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THE financial event of the week has, of course, been the action of the associated banks in preparing to issue Clearing House certificates should they be needed. It is hardly necessary to say that the result of this action has been anything but reassuring. It may be taken either to indicate the precarious condition of the banks or as part of a policy to secure the repeal of the Sherman Silver law. If it is only intended to influence the members of the coming Congress or to force an earlier assembly of that body than is yet promised it is a most unwise move and the banks are likely to feel its reactive effects. If it really indicates the need of the banks for an enlargement of the circulating medium it is a warning of what may be expected in the money market and in quotations for securities. That this move has been followed by a rally in the few stocks now active does not prove that it is in any way effective for good, because the market is so narrow and outside business so small that a movement either way is easily made by the professional element preponderating on the long or short side. It is significant of this peculiarity of the market that while a few active specularive issues are advanced that good investments are not affected by the same movement notwithstanding the decline they have seen. For instance, Atchison and West Shore 4s are both selling within about one per cent of the prices they made as a result of the Baring failure. Other securities equally as good can only find a market at a sacrifice. The low price at which these securities are selling ought to attract buyers, but they are not likely to do so while the Treasury Department and the New York banks are by their acts and announcements declaring the situation to be so bad. The part the Treasury is taking seems somewhat inconsistent with the advice that recently came from its head and his head to the general public to have confidence and shows how thoroughly mixed and uncertain it is on the question under review. The administration and its friends are also likely to do the cause of sound currency more harm than good by going too far in attributing all the financial trouble we are now experiencing to the Sherman law. That measure has a great deal to answer for, but there have been other causes at work-over-production in manufactures and agriculture, over-speculation and dishonesty-which have all contributed their share. To overlook these contributing causes is to act the part of special pleader and put arguments into the hands of the opponents of currency reform.

S every indication is eloquent of the fact that the Rapid Transit A problem in New York City will certainly be surrendered sooner or later to the Manhattan Company it is well that the Mayor did not promptly accept the resignation of Mr. Spencer and his sympathizing fellow-commissioners. If the most that official quiescence and public stupidity will permit us to have is a patched-up, makeshift addition to our transportation facilities the sooner we get it the better and have done with the matter. New York has been bought and sold and it is useless to lament our condition or interpose objections. We must say "Kismet" and stoically continue to crowd into packed cars. As there appears to be only a few thousand dollars between the price which Mr. Starin and Mr. Spencer put upon the comfort, decency and progress of the metropolis there is no reason why they should remain apart. Conclude the bargain, gentlemen! Twenty-five thousand a year isn't worth sticking over. Indeed, it is part of the topsy-turvey consideration that has been given to this rapid transit business from the first that such tremendous anxiety has been shown over whether the city shall get one or two thousand dollars, more or less, for its treasury out of rapid transit. The character and extent of the new service was the really important side of the matter, but strangely that has had very little attention, and we see that when the Manhattan Co. object to extending their line beyond the limit of immediate divi-

dends the Commissioners are readier to forego their demands in that direction than they are to modify their stipulations as to cash payments. Here they are firm. The city must have the few thousand dollars; but as to the service the public are to get, there is no need to be too particular about that. If the company thinks it cannot give us cars enough the public must go without them, if it wont pay to build to the city line the city must wait, and so on. These are unimportant matters compared with whether the company shall pay on its gross revenue or its revenue after deducting the present taxes! Strange perversity! when the cry of New York is for better accommodation and service and not for a petty addition to the treasury. Better far forego payment of any kind if the city could get the service it requires.

WE cannot sympathize with the efforts which the Sabbatarians are making to close the World's Fair on Sunday, for we must regard the matter chiefly from the practical rather than the theological point of view, and it seems to us very much more desirable that several thousand people should spend Sunday rationally and respectably within the Exposition inclosure than in loafing and loitering in hotel halls and corridors or on the streets, or, as would be the case with a great number, "drinking perpendicularly" in Chicago bars. We don't mean to say that this is the only alternative. The churches and the Sunday schools are open on Sunday as well as the saloons, but no one can have any hesitation in saying that, of the crowd excluded from the Fair on Sunday, if the doors be closed, only an inconsiderable minority would seek the churches. Sunday is the great American loafing day and the bulk of the people in Chicago would put their time to no better use than they would if they were allowed to enter the Exhibition. But while we do not sympathize with the Sabbatarians, we cannot quite agree with their opponents who endeavor to make out that the fight about the opening of the World's Fair is "pure cussedness." Given certain ideas concerning the sanctity of the Sabbath, the opposition to the opening of the Exposition on Sunday is logical and in a sense very practical. The force of a great national example, one way or the other, cannot be overestimated, and the success of the anti-Sabbatarian principle in Chicago, while it would not in our judgment make in the least for unrighteousness, would certainly be a sort of popular decision against the ecclesiastical idea of Sunday. That it has been possible to raise this question as forcibly as it has been raised and in such an extreme case as the World's Fair, clearly indicates how strong the ecclesiastical idea remains, even at this late day.

DURING the conference with several representatives of Labor which Professor Levasseur, the distinguished French statistician, held the other day in Columbia College, George Murray, an ex-Master Workman of the Knights of Labor, declared that the high wages earned by the American laborer are due to the labor organizations. It is, of course, natural that Mr. Murray should be of this opinion. Everybody is apt to magnify the importance of his own trade. The strange thing is that people who are not professionally connected with "Labor" should share Mr. Murray's opinion, as over and over again we see they do. The rate of wages in any country depends primarily upon the productiveness of labor. Wages in Patagonia could not be high as in Pennsylvania even though the Walking Delegate were supreme in the former and the "union" unknown in the latter. The fundamental cause of high wages in this country is that labor in the United States-largely due to natural advantages-is more productive than elsewhere. Wages are the portion which Labor receives in the distribution of the national income. The Unions add nothing to the amount for distribution. The most that they can do is to exact as large a share as possible for "Labor."

PRINCESS EULALIA will, no doubt, carry home many amusing recollections of her visit to this country; but we doubt if she will get quite so much fun out of anything as out of the efforts of our great journalists to "illustrate" her. It is customary for travelers, who push their journey into remote parts, to return laden with curiosities connected with the most peculiar practices of the barbaric peoples they have visited, and certainly the princess could exhibit no more striking example of the savagery of this country than its newspapers with their childish attempts to represent her pictorially. Nothing more archaic, simple, untutored could have been done by the savages that greeted Columbus upon his arrival on these shores some five hundred years ago. Our great journalists are, of course, not likely to take this view, but no doubt the old Peruvian and Mexican artists who attempted to portray the first visitors from the Princess's country were not without a fondness and sympathy for their own rude attempts which passed with them for the tempered appreciation of the critical judgment. How elusive the royal physiognomy was to the artists of the metropolitan press our readers cannot have forgotten. Twenty-four hours was sufficient to completely change its character and features as portrayed even in the same sheet. The retrousse nose of Monday had developed a fine Roman contour by Tuesday, and the bleached hair took on a raven gloss in the course of a night. No such problem was ever put before an intelligent people as that



of discovering from the newspaper prints the true likeness of the Infanta. We might also add that royalty was never so ruthlessly caricatured or a lady's face treated with so much levity. The Chicago papers have not dealt kindlier with the Princess's countenance, Though they have been



working away valiantly at the problem since the unfortunate woman set foot within their city, they have not succeeded in arriving at what may be called the "lowest common measure" of a likeness. We reproduce herewith the latest results of the effort taken from different journals, and, as the Princess has left Chicago, we regret to say that they must be regarded as the final product of Western art, so far as the Infanta is concerned. The

sorry thought is that our visitor can more easily laugh at the matter than we can. When she leaves us she will pass to a coun-





try where civilization exerts some restraint upon "journalism. We have to endure the affliction daily, though how intelligent men and women tolerate this pictorial stuff which an African would reject is not comprehensible. The "reportorial" balderdash that makes up four-fifths of our "great dailies" was surely bad enough without the addition of the "cuts."

Value of our Municipal Water Front Property.

It is always a source for regret when we see a great newspaper devote itself to the services of a political machine. This is not said because it is believed that political machines are altogether evil, and that a great newspaper cannot engage in their service without enlisting in an unworthy work. Such political combinations as we call machines are necessary, and will doubtless always remain necessary so long as social administration is managed by political agencies; but at the same time there will always remain so much in political management which ought not to find an advocate or defender that it is impossible to see an influential newspaper surrender itself to the uses of a machine without a feeling that there is likely to be some mischief done by the coalition.

We are led to make these remarks by seeing in the Sun of last Sunday a brief statement, supposed to be a news statement, in relation to the municipal water front property of this city. It was entitled "New York's Bankside Wealth," and, to give it a titulary completeness that could leave no doubt in advance of the patriotic motives of both reporters and editors, it contained a subtitle exalting the great and growing value of our "wharf and bulkhead property." Then, after these stilted preliminaries, the writer, in the body of the article, discourses as follows: "To-day the docks of New York are worth at a fair calculation not less than \$30,000,000, and they yield about 4 per cent net on such valuation. If the improvements now in contemplation secure the approval of the Sinking Fund, it will not be long before these docks will, through the increased facilities offered to commerce, be worth probably \$50,000,000, or one-half of the whole city debt."

Now, something can be excused to a great newspaper that has suffered itself to be made an organ. We may forgive such a paper, for example, when it descends to sophistry, or makes use of the best argument to be found, though still a bad argument, to defend a position which may possibly be indefensible; but nothing can be excused to a newspaper that forgets its obligations to journalism and makes positively misleading statements for the benefit of its clients. As an organ the Sun may desire whatever it pleases in relation to the water front; but as a journal it should know that this is not a new subject to be treated carelessly. It is a subject that has recently attracted wide attention, and promoted discussion in some of the most remote parts of the Union. We will give the Sun credit for enough intelligence to presume that it is not ignorant of the articles in relation to the water front that have appeared from time to time in The RECORD AND GUIDE. They were begun long ago, and have since been taken up and reported and elaborated in various independent journals both in New York and elsewhere, noticeably in such publications as the Engineering Magazine, and the subject has received a wide circulation. As a newspaper, therefore, the Sun ought not to be too unguarded in its statements, however reckless it might be willing to be in its assumptions as an organ.

We would like to know, in the first place, upon what data the Sun puts the value of the pier property in the possession of the city at \$30,000,000. We are in the habit of estimating the value of property on net receipts. It is the only way of estimating values not fantastical, and we would like to know where the Sun obtains its statement of net receipts. We have diligently studied the reports in the Controller's Office and have never been able to learn that there have been any net receipts worth mentioning. Readers of The Record and Guide are familiar with the fact that the Department of Docks since its organization has collected very little more money than it has expended, a difference which, scattered through all the intervening years, would amount to about \$60,000 a year gain. In other words, taking the report of the Department itself, it has collected in the twenty-three years of its existence

\$31,438,670.28 and expended \$20,018,593.48. On the basis of capitalization adopted by the Sun, then, 4 per cent, the municipal pier property can be worth only \$1,500,000, and on the true basis which will always be adopted by the level-headed business man—6 per cent—it will be worth less than \$1,000,000. Can the necessary exercise of the functions of an organ justify our contemporary in the surrender of more than 90 per cent of its truthfulness in a simple statement of fact?

What, too, shall be done with the \$50,000,000 future day-dream of the Sun after we have sunk another \$8,000,000 in the bottoms of the rivers at the rate of \$3,000,000 a year as it is now proposed? Will it materialize. It is to be feared not. It is the fatality of the dock department to destroy more property than it creates. It takes more from the common fund than it gives in return. Suppose, for example, that during the last twenty years there had been no dock department, and the Sinking Fund, instead of receiving its paltry contribution of the interest on less than \$1,000,000, had been receiving taxes at current rates per thousand or hundred dollars assessed valuation on all the pier property along the water front held in fee simple in private hands. Can any one doubt that it would have been a great deal more than \$60,000 a year? Can any one doubt really that it would have been less than \$1,000,000 a year? The pier property of New York ought to be worth all that the Sun statisticians imagine it to be worth multiplied by 6 or even more. But we cannot shut our eyes to the fact that it has been worse than worthless down to date, a source of no appreciable revenue to the city but the origin of an almost incalculable commercial demoralization and loss. Neither can we shut our eyes to the further fact, when forecasting the future, that it promises not a glorious increase, as the Sun assumes, but the extinction of the city as a commercial entrepot.

This is one of the subjects that the Sun's young men should be permitted to get right, and on which the Sun's old men should make a new declaration of independence. It is all right to defend Tammany when Tammany is consistent with democratic principle and common sense. We are Tammany people ourselves on occasion; but we are not fools, and do not think it necessary to follow Tammany and encourage it to proceed when we see that its lines lead straight to the devil. The idiotic water front system of New York is something for which Tammany is not especially responsible. It is responsible only to the degree that it works to aid in its defence and elaboration after experience has demonstrated that it is a disgrace to the intelligence of the city and a public curse. To say truth, Tammany is rather to be pitied than blamed for the engineering folly on which it is engaged along the water front.

Investments.-Good and Bad.

In the recent attack on the Granger stock St. Paul has been the especial target for bear operators and the subject of more of the talk of the character that is usually employed to assist a break in prices. So far the stock has taken these things very well, its decline, considering the circumstance of the times and the drop that has been seen in other securities of its class, being only moderate. Among other things, it is claimed by people who are working to bring about a fall in the price of St. Paul, that the company is issuing bonds to meet the cost of certain repairs and improvements which should be charged to operating expenses, and in that way only is able to pay dividends. It is also held that there has been no liquidation in St Paul, the people who bought on the great increase in earnings last year still holding on, but who would be unable to do so if any sharp decline could be brought about in the quotations. That is a question of ability impossible for an outsider to decide. Confidence in a stock is not ordinarily a bear point. Another ingenious theory is that St. Paul common is relatively dearer than the preferred. On a 5 per cent basis the preferred stock would be worth 140 and the common 80; their actual several prices are about 115 and 68, the 12 points in the latter case being, it is claimed, in entirely unwarranted disproportion to the 25 points in the other, so that either the preferred should sell up to 127 or the common down to 57 to gratify the bears' love of perfect proportions. It is remarkable that at current quotations the preferred stock should pay more to the investor than the common, but not at all unusual; for instance, take the high and low prices during ten years:

It is easy to see from these figures that the common stock has always been relatively dearer than the preferred. The greatest difference is seen in the low prices of 1890, they were made at the time of the Baring failure and when the common was a non-dividend stock. The explanation of this discrepancy is found in the facts that the preferred does not rank among the certain 7 per cent stocks, and that the common is in greater speculative demand, which last fact alone is good for ten points in its lavor. As regards the matter of the issuing of bonds, the last application made by the Company to the New York Stock Exchange was in February for \$9,6-9,000 general 4s included in the statement of bonded debt made in the last annual report. Of these only \$6,806,000 were listed, the listing of \$2,823,000 being refused because they remained in the treasury of the company unsold, notwithstanding that bonds had been canceled or expenditures covering them had been made in accordance with the terms of the

mortgage under which they are issued. This discrimination was made in obedience to a very proper rule of the Stock Exchange that no treasury securities shall be listed. The general mortgage was made with a view to providing the company with funds from time to time to prevent the accumulations of floating debts, and in this way the St. Paul Company was among the first to make an elastic provision for necessary improvements which all the other great companies are finding themselves compelled to make from time to time. In looking over the debt statement and the statement of operating expenses, it will not be found that St. Paul unduly enlarges the first to spare the second, but that the increase of capital bas been in fair proportion to the growth of the system, and that the expenses of operation grow faster than gross earning, which is also the unfortunate experience of most of the roads in the country. It will most probably be found when in due course the annual statement appears that St. Paul shares the common inability to raise new capital by the sale of bonds on proper and reasonable terms, and consequently the floating debt is considerable and increasing, but this will soon be disposed of when the market for bonds is better. How the debt earnings and expenses compare now with past years can be seen by the following table, which gives capital, earnings, expenses, fixed charges and dividend requirements per mile of road for four years ending on June 30th in each year named, the figures for this year where necessary being estimated on the basis of reported results for the first ten months:

It will be seen that there has been a small decrease in the bonded debt per mile and a somewhat considerable increase in the stock. The latter is offset by new mileage and the stock of the Milwaukee & Northern taken into the treasury. The result is an increase of about \$2,000 in the total capitalization per mile. Compared with last year, there been an increase of gross earnings of about \$150 per mile, while the increase of operating cost is double that amount. Fixed charges have been reduced by the conversion of maturing or called bonds into preferred stock, which has, of course, increased the dividend requirement on the latter. The surplus per mile, which will be eventually enlarged by the addition of miscellaneous income, if not as good as last year is equal to the maintenance of dividends on both classes of stock at the rates now paid The continuance of dividends on the common stock depends a good deal on the view the management takes of the future. It has already been shown here how the surp'us for stock grew as a result of the great grain crop of 189) and 1891. St. Paul wili undoubtedly suffer in its grain business hereafter and in its general business so far as the present commercial depression affects the territory it develops. This ought to be offset to some extent by World's Fair traffic and so far as common stock dividends are concerned by the very large surplus that was carried forward at the close of the last fiscal year. So far as the available facts and figures are evidence there seems to be no more reason for selling St. Paul now than there is for selling anything else, good or bad. That the price has doclined is only natural and a further decline is probable unless for some cause now not in sight the whole commercial condition immediately improves; neither present or prospective decline can be attributed to any defect discoverable by a careful weighing of all the circumstances which are a matter of record.

A Prospect for the Completion of the Hudson River Tunnel.

At a meeting of the Dock Board, held on Wednesday, Lawyer Simon Sterne appeared as a representative of the Hudson Tunnel Railway Company and asked that the company's permit be not revoked, representing that a syndicate to complete the tunnel had been formed, and that negotiations were in a fair way for consummation for a loan of £700,000 to finish the work. For the past year or more no work has been done, though but 1,200 feet remain, and a year's nent of the Clarkson street shaft station is due. The Board will take no final action at present.

Numidian Marbles.

STRUCTURAL AND DECORATIVE POSSIBILITIES IN THE USE OF THESE HANDSOME STONES-EXAMPLES IN THE MORRIS BUILDING, THE HOTEL VENDOME CAFE AND IN OTHER NOTABLE BUILDINGS.



The man who would be abreast of the times in the building business has need to abandon many of the traditions of the past and to learn several new things. A new style of construction has appeared, involving new methods, requiring new materials and producing new results.

And the new style has taken position at the front and established itself at the head of architectural construction in all kinds of buildings. It pays best, therefore its supremacy.

Which is why the statement is made, that the prospective, builder who would be wide awake to his own interests and abreast with the times, must thoroughly inspect the new system of construction and the new materials. In so doing it will be impossible for him to overlook the important and significant part that decoration, organic decoration, performs in making a building, of a semi-public character especially, generally comthe capitals of the pilasters on either side the doorway leading into the main hall are of the same material. The dado is of the more elaborately figured Pavonazza Numidian marble of buff ground with veins of darker and brighter colors, and above this, with an architrave of the Breche Numidian between, is a frieze of Convent Quarry Sienna marble finished off with a cornice of the maroon colored Breche marble. Above this wainscoting are panels of the same Pavonazza marble as the dado-buff ground color with bright colored veins and figures, while the main cornice is of the darker shaded Breche marble. The pilasters which guard the main doorway are made to harmonize with the construction of the wainscot and wall. Between them is a solid square door casing of the same Pavonazza Numidian marble. It supports an outer iron grilled double gate of heavy construction, and back of them a pair of double oaken doors.

Passing through this entrance to the main hall, this is found also to be wainscoted with the same handsome patterns of Numidian marbles, constructed in style similar to that of the loggia. The side corridors also and the main staircase have the same style of wainscoting, and the bases of the columns in the banking office, that occupies the corner part of the first floor, are of Numidian marble. A peculiarity of all this work is the

mendable. He will find in every creditable example of this new style of architecture new structural and decorative effects worked out in new and beautiful marbles-notable and superior among which are the handsomely variegated Numidian marbles.

The most reasonable course for a prospective builder to pursue would be for him to visit and personally inspect some of the most distinguished and successful of the new buildings. Perhaps as good a one for all his purposes as any would be the new Morris Building at Broad and Beaver streets; no need of mentioning the corner—when you get there you are oblivious of all the other corners. Its handsome exterior might be classed as an example of the Renaissance style, but it isn't. It is distinctly and psculiarly modern and American. Dignity and grace are expressed in its proportions and lines as in a temple. But what will most interest the beholder is the main entrance to the building and its main hall.

The main entrance is constructed in form of an open recessed porch or loggia a few steps up from the sidewalk, and entered between polished pillars of Scotch granite. It is the work of Nichols & Shipway, of Nos. 105-111 East 128th street and Nos. 104-110 East 129th street, near Park avenue. It contains one of the best existing examples of the structural and decorative possibilities of these new marbles. The walls are wainscoted and paneled, and the ceiling is paneled with Pavonazza Numidian marble, in classic architectural design, with mouldings and bases of Breche Numidian marble, and a frieze of Convent Quarry Sienna marble. The base is of the dark maroon colored Breche Numidian marble, with lighter colored and delicate veins and shadings, and some of the mouldings and

massiveness and beauty of the mouldings. None finer or of more symmetrical design and proportion are to be seen in the city. They impart a substantial and solid appearance, while undoubtedty serving a practical structural purpose as well.

structural purpose as well.

Messrs. Nichols & Shioway were also the furnishers of the handsome mosaic pavements which are found in various artistic designs in the porch, the vestibule and main corridor and in every hall on every floor of the building, and of the Italian marble furnishings of the toilet rooms.

Another conspicuous example of the fine work that is possible in the employment of Numidian marble may be seen in the cafe of the Hotel Vendome. The entire bar is constructed of highly polished Numidian marble, also the work of Nichols & Shipway. It is undoubtedly the finest pice of work of its kind in the city, and is well worth a special inspection by any one interested in marble construction.

Other finished and artistic examples of the work in this line which Messrs. Nichols & Shipway have turned out may be seen in the Mail and Express building, on Broadway, near Fulton street, the Germania Insurance building, at William and Cedar streets, and in the new Metropolitan Club, now approaching completion, at 5th avenue and 60th street. They are also doing the marble work in several of the large office buildings now in process of construction and in which hallways of Numidian marble will be conspicuous features.

Collis P. Huntington's Bay Window.

SUPERINTENDENT BRADY CORRECTS SOME MISSTATEMENTS ABOUT THE MATTER.

Mr. T. J. Brady, Superintendent of Department of Buildings, said yesterday that the facts in regard to the trouble between C. P. Huntington and the Department concerning the bay window on the 5th avenue side of Mr. Huntington's new house had not been correctly stated by the daily press, and that he wished them corrected. The facts of the matter are that when the plans were originally submitted to the Department of Buildings they embodied a bay window which was not in conformity with the laws. The plans were returned and an amendment was made omitting the bay window, after which the plans were approved. Some time after it was found that the building was being erected with the bay window included. Brady, through Eugene Otterbourg, attorney for Department of Buildings, at once secured an injunction from Judge Bookstaver, of the of Common Pleas, restraining Mr. Huntington and the contractor from proceeding with the work, A high board fence was at once erected around the building. A short time ago Mr. Brady found that the work was being carried on behind the fence without regard to the order of the court. He then secured an order from Judge Bischoff ordering Mr. Huntington and David H. King, Jr., the builder, to appear and show cause why they should not be adjudged guilty of contempt of court. The order was to have been argued yesterday, but owing to the recent arrival from abroad of F. R. Coudert, who has been retained as counsel by the defence, Mr. Otterbourg has consented to an adjournment until June 23d. Another order has been secured from the Supreme Court for the defendants to show cause why an order should not be given to the Department of Buildings to tear down the bay window. This stands on the Supreme Court calendar for June 19th, but we understand that it will be adjourned until June 26th.

A Question of Building Law.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

Sir—Is there any law forbidding the conversion into stores of the first stories of existing tenement houses—that is, apart from details of construction, and supposing the building to be as required by law otherwise.

R.

[No, there is nothing in the building law which prevents the first story of an existing tenement house being altered into a store, but when such a building is altered, if five stories in height, it must have the first floor above the cellar or lowest story constructed fireproof, and the stairs from the cellar to the fire-proof floor must be located to the rear of the staircase leading from the first story to the upper stories and be inclosed with brick walls. To remove the wooden floor beams and substitute iron beams and brick arches is costly and tedious, and in many cases would defeat the object of an owner to obtain an increased rental from his property by a simple and inexpensive change of an apartment to a store. The Superintendent of Buildings, with the concurrence of the Board of Examiners, has approved of a number of such changes where the first story wooden floor beams have been wire-lathed on the underside and plastered and the ceiling over the store part also wire-lathed and plastered, and the fore and aft and cross wood stud partitions, which separate the store from hall and stairs on the first story wirelathed on both sides and plastered. Variations from the law as described are not granted indiscriminately, nor should they be, for it must be remembered that a risk of fire is greater in a store than in an apartment, and some buildings could be so altered with comparative safety while others could not.]

A ROOF CLOTHES-DRYING DEVICE.

A frame for supporting clothes lines on the roofs of houses, one of inexpensive construction, conveniently adjustable, and which will be strongly held in place on the roof without the use of nails or screws, has recently been patented by Mr. Leo Oppenheimer, and is described as follows by the Scientific American: The side frames supporting the lines may be of any suitable constructions, and they are adjusted toward or from each other, according to the tautness or slack of the lines, by means of cross-rods connecting the ends of the top rails, each of the rods having a turnbuckle, by means of which the rods may be readily lengthened or shortened. Similar rods also extend downwardly and outwardly from the ends of the rails to hooks on the edge of the coping or other fastening on the top of the wall of the building, these rods likewise having turnbuckles, for lengthening and shortening the rods to adjust the frames and hold them securely down on the roof. By means of this improvement the frames may be readily held in the desired position, and the roof is not injured by perforations likely to cause leakage." Mr. Oppenheimer also continues to manufacture other clothes-drying frames for roofs, and will cheerfully furnish drawings, specification, estimates and references to owners, architects and builders. THE REAL ESTATE MARKET.

At private sale the week has been a disappointment, in that it has witnessed an unusual number of deferred sales. Brokers do not complain so much of the lack of customers or at the prices asked, although these are stiff enough, but of the unsatisfactoriness of a waiting market. Many sales that seemed about to be closed last Saturday are in very much the same condition to-day. They have not progressed forward and, on the other hand, they do not seem any less hopeful. Buyers and sellers both seem to be waiting, and indeed the real estate market is best described by that word—waiting. It is not that owners fear a shrinkage of prices, for they

do not, or that buyers look for a break, in the hope that bargains may be had, for the large sales of the last few weeks and of the spring season fully justify a confidence in the stability of New York real estate values. The fact of the matter is that the real estate market, in splendid condition as it is, nevertheless is sympathetically inactive with the rest of the business world. As soon as the cloud of apprehension which now hangs over every branch of commerce is removed the real estate market will take on a more active tone and transactions will be more numerous. Meantime the temporary dullness need cause no anxiety. Real estate values were

never so firmly established and had never a better probability of being firmly maintained. The present holders of real estate are strong men financially, and they are not likely to be even slightly affected by the temporary business disturbances. Besides, there has been no inflation of prices to warrant a collapse or even a material drop in prices, and, this being the case, there is no expectancy on the part of the bargain hunter or weakness in the real estate owner.

A GOOD SALE OF CITY PROPERTY.

The long-heralded sale of real estate belonging to the city was held on Thursday at the Real Estate Salesroom, No. 111 Broadway, Auctioneer Peter F. Meyer officiating. With him on the stand was Deputy Comptroller R. S. Storrs, representing the municipality, while John A. Sullivan and Henry Maurer, of the Finance Department, took the cash payments. Notwithstanding that it is the fag end of the season and the depressed condition of the money market made it an unfavorable time to sell a large quantity of real estate, especially on the rather severe terms fixed, there was a large and interested crowd in attendance—larger than at any other sale of the year, with the exception of the Stuart Estate sale, and the prices paid averaged nearly up to prevailing market values. Some of the parcels sold much better than was expected, while others were decided bargains.

The offerings included twenty-one parcels of acre property along the line of the Croton Aqueduct from the vicinity of Sing Sing to Yonkers, and these attracted the larger part of the crowd of out-of-town people. But there were thirty nine lots in the city and one large parcel near Fordham Heights station in the 24th Ward, and these were sought with more or less eagerness by a crowd of well-known operators. Among them were Frank R. Houghton, Morris B. Baer, R. E. Dowling, A. Flake, M. Hynds, James A. Frame, Wm. H. Frame, Timothy Donovan, Robert McCafferty, Alexander Bros., Wm. H. Hall, L. M. Jones, M. Goldsmith, L. Toplitz, Emanuel and L. Z. Bach, Mitchell A. C. Levy, Ferdinand Kurzman and Stephen H. Olin. The first property offered was two full sized lots in 101st street, south side, 100 feet west of Columbus avenue. They were started at \$4,000 and sold for \$7,300 each to Wm. H. Hall, who also obtained the two lots opposite, on the north side of the street, for \$6,750 each. Two lots, in direct line with these, in 102d street, north side, 100 west of Columbus avenue, fell to M. A. C. for \$6,750 each. Levy at \$7,100 each. Lots have not sold in this immediate vicinity lately for less than about \$10,000 per lot; but there is rock on these particular ones, and that fact will account in part for the apparently very low price obtained. Another very cheap parcel of lots was bought by James A. Frame, one of the leading West Side builders. It included seven full-sized lots in 120th street, south side, 175 feet east of Lenox avenue. They were started at \$6,000 each and, after a spirited contest, went at \$9,000 each to Mr. Frame, who will improve them at once by the erection of high-class dwelling houses. The lots were appraised by a real estate man of long and intimate acquaintance with the district at \$12,000 each. On the other hand, the prices obtained for Amsterdam avenue corners and inside lots-\$15,500 for the southeast corner of Amsterdam avenue and 157th street and \$7,500 each for adjoining lots, and \$8,700 for the southeast corner of Amsterdam avenue and 166th street and \$5,500 each for adjoining lots, were considered very good prices.

Probably the hottest competition was worked up over the Grand street parcel, 75x100, north side, between South 5th avenue and Wooster street. This started at \$50,000, and was run up by Dowling and Flake to \$85,-000, when they quit, and the property fell to L. M. Jones at \$85,250. Park avenue and 81st street (northwest) corner sold at what is considered a low price for property in that neighborhood. L. Z. Bach got the corner lot for \$22,000 and the adjoining one for \$14,000; and Robert McCafferty got the two adjoining lots at \$13,000 each. The Westchester County parcels sold "dirt cheap." E. C. Neil, of West Somers, got the first seven parcels, embracing a total of 32.423 acres, for \$3,790. Morris B. Baer bought a 9-acre tract in the town of Greenburgh, about midway between Tarrytown and White Plains, right alongside the New York & Northern railroad, for \$1,800, and L. Toplitz and Robert Somerville bought parcels in the same township. Sam'l Josephs bought 2.163 acres in the City of Yonkers, on Central avenue, near Midland avenue, for \$3,750. The last piece sold was a compact plot of 2.611 acres on the Fordham Landing road, between Sedgwick avenue and the Harlem River, in the 24th Ward. It was started at \$8,000 and finally sold to Stephen H. Olin for \$14,000.

Altogether the city property brought \$352,400, and the Westchester County acres \$20,420, making a total of \$372,820—a good sale, all things considered, and one which ought to give good tone to the little that remains of the season's auction business.

THE CHICAGO REAL ESTATE MARKET.

The Chicago Evening Post of the 3d inst., in an article on the condition of the real estate market of the World's Fair City, quotes W. D. Kerfoot as follows:

"There is no real estate market, and you cannot discuss its conditions, because you have not got anything to talk about. There is absolutely nothing doing. I am convinced if the newspapers would just leave the market alone for a while and take no notice of it whatever they would be doing it the best service they could. There is certainly nothing to be gained by keeping public attention centered on the present stagnation. The reason for that stagnation is the tightness of money. Nobody has got any money now to put into real estate or anything else. They cannot borrow it on mortgages or in any way, and while that continues there is not going to be any revival. Certainly the dullness is having an effect on the firmness of prices. Many people who have property to sell would be glad to make concessions if they could thereby secure customers for their property. At such times as these, however, people are not going to put money into a form of investment that will yield them only 3 or 31/2 per cent when they can get from 6 to 8 per cent for it from other classes of security which are every whit as desirable. There really has not been any real estate market for the last year, and there will not be any for some time to come. The market was overdone, and in my opinion prices will be lower before any revival sets in. Prices will have to come to such a basis that real estate will yield as good an income as other classes of desirable securities before any number of people can be induced to take an active interest in Chicago real estate. There are no indications of immediate improvement."

Another broker said:

"Real estate will be about the last salable commodity to feel the effects of any financial disturbance, and so far the present flurry has not had the slightest effect on the firmness of prices; neither has the World's Fair. It can hardly be said to have been open yet and has not furnished the slightest indication of what its future effect is going to be on the price of real estate."

The same paper has the following weekly summary of land transfers:

"Real estate transfers for the week aggregated \$2,281,067, against \$3,-265,117 for the corresponding week last year."

MOUNT VERNON.

For five years or more New Yorkers have been aware that Mount Vernon was growing at a fairly lively rate, that the town was in the hands of active and enterprising people, that its present condition was satisfactory and its future promising. During all that time the town has been growing rapidly both in population and in wealth and to-day it is probably one of the most substantial towns about New York. Much has yet to be done, of course, especially in the way of street improvements and road-making, but these necessary public works will probably follow in the wake of other improvements which are now making. Among these may be mentioned the fine new station of the New Haven road which is being erected to the west of the tracks and about 300 feet north of the present station. This station it is expected will be a great addition to the town architecturally, and judging from the earth embankments which have been removed close by the site there will be a number of side tracks laid affording further railroad facilities. Besides the new railroad station there is the electric road just completed between Mount Vernon and Yonkers and bringing these two cities within a few moments of each other. This electric road will tap the surrounding country and in this way greatly benefit the two adjoining cities. Another improvement is the free delivery by the post-office conferred on the city as a reward for its extraordinary record of post-office receipts last Yonkers has a population of 36,000 and Mount Vernon a population year. of only 18,000, and yet the post-office receipts in the latter town greatly exceeded those in the former.

The past season in real estate and building in Mount Vernon has been fairly active. Mount Vernon only pretends to be a residence town—a bedroom for New York, as one inhabitant put it—and the activity has been, therefore, in residence property. This property, according to a real estate man, sells at all the way from \$10 to \$100 a front foot. As most of the houses are built on plots 50 feet front the prices of building lots, as that term is understood in Mount Vernon, is from \$500 up. This year the houses that have been erected within the lines of Mount Vernon have been of a better description than formerly and they are all detached. There is scarcely a flat in the whole town. The houses built in Mount Vernon this year have cost from \$3,000 up and have been more or less pretentious architecturally. A good deal of building is still going on, but the real estate business has received a temporary setback, so far as selling is concerned. The property, however, is nearly all in strong hands and a decline in values is therefore entirely unlikely.

BROOKLYN'S ASSESSED VALUATIONS.

Quite a stir has been caused in Brooklyn by the aunouncement of the Department of Assessment that the values of real estate as assessed this year would probably show an increase of \$30,000,000 over last year's figure. It is generally known that the city is on the verge of the constitutional limit of municipal debt, and for this reason it has not been in a position to issue bonds to undertake projected improvements or finish

those already undertaken. As the improvements already started are very extensive in character, and at the same time of considerable importance, the estimated increase in the assessed valuations has caused considerable comment, because if it proves to be accurate the city will then have the power to sell about \$2,000,000 worth of bonds, the sum realized being used to finish at least a few of the improvement schemes which have been so long in abeyance on account of Brooklyn's straitened financial condition. But the Assessors' estimate cannot be confirmed until about July 1st. In the meantime the books will be open to public inspection.

PROSPECTIVE STREET OPENING.

Corporation Counsel Wm. H. Clark will on Tuesday, July 11th, apply to the Supreme Court, special term, for the appointment of Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment in the following street opening proceedings, which have been ordered by the Board of Street Opening and Improvement:

112TH ST., between the Boulevard and Riverside Drive;

156TH ST., between Wadsworth and Amsterdam avs.;

156TH ST., between Elton and 3d avs.; and

146TH ST., between Bradhurst and 8th avs.

THE LEXINGTON AVENUE IMPROVEMENT.

The Supreme Court Commission appointed more than a year ago in regard to the taking of property for the opening of Lexington avenue, between 97th and 102d streets, have declared the proceedings closed. It will take two months to get up the report. The improvement of the avenue has been pending for eight years. It is intended to make the area of assessment large.

FORT WASHINGTON RIDGE ROAD COMMISSION.

Michael J. Mulqueen, Walter Stanton and Charles Place have been appointed Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment in the Fort Washington Ridge road improvement matter. They will begin to take testimony on August 18th at noon, at their office, room 76, No. 115 Broadway.

STATISTICS OF NEW YORK COMMERCE.

The Dock Board has started a plan whereby the tonnage of all vessels docking in New York may be recorded. During the month of May the total vessel tonnage docked was: North River, foreign, 197,664 tons; domestic, 1,354,786; East River, foreign, 64,337; domestic, 569,554; total, 2,186,341.

THE MANHATTAN ATHLETIC CLUB HOUSE UNDER FORELOSURE.

Receiver Freedman having failed to sell the Manhattan Athletic Clubhouse at receiver's sale, Adrian Iselin and others have got an order in foreclosure from the Supreme Court, appointing July 6th as the date when the property shall be sold to satisfy the mortgages against it.

BUILDING NEWS.

BOSTON'S FIRST STEEL SKELETON BUILDING.

Boston is watching with deep interest the growth from the foundations of her first steel skeleton tall office building. It occupies the block between Washington, Water and Devonshire streets and Spring lane. But the "block" is only 30 feet wide on Washington and 19 feet wide on Devonshire street. The building will rise 11 stories, or 130 feet, above the street level. Its four lower stories will be constructed of steel, iron and glass, and the rest of steel or iron, with terra cotta and hollow brick. The architect, Clarence H. Blackall, has been giving the Traveller some interesting details of the difference in the weight of the structure from what would have been required for a building of similar size under the old system of construction. He estimated roughly the entire weight of the building, foundation and superstructure, at nearly 6,000 tons.

In the outer wall of the new Carter building about 2,000 tons of steel and iron are used, while ordinary walls would have a weight of 4,520 tons. Another great saving, and the most important, is in the matter of space. The first story walls are only 16 inches thick, while ordinary walls of masonry would need be 3 feet in thickness. The rentable area of nearly one entire floor is saved by the use of the new system of construction. These changes are accomplished by the use of steel columns, girders and beams instead of masonry and iron.

In appearance the new building will closely resemble the Havemeyer building minus its two upper stories.

Large forces of men are now at work on the excavations for the choir of the Cathedral of St. John the Divine at 113th street and Morningside avenue. The surveyors have staked out the boundaries for the excavations. and already there is a semi-circle of trench-like preparations for the real excavating, which will not commence from present appearances for some The contractor who has charge of the work has carefully time to come. followed the lines marked out by the surveyors' stakes, and between these lines he has removed the earth down to the first layer of rock. This first layer of rock is a comparatively soft substance, and it has been struck at varying depths from the surface. In some places rock was struck only a couple of feet below the surface, while in others, notably that part of the ground on which one of the spires is to stand, rock has not yet been reached, although earth has been removed to the depth of 20 feet. In these cases the contractor will continue his work until rock is reached. He will then blast out the softer rock which is near the surface until firm solid rock is struck, when a flat surface will be leveled off for the foundations. From present indications the summer will be well spent before these excavations are finished and not until then will work on the foundations be commenced in earnest. Allowing for the ordinary delays, the time (three years) when it is hoped the choir will be completed, seems exceedingly short. At the present time the only part of the great building which is an accomplished fact is the deserted looking corner stone close to 113th street, and just west of Morningside avenue, and one has not even the satisfaction of examining this integral part of the great church structure, for it has been carefully boxed over to protect it alike from the ravages of the elements and of vandals. The semi-circular wall of the choir looks on Morningside Park, while one of the side walls rests on 113th street, and the opposite wall is parallel to 110th street. The building of the choir will not interfere apparently with the old Leake and Watts Orphan Home building nor require its removal, so that it will probably be used for executive offices. Already Messrs. Heins & LaFarge have established a representative in a rear room of the old orphan asylum, the windows of which overlook the excavations. By means of this representative, the architects can exercise a constant and careful supervision over the work and avoid those mistakes in construction which would entail extra labor and unnecessary expense.

Directly opposite the cathedral grounds, on the north side of 113th street, is the site of the new St. Luke's Hospital, between Amsterdam and Mouningside avenues. Here, too, there is a deserted-looking corner stone standing in the centre of a great plot of partly excavated ground. the case of the cathedral, the excavating is only partially finished and much more work still remains to be done before even the earth is completely removed. Rock-drilling and blasting on the hospital foundations has, however, already commenced, and it is probable that progress toward completion will be much more rapid in the case of the hospital than the cathedral. Indeed, now that the old 5th avenue site has been so advantageously sold work will be pushed with the utmost speed in order that the old property may be the sooner vacated. The hospital excavations are of course more extensive than those which are being made for the cathedral choir, for they must be deep enough to allow for a cellar and sub-cellar running the whole length of the building. In the case of the cathedral, the trench-like excavations which have been already made seem to indicate that they are for the walls only and that there will be nothing underneath the church floor but solid earth.

The future site of Columbia College, Amsterdam avenue, 116th and 120th streets and the Boulevard, is as yet undisturbed. This property, part of the grounds of the Bloomingdale Insane Asylum, is still occupied by that institution, and it remains in its original condition. As soon as the new buildings, now in course of erection for the asylum at White Plains, are completed the removal of the patients and effects of the institution will

commence. The new buildings, however, will not be ready for a full year yet, and as nothing is to be done by the college authorities in the way of excavating or building until the asylum is out of the way it will probably be the spring of 1895 before work is commenced on the college buildings. The architectural advisory committee of the Building Committee of the college trustees made a preliminary report at the May meeting of the Board, and the question of the architects and architecture of the new structure was again discussed at the June meeting of the Board on June 5th. Nothing definite, however, was decided, and the Board adjourned to the first Monday in October, when it is probable final action will be taken. It is evident that the trustees are going about the great improvement slowly and carefully, and that the final decision, when it is made, will look to the erection not only of first-class college buildings, but of a fine architectural monument.

Opposite the inclosed site of Columbia College is the site of the Teachers' College, or the north side of 121st street, between the Boulevard and Amsterdam avenue. Work on this structure has been rapidly pushed and the building is now up to the third tier of beams and the two first stories of brownstone front are already in place. Architect Wm. A. Potter's ideas are even more attractive, embodied in brick and stone, than they were on paper, and when the building is finished, in about a year from now, it will take rank with the fine buildings now being erected and soon to be erected on fortunate Morningside Heights.

BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

BRICKS.—A more generally cheerful tone was to be noted in pretty much all reports this week, and while there is nothing in the way of a quotable recovery on values toward the figures sought last month sellers generally are holding the advantage without much difficulty. Arrivals have come along from day to day in pretty full force, but there has also been an increase in the consuming demand, with the result of keeping the cargoes well sold down and at no time leaving an accumulation over which there was apparent need for the least worry. Work is now getting along to a point where brick are needed and the consumption is quite likely to rapidly expand, as a great many structures under way will want large quantities of stock. There appears to have been a better run of quality this week as the stormy weather production is about marketed, and the shipments now are from an output under more propiti us conditions. From information at hand and on general principles it is calculated that manufacturers will continue shipments without check for some little time to come in order to realize upon stock and get themselves in shape for the usual 4th of July settlements. The chances seem to be favorable for securing custom, and, so far as known, dealers are making no objection to about the present general line of cost on best quality, but might want favors on the low grades. Pales remain firm at \$2.50 average, and have been selling well enough to keep pretty much everything passing directly into consumption. there is nothing in the way of a quotable recovery on

GLASS .- Demand for window glass has been dull locally, and for that matter all over the country, with an unsatisfactory market reported by both with an unsatisfactory market reported by both jobbers and manufacturers. The building trade seems to be slowing up at other points as well as here and investment very generally is of a cautious character. An offset seems to be found in the gradual shutting-off of factories with a prospect that by the end of the month all the fires will be out, in a read with the seasonable custom. Present stocks a said to be small in first hands, and through all the dull period there appeared no difficulty in sustaining the line of value. Meanwhile there has been a gradual absorbing of factories by the combine, and the organization is now greatly stiengthened. For plate glass an ordinary light jobbing trade has been done, but the business by no means large or satisfactory, and some irregularity on prices is now and then shown. Just at the close of last month a big combination of plate glass jobbers was formed, including all those located west of the Alleghenies, the real intent of whice is to form a protective body against the manufacturer's organization.

HARDWARE.—The entire market is dull, build-ers' hardware and all. Consumption, however, tends increase on booked orders and will probably further expand next month, though no real anima-tion is calculated upon. Offerings of staple goods would satisfy any ordinary call promptly, and manu-facturers can increase the output if needs be, while on prices the tone is easy with quiet allowances now and then from regular rates.

LATH.-The market has been somewhat irregular since our last, and the advantage went principally since our last, and the advantage went principally in buyers' favor. Demand somehow did not quite come up to the force and character expected, and arrivals run a trifle full, making a combination that was a little depressing. Round wood stock appears to have ceased for the time being at least, but on slab the rate has been modified to \$2.40 for cargo lots and \$2.45@2.50 for smaller quantities. As we close, there was still some unsatisfied demand and not many offerings, with tone quite steady.

LIME.-The general demand continues slow, and the market without any cost changes or really new features since our last. A little stock remains over unsold all the while, principally Rockland, and holders on the lookout for all custom that may come along. The usual differences of opinion may be heard regarding quality and conditions of some stock, and there is also contradiction as to price, but there is reason to suppose that some who quote at the highest have a method of giving buyers an advantage that reduces gost to the lowest current selling plane.

LUMBER.-It is difficult to discover any decided change in the general features of business at the moment. Some dealers on the suburban borders are getting a trifle more trade in meeting a call for build-150 ings progressing along to point of floor timbers and
