IN the gentle midsummer ebb and flow of prices on the stock market such features as make themselves distinguishable do not encourage the hope of an early advance. If any one will take the trouble to watch the course of good stocks, such as New York Central and Northwest, he will see that the tendency has been almost constantly downward. The only strong stocks are a few most actively dealt in speculatively, and even these bear evidences of realizations. It cannot fail to be marked that the defeat of the Stewart Silver Bill in the House failed to carry prices back to the point at which they stood when the Bill passed the Senate, and although the trouble at Homestead was influential in depressing prices, peace there fails to advance them. As a matter of fact the action of the House no more disposes of the Silver question than the occupation of the Carnegie works at Homestead by the militia of Pennsylvania settles the strike. These are only moves in what must be lengthy operations. In one case it has yet to be seen whether the company can operate its works independently of its late employes, and in the other whether the currency as it now exists can be made satisfactory to the home and foreign publics and remove the fears it has created in the financial world. Another instance of the trepidatory influence of silver legislation comes out in the refusal of some banks to supply gold certificates for conversion into gold for shipment. This refusal could have only been actuated by a desire on the part of the bank making it to protect its store of gold and while the danger which caused it has disappeared for the time being, and gold is easily obtainable, the instance remains to show how much nervousness exists on this question. This nervousness can now only be removed by a comprehensive solution of the Silver question. The defeat of the Stewart bill does no more than prevent its aggravation, and the passing of the suggested Sherman bill will not remove it unless concurrent with an enactment which will satisfactorily dispose of the matter, though how satisfaction is to be obtained outside of an international agreement, it is very difficult to say, because any legislation on the part of Congress alone will not now be accepted as anything more than an experiment. Another feature of the financial situation not without its gravity is the position taken up by the Burlington road towards the Western Traffic Association, from which there is reason to fear that the end of the association is desired in order to obtain a readjustment of business and rates, a process that is always injurious to the securities of the railroads affected.

IT is noticeable that Austria-Hungary who, when the first announcement of her financial reform project was made, was represented as a most flourishing country, is now painted in colors much less bright. Just when the bills for the currency reform are being passed, the commercial and other securities of the country are undergoing a severe fall. It is claimed, however, that the causes for this depreciation must be sought in the condition of other continental bourses. Just as foreign investors have been obliged to sell a great many of our own securities, so their necessities compel the disposal of their holdings of Austrian issues. It is said that there are no local reasons for the fall in prices. Trade is not as active as it was; but it is still in a sufficiently prosperous condition. The finances of both parts of the monarchy are so satisfactory that they can give the exchange no cause for uneasiness. The *Austrian Economist* calls attention to the fact that the indirect taxes of Hungary during the last twenty-five years which have witnessed an

extraordinary development of the country have increased from about \$22,000,000 to about \$67,000,000. During this period the number of inhabitants in the capital increased from 150,000 to 500,000. No excessive pressure became necessary on the part of the government to obtain these favorable results, while at the same time the credit of the State improved so much that, whereas, twenty-five years ago it could not get a loan under nine per cent., it now pays only four per cent. In England there is no cessation of the fall in the prices of commodities which, generally speaking, have been steadily dwindling for the past couple of years. Since the middle of 1890 the fall in prices, taken as a whole, has been about 7.9 per cent, while during the past half year the decline has equalled 2.4 per cent. During these six months, while the domestic trade has been fairly well maintained, the foreign trade has continued decidedly dull. The protracted diminution in commerce accounts for some of the decline which is still taking place in quotations; but in the case of some important commodities there are other causes to which the fall is attributable. The low price which cotton and cotton manufactures have touched, for instance, may be traced to the abundance of raw material.

THREE is no real opposition in any quarter to the appropriation of \$5,000,000 for the World's Fair which Chicago has requested of Congress, and no question should be raised over granting the amount desired. Chicago has already contributed all that can be fairly expected of her, and the sum still needed to finish and equip the Exposition does not do much more than represent the larger outlay necessitated by the extension which the scope of the enterprise has undergone during the progression of the work. The opinion originally held that an international exhibition in Chicago could be nothing but a freak of Western imagination has step by step been driven from every corner of the land. Chicago enterprise and capital has developed the "local affair" with which we were threatened into an undertaking the scope, character and extent of which is too large for any one city to carry. Chicago has done her part so well that she has practically forced the nation into partnership with her. We simply cannot afford to refuse the appropriation. It should be granted without any unnecessary objections or delay.

FOR years past the farmer has been salting away a number of ideas, social and political, which he regards as valuable assets. One of these ideas has recently been embodied, for his benefit, in the Anti-Option Bill, a measure which demonstrates that the farmer is still as much the victim of the political quack as he has always been of the well-advertised patent nostrum. Even from, or rather particularly from the farmer's point of view, the Anti-Option Bill is a dangerous attempt to restrict commercial freedom. It is based upon a totally false conception of the relation of modern speculation, in even its most gambling aspects, to what the farmer regards as legitimate trading. The farmer is no more a victim of the one than he is of the other. Indeed, speculation gives him a readier market for his produce than he would otherwise have, and brings about a speedier adjustment of prices to the conditions of supply and demand, which surely are as much in his favor as against it. If prices decline in the operation, it isn't the fault of speculation but of the state of the market. There is nothing in "futures" that differs essentially from any ordinary trading. If a farmer is driving a small herd of swine to market and he sees ahead of him his neighbor driving a larger herd he will take a short cut, if he can find one, and get rid of his pigs before his neighbor arrives. This operation could be performed by telegraph. Knowing that the supply of pigs in the market promised to be large he could instruct his dealer to sell his porkers, promising to drive them to town the next day or the day after, or at any future time convenient. If he were a farseeing man he could go further than this. Suppose in his travels among the neighboring farms he noticed the promise of a very large "output" of pigs. "Marthey," he might say to his wife on his return home, "Dealer Jones who has agreed to take any pigs we may have in the fall is just as ready to buy them now as later. The chances are we shall have fourteen; but law! if we market them when Farmer Hayseed and Farmer Wayback markets theirs we won't get anything like present prices. I'm going to sell mine now." Thereupon, he does sell his by mail that very day, and in the fall delivers them, finding himself so much in pocket by his foresight. Are any of these transactions essentially different from the others? Supply and Demand governs them all, as our farmer would find to his cost if he should fall into a miscalculation in carrying out any of them. Farmers Hayseed and Wayback might wish to suppress the mail or the telegraph when they learned what their neighbor had done, but the latter would surely maintain that his action all along was legitimate. Next year our farmer might be using his foresight and the mail and the telegraph to advance prices, and then of course Hayseed and Wayback would be convinced of the legitimacy of the operation. It may be said that into the transactions of the

gambling speculator, unlike those of our farmer friend, the actual commodity never enters. That is true, but it doesn't alter the conditions which govern the transactions.

IT was to be expected that the Homestead riots would inflict upon us a sickening attack of demagogery. Blatant aldermen have been braying their resolutions in many dialects in every quarter of the land about Labor and Capital and Pinkerton and all other things that mean grass to them. The House of Representatives has dispatched with rabid haste a committee of comedians to Pennsylvania to investigate the strike for whatever campaign spectacular material it may afford, and Labor has been brawling out its "sympathy" with an ignorant indifference to any considerations but those of labor, as though Law and Order were "scabs," and civilization with the requirements it imposes on the individual a capitalistic institution or device. In the midst of this vociferous demagogery and bumble the low piping in the Senate in favor of arbitration in labor disputes rises like a comic interlude to show us how hopelessly distant from any solution of these labor troubles we all must be if this advice in *vacuo* is the best wisdom we can get from the highest legislative body in the land—the assembly in which, above all others, we might expect to find brilliant statesmen and profound students of the deepest social and political questions of the day. Arbitration, like the ten commandments, reads well, but as a solution for troubles of the sort that exist at Homestead it is about as efficacious as Epsom salts. It is a good thing undoubtedly, but it is not applicable; for to be of the least account it requires that among the Carnegie Company and their workmen there shall exist a mutual respect, a sympathy for the rights and well-being of each other, desire on both sides to reconcile conflicting interests, the absence of which in the beginning made an agreement impossible and the strike inevitable. Arbitration to be of any value must be something more than a process and a decision, or even an authoritative decision. It should represent the mental attitude of men toward one another. It is a process of civilization, and how much of the spirit of civilization there has been on either side in any of our large strikes recently no one needs to be informed. For the present, we are afraid, arbitration must be put aside with Christian precepts as a factor in preventing and terminating strikes. The discord between the employed and the employer, will, it is pretty certain, become more and more intense as we go along until Society itself will surely be drawn into the controversy, with what result we shall see.

WHEN interest in Austin Corbin's ingenious and enterprising idea of running fast ocean steamships from Montauk Point to Milford Haven was aroused by the introduction of Senator Chandler's bill providing for American registry of the foreign-built ship, we pointed out that the enterprise had a local interest due to the fact that it would help to improve the transit facilities between New York and Brooklyn. This bearing of the matter has been revealed sooner than there was any reason to expect. A company has already filed articles of incorporation at Albany, whose purpose it is to construct a tunnel from Jersey City to Brooklyn; and this tunnel will, of course, have a station in New York, connecting with the surface by enormous elevators. But the interesting point about this tunnel is that the Long Island and the Pennsylvania Railroads are behind it; and this fact is the best assurance that it can and will be built. What has wrecked and is wrecking such schemes is the difficulty of securing the necessary capital. One tunnel has been already completed very nearly to the New York side; but, after years of delay, work has again ceased, owing to the failure of funds. In order to have the guarantee of a sufficient income, such a system needs the backing of the great railway companies, whose traffic it seeks to obtain. We have frequently pointed out that it was childish for the New York and New Jersey Bridge Company to talk of spending \$50,000,000 on a bridge, unless it was prepared to show investors contracts with several of the roads terminating in New Jersey, in which these companies bound themselves to send their traffic over the bridge. It is just this promise which lies behind the tunnel which will be constructed from Jersey City to Brooklyn. Its alliance with the Pennsylvania and Long Island roads is a guarantee of success. The capitalists owning these properties can themselves easily find the necessary money.

THE Huckleberry Road has already taken advantage of the opportunities so liberally conferred upon it by the last Legislature. The three roads which constitute the system having been consolidated a few days since about seventeen miles of this Union Railway are now in operation by horse power. It is expected that before next November the entire seventeen miles will be equipped with the trolley electric system, and to these will be added eight miles more. It is to be noticed that these eight miles are located where they will be very much needed. One extension will run from Macomb's Dam Bridge along Jerome avenue to the city line. Another will begin on Morris avenue at 8d avenue, extending

along the former to Highbridge road, along Willis avenue from the Harlem River to and along Melrose avenue and Webster avenue and Bronx River road to the city line. It is an important addition to the transit facilities of the 23d and 24th Wards and will doubtless do much to assist the building up of that section. This will be particularly the case as soon as the Manhattan Company improves its express service, or as soon as the West Side rapid transit line is constructed. For as we have frequently pointed out, these roads are in their nature essentially subsidiary; they are useful to supplement the opportunities of traveling south to the centres of business. If the 23d and 24th Wards had local industries of sufficient importance to support a population of any size, the function of these roads would not be as limited as it is; but until the Harlem River Canal is completed, and until the growth of the city northward brings with it its own industries, the trolley roads should be operated principally in conjunction with the existing rapid transit lines.

New York Tenement Houses.

BEFORE any tenement house can be built in the City of New York plans for the same must be filed in the Department of Buildings, and permits obtained not only for the structural parts thereof, but for light and ventilation and for plumbing, to the end that the building, when erected, shall be in accordance both with the building law and the sanitary law, and the rules and regulations made thereunder. Department records show with minute accuracy every constructional feature of a building, its width, depth, height and estimated cost. It is a comparatively easy matter, therefore, to get statistical information of classes of buildings erected during any stated period as well as the total yearly aggregate.

A recent occasion required that the total number of light and ventilation permits for tenement houses issued during the months of February, March and April last past be known. It was found that during this quarter plans for 460 tenement houses had been filed, and that these houses were arranged to accommodate 6,365 families. The least number of families to a house was four, and the greatest number of families forty-one. The list made up did not include alteration cases, only new "multiple domicile" buildings, but did not include lodging houses. It so happened that during the period stated there were no applications for such permits for great apartment houses, nor for the more modern hotel apartment houses, so that the list fairly stands for the ordinary run of tenements and apartment houses or flats. The figures show that the average number of families to each house is 13.81—say fourteen families to a house. This fact is in itself interesting. In 1864, when about a half million persons in this city resided in tenement houses, the average number of families to a tenement was 7 1/2. The smaller average of that period is to be accounted for in part by the fact that many spacious dwellings in sections from which fashion and wealth had removed were converted into tenement uses. The old mansions finally fell before improvements, and tenement houses of the type which was for so long a prevailing evil became the only available homes of the poorer persons, with more limited accommodations and higher rents. The necessities of increasing population, principally through the influx of immigration soon began to require the displacement of three and four-story houses, with one or two families upon a floor, by tenements to accommodate four or more families upon a floor; and houses were made five and six stories in height. Interior rooms had no means of ventilation other than by doors leading to them from the outer rooms. At night, when these rooms were occupied, privacy required the closing of the doors, they were utterly dark and without means for ventilation, closets in fact. The halls were narrow, dark and unventilated. Water was supplied usually by a hydrant in the yard, under which an untrapped cesspool, connected with the house-drain and sewer, was provided. Often there was no sewer connection whatever the cesspools depending for their emptying upon ground saturation. The rapid growth of the city's population and the great increase in real estate values, led builders of this class of houses to cover lots as much as possible by the buildings regardless of the necessities for light and ventilation or the health of the occupants. This danger to the public health led to the consideration of the subject at several public meetings and the outcome of the agitation was suitable action by the Legislature.

For forty years the tenement-house problem in this city has received constant public attention. In 1857 a special committee appointed by the Legislature made an elaborate report upon the subject. In 1867 a Tenement-House Law was enacted. Prior to 1879 there was practically no municipal control over the construction of tenement houses in this city, and but little, if any, effort was made to introduce light and air to the interior rooms. In that year the incentive of a money prize for the best tenement-house plan brought out the dumb-bell shape, which soon became the standard after some modifications. In 1882 the Consolidation Act was passed, and subsequent amendments have brought the laws relating to building and sanitary matters up to the highest state of efficiency. As late

as 1884 the Legislature appointed a special committee to investigate and inquire into the condition of "tenant-houses." In 1887 important changes in the laws affecting tenement houses were made, and this year, 1892, the Legislature made still further changes, looking to the safety of people in tenements from fire.

Under the new building law, every tenement house hereafter erected must have the first floor constructed fire-proof, and the inside stairs from the cellar to the first floor must be located to the rear of the main staircase, or be placed in one of the open side courts. Underneath the first story staircase no closet can be constructed, but the space must be left open and kept free from incumbrance. It is in the cellar, where the tenants' coal and wood bins are located, that the great majority of fires in such houses start. The fire-proof floor is intended to prevent a fire from spreading above. The separated staircase is to prevent smoke and flame coming up from the cellar and setting fire to the staircase leading to the upper floors, and aims to leave free and safe the ordinary means of exit. A staircase fire compels the use of outside fire-escape balconies and ladders in the front and rear of buildings. In the first excitement of a fire, the occupants of the house rush through the hot and blinding smoke to the staircase, too often to meet death by suffocation. These new requirements add somewhat to the cost of a house, but figures have been given which show that the additional cost is only a few hundred dollars to each house. The fear that the cost would be large has operated as a check upon tenement house and apartment house building since the passage of the new law. The bugbear of cost is disappearing, and not a few shrewd builders see that tenement houses built in strict accordance with the provisions of the new law will meet with more ready sale than if constructed under the old law, if the latter were now possible. Every progressive step in improving tenement house construction has been met with more or less opposition. That any power could intervene to regulate the occupancy of these crowded domiciles and reduce the aggregate of their rentals was deemed a very great hardship and an infringement of personal rights. Even tenants often resisted innovations quite as strenuously as the landlords. In the end builders, landlords and tenants have all been benefited. The interests, or supposed interests of individuals have always to yield to the public good, and as the law has prescribed the construction for future tenement houses, builders must comply or stop building. It is from this point of view that the wisdom and policy of continuing operations can be clearly seen. The best tenements command the best tenants and the highest rentals. Partially fire-proof tenements will be preferred by tenants, and will be purchased by investors in preference to the kind that will soon be known as the old style. There will be an increase of profits under the new order of things, both for the builder and the owner. Instead of hesitating, builders should confidently extend their ventures. New York is growing as compound interest grows, and purchasers and tenants will keep pace with the new buildings. No backward step will be taken in building and sanitary laws; on the contrary, the tendency is to still farther requirements, and probably within a very few years time every multiple domicile will be required by law to be constructed entirely fire-proof.

ALTHOUGH the Gladstonians' will control a majority in the newly-elected House of Commons, it is by no means so certain that this majority will prove to be workable; and the British Islands may be treated to another general election before many years have passed. It must be remembered, as we have frequently pointed out, that the Liberals are committed to more than Home Rule. So far as the metropolitan constituencies are concerned they are elected also on a platform of municipal reform; and their legislation to make the County Council a more effective and powerful administrative body will be watched with as much interest by many as their attempt to place a legislative body in Dublin. If they are successful in carrying through this legislation, it is probable that a gigantic and far-reaching plan of municipal reform will be initiated. What the spirit of the London Radicals is may be judged by some recent action of the Progressist majority in the present County Council. It decided to abolish the contract system of lighting and watering roads, repairing on the embankment and bridges, and start its own electric plant, stables, wharves and the like. More important is a report of the Improvement Committee, which proposes to cut a broad, new street from Holborn to the Strand. It is to be 100 feet wide and will enter the Strand with a terrace in the centre, round which the roadways will curve down on each side 400 feet apart, the old church St. Mary's le Strand standing alone in this space. The Council will control the architecture along the whole avenue, and may build a County Hall for itself on the terrace, giving London for the first time a municipal building rivalling those of Paris, Vienna and Rome. Other tasks more important still are being talked about. The Council is considering the building of new homes for thousands of poor people rendered homeless by the cutting away of the slums between Holborn and the Strand; and, if undertaken, this will be done,

according to the London correspondent of the *Times*, upon a comprehensive plan, going far beyond the present notions of model tenements. The purchase of the property and franchises of the companies supplying water and gas to the citizens of London is also receiving serious consideration; and what responsibilities will be incurred by such a purchase may be gathered from the fact that the water works alone represent an investment of nearly \$125,000,000. The London reformers are not, however, scared by big undertakings and big figures. Their success or failure will profoundly affect the progress of similar reforms throughout the world.

Investments—Good and Bad

Louisville & Nashville.—The depression of Louisville & Nashville, which has been persistent since the declaration of the last January dividend, continues, notwithstanding that the company has made what on its face appears to be a very fair statement for the fiscal year ending June 30, last, especially when the unfavorable condition of trade generally and especially the iron trade in the South during the period reported on is considered. In January the stock sold at \$4 $\frac{1}{4}$, but no sooner was the 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ per cent dividend declared than heavy selling set in, and it has continued to such an extent that the last dividend of 2 per cent fails to induce buying enough to more than offset realizing and short selling, and certainly not enough to carry the price away from 70 to 71. Of course there is a cause, or rather several causes for this as there is for everything. The chief is that there is a general opinion that the management is going too near the danger line in its policy of distribution of profits to the stockholders. A large amount of Louisville & Nashville is held in London and in the continent of Europe, where there is a long-standing objection to any practice of carrying forward a large surplus or perhaps any surplus at all, by an American property on the principle that the stockholders are entitled to all the profit of any one year and that each year should take care of itself from a dividend point of view. The principle is an unsound one, as only a limited experience of railroad securities will show, but probably the Louisville & Nashville directors are influenced in a great measure by the opinion of their foreign stockholders in calculating the amount of the dividend to be paid for any one dividend period. If this theory is correct they carried their complacency so far as to distribute in January all but \$143,000 of the profit earned in the first half of the fiscal year and \$153,000 more than was earned in the second half, making for the complete year a distribution of the whole of the profit earned and \$10,000 that were not earned. This is a policy that does not commend itself to the wisdom of Wall Street, and hence the continued selling of the stock.

Moreover, the Louisville & Nashville management has of late years largely increased its mileage, and, as a natural consequence, its bonded and stock obligations. The earnings do not show that these extensions have resulted beneficially to the stock, for whereas the company in the fiscal year 1889-90 paid 5 per cent on \$48,000,000 of stock, and in 1890-91 6 per cent, mostly in scrip, on \$40,000,000, in the fiscal year just closed it paid only 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent on \$32,800,000. It may be that this change is due entirely to the business conditions of the territory developed. The new property may maintain its earning power as well as could be expected under those conditions, and it may be that had it not been purchased and the Louisville & Nashville stock not increased, those business conditions would not permit the older property earning more for the lesser amount of stock outstanding two years ago than the old and new properties earn together on the increased capital. Still, there is a general inclination to believe that the property is unduly weighted down by the later acquisitions, based upon a comparison of earnings from year to year. The following table, giving the figures from 1889 to 1892 and the changes 1889-90 compared with 1891-92 will show how this belief arises:

In order to make as fair a comparison as possible with the last fiscal year the annual statements put out in July of each year when the dividend is declared, which have in each case the June earnings estimated only, have been taken. It will be seen that, compared with the year 1889-90, the increase in operating expenses has almost entirely absorbed the increase in gross earnings and at the same time fixed charges have increased and income from investments decreased. The loss on roads operated under leases shows a falling off, but only to an extent very slightly offsetting the unfavorable features of the statement. The difference in the gross amount paid out in dividends is slight, but it does not show the full extent of the loss because the amount so paid out is distributed to a greatly increased stock capital. In support of the bear arguments on Louisville & Nashville great confidence has been put in the monthly statement of gross and net issued for the first six months of the calendar year and the last of the company's fiscal year, it being claimed that they show that the power of the company to maintain dividends is declining. What justice may be found in that claim can be seen from the following comparison of the results in the last halves of the last three fiscal years. The proportions of income from investments have been made up by deducting the proportions of losses from leases from the

proportions of income from investments, and giving the net result in order to confine the table to only necessary limits. The actual amount made or lost in either case for the half year cannot be given, as these items appear only in the annual reports and in amounts covering the whole year:

It will be seen that the net results of operation in the first six months of this year compared with the same period in 1890 were actually a shade better than in the year, net earnings having increased \$79,956, as compared with an increase of \$38,034 in the whole fiscal year; but owing to the increase of fixed charges and to the decline in the return from investments, the half year only bears its portion of the dividend payments by the deficiency of the first half of 1890 by making a deficiency of about \$153,000. The unsatisfactoriness of this result is aggravated by the fact that two years ago a larger sum was distributed to a smaller amount of stock without making so large a deficiency by \$41,583. These facts lend color, it must be admitted, to the belief that the company has harmed itself by its recent extensions, the earning power of the system as extended not only not keeping pace with the increase of obligations and operating requirements, but really falling behind. The fact that the income from investments has fallen off mitigates the general showing by suggesting what is proved by the returns from other systems in the same territory that railroads generally are suffering by the depression of business. The increase in operating expenses is pretty well proportioned over the whole year, and is not, therefore, explained by requirements from any special cause, floods for instance. Any one who chooses to make a comparison of the figures given for the fiscal year and the last half of that year with the corresponding figures for the year 1890-91 and its last half will find the same condition of affairs to have prevailed during all that period. Operating expenses for the last fiscal year increased over those for its immediate predecessor \$1,696,135, of which increase \$888,684 was made in the first half and \$808,101 in the second. The detailed report when issued, though it cannot be expected for some time yet, will explain many of these things doubtless, but if the unfavorable features here pointed out are due only to the unsatisfactory business in the South, no improvement can be looked for until business improves, but with any indication of improvement there should be an advance in the price of the stock. Meanwhile realizings and bear attacks are likely to be effective.

The Fort Washington Ridge Road Commission.

TO CORRECT A PECULIAR SERIES OF BLUNDERS IN THE IMPROVEMENT OF THIS PICTURESQUE THOROUGHFARE.

Under an act passed by the last Legislature, Robert E. Deyo, Henry S. Crain and Edward B. Ives, as Commissioners, are engaged upon a most extraordinary proceeding. The gentlemen named constitute what is known as the Fort Washington Ridge Road Commission. Their mission is to correct a series of blunders committed by former city officials, and to make it possible to collect some \$175,000 which the city has expended for work, which was so erroneously done that the authorities thought it would be imprudent to attempt to levy an assessment for it.

It appears that under the Act of April 24, 1865, the city, in the early '70s, proceeded to acquire title to the land for the opening of the Fort Washington Ridge road, from its beginning at 159th street to its junction with 11th avenue up near Inwood. The map was prepared in 1873, and the report of the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment was finally confirmed on April 21, 1876. By this proceeding awards were made for property taken amounting, with the costs, to over \$600,000, of which \$300,000 was paid by the city and \$301,109 was levied upon property benefited, and most of which has since been paid.

Seven years later the Common Council passed an ordinance for the improvement of the road so acquired. It was to be regulated, graded and paved with Macadam pavement. Pursuant to this ordinance a contract was made with Allen & O'Maley, contractors, on December 16, 1884, for the work, and the records show that the contract was completed and the work accepted January 5, 1889. Up to March, 1889, the Comptroller had paid to the contractors over \$160,000 and for surveying and inspection enough more to swell the total outlay to \$171,819.34. But in the meantime, and before the contract was completed, the authorities discovered that the road was not being built where the land had been acquired. In some places the contractors had invaded private property with their lines and had left patches of city property unimproved. As early as November 29, 1886, the Commissioner of Public Works wrote to the Corporation Counsel that the lines of the constructed road were not correct and that the three-fourths of the work already nearly done did not follow the descriptions of the property acquired for the purposes of the road. The remarkable and inexplicable thing about the whole affair is that instead of calling a halt at this point and correcting the mistakes that had been made, the authorities continued with the work and allowed the road to be finished and paid for.

Then the effort was made to reimburse the city by an assessment upon abutting property for the work done. The opinion of the Corporation Counsel was asked, and he replied that it would be inadvisable to attempt to raise the money by assessment until legislation had been obtained to cure the defects in the record. It was found that the contractor had

properly followed the lines of the map furnished him, and that the map was an accurate copy of the original map filed by the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment when the property for the road was acquired; but a survey of the road according to the descriptions in the deeds of conveyance to the city showed that it was impossible to locate the road as laid down in the map. The errors, it is said, were in the descriptive paragraphs in the deeds, and they were so serious that it was impossible to lay out any continuous, unbroken road, in conformity with them. The error was first discovered by one of the abutting property-owners, Mr. John Haven, and he promptly notified the authorities.

Under these circumstances the Corporation Counsel advised that the assessment be suspended, and then he went to the Legislature and had the Commission authorized as above stated. Mayor Grant appointed the Commissioners. They are clothed by the Legislature with authority of ample extent to correct the peculiar errors in the record, and to report the amount to be assessed for the improvement of the road. Under the provisions of the act the owners of abutting property are to be paid for the property that was taken for the improvement, outside the lines of the original purchase, and where they find their frontage on the road cut off by intervening city property, they are allowed to take it back upon payment of the amount of its cost to the city originally. The Commissioners are sitting frequently in an upper room at 115 Broadway, taking voluminous testimony, endeavoring to ascertain the sums to be paid by the city and by the property-owners to correct the original blunders of the city's surveyors. The Commission will endeavor to adjust the legal lines of the road as nearly as possible to the lines of the improvement. For the original blunders of an incompetent surveyor, however, there will be a large addition to the cost of the improvement rolled up.

Appraisement of the Custom House Site.

SOME INTERESTING DATA FURNISHED BY THE REPORT OF THE OFFICIAL APPRAISERS.

A report of peculiar interest to real estate men and owners of property in the vicinity of Bowling Green, was filed in the office of the Clerk of the United States Circuit Court, on Thursday, of last week. It was the report of the Appraisers, Henry L. Burnett, Chas. S. Fairchild and George W. Cotterill, upon the amount to be paid by the Federal Government to the several owners of the block between Bowling Green, Whitehall, Bridge and State streets, which is to be the site for a new Custom House.

The aggregate area of the block, exclusive of the alleys, is 59,019 square feet, and the total of the awards is \$2,111,000, which is pretty near the average of the estimates placed upon the property by the six experts who were first asked to give an estimate of its value. As to American Roofing Tin.

Apropos of the recent discussion of the "American Roofing Tin" question in these columns, THE RECORD AND GUIDE has received the following:

"PHILADELPHIA, July 13, 1892.

"To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

"There appeared in last week's *Metal Worker* a very able editorial on the subject of the inferior quality of tin that has been received from Wales at the present time. Of course we do not mean to say that this condition of affairs is entirely the fault of the Welsh makers, but we do say that in order to depress prices as a rule inferior plates are now being imported, not only of light weights, but of inferior coating as well.

"There has been so much misrepresentation on the subject of tin plates that while the amount of plates made in this country is yet small compared with what is imported, yet we assure you that we and others are turning out far better plates for the same grade than we ever imported, and while we are making but a small proportion of those made on this side we are doing our utmost to let consumers know that there are some American plates being made in this country and we further know that the output is being increased each month; that our firm has always handled the highest grade plate imported.

"We feel satisfied that before the tariff can be reduced we shall have our special brands so well known throughout the country that we do not fear that these special brands will ever have to be made in Wales again. Even should the election go Democratic it will be another year before any reduction can possibly take place. In the next year we think our people can satisfy any doubters that they can not only buy American plates, but they will be more than pleased with the quality. We are taking hold of this subject as a matter of business and not of politics. We are sending you a card to-day which we are sending to our customers generally. Yours very truly,

Continuation of the Labor Troubles.

Labor troubles continue to disturb the building industries of this city, notwithstanding that two of the strikes entered upon by the men in the early part of the season were ended during the week by the capitulation of the men with disastrous results both to their finances and to their organizations. The cabinet-makers are worse off by far than before they entered upon their strike, and it will take them many weary months to recover their lost ground. Several hundreds of men were out of employment for three full months while the strike was in progress, resulting in a loss of wages of not less than \$600,000. Substantially the same condition of things is true of the granite pavers' strike. After being out nearly two months, the men have gone back to work unconditionally, their organization not "recognized" in the terms of capitulation.

But the housesmiths' strike remains a much more difficult and serious disturbance than any of the others which have occurred this season. This strike was ordered by Master Workmen Henry A. Hicks, of District Assembly 253 of the Knights of Labor, against the Jackson Architectural Iron Works, a member of the Iron League, to compel it to employ none but union men. The Board of Delegates of the Building Trades refused to take cognizance of this strike unless it was given complete and exclusive control. The Housesmiths' Union was represented by a delegate in the board up to the time of the Downey strike, when the housesmiths refused to go out in obedience to the orders of the board, and their delegate withdrew. During the last week Master Workman Hicks has surrendered the management of the strike to the Board of Delegates, and the Housesmiths' Union has taken steps to be restored to representation in the board.

The Board of Delegates, on Wednesday, ordered the housesmiths to quit work on all of the Cornell jobs. Secretary Clayton said he thought over a hundred of the men quit on this order; Mr. J. M. Cornell said there were about forty-five. Mr. Cornell, in an interview with a RECORD AND GUIDE reporter, on Thursday, said the Iron League had only taken action when the Jackson Architectural Iron Works, one of its members, was boycotted. The League insisted that all men who desired to work, whether they were union or non-union men, should be permitted to do so. The Board of Delegates had started a fight on him, when it admittedly had no cause of complaint against him, simply because he was the president of the League. He had not yet called upon the United Building Trades for assistance in the fight. The material dealers had taken the matter up and had issued notices to their employees that unless by yesterday afternoon they consented to deliver material where it was ordered they would be discharged and their places taken by others. It was only by working through the Public Cartmen's Union that the walking delegates were able to prevent building operations anywhere. Mr. Cornell was asked if he was not surprised that any of his men should go out on the order of the Board of Delegates. He replied that he had learned not to be surprised at anything that took place in relation to a strike. When the notices were issued by the Iron League, three weeks ago, stating that after a certain date none but non-union men would be employed, the intention was to enforce that rule. But because their opposition was against the few who were chronic disturbers rather than against the union, they had changed their minds and discharged all of their men, immediately re-hiring all of them, union and non-union, except a few whom they thought it better to dispense with. Now he would notify those who had struck in obedience to the order of the Board of Delegates that if they did not return to work their places would be filled by other men, and there was no difficulty about getting all the men that were needed. Mr. Cornell said there was no objection to the organization of the men, but there was objection to sympathetic strikes, and there was objection to the boycotting by union men of the non-union men. The latter were entitled to work just as much as the former, and the Iron League meant that they should in their business receive equally fair treatment with the union men. It was reported yesterday afternoon that the Public Cartmen's Union had anticipated the action of their employers, the material men, and had ordered a general strike.

There is some prospect of a settlement of the granite-cutters' strike in the New England quarries on the basis of an agreement for four years. In the meantime all the union granite-cutters have been locked out in Brooklyn for refusing to work black-listed stone.

Obituary.

Frank X. Radley, one of the younger and a very popular representative of the building industry, died at Mount Vernon on Wednesday in his thirty-fourth year. His funeral will take place at St. Agnes Church, in 43d street, near Lexington avenue, at 10 o'clock this morning. President John J. Tucker, of the Building Trades' Club, has issued a formal notice to members to attend the funeral.

Edwin H. Wootton, for many years in the cement and asphalt trade in this city, and well and widely known among builders, died at Saratoga on Tuesday and was buried on Thursday at Clinton, Conn. Mr. Wootton was fifty-six years old at his death.

In and About the City.

Mayor Grant has called a halt on the Board of Education in the matter of the new administration building, which the Board intended to put up at 59th street and Park avenue. The Mayor says he will oppose any expenditure for the purpose until he is satisfied that ample accommodations exist for the children who would attend school if there was room for them. With reference to this the rent rolls of the Board of Education show that the city is paying \$53,900 per year for twenty-two inferior school-houses, where, at least in most instances, the city should have its own schools. Besides this annual outlay the Board had to pay for putting the premises in proper order for school purposes. The rental represents the interest at 3 per cent on over \$1,775,000, for which sum the city could provide better accommodations for a larger number of pupils. The Mayor has the right grip on the matter.

"What to do with the Harlem River," is to be the subject of special investigation by a board of engineers of the regular army, acting under departmental instructions, at the Army Building, in Whitehall street, beginning next Tuesday. The direct proposition is to fill in the "river" from 3d to 8th avenue, constructing a big trunk sewer through it for drainage purposes, and doing away with the stream for navigable purposes and with the bridges from 3d to 8th avenue inclusive. The question came up incidentally, on Wednesday, in the Park Board, when President Paul Dana expressed an unqualified opinion in favor of the enterprise. Commissioner Tappen opposed the scheme, for one reason, because the river was needed for sanitary purposes, and for another, because there would be so vast a sacrifice of dock property. The interests that are lined up on the opposite sides of this proposition, now, are on the one side the New York Central, the New York, New Haven & Hartford, the New York & Northern and the elevated and surface street car companies—generally speaking, all the land transportation companies—and on the other the owners of dock property along the river. The general public has not yet manifested any pronounced sentiment on the subject. But it is manifestly one of the questions of local improvement that is not to be settled in a hurry, and is probably not to be settled until the fact is accomplished. So long as there are drawbridges at the main crossings to continuously and seriously impede railway and land traffic there will continue to be a demand for the closing of the stream. Whether the water commerce is at present, or prospectively, of superior importance to the uninterrupted communication between the island and the mainland is the question to be settled before any decisive step is likely to be taken.

There is no doubt that Mr. Stern will also improve his latest purchase by putting up a fine house.



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BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

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| BRICKS.—Although the market for Common Hards has made no radical change for the better, some of the features developed since our last are of a character to afford a slightly hopeful feeling. First of all there were very liberal arrivals at the commencement of the week, embracing many of the supplies backed up by the 4th of July break, but these were all taken off with a fair measure of promptness, and are said to have passed directly into consumption. When it is considered that some sixteen or seventeen of the most important jobs are tied up by the strikes, and that the walking delegates has broken out again and boycotted one of our leading dealers, the result of trading may on the whole be considered quite a cheerful one, and creates a slightly hopeful feeling among operators. Values, however, have not yet been influenced to any noticeable degree, and sellers can claim no greater advantage than last week in matter of cost, \$5.00 per M remaining as the average top, and anything exceeding that simply representing some exceptional deal. The easy feeling on Pales grow more pronounced, and while \$1.00 is still quoted on "very fine" it has become quite an extreme figure. From along the river not much news can be gleaned. The condition of the weather has, as a rule, been favorable for work, and manufacturers kept right along with the production unchecked, though with some thirty barges laid up and shipping facilities correspondingly reduced, it looks as though there must be some accumulation taking place at the yards. The St. Johns, N. F., fire has been spoken of in some quarters as a possible basis for a call for brick from this section when rebuilding the city commences, as was the case under similar conditions at St. Johns, N. B., a number of years ago. | 1,047 |
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| LATH.—There seems to be substantially the old line of reports on this market. Demand can be found to some extent, but it lacks decided form or anxiety, and has been added to some extent by reasonably full offerings. Included in the arrivals was one parcel said to be of round-wood production, rather a singular feature for this season of the year, but we could not learn at what rate it was sold. For slab stock the lowest figure we know of is \$2.50, and receivers are making the usual claim that flush of receipts is over for the present and any increase of demand will make a stimulus for value. The buyers who worry over those statements were not on Change at the time of our visit. | 1,047 |
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| LIME.—Any report of the past few weeks would fairly fit present conditions. Arrivals probably have been a trifle fuller, but that seems to be about the only change as demand moves in much the old sluggish condition, and no opportunity afforded for strengthening or raising the line of value. The Thousand Island and Rockport precinct appears to sell out the cleanest as it is 5¢ per bbl. the lowest, and of the Rockland there is quite a little remaining over. | 1,047 |
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| MANUFACTURERS.—Business has been somewhat fuller on the distributive outlet, yet hardly up to a point that can be called active, and buyers evidently find no incentive to hurry themselves at the moment. The settlement of some of the strikes is a partial relief, although a great deal of work has unquestionably been lost beyond recovery until next season at least, and no unusual animation is expected this fall. Meanwhile, agents, local and casual, are getting in their fine work, and in some cases succeed in booking fair orders, but, as a rule, the business is confined to regular staple goods and standard selections taken by dealers in the ordinary course of preparation for yard accumulations. It does not take an expert seller long to weigh up the tone and temper of the local market, and consequently those who are most successful in securing custom adopt conservative methods, and make no attempt |

Hemlock remains nominally unchanged in value and without any great amount of local demand. Agents, however, are picking up more or less trade outside the metropolitan limits and generally claim ability to book their orders without sacrifice from rates of late ruling.

White Pine of better quality still secures only a moderate sort of demand without much chance for improvement, it is thought, during the balance of this month at least. Something desirable in the way of dry box and shippers, however, it is thought, would do very well, as regular operators in those grades have no immediate abundance of supply and willing to contract for later delivery upon about a basis of present cost. A fair number of agents are in town with tenders, though the representatives of some of the Canadian mills are conspicuous by their absence, the last report from them being to the effect that practically the entire season's cut was placed and they required no more custom. Export orders are fair except from Australia, where the market at present is unprofitable.

Yellow Pine remains dull, and another season appears to be passing away without successful result in the effort to recover the market into solid healthy condition. Probably this class of wood is obtaining its natural relative share in present consumption, but there is too much of it available and greater competition among manufacturers than calculated upon, out of which the buyer is reaping advantage. Saps are spoken well of by those who have used them, and will be likely to participate in any general improvement in the trade that may take place.

Caroline Pine remains steady, because the production is under control, and manufacturers feel confident over their position. The demand, too, is quite as good as could be expected, considering the general state of trade, and there is no indication that any modification on cost will be made. Some say it must go up in the fall.

Hardwoods are not particularly active, but there is a better feeling on the market consequent upon the ending of the labor difficulties that have so long been a drawback to consumption. A great deal of work has probably been lost during the strike, but there will be more to come on, and with back orders to fill manufacturers are likely to use up quite a little stock this fall and winter. That naturally imparts a somewhat more confident feeling among dealers, and induces them to give greater attention to first hand offerings, though most of them appear well posted and are refuse to submit to any advance in cost, even on the most desirable grades. They believe supplies to be plenty enough, and find confirmation in the more or less ample assortment tendered them.

GENERAL LUMBER NOTES.

STATE.

The Argus reports Albany market as follows:

Business, generally is quiet, more from a lack of stock than almost anything else, although there are of course several causes previously recited which curtail the demand to some extent. Here and there in the district a house is found that is and has been doing a lively trade ever since navigation began, but unfortunately for the good of the district as a whole this is not the rule. Some of the pine concerns, for instance, that make a specialty of thick lumber are having an active trade, particularly in 1 1/4 and 1 1/2 inch, and their sales are considerably ahead of the corresponding period last season. The demand for shipping boards continues good and box is selling fairly, while stocks come dragging along all too slowly to promptly fill orders. Spruce receipts have been rather better and the demand for the popular sizes of cuts keeps up well. Hemlock, however, is not doing well, except for a fair request for culms. Good lumber is pretty dead on the competition with Pennsylvania lumber, and if present conditions continue it will not be long before hemlock will cease to cut any figure in this market. Already concerns that have dealt heavily in spruce and hemlock are about ready to make the latter a side issue, and have turned their attention to pine. Hardwoods in all lines are quiet and having a very moderate call, while shingles and lath are rather more active than of late. The market shows a pretty good tone, prices throughout ruling steadily.

THE WEST.

The Northwestern Lumberman as follows:

The demand for northern pine at lakeside and interior points in Michigan and Wisconsin continues to be especially urgent, despite the late prolonged wet weather. In one way it has stimulated the call, for dry lumber has been scarce, and green stock has been substituted for it. The shortage of supply last season, and the close selling out of what surplus was carried over winter, has rendered the demand for the new cut more active than usual at this period in the sawing season. This has prevented the usual summer decline of prices, and such a stimulus has been given to the market by this condition that careful observers begin to doubt if there is to be any sag in values this season. In the Saginaw valley a very different tone is sounded than last year. Stocks are being sold rapidly, and at prices from 50 cents to \$1 a thousand higher than at a corresponding time a year ago. All around the lakes the market is fully as strong, if not stronger, than it was short time since. Thus, instead of the usual midseason weakness, there is unworded strength.

In Wisconsin, lumber has dried slowly on account of the superabundance of rain, and shipments have been hindered on this account. The mills are running with a plentiful supply of logs, and there will be an ample stock of lumber on hand for the later season's trade.

On the cargo market at Chicago:

Sales of offerings at the market docks have lately been a small part of actual transactions. The greater portion of the lumber sold by the commission men nowadays is on tally of lumber that is to arrive. Inch stock, which is in active demand, is largely reserved at the mills until sold. The large dealers send their agents to points of manufacture and pick it up in lots to suit. The vogue is getting to be to pile and dry at the mills. This removes transactions from the open cargo market, though negotiations are largely carried on by the commission men.

The inquiry for piece stuff is greater than a short time ago, and prices are reported a little firmer. Dealers are wanting all lengths from 10-foot and upward. Prices range on short lengths from \$10.50 to \$10.75, according to the character of the tally. One dealer reports having sold a cargo to arrive at \$11 a thousand, without any longer than 18-foot in it, though the tally was shaped up to suit the purchaser. Piece stuff is bought to a considerable extent like inch

lumber. Dealers are trying to secure stock at the mills, shipped as to assortment and size to meet their wants in the yards. This they are forced to do on account of the thin margin between mill and yard prices. The tendency is away from the old fashioned method of lumping the promiscuous cut into cargo and auctioning it off for what it will bring. The effect of this is to maintain an even, strong market.

The Mississippi Valley Lumberman as follows:

High water has caused some interruption of running of the mills below Clinton, but the stage of water in the Mississippi is so good and logs are being run out of West Newton and the rafting works on the St. Croix so freely that a large production along the river, as elsewhere, is assured. But the cut does not now promise to be disproportionate to the consumptive demand in the west.

In the Saginaw valley dry stocks have gone off briskly despite the labor disturbances at Tonawanda, now happily at an end, and the trouble in the building trades in New York and Philadelphia. The car trade has relieved the market of a good deal of lumber piled in the Saginaw valley.

The Timberman as follows:

The most noticeable feature of the hardwood trade throughout the country to day is the apparently general complaint of over production, fluctuating, fair to dull demand, and unsatisfactory prices. But from a careful and conservative observation we are of the opinion that there is more "calamity" in these complaints than actual conditions of the trade will substantiate. Although there has been at no time since the first of January anything approaching a rush of business, if books were balanced to-day they would show a decided increase in sales over a corresponding period of the year just passed. While prices range lower, sales are being made on correspondingly better terms, and it is a noticeable fact that we hear of no complaints in regard to collections. We believe the trade to be in a decidedly more healthy state than surface indications suggest, and the winding up of the year's business will show few disasters and more satisfactory results to both mill men and dealers than the season of 1891.

Oak, which is the standard wood of the list, is down in price, both white and red varieties feeling the effect of greatly increased production, and are in rather slack demand. To be sure there is a great deal of oak going into consumption, and it is the standard wood that is always wanted, but even the oak business can be overdone, and apparently it has been.

The market has hitherto experienced some relief from the pressure of supply, on account of bad conditions at the mills, but now, with better weather and the floods abating through the oak country, stock is coming forward with alarming rapidity. Oak is a timber that is widely distributed, and mills by the thousand are cutting this timber into lumber and getting it to the market. Quartered oak gives better promise for the future than does plain sawed, for the mills who have waked up to the fact that the quartered business was being overdone, are now running their mills on plain sawed. The danger is that they will now go to the other extreme, and that by the first of next year quartered oak will be scarce and plain sawed a drug on the market.

There is some indication that the craze for red oak as a finishing material, is abating, and dealers and those who have holdings of white oak timber are anticipating that the white variety may again be placed in the supremacy that it deserves. Red oak is a valuable building material, but it has no such beauty nor wide range of adaptation as has the white.

METALS.—COPPER—Ingot has continued to find slow, uncertain demand, and made only a flat, stupid sort of market during most of the interval since our last report. It looks, in fact, as though matters had been more or less overstrained, and were now undergoing a natural reaction without as yet reaching a level at which buyers feel willing to take hold. On the average range of valuation we quote at 1 1/4@11 1/2c. for Lake and 10 1/2@11c. for casting brands. Manufactured Copper meets with more or less trade demand of a regular order, but there is no unusual movement, or new run of custom, and the market is tame, with now and then a hint of quiet cutting on regular rates. Circles 60 diameter and less, 3c. above price of sheets of same thickness; circles, 60 to 96 do, 5c. do; circles, 96 do and over, 6c. do. Segment and pattern sheets, 3c. above price of sheets required to cut them from. Cold or hard rolled copper, 1@2c. per lb. above the foregoing prices. Copper bottoms, 28@32c. per lb. IRON—American Pig has verified the indications of a tendency in buyers favor noted in our last report and settled off \$1.50 per ton on the best grades and quite difficult to say how much off on the poorer qualities as the shading has been most severe but very irregular on all grades not possessing the highest merit. This has occurred in the face of curtailed production in several districts and indicates very clearly that moderate consumption and competition to secure it are weighty factors upon the market. We quote at \$14.50@15.00 per ton for No. 1 X foundry: \$3.00@4.00 for No. 2 X do. and \$12.00@18.00 for Gray Forge. Old material naturally is also quite dull and tame, and indeed has become more uncertain than ever in the matter of value, though buyers could no doubt obtain terms quite as proportionately low as on other stock. We quote at about \$17.50@18.00 for old rails; \$16.00@16.50 for No. 1 wrought scrap; \$14.00@14.50 for cast scrap and \$8.00@9.50 for borings, stove, plate, etc. Manufactured iron has practically no demand beyond ordinary trade lines and the market is uncertain beyond the fact that it favors buyers. We quote Common Merchant Bar, ordinary size, at 1.30@3c. from store, and refined at 2@2.40c. Rods round and square 2.10@2.30c. Bands, 2.30@2.50c.; Norway Nail Rods 3.1@3.4c., and domestic sheet on the basis of 3.00@c. for common Nos. 10@16. Other descriptions at

corresponding prices, with 1.10c. less on large lots from cars. Steel rails are steady so far as manufacturers refuse to openly name any modification from the old rate, but the indifferent demand coupled with depression in the iron and steel markets make a heavy sort of undertone and a break in price is not unlikely at any moment. We quote standard sections \$30 per ton at mill, with usual advances for delivery at tide water. Pig Lead appears to have a little more natural stamina than other metals at the moment, but the demand is not very full and buyers show no inclination to invest beyond ordinary necessity. We quote at 46@44c. per lb. The manufacturers of lead are quoted at 6 1/2c. for Pipe, 7c. for Sheet, 15c. for Tin-lined Pipe, and 37 1/2c. for Block Tin Pipe. Pig Tin finds only moderate uncertain demand on trade account, buyers restricting themselves to parcels of absolute necessity. The speculative feeling also appears to be somewhat under repression, and altogether the market is pretty dull. Rates fluctuate somewhat in response to cable advices, but show inherent weakness. We quote at about 20.20@21 1/2c. for round lots, and 20 1/2@20 1/2c. for jobbing parcels. Tin Plate has found a quiet deal without much change in cost of radical character, though the tendency is in favor of buyers. We quote as follows: I. C. D. grade, 14x30, \$5.85@5.40; D. R. D. grade, 20x38, \$10.40@10.45; I. C. Coke, Penland grade, \$5.25@5.30; J. B. grade, 14x30, \$5.37 1/2@5.40; I. C. Bessemer steel, squares, \$5.70@— basis; I. C. Siemens steel, squares, \$5.80@— basis. Spelter has met with limited sale, yet there was no evidence of serious effort to realize, and about former rates remained current. We quote 4 1/2@5c. for Common Wester, according to brand.


NAILS.—There has been a trifle more doing than at the date of our last, but no real animation, and fo that matter the movement hardly comes up to calculations, as buyers discover no reason for haste or alarm regarding the outlook, especially since the price of metals has commenced to take a downward turn. Offerings fair and available at about former cost. We quote Cut at \$1.50@1.55 per kg for keg for car lots and \$1.65@1.75 per kg for parcels from store for iron, and add 5c. per kg for steel; Wire, \$1.55@1.60 at mills, and \$1.75@1.80 from store.

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PAINTS, OILS, ETC.—Locally the trading is light and unimportant, the movement embracing only such small odd parcels of stock as might naturally be calculated upon to go into dealers' hands for assortment. From outside sources orders are commencing to come in hand with rather more freedom again, and while no real animation is reached the improvement is sufficient to create favorable comment. Buyers are acting in familiar manner, the calls in pretty much every instance showing clearly that actual wants have been carefully calculated, and that no investment will take place beyond that line. Importers and manufacturers, however, are very well satisfied to secure a gain in business, and hope for further growth as the season progresses. Supplies in first hands are abundant enough for all present wants without becoming excessive, and can generally be reached at former cost for most goods. Jobbers are still understood to be cutting a little on White Lead, but official figures undergo no change. Corroders' rates stand as follows: Lead in oil in kegs and dry lead in kegs in lots of less than 500 lbs., 7½c. net; in lots of 500 lbs. to 5 tons at one purchase, 7c.; 5 tons to 12 tons, one purchase, 5½c.; 12 tons and over, one purchase, 5c.; kegs. Lead in oil in 1½ lb. tin pails, add 1c.; in 25 and 50 lb. tin pails, and ½c.; and in 1 to 5 lb. tin cans, assorted (100 lbs. in case) add 2½c. per lb. to keg price. Terms on lots on 500 lbs. and over, note or acceptance at sixty days, or 2½ per cent. discount will be allowed for cash paid within fifteen days of invoice date. To make either of the above required quantities any assortment of packages of white lead, red lead and litharge may be counted. The above quotations are free on board cars or boat at corroding point. Linseed Oil has found very good average demand from

day to day, and with no special competition at the moment, or occasion for it, rates remain about steady all around. We quote at general range at 41@42c. for Western, 42@43c. for City from domestic seas, and 57@58c. for do. from Calcutta seed. Spirits Turpentine has not been particularly active, but of late buyers appeared somewhat more decided in their movements, and the tone on values strengthened. We quote 30@31c. per gallon, according to quality, quantity, delivery, etc.

TAR AND PITCH.—There have been more orders given for supplies by actual consumers; some of them on contract for later delivery, and reports are cheerful in consequence. Still sellers neither gain or claim any great gain of advantage, and valuations stand much the same as for some time past. We quote Pitch at \$1.70@1.75 per bbl.; Tar at \$2.15@2.40, according to quantity, quality and delivery.

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
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
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
