.9 on the same capital of the United States, this latter being taken to be only the bond and stock debts, the current and unfunded debt being rather regarded as probable than actual capitalization; they consume a large part of net earnings. Were they capitalized the results in the two countries would be on the whole about the same with, if anything, a slight difference in favor of this. The operating cost in the two countries shows a marked difference, in the one case being 55.1 per cent of the total receipts, and in this country 63 per cent. The low rate in the United Kingdom is the result largely of increased efficiency produced by the employment of new capital from time to time, and it remains to be seen whether the same policy in the United States can reduce the proportion of the working cost. At first sight it seems hardly credible that 45 per cent of the total receipts should be only equal to 4 per cent on the capital employed in any enterprise, but this only shows to what an extent it has been necessary to swell the funds employed to bring about the results seen in the operation of the railroads of the United Kingdom and as if a reduction in the cost of working can only be produced by an increase in the amount of capital to share the profits. If a stable, though low, return

can be secured in this way it would seem to be preferable to a system in which floating debts are created which eventually become capitalized, but meantime carry high rates of interest, and debar stockholders from the enjoyment of the profits which are made from time to time. In the English system the future is charged with its share of the burden; the American is an attempt to provide for the future. Which is the best railroad experts are now trying to decide. There is one point on which both countries are to be congratulated, and that is on the apparent readiness of their several investing publics to provide the capital necessary to build new roads or to improve old ones. In the United Kingdom the additions to railroad capitalization amounted in 1891 to more than \$71,000,000, and in the United States to more than four times that amount. In the first the nominal increased capital has not been included, and making allowance for that in the second and for discounts in both, these figures show a very satisfactory confidence on the part of the public on both sides of the Atlantic in railroad investments in spite of falling rates and increase in the cost of labor and supplies.

Architectural League's House Warming.

The Architectural League took formal possession of its new quarters in the new American Fine Arts Building, in 57th street, on Wednesday night, the occasion being the first of the regular series of monthly dinners since the summer vacation. The building is not quite finished and some extraordinary work had to be done on Wednesday in order to get the rooms of the Architectural League in order for the function of that evening. But barring a slight odor of freshness, with which the members of the League are not unfamiliar, the new rooms were in excellent order and their bright and cheerful appearance elicited the admiration of every one present.

When completed the building is to be the home of the Society of American Artists, the Artists' Guild and the Art Students' League, as well as of the Architectural League. The students are already in possession of their portion of the new building. There is a large exhibition gallery, of which the societies named will have alternate use for their various exhibitions, besides the exclusive use of their respective apartments. The interior of the building is finished in buff and blue, with oak wainscoting and fine carved mantels of the same wood. All the contributing societies are waiting with but small patience the completion of the building, for they are all anxious to get into it.

The Architectural League has a spacious room in the southwest corner of the second floor, with two adjoining committee rooms. The larger room, in which the famous monthly dinners of the League are to be given hereafter, is to be handsomely fitted up as a parlor and library, and hung with architectural drawings and photographs, and various other forms of art work. It was here that the dinner of Wednesday night was spread. The members and their guests, to the number of over a hundred, were seated at five tables, President Russell Sturgis occupying the seat of toast-master at the guests' table. Among the others present were: President Edward H. Kendall, of the American Institute of Architects; Howard R. Butler, President of the American Fine Arts Society, H. J. Hardenbergh, who, with Messrs. Hunting & Jacobs, designed the Fine Arts Building; Montgomery Schuyler, C. Powell Karr, E. K. Rossiter; C. A. Rich, Thomas Tryon, J. William Fosdick, Chas. H. Jacobs, John M. Carrere, A. F. D'Oench, Creighton Withers, J. H. Taft, W. W. & E. B. Remick, Geo. Keister, Percy Jackson, H. L. Coulter, W. W. Ferguson, Horace Bradley, E. D. French, E. D. Franklin, Hamilton Bell, Henry Parrish, F. C. Butler, Joshua Barnum, Dr. Elwyn Waller, C. F. Post, G. F. Chichester, C. Malcolm Fraser, J. S. Schroeder, Thomas G. Holyoke, Walter S. Fullerton, Howard Van Lindecker and P. E. Belt.

The toasts were all informal, but everybody called upon had something good to say, and said it just as if the speeches had been prepared for the occasion. Addresses were made by President Russell Sturgis, Edward H. Kendall, H. J. Hardenbergh, Montgomery Schuyler, Warren Briggs, Architect Nickerson, of Providence, R. I., and Wm. Coffin.

Sale of the Old Greenwich Savings Bank.

UNDERGOING CONVERSION INTO A LITHOGRAPHING ESTABLISHMENT FOR THE NEW YORK BANK NOTE CO.

The New York Bank Note Co., Geo. H. Kendall, President, has purchased the substantial old Greenwich Savings Bank property, on the southwest corner of 6th avenue and Waverley place, and is converting it into one of the most complete lithographing and engraving establishments in the country. When the Greenwich Savings Bank abandoned this corner, the scene of its many years of successful business, much wonder was expressed as to what would become of the property. The substantial and imposing old stone building was splendidly adapted to banking uses, but was hardly supposed to be of use for any other known business.

For the purposes of the New York Bank Note Company, however, it is apparently well adapted. So far as the walls and general interior construction were concerned the building on the corner was suitable in arrangement, and required no radical alterations. But there were two other pieces besides the bank building and lots, which the bank had purchased, for protective purposes, several years ago. They were the four-story brick store and flat building adjoining on 6th avenue, making the whole of the corner plot 67 feet front on 6th avenue by 50 on Waverley place, and the three-story and basement brick dwelling and lot, 25x100, adjoining on Waverley place. The price expressed in the deeds is \$87,500 for the bank building and adjoining property and \$22,500 for the Waverley place property. But this price is said to express something less than the actual consideration.

The New York Bank Note Co. will use the bank building and adjoining property on 6th avenue for its offices and engraving and lithographing business, and is at work upon the necessary alterations. Architect Stephen D. Hatch has drawn the plan for the alterations which require a material strengthening of both structures by an interior construction of steel framework and the laying of a granite floor in the basements to

support heavy presses, and the addition of another story to both buildings. The company will also put in its own steam plant and elevators and an independent electric light plant and, what is very unusual, electric heating apparatus. It is also intended to alter the entrances to the main building, so that instead of three there shall be one large central entrance to the main office. This main office, which was the great feature of the bank, will remain substantially as at present, except for a thorough renovation. It is a splendid room, 47x80, and 25 feet high, and is well lighted and ventilated, and the architect has probably concluded that it could not be much improved upon for office uses. The New York Bank Note Co. expects to occupy about May 1st next. Property-owners in the vicinity will be glad to learn that the old bank property is to be devoted to such excellent uses.

The Kilpatrick Factory.

A FINELY-EQUIPPED BUILDING.

Among the large number of builders in New York City Edward Kilpatrick is, at the present moment, the only one who manufactures the entire trim for the houses which he builds. For many years Mr. Kilpatrick has erected houses of a first class character in various parts of the city. Experience had shown him that reliance was not always to be placed upon the trim ordered for his houses being delivered on time, and in order to obviate this, and at the same time have all the cabinet-work made under his own supervision, he erected a factory on 67th street, near Columbus avenue, which contains the latest and best appliances in machinery for the manufacture of cabinet-work of a high-class character.

THE FACTORY DESCRIBED.

A reporter of THE RECORD AND GUIDE visited the factory recently and found it to be practically perfect in its appointments for carrying out the various processes of the manufacture of trim of every description. Foreman Miller courteously showed him over the building and explained the different stages of manufacture, setting the machinery especially in motion where necessary.

On the first floor of the building a vast quantity of lumber is stored for use, the capacity being over 80,000 feet of material in working condition.

The first processes were shown where the lumber is taken out and prepared for finishing. Some of the most massive machinery is on this floor. An "outside moulder" and an "inside moulder" were seen, a band-saw that turns out all kinds of scroll sawing and resawing, and a self-feeding rip-saw which does the work of a man automatically. There is also a "matching machine," one of the heaviest ever constructed, which is used for making flooring and squaring up timber as large as 6x12. Indicators show the number of feet of lumber which has passed through the machine, a most ingenious invention that dispenses with the necessity for counting. This indicator shows the ten-foot hand, the hundred-foot, and 16,000 feet, and enables the operator in charge to ascertain the exact number of feet used up to the hour of stoppage.

Of course, the aggregation of so much wood would seem to call for extra precautions in the event of a conflagration, and this is provided for by automatic sprinklers, which, when a heat of 150 degrees reaches them, send a strong shower of water from a network of piping along the ceiling on to the material below. On the same floor are trucks that carry lumber ready to be manufactured, to the floors above, by elevators. At the time the reporter saw these trucks they were loaded with wood for inside shutters.

Ascending to the second floor all the various processes of manufacture were seen to finish all kinds of cabinet-work, and make it ready for varnishing. Doors, windows, closets, dressers, sideboards, ball stands, mante's, and every kind of work that goes to make up the trim of a first-class private residence is to be seen here. All this work is manufactured from designs specially made for the purpose. The trim seen was for the inside work for ten houses recently finished by Mr. Kilpatrick on 98th street, between Columbus avenue and Central Park West, as well as for other houses on Columbus avenue and 68th street.

This floor contains a number of machines for finishing, and the reporter found it of great interest to watch the different saws in operation. These comprise two finishing saws, two "variety" moulders, one power-morticer, one tenon, one sand-paper and one embossing machine. Those who are not familiar with the various machines required to turn out different kinds of hardwood trim will find it both interesting and instructive to visit the factory. On the same floor is a draughting-room, where the designs for the different materials are prepared.

After the various pieces of trim are placed together and adjusted, they are sent up to the third floor, where they are varnished and left to dry, ready for use. On the first floor a compartment exists for grinding planing machine knives. This is done by an automatic grinder, which enables the finest edge to be obtained within a few minutes. There are also emery wheels for grinding moulding tools.

IN THE BOILER-ROOMS.

The engine of 200-horse power turns every wheel in the factory. Two large boilers of 350-horse power occupy a large space. They are supplied with all the modern appliances, such as a draught regulator, boiler feed, etc. There is also a storage-room capable of holding 160 tons of coal, and a shaving vault to receive the vast quantity of shavings that are conveyed through the numerous chutes all over the factory.

This is a meagre description of what is really a splendidly-equipped factory for turning out the very finest cabinet-work. Considerable courage must have been required for a builder to erect a structure with such expensive machinery for the purpose of making his own woodwork. "And, with only a very few exceptions," said the superintendent, "the trim turned out by Mr. Kilpatrick is used for his own houses only."

"It would be a mistake," said E. W. Kilpatrick, a son of the owner, "to say that we effected any economy by manufacturing our own trim

It would be true, however, to state that we avoid delays in delivery and that we turn out a better material for the same cost, thus giving the purchasers of the houses in which our cabinet-work is placed the advantage of first-class material and workmanship at the same price as a house in which trim of a much inferior character is placed." It should be added that Mr. Kilpatrick has for sale nine houses on the south side of 96th street, between 8th and 9th avenues, the tenth having been sold; four on West End avenue, 97th and 98th streets, nine having been sold; and one 25-foot house on West End avenue, between 85th and 86th streets, all of which are worthy the consideration of intending purchasers.

Auction Business in Chicago.

It seems that the Chicago real estate market is suffering from an acute attack of the same disease that has for a long time afflicted the New York market, and for which the New York market is now undergoing heroic treatment. From the Chicago *Real Estate and Building Journal*, of Sept. 24, we quote the following:

"AUCTION SALES AWAY ABOVE THE APPRAISED VALUATION."

"Real estate men are asking seriously why it is that property can be sold at judicial sale at prices way above the valuation put on it by the court appraisers, when the same property could not be sold at the same figures either at private sale or public auction. Two prominent instances illustrating this fact have come to light recently. One was the sale of the premises known as No. 663 Pine Grove avenue, 50x225 feet, improved, to close the estate of John J. Smith; the other was the sale of the premises 585 Cleveland avenue, by the estate of Charles M. Drake. Both these sales were conducted by Adams & Hamilton, upon the order of the Probate court. In both instances the property brought more than the valuation placed on it by the appraisers. In the case of the Pine Grove avenue property, the valuation was fixed at \$4,500 and the price secured at auction sale was \$5,700. The question is, why can property be sold at judicial sale when it could not be sold at public auction? The answer made by real estate men who profess to know is that the public have lost all confidence in auction sales, unless conducted by the courts. The experience of many a purchaser at auction has been disastrous. Too many 'fake' auctions have been held, at which the brass band and free lunch features have been predominant. The after effects of such auctions are exceedingly disastrous to public confidence. Then, too, the fact that property put up at public auction is not subject to actual sale is against such auctions. A bidder is entirely at the mercy of the owner of the property. If the latter does not choose to sell at the highest price bid he is at liberty to withdraw the property. In a judicial sale, on the other hand, the sale is absolute if two-thirds of the valuation established by the appraiser is bid. Inasmuch as this valuation is almost invariably reasonable, the result is that an auction seldom or never results in a failure to receive the required two-thirds bid, but rather, as in the instances above cited, the bids usually exceed the valuation. This is still more remarkable because in almost all these cases where real estate is sold at judicial sale it is for cash, whereas at regular auction sales very favorable terms are obtainable. So much for an impaired public confidence."

THE GUASTAVINO ARCHES.

When THE RECORD AND GUIDE drew attention several years ago to the new application of fire-proof arches, made by Mr. Rafael Guastavino, we had little idea that in so short a time it would be so generally adopted by the leading architects of the United States and so greatly improved and extended in application as to amount practically to a new device. It has been in a sense Americanized, so that to-day Europe would scarcely detect the original idea from which it was derived. The first of our architects to realize its value and adopt it in their buildings were Messrs. D'Oench, De Lemos & Cordes, F. H. Kimball (in the Corbin Building), Buchman & Deisler (in all the Edison stations), McKim, Mead & White (in the great Boston Public Library), and other practitioners in the buildings named, and elsewhere. The value of the idea lay in the fact that it made the construction of light arches of any span, strength, form or shape possible in a very much shorter time than was previously known. To accomplish this three factors were necessary—1, the skilled draughtsman or architect; 2, the skilled director of construction in the works; 3, the skilled workman to lay the material. The most difficult to find is the second, although the common idea is that the last holds the highest place. Some idea of the extent of the operations of the Guastavino Fire-proof Co. may be gathered from the fact that during the current year their operations have been carried on in the six Eastern States, using 2,500,000 tiles, over 5,000 barrels of Portland cement, and keeping busy more than 150 men

distributed among their several works, as can be seen in their advertisement on page XII. of our Chicago Supplement. We congratulate ourselves, in a certain extent, for the success of this idea, and the company that have carried out a device so adaptable to any position.



The building consists of a four-story structure built around three sides of a wide court, with a one-story foundry extension. There is a wagon entrance to the foundry, with coal and sand chutes near the entrance. The basement or cellar is cemented and dry as a bone. In the basement are the boiler and 100-horse power engine, in first-class condition. There is a large storage capacity here also, which a good freight elevator renders peculiarly available.

The foundry, which is brick-floored and nicely ventilated through a glazed skylight, is a model of its kind, containing twenty-two furnaces. On the same floor are the brazing room, a large casting room, with connecting plunge bath, which is supplied from a driven well on the premises, and the japanning room, which is one of the best of its kind in the country. All the floors in the manufacturing rooms in which hot metal is used are cemented.

Spacious and comfortable offices are in a corner of the second floor. Here also are a large pattern room, the plating rooms, with steam tables, and the coloring rooms. The third is the assembly floor, where the various parts of any article manufactured are assembled and put together, with a variety of brass and bronze-working machinery, and all the line and counter shafting necessary to any business. Here also is the most complete and best equipped polishing room in the country, fitted with a Sturtevant exhaust blower and a window for every machine. The fourth floor is without partitions, but equipped with line and counter shafting and various machinery. The building has been used as a factory for the manufacture of locks and builder's hardware, but is suitable for any business.

The partitions throughout the building can be moved and rearranged at but little expense. The machinery is all as good as new and will be sold or leased with the building or removed and the building sold separate. A good elevator runs from the basement to the top floor and there are two staircases. Every room is light and well ventilated. There are one or more water-closets on every floor, and a toilet room for female employees. The building is steam heated and equipped for gas lighting. There is a large tank on the roof with ample supply of fire hose on every floor. In all there are about 40,000 square feet of floor space, not counting the cellar, and from top to bottom it is as clean as a model kitchen, and in shape to start the machinery on eight hours' notice.

THE REAL ESTATE MARKET.

There has been little to distinguish the real estate market this week, beyond the little spurt in the auction rooms, and which, except for James L. Wells' sale of Kingsbridge lots, would have been but little better than any preceding week for three months. Some business has been accomplished—it would be a bad week for New York business in which there was no real estate trading—and there has been talk of a great deal more. But the results are far from satisfactory, and it is not without some annoyance that brokers and auctioneers alike look forward to two weeks of holiday disturbances. The Columbus celebration in this city next week, while it imposes but one legal holiday, is likely to encroach upon regular business so far as to practically destroy the first three days of the week, and with them the week itself. Then the Brooklyn celebration in the following week will also be more or less of a disturbing element. With these inevitable disturbances there is no likelihood that the real estate market will strike a normal gait much before the last of the month. Notwithstanding these disappointments, there are no indications of any weakness in the market, and the demand for residence property continues strong enough to encourage builders to new efforts.

THE REAL ESTATE CONGRESS AT BUFFALO.

A much larger number of real estate men attended the second annual convention of the National Real Estate Association at Buffalo than was anticipated, and an interesting time it proved to be for those who attended. New York was informally represented by Manager Benjamin Hardwick, of the Real Estate Exchange, and Mr. John R. Foley. Gov. Flower and Mayor Bishop made welcoming addresses, and some of the delegates responded. Manager Hardwick's address on the New York Exchange was well received, and the speaker was given a vote of thanks. St. Paul was selected as the place, and February, 1893, for the time of the next meeting. Officers for the ensuing year were chosen as follows:

President, Wm. B. Cutter, Buffalo; Secretary, O. W. Crawford, Chicago; Treasurer, Matt Williams, Nashville, and for members of the Board of Control: Benjamin Hardwick of New York, E. C. Van Dusen of Detroit, S. S. Meddis of Louisville, Frank Bearley of Chicago, Malcolm McNeal of Chicago, A. J. Norton of St. Louis, Col. D. H. Elliott of Sanford, Fla.; Benjamin M. Weil of Milwaukee, R. E. Montgomery of Denver, and W. A. Barnes of Detroit.

GENERAL TAX COLLECTIONS.

Capt. A. Vredenburg, Deputy Receiver of Taxes, began the collection of this year's levy last Monday morning, and with it his thirty-eighth year's service in the department. As usual, several millions of dollars were paid in by checks on the first day, in order to obtain the benefit of the full discount. This is stowed in the big safe, for marking off the books and receipting of the bills when the rush at the cash windows lets up a little. The daily receipts thus far are as follows:

The total levy for the year is \$33,725,555.84, calling for a tax rate of \$1.85 per \$100 on an aggregate valuation of \$1,825,364,275.

Persons who pay their taxes before the first day of November next are

entitled to a discount at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, to be computed from time of payment to the first day of December next succeeding.

If any tax is not paid before the first day of December 1 per cent will be added to it. If not paid before the first day of January interest is charged at the rate of 7 per cent per annum from the day the books are delivered to the Receiver of Taxes; and if not paid by the fifteenth day of January he may issue his warrant for the collection of personal taxes by distress and sale.

The residents of North New York are an enterprising and persistent class of people. They have a way of getting anything they want in a fashion that shows a highly commendable and energetic public spirit. The present object of attack is the Manhattan Elevated Railroad Company. The North New Yorkers concluded as soon as Jay Gould purchased the Suburban elevated that they wanted a single fare to carry them to the City Hall. They presented a petition to the company and commenced a very widespread agitation of the question. As yet they have not been successful and so they have about concluded to try to force the Manhattan Company into doing what they want. The trolley road makes almost as good time as the elevated and it costs them no more and so the residents of the district say they are going to stop patronizing the elevated until one fare is introduced. Already there is a noticeable diminution of the travel on the elevated roads, so one of the advocates of the one fare said, and it appears to be decreasing every day. If their present efforts are not successful it is proposed to circulate a petition in which all the signers will pledge themselves not to use the Suburban Road until one fare is introduced.

SALE OF THE FOGG MANSION TO GEORGE J. GOULD.

The transfer this week of the well-known Fogg residence on the northeast corner of 5th avenue and 67th street, by Jacob H. Schiff to Geo. J. Gould, has excited a good deal of interest in real estate circles. This house is three stories in height and covers a plot 45x125 feet in size. It is said to be one of the handsomest in New York and only very slight alterations will be made to the interior by Mr. Gould. It was built by Mr. and Mrs. Fogg for their own occupancy, but neither of them lived long enough to take up their residence in it. Mr. Fogg died from pneumonia contracted while inspecting the plumbing in the cellar, and his wife did not survive him long enough to make her home in the beautiful dwelling. It has therefore never been occupied. Mr. Schiff purchased it at the auction sale of the Fogg Estate last June for \$341,000, and he sold it to Mr. Gould for \$365,000, without the intervention of any broker. The transaction took about five minutes to complete, it is said.

REMAPPING THE NORTH SIDE.

Although the task imposed by the Legislature of 1890 upon the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the 23d and 24th Wards has been tentatively completed and some of it approved by the Board of Street Opening and Improvement, the final maps have not yet been made ready for publication. Chief Engineer Louis A. Risso said yesterday that he thought all the maps would be finished in about six weeks, when a public hearing would be given upon them.

REAL ESTATE EXCHANGE MEETING.

At their regular meeting on Tuesday the Board of Directors of the Real Estate Exchange elected Messrs. J. D. Trimble, Homer Foot, Arthur Wheeler Francis, W. E. Jackson and W. W. Thompson to membership, and accepted the resignations of two of the seceding auctioneers, Philip A. Smyth, of Smyth & Ryan, and Thos. C. Smith.

Bryan L. Kennelly has enlarged his Real Estate at Private Sale Department, and, as will be seen in the column of "Gossip of the Week," Mr. Kennelly's business has been unusually active for this season of the year.

THE KINGSBIDGE AUCTION SALE.

One of the best crowds that ever attended a suburban or rather a vacant lot sale gathered in the New York Real Estate Salesroom on Tuesday, when Auctioneer Jas. L. Wells offered the 172 lots on North Marble Hill, at Kingsbridge, for sale. The lots are in the 12th Ward, between the United States Ship Canal on the south and the Harlem River on the north and east. The land was the property of D. E. Seybel and Hugh N. Camp, who have laid out the streets and graded the same according to plans approved by the city. These streets are macadamized and sewer pipes have already been laid. The large audience was made up of home-seekers principally, including a goodly number of shrewd women who have become

important factors at suburban sales and several policemen from the northern part of the city. Considered as a whole the sale was a decided success as well from the buyers' as from the owners' standpoint. The lots brought very good but not extravagant prices, considering the location of the property in respect to transit facilities, the condition of the streets and the restriction to the erection of two-story dwellings, which is a feature of the property. The owners realized \$216,810 for 172 lots, or over \$1,260 per lot. This was about \$6,000 in excess of what the owners expected from the sale, and they of course are satisfied. In this district already a number of building operations have been started by L. & J. Brandt, who were large buyers on Tuesday, and a number of houses have been built by Camp & Seybel and by others. This and the present condition of the property will probably induce the purchasers at this sale to erect houses also. The details of the sale are reported in another column.

While Jas. L. Wells was selling the Kingsbridge lots on Tuesday, Auctioneers Smyth & Ryan, at the other side of the New York Real Estate Salesroom, were offering Odell's organ factory, a four-story brick building, on plot 50x100.5, on the north side of 42d street, 100 feet west of 9th avenue. now about as low as can be quoted. It is claimed that most dealers admit the general strength of the situation, and are willing to take in supplies without waiting for lower rates.

LIME.—The general features of the market undergo few important changes. Dealers are not carrying very extensive supplies, but the majority of them assert that there is no necessity for much of an accumulation as the per cent of consumption is comparatively small. Very little new work is opening up, and the prospect for fall addition is poor, while there has not for a long time been any scarcity of available supplies. The state and Western productions is coming along fairly, and although Eastern manufacturers evidently try to regulate the production and shipment they are not so successful but that occasionally there is an over-supply here. Such are the conditions at the moment, and the influence is depressing upon values with finishing quoted at \$1 per bbl., and common unsettled at \$5@90c. per bbl., according to make and the anxiety of sellers.

LUMBER.—There appears to be a little monotony in the general run of reports and we do not discover any change of importance in the information obtained this week. Compared with the summer months there is certainly more business doing and in some of the yards in best situations something like animation is shown; yet taken as a whole the movement is nothing very remarkable and several of our level-headed dealers are frankly admitting that they do not see a very brilliant prospect for improvement. The manufacturing interest is reasonably prosperous and making a fair call for supplies, but building operations drag a little now, and those who might be expected to manifest greater interest act a mere or less indifferent about developing their plans. In fact there is not much faith in the present month as a business producer, in view of the almost certain increase of the political excitement and a desire to await the result before entering upon new enterprises, and there will also be a diverting factor in the holidays and other drawbacks attending the Columbian Celebration, during which it will be difficult to get much work attended to.

Eastern spruce is generally spoken of with considerable firmness and confidence by receivers, and most of them assert that they could now dispose of a pretty full arrival of stock without being compelled to make any very extended search for custom. Possibly within the city limits proper custom would not prove very extensive, but within the district around about there are a great many yards in want of stock and a good proportion of them owned by dealers to whom there is no objection as buyers, to an average extent at least. Orders for specials, too, are pressing to some extent, but not in all cases representing really new demand, as quite a number have been on the market, some time awaiting acceptance from indifferent sellers. Manufacturers certainly have done very well in verifying claims to ability to hold up the value line, and as the season gets along buyers entertain less hope of a break down in cost. Piling seems to be handled as it comes in without difficulty and to command former rates readily enough.

Hemlock finds some demand, more of it apparently than last week, but there are two feet of stock available against every one called for, and buyers retain most of the advantage in matter of price. Indeed, there have been rumors of a further shading, but if such action was taken it probably came voluntarily from sellers under force of necessity, as buyers do not as a rule appear inclined to crowd a market that is already quite as low as could reasonably be expected, and giving manufacturers practically no margin for profit.

White Pine retains a firm position in reflection of conditions prevailing at primal points, and even at Albany the advance of \$1.00 per M is now quite positively insisted upon, thus conforming to what has for some little time been common in other localities. The claims of a present shortage in supply are best supported by the fact that offerings are moderately and indifferently made, and sellers tenacious in standing out for full rates. Dealers are providing a very fair amount of custom for stock, and there is continued good chance for deals against a waiting consuming and shipping demand.

Yellow Pine has continued in a more or less unsettled condition, but showing little or no tendency toward improvement of tone. Buyers commence all negotiations in an independent sort of manner, indicating that they fully appreciate the favor they are bestowing by calling for stock, and they are met by an ample offering with a competitive spirit among sellers that insures about the former easy tone on value. Indeed, about the only chance that manufacturers have for commanding full terms is upon extra difficult specials, and of these very few are on the market at the moment.

Carolina Pine is held steadily, and offered with sufficient care to prevent much pressure upon the market. The selling side, however, is compelled to constantly contend for its advantage, as the demand lacks the force and anxiety that might be expected at this season of the year, and were it not for custom beyond the local limit, agents would find it rather an unsatisfactory market. Unity of action among manufacturers sustains the value line without much trouble.

Hardwoods have fair attention from manufacturers, some of whom are picking out specially desirable parcels of stock and putting them one side against the probable wants of winter months. They do not, however, make a business that is at all liberal or altogether satisfactory, and from the selling side complaint is to be heard with considerable frequency and in more or less pronounced tone. Dealers are buying something for stock all the while, with poplar showing rather the largest movement of late, but they claim and secure most of the advantages in negotiations, and while not getting any better terms of late are successful in preventing an advance on any of the staple lines of stock. Exporters make good custom whenever they find anything of high quality available.

Shingles have been arriving for some time to a fair extent from coastwise points, especially the Southward, mainly in execution of orders. Dealers describe the market as more or less unsatisfactory and some of them complain that agents go direct to consumers and negotiate to the detriment of the regular course of trade. Values are more or less unsettled and quotations have only a nominal basis.

GENERAL LUMBER NOTES.

STATE.

The Albany market as follows:

Dealers have been fairly busy during the past week and the market has held very firm, and is in a very satisfactory condition so far as prices are concerned.

There is no attempt to force sales and no disposition to make concessions, the advancing tendency holding rates stiffly to the top notch. No new features have developed during the week. Freights are ruling at the high figures last noted, and may go yet higher. Trade in white pine was good and shipping is quite lively. Receipts are moving in to the satisfaction of dealers, but nowhere is there shown through the district any evidence of a pine house being enabled to accumulate stock to any great extent. It is asserted in some quarters that stocks of pine lumber now in the district are much smaller than ever before at this season of the year. From this it must not be inferred that assortments are not fairly good, the opposite being the case. It is apparent, however, that the quantity of stock to be wintered by the dealers this year will be very small. If indications prove correct those who have the lumber will continue to do a good business until the close of navigation. Buyers are not believed to be well stocked, and with the prospect of a fair winter and spring trade before them, will desire to supply themselves, and to do it in Albany, where they will be certain to secure good treatment.

There is a large stock of spruce on the market and trade is good, though largely in the hands of a couple of well-known houses. There is a slight disposition to shade prices in some cases, but generally the list is held about steady. Hardwoods are also in good supply and trade is reported good. There is not much change in shingles and laths.—*Argus*.

THE WEST.

Referring to the deal in cargoes at Chicago, the *Northwest Lumberman* says:

In a general way the market continues to hold a strong position and all kinds of lumber are salable. Piece stuff leads in activity at the present time, short lengths being in more urgent request than long, though the last named are easily salable at unchanged prices. The yard dealers want short dimension with more than ordinary strength of desire. There is a demand for shaped up cargoes; that is, those which contain good percentages of 2x4, 2x12, 3x12, 16-foot lengths of some kinds, and short timbers. When a cargo can be made to include a considerable percentage of 18 and 20-foot lengths among the short, it increases the price 50 cents above cargoes that contain strictly short lengths only. Those which are shaped up to suit the customer, on order sent to the mill, even when all strictly short, sell at 25 cents a thousand more than for ordinary flat short without anything extra in the tally. In order to cover these conditions a range of \$11 to \$11.25 a thousand is this week quoted.

A peculiar feature has recently developed in the board and strip market. Several millions of feet have arrived from Lake Superior and elsewhere, much of it picked common; that is, lumber out of which has been picked all the good common and better until the residue is not, if any, better than No. 2 common. This lumber has been put on the market in great barge loads when all the yard stocks were crowded with lumber, and men were scarce to take care of it. In some instances sales have dragged a little on this account, and lumber that started at \$13 a thousand has slid down the scale to \$12.25 to \$12.50. This has caused considerable talk on the market, yet it is thought that the weakness on certain cargoes was only temporary, and that the buyers kicked only at the poor quality of the stuff when it was unloaded. The tally was desirable enough, for it was mostly boards of stock width and stripe. But everything good was picked out, and that made the buyers sick of it and unwilling to give for further cargoes, the price that only a fair run of common inch should bring; or, at least it was desired that there should be a little sweetening in the cargoes to make the lumber worth \$13 a thousand.

At the yards dealers uniformly report short stocks, much less than last year by comparison. Sales are so rapid that the supply does not accumulate. Looking forward to a brisk demand the remainder of the fall and all winter, dealers are wondering what they will have to sell next spring. There is certain to be a new spurt of building beginning in February or early March. Owners will want to get flats and hotels ready by May 1st. The demand will come when yard stocks will be low.

The *Chicago Timberman* on hardwoods as follows:

Oak, which early in the season was in large supply and weak, has been firming up greatly of late and is now considered excellent property to buy at prices we quote. Both plain and quarter sawed white oak are firm and in demand and plain sawed red is in fairly satisfactory shape, the only exception in this line being quartered red, which has been manufactured for the last year in too large quantities and moreover experiences a revulsion of sentiment in regard to it. It is being felt that quartered red oak has no such advantages as would warrant a materially higher price than that of flat sawed.

There is some little demand for good walnut, though as usual common and culms in this market have the call. Cherry is in fairly good shape, and the dealers are finding that their stocks are hardly in condition to meet every demand made upon them.

Sycamore is a wood that is going more into finishing and furniture than it used to, though in the shape of quarter sawed lumber. Soft elm is in fair request by the furniture men, and hard elm is moving to some extent to manufacturers.

Ash is wanted, and good dry stocks are not as easily picked up as they should have been. The country mills in Indiana and Ohio no longer have the supply of good large timber that made the ash of those States famous, and what they get is high in price. The standard wood in Chicago, therefore, is Southern ash, which forms the reliance of the dealers.

Basswood is keeping up its gait of quick sales, and prices better than those which at one time were the rule.

The *Mississippi Valley Lumberman* says:

The car shortage has begun to be seriously felt, more particularly in the south and southwest. During August, when the demand was large in Iowa and other agricultural states, a great deal of yellow pine was sent north. But with the movement of the cotton crop and the shortage in the supply of cars for the shipment of lumber less yellow pine usually finds its way into white pine territory. Yard men are now so given to ordering for immediate requirement that they readily pay a higher price for white pine, with the assurance of getting it promptly, than a lower price for some substitute about which there is more or less uncertainty.

ENGLAND.

The *London Timber Trades Journal* has the following:

We have already reported on the newly-imported

sugar-pine doors offered in last week's sale, and our opinion on further inspection is confirmed, and we are able to compliment the producers in San Francisco on the excellent manufacture of the sample parcel shipped. The reasonable price at which they can be imported ought to assure them a sale on this side if the supply can be maintained, as it is considerably below that of yellow pine. The wood has a peculiar odor about it, regarding which there is a considerable conflict of opinion, some buyers maintaining that it is a recommendation, while others hold a contrary view.

METALS.—COPPER.

—Ingot has found only a moderate measure of animation of late and, down to the present writing, we find simply a sort of natural trade movement, out of which neither buyer or seller can secure any special degree of advantage. The supplies appear to be fairly well in hand, however, and they are, as a rule, held steadily, only moderate fractional fluctuations taking place since our last. On the average range of valuation we quote at 11½@11¾c. for Lake and 10½@10¾c. for casting brands. Manufactured Copper has been selling a little more freely, in some cases the increase coming mainly from custom ordinarily to be found taking in supplies for stock at this season of the year, and also to some extent on special orders. Offerings ample and, as a rule, at former rates. We quote as follows: Sheet, not above 30x72 in., 16 oz. and over, 22c.; do, 14 to 16 oz., 23c.; do, 12 to 14 oz., 24c.; do, 10 to 12 oz., 25c.; do, 8 to 10 oz., 28c.; do, under 8 oz., 30c. Sheets longer than 72 inches add 1c. for 12@14 oz., 2c. for 10@12 oz., and 3c. for 8@10 oz. Sheets, not above 36x96 in., 16 oz and over, 22c.; do, 14 to 16 oz., 24c.; do, 12 to 14 oz., 26c.; do, 10 to 12 oz., 28c.; do, 8 to 10 oz., 33c. Sheets longer than 96 inches 22c. for over 22 oz, and add 1c. for 16 to 32 oz., 2c. for 14 to 16 oz., 2c. for 10 to 12 oz., and 3c. for 8 to 10 oz. Sheets, not above 48x96 in., 16 oz, 22c.; do, 16 to 32 oz., 24c.; do, 14 to 16 oz., 26c. do, 12 to 14 oz., 28c.; do, 10 to 12 oz., 32c. Sheets wider than 48x6 and longer, 22c. for 22 to 64 oz. and over, 25@27c. for 16 to 32 oz., 27c. for 14 to 16 oz. and 29@30c. for 12 to 14 oz. All bath tub sheets, per lb., 16 oz., 17c.; 14 oz., 22c.; 12 oz., 21c.; and 10 oz., 20c. Bolt copper, ½ inch diameter and over, 22c. Circles, 60 diameter and less, 3c. above price of sheets of same thickness; circles, 60 to 96 do, 5c. do; circles, 96 do and over, 6c. do. Segment and pattern sheets, 3c. above price of sheets required to cut them from. Cold or hard rolled copper, 1@2c. per lb. above the foregoing prices. Copper bottoms, 26@28c. per lb. Iron-American Pig is not meeting with above an ordinary demand from consumers and the market retains a great deal of the old slow and uncertain tone, with the general supply of stock at present offering quite equal to the outlet. Nevertheless, there has of late been a gradual disappearance of cheap lots of foundry and mill grade pig iron, and with the general production worked down to comparatively moderate proportions, the position as a whole is considered in better form. We quote at \$14.25@15.00 per ton for No. 1 X foundry; \$13.50@14.00 for No. 2 X do, and \$12.50@13.00 for Gray Forge. Old material has found some increase of attention. wrought scrap iron in particular selling well, and values stiffening a trifle in consequence. Holders, however, seem very well disposed to meet the market and prefer seeing trade more generally active before talking about an advance in cost. We quote at about \$17.00@18.00 for old rails; \$16.00@17.00 for No. 1 wrought scrap; \$15.50@16.00 for cast scrap and \$8.00@10.00 for borings, stove, plate, etc. Manufactured iron remains generally steady in price, and there is report of an increasing business, especially in the way of orders for structural designs and assortments. The call has been met readily enough but sellers seem to be more cheerful over the situation. We quote Common Merchant Bar, ordinary size, at 1.90@2c. from store, and refined at 2@2.40c.; Rods round and square, 2.10@2.30c.; Bands, 2.30@2.50c.; Norway Nail Rods, 3½@4c., and domestic sheet on the basis of 3.00@—c. for common Nos. 10@16. Other descriptions at corresponding prices, with 1.10c. less on large lots from cars. Steel rails meet with no more than an ordinary demand and the railway companies hold out no inducement for the belief that they are likely to increase orders to any extent at present. There has been no change in cost. We quote standard sections \$30 per ton at mill, with usual advances for delivery at tide water. Pig lead on the whole ruled pretty easy in tone and most of the business was of a sort of regular character guided solely by the immediate requirements of the regular trade. Offerings plentiful but holders abstaining from urging business freely. We quote at 4@4½c. per lb. The manufacturers of lead are quoted at 6c. for Pipe, 7c. for Sheet, 12c. for Tin-lined Pipe, and 37½c. for Block Tin Pipe. Pig tin has secured rather more attention in a speculative way, with variable tone on values, but the wants of consumers do not appear to impel them to invest beyond ordinary jobbing parcels. Supplies are fair. We quote at about 20.40@21.50c. for round lots, and 20½@21.50c. for jobbing parcels. Tin Plate, since last report, has found a variable demand, but rarely reached a point of animation and gained nothing in tone, but supplies were kept under control and pressure to realize prevented. We quote as follows: I. C. Charcoal, ½ cross assortment Melyn grade, \$6.40@6.45c. each additional X add \$1.50; I. C. Charcoal, ½ cross assortment, Allaway grade, \$6.70@6.75c. each additional X add \$1; Charcoal Terne, M. F. grade, 14x20, \$7.90@7.95c. M. F. grade, 20x28, \$16.00@16.05c. Worcester, 14x20, \$6.70@6.75c. Worcester, 14x28, \$11.40@11.45c. Dean grade, 14x20, \$5.45@5.50c. Dean grade, 20x28, \$10.80@10.85c. D. R. D. grade, 14x20, \$5.35@5.40c. D. R. D. grade, 20x28, \$10.65@10.70c. I. C. Coke, Penland grade, \$5.20@5.25c. J. B. grade, 14x20, \$3.37½@3.40c. I. C. Bessemer steel, squares, \$5.60@5.65c. basis; I. C. Siemens steel, squares, \$5.75@—basis. Spelter has been rather urged for sale without much success in dading custom and prices shaded accordingly, but of late holders have tried to assume a somewhat firmer tone. We quote 4.45@4.50c. for Common Western, according to brand.

NAILS.—Business somewhat irregular and in many cases evidently not up to the volume that had been calculated upon for the commencement of the new month. Still there is stock moving all the while and chances favor some expansion of the call especially from interior points where advances in transportation charges are a reasonable probability. We quote Cut at \$1.62@1.77 per kg for car lots and \$1.82@1.85 per kg for parcels from store for iron, and add 8c. per kg for steel; Wire, \$1.60@1.65 at mills, and \$1.85@1.90 from store.

PAINTS, OILS, ETC.—There was for a time a little break in the volume of demand, possibly owing to the turn of month; but it appears to be recovering again, and the volume of business is evidently quite as full as one week ago. The selection continues of quite general character, so that manufacturers and agents are all getting some of the custom, and especially those dealing in popular specialties adapted to regular consumption. Some of the trade who have been carefully looking over the situation came to the conclusion that local consumption is not likely to prove very extensive during balance of the year, but entertain a better impression in regard to outside custom and calculate that some pretty free calls may be made. Supplies and assortments are known to have run down quite positively, and buyers, almost without exception, in the various dependent localities, give evidence of ample financial ability to satisfy their requirements. Prices remain just about steady as for sometime past, and reports of rate cutting on white lead can only be located on inferior stock, the best known brands keeping close to regular list figures. Corroders' rates stand as follows: Lead in oil in kegs and dry lead in kegs in lots of less than 500 lbs., 7½c. net; in lots of 500 lbs to 5 tons at one purchase, 7c.; 5 tons to 12 tons, one purchase, 6¾c.; 12 tons and over, one purchase, 6¾c.; Kegs, Lead in oil 12½ lb. tin pails, add 1c.; in 25 and 50 lb. tin pails, and 4c.; and in 1 to 5 lb. tin cans, assorted (100 lbs. in case) add 2½c. per lb. to keg price. Terms on lots on 500 lbs. and over, note or acceptance at sixty days, or 2½ per cent. discount will be allowed for cash paid within fifteen days of invoice date. To make either of the above required quantities any assortment of packages of white lead, red lead and litharge may be counted. The above quotations are free on board cars or boat at corrodors' point. Linseed Oil has a very good general trade demand, and promises of a continuation of the movement do not appear to be wanting, while on value indications are steady. Buyers, however, are watchful in view of the somewhat erratic tendency of Western manufacturers. We quote on general range at 42@44c. for Western, 44@45c. for City from domestic seed, and 56@58c. for do. from Calcutta seed. Spirits Turpentine shows

no new feature worthy of extended comment. Prices range about as before and are nominally steady, but the market lacks force and character, and sellers are unable to command positive advantage. We quote at 28½@29½c. per gallon, according to quality, quantity, delivery, etc.

TAR AND PITCH.—There has been a fair demand from regular sources and sellers enter no complaint regarding the general condition of the market. Supplies appear to be under very good control and while offered promptly enough they are only available at about former cost. We quote Pitch at \$1.70@1.75 per bbl.; Tar at \$2.15@\$3.40, according to quantity, quality and delivery.

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
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
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
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
