THE business revival, no bigger than a man's hand two months ago, has now reached such dimensions that everybody sees ago, has now reached such dimensions that everybody sees it, and at last it is recognized that once more the wheels of commerce are moving, slowly as yet, but none the less surely. dry-goods jobbers say that the last fifteen days of business equal those of 1892, which were very large. This improvement is not local, but extends all over the country, with the possible exception of Nebraska, Iowa and a small part of Kansas where the corn crop failed. In the South there will be an increase of 800,000 bales of cotton, which increase alone will represent a very good business in handling, carting, etc. In the stock market there seems to be no general buying movement, and prices sag when realizations are attempted. The next signal for an advance will be when we begin to import gold, which naturally ought to be very soon. How quickly prices may return to better figures is shown by the very recent movement of the Pittsburg, Chicago, Cincinnati & St. Louis stock, which a year ago sold for about 20, and slowly declined to 13, remaining there for months, but a little buying movement taking place the price in a week rose to 20 and is there now. It is the same with Northern Pacific preferred, which recently advanced from 13 to 22, while it was months in falling to the first-named point. On the whole, it may be safely said that a substantial improvement has set in which gives every indication of being permanent.

EUROPEAN financial papers continue to be occupied with discussions of our tariff and its consequences to the trade of the countries they represent. The Lendon Economist is not very enthusiastic over its probable effects on British trade, owing to the low prices already prevailing here. It takes tin plate, cotton ties, iron and steel to be most in question from that point of view. Of the first it says: Seeing that they have already made the larger proportion of the black plate tinned in America there is little reason to doubt that they will be able to overtake the production of all the black plate required, so long at least as the basis of prices is so near our own. South Wales makers may be disappointed if they anticipate any very great immediate benefit from the change in the change in the tariff, and we think it would wise to keen be so as to check the new industry up in America. In cotton ties the prices moderate which has sprung English manufacturer could find no comfort because prices on The reduction both sides of the Atlantic were so rearly equal. of the duty on pig iron from \$6.72 to \$4 was not likely to help English trade at present. English iron of the same quality as No. 1 American and Bessemer would cost \$4 more than the product of the home furnaces and mills laid down in New York. Harvest time has not yet brought the demand for money which the banks expected, and a new process of piling up has begun at the great European financial centres; the Bank of England surplus continues to make new precedents in proportion to liabilities. Discount rates as a consequence remain low, and business gives signs of relapsing into dullness. If Secretary Carlisle wants \$50,000,000 or even double that to put his gold surplus on a proper foundation it can now be had easily and cheaply. A westward movement of gold would be hailed as affording a gratifying relief to the choked European money markets, and as matters now stand there would be no danger of its being demanded back again for some time to come. The Austrian public is fighting against the use of silver in place of the oneflorin notes they have become accustomed to, but this absurd prejudice toward the white-metal money will not endure long. This is what we would have to expect in our Eastern States if our \$1 and \$2 bills were retired to make way for a larger use of silver, as they ought to be.

RICHMOND TERMINAL, a name which has had such a disturbing influence in financial circles and has been synonymous for disaster in the minds of investors for so long, will soon disappear entirely from the security lists, which places will happily know it no more. The Southern Railroad, in which is embraced all the lines, except the Georgia Central and some few others that were cast off or refused to come into the plan of reorganization, has been finally organized, and the securities of the new company which is to control it may be issued in the course of a month or two. If any regret is to be expressed regarding the substitution of one organization for another, it is that the process did not include an inquiry into the manner in which the old one was brought to the ground and the way in which deceived and defrauded security-holders could obtain recompense. Such a thing was apparently not because of the impossibility of because of the impossibility of getting stock and bondholders to act with any spirit even in their own interests. The Southern Railroad Company will start with a compact, though extensive railroad of 4,000 miles, with about 150 miles of water line besides owned directly by it, and leasing 500 more lines of railroad, with fixed charges cut down to recent net earning capacities and with a reserve of securities to provide equipment and improvements for some years to come. Moreover, the territory it operates being the first to feel the stress of the hard times that have weighted down commerce for some years past is now, under the stimulus of extensive economies aud good crops, returning to prosperity at a rate, if not rapid, is at least satisfactory. Consequently if the new company is managed conservatively, it will make itself strong before another phase of adversity is likely to come upon it. The launching of this the first of the great bankrupt railroad enterprises into renewed solvency will be watched with interest both at home and abroad, because the results will show whether railroad managers of this country have learned a lesson by the past, or whether the old-time recklessness and dishonesty are to continue and the process of reorganization to go on over and over again as in the case of Reading and Atchison. An immediate influence of this reorganization is the encouragement of holders of securities of other bankrupt properties who may well feel cheered when some intrinsic merit can by any process be found in securities that once seemed so hopelessly placed as those of Richmond Terminal.

T is an unwholesome and discouraging sign, that of the reported refusal of practically all those merchants who testified before the Lexow Committee to appear now and assist the Grand Jury to find indictments against the police officers to whom they had paid regular blackmail for "sidewalk privi-leges." It bears out the pessimistic view which has been advanced frequently, but always with reluctance in these columns, that New York City after all is governed in close conformance to the moral and intellectual standards of the bulk of the people. It is a sad enough disclosure which reveals prominent and wealthy merchants debauching the police in order to obtain small conveniences at the expense of their fellow citizens; but what are we to say when these men, having publicly testified to their own wrongdoing, refuse to make their confession effective toward producing a cleaner administration of the Police! Under such circumstances a reformer in New York must needs be furnished with unexhaustible confidence in his fellow-men and unconquerable faith in the long right arm of the Lord. The truth is, whether it be pleasant to us or not we have the government we deserve and a municipality of our own making. It is the most arrant hypocrisy to denounce officials whom reputable citizens have been busy bribing, and whom when occasion presents itself they refuse to testify against. Citizen and officer are tarred with the same brush. Let us at least retain the courage of our vices. Let us clear ourselves of cant, as Dr. Johnson advised, and not whine sanctimoniously for "clean government" when the bulk of us do not want "clean government," which means the abolition of party rule in city affairs and the strict enforcement of the laws of the municipality. People don't want to do jury duty, pay their the uttermost cent, see the excise laws ministered, and all those places-that-shall-berigidly administered, and all those places-that-shall-be-mentionless here effectively closed, no sidewalks or streets occupied for the storage of goods and carts, no franchises contracts let save upon taken and no terms which amply satisfy the last just requirement of the city. In short, people don't really want clean government out and out. Everyone no doubt would not object to his neighbor being strictly looked after. The merchant whose goods encumber the sidewalk is ready enough to see the saloons closed on Sunday, and so on; but righteous indignation over six offenses of one's neighbors counts as nothing against the bribery one commits or the laxity one practises on one's own behalf.

A NOTHER bi-metallic conference has been held in London, at which there was a great deal of talking and very little said. This is not remarkable because it was characteristic of the other meetings of the party, which says a national currency can only be adequate and safe when it has, instead of one firm support, two legs of unequal strength. The result is especially disappointing in the last instance, however, because the conference was attended by two such well-known men as the Hon. W. C. Whitney and Mr. Lidderdale, late governor of the Bank of England, who so efficiently carried that institution through the Baring trouble. Mr. Whitney's work on this side of the Atlantic in public office and in large financial operations has been of quite a practical sort. It was, therefore, expected that these two gentlemen would have, something very interesting to say and perhaps some convincing reasons to give for this espousal of the bi-metallic cause. But nothing of the sort; their remarks as reported contain nothing but stereotyped assertions about the necessity for a double standard and the usual threats of what injury is to follow to the commerce of the world unless it is soon adopted. The fact of Mr. Whitney and Mr. Lidderdale being found in such a crowd remains then a matter for wonder and the elevation of eye-brows. A knowledge of the processes of reasoning which brought them there would not necessarily alter this position toward the fact, indeed it might increase the wonder and physical indications of indulgence, but really an explanation of their position is due to the people who have a respect for their opinions judged from their conduct in the past. The conference had another point of interest in showing how the conferees regarded the steady increase in the world's supply of gold, forgetting apparently that they had hitherto used the fact of the limited output of gold as an argument in favor of the larger use of silver, they simply said the increased output of gold did not matter at all and went on with reiterations of their demand that the coinage of silver be made free at all the mints of the world.

NLY a year ago, such a movement as that which has been started in Donger to d. for the D started in Denver to defeat the Populist party in Colorado would not have been possible. The leader of that party was then in the height of his renown, having metaphorically dipped his horse's bridle in the blood of the East, amidst general applause in his State. All through the West there was much wild, ignorant talk of cutting loose from the moneyed power of the Atlantic States. This was not seriously intended, but it brought about at least some estrangement and the withdrawal of foreign loans taught Colorado what she was talking about and at the same time contributed a good deal to the distress from which both East and West have suffered. It is very doubtful if fifteen of the one hundred and fifty Denver business men could then have been induced to adopt the address which they have, by common consent, recently published to the electors of their State, asking them to relegate Governor Waite and his party to private life in order to regain the confidence of the East. There is nothing more satisfactory in life than to see mistakes acknowledged readily and generously; nothing is more helpful or more conducive to good feeling. The East will doubtless recognize this and extendits fullest and heartiest sympathy to the business men of Denver who have set about doing the thing that can help their State more than any other. Even if they are not fully and immediately successful these men of Denver will have done something for themselves and their neighbors; their good sense cannot fail to ultimately prevail, and their example will not be without effect upon the thinking parts of other crank-ridden States. Meantime the East will know that a powerful opposition is growing up against the continued rule of those witchdoctors of modern politics, the Waites, the Pfeffers and the Hatches, who have in a time of temporary derangement of the public faculties set the community by the ears by the sheer strength of impudence and what may be called their economical superstitions. The East is fully alive to the value of commercial friendship with the West and ready to respond to any advances made on the basis of good politics and sound finance.

If the Health Department is to keep us free of the soft coal smoke nuisance it must increase the efficiency of its system of inspection and carry it up town. The city is full of factories, small as well as large, and while they are in every district the latter are particularly thick near the fronts of the rivers. Such a violation of the law as was committed last winter by the Steam Heating Company in so conspicuous a place as Cortlandt street was easily and promptly detected. A similar offense by a small manufacturer in one of the side streets, near either of the rivers which flow around New York, might very easily escape the

attention of the officers of the department unless their search for such violation is constant and systematic. If the small manufacturers find immunity in the carelessness of the department, the large ones will hope to do so too, with the result that one day we shall be surprised to find that soft coal has come into general use in the remoter districts without accompanying precautions against its use becoming a nuisance and a danger to health. Abuses of this nature take root most easily and thrive most luxuriantly in the poorer quarters of the town, and it is in them that violations of any sanitary ordinances can most naturally be expected to be found because of the laxity of official attention as well as the indifference of their populations to things that would arouse bitter indignation in richer quarters. There are now some chimney shafts on the East River and adjacent streets giving off clouds that in appearance, smell and taste, resemble the smoke of bituminous coal enough to warrant scientific tests being applied and the securing of action according to the result. Any way, as the offense consists not in using any particular class of fuel, but in giving off smoke containing noxious gases and being an annoyance to the public, there can be found sufficient justification for a crusade by the Health officers among the manufactories of the city. If its citizens could only thoroughly appreciate how much the comfort and satisfaction of living in New York is due to the clearness of its atmosphere, they would not only see that the manufacturer's chimney shaft was kept innocent of offense, but also that every locomotive smoke stack should be equally free of harm, and that even the river tugs should not be allowed to pollute the air as they are doing by sending up huge clouds of black vapor and coal dust, and as a Federal tug does at the Barge Office daily.

A N electric locomotive, not a trolly with either overhead or underground wires, but a machine generating its own electricity has proved a mechanical success in France. Such a one is reported to have pulled a train of 180 tons with ease eight different times in two days over a distance of about twenty miles on the Western Railway between Havre and Beuzeville-Breaute, attaining at different times a speed of 40, 50 and 6212 miles an hour. The value of such a locomotive will depend on its ability to make better time at less cost than the ordinary steam engine. What it will have to do in the mere matter of drawing power, before it can be pronounced a success, may be seen from the reports of a trial recently made on the Missouri, Kansas & Texas Railway of a compound steam-engine specially made for that road. This engine drew a train of 363 tons, almost exactly double the weight of the train attached to the electric locomotive, at a speed of forty-eight miles an hour over a 50-foot grade, forty-one miles an hour over a 55foot grade and thirty-eight to forty-five miles an hour over a 71-foot grade. While the achievements of the electric locomotive as recorded by its friends in France are very considerable, they can as yet only be taken as an evidence of advancement and promise for the future. It is still a long way from beating the record of the American steam locomotive, with the matter of cost quite unknown, but most probably against the new invention.

NOTWITHSTANDING the many exposures that have been made of bogus land schemes and the method of doing business adopted by many irresponsible projectors of so-called suburbs, it would appear that the list of confiding victims is still far from complete. It may be claimed that buyers who incautiously invest in lots in suburban localities that are as nearly inaccessible as they well can be or if within easy reach have nothing whatever to recommend them for settlement are undeserving of sympathy in that they reap only as they have sown, with their eyes wide open. But it must be remembered that many of the agents employed to sell worthless suburban property are but a degree better in a moral or conscientious sense than the average bunco steerer. Their methods of swindling the unsophisticated are almost identical. The land agent simply lacks the bunco man's effrontery, and instead of "playing for big stakes" is content to extract from the pockets of poor and ignorant, yet thrifty people, their hard-earned savings. The latest scheme that promises to be hauled up with a short turn is that of a so-called "Land Improvement Company," dealing in Long Island wild and swamp land, with offices in a down-town building. The man who is president of the company sold lots in a tract near Babylon, L. I., which had been given an euphonious title. The company had given the original owner a purchase money mortgage on the land, but nevertheless sold lots on the installment plan, and when a lot was fully paid for obligingly gave the buyer a warranty deed. The property was recently foreclosed to satisfy the mortgage and the warranty deeds are now worthless, unless they become the means of sending the officers of the company to jail.

The Renting Season.

SMALL HOUSES AND MODERATE PRICED FLATS IN ACTIVE DEMAND,—
IMPROVEMENTS NEEDED IN MANY OLD HOUSES.—CONCESSIONS
THE RULE ON HIGH-CLASS HOUSES.

A canvass made of the up-town brokers' and agents' offices last week by two observers of the real estate market resulted in two diametrically opposite impressions of the renting season. One came away with the conviction that every vacant house and flat was being eagerly sought after and would surely be rented before the close of the month at good figures. The other found that the season had not more than made a beginning and that rents were down below anything ever before known, with a dismal prospect of more vacant houses being carried over to another renting season than ever before. A more systematic and thorough inspection of the field this week shows that both were in a measure right and both wrong.

Under normal conditions the fall season in real estate opens with the return of the usual summer migratory part of the population to their homes in the city. Until within recent years these homes had been standing in readiness for their reoccupancy since early sum. mer and there was not much of a renting business done in the fall-But of late years, as has frequently been observed in these columns, a very great change has taken and is taking place in the customs of New Yorkers in this respect. A much larger proportion of the population than ever before annually remove their entire household establishments from the city during the four, five and sometimes six months of warm weather. A considerable proportion of these people surrender old spring leaseholds every year with the intention of renting from the 1st of October thereafter, some for only eight months, but the most for periods of two, three or more years. Again, there is a growing disposition among the wealthier classes of tenants to maintain their permanent establishments in the suburbs, and to live during the opera season in the modern family hotels that have been established to meet this demand. Then, too, the result of every winter and spring season's operations in real estate is to transform a large number of former private residence properties into business or flat properties, driving their former dwellers to the newer residence sections up town. These almost invariably resign their old homes in the spring, go to the country for the summer, and return in August or September to look up new homes for occupany in October. These are the usual conditions.

Last year and this there have been the additional incentives of a universal business depression to make changes in the renting seasons. In their efforts to meet reduced incomes with corresponding economies many owners of fine town houses discharged their servants and moved into less expensive establishments in the country, and offered their town houses for rent, furnished. Many of these owners, if they have returned to town at all, have taken quarters in the hotels, where their entire living expenses are met by the incomes from their rented houses. But what more directly affects the rental of houses is the fact that many former householders have abandoned expensive establishments and have gone to live in apartments and flats at from one-fifth to a-half their former expense for housekeeping. All these facts in conjunction had a year ago thrown upon the market a larger number of houses, chiefly of the better sort, than were ever before vacant at one time in this city. The larger proportion of these houses have been carried over unoccupied until the present season.

Now, however, there are many evidences of a change for the better. To a much greater extent than has generally been admitted business conditions were held in suspension pending the long protracted struggle over the tariff laws. Had this been settled a month earlier there is every reason to believe that the fall renting season would have begun at the usual time—about the 20th of August, and would have been at its height at this date. But the delay in its settlement postponed with a vast number of our business men the day of decision upon their winter's operations, upon which in turn depended the opening of establishments in town and the employment of operative forces. Thus the renting season was delayed from a fortnight to a month, and has only just begun to develop in good force and energy.

Without entering into details the result of our inquiries in most of the representative brokers' and agents' offices this week shows that the demand for houses and apartments has actively begun, and is much better now than it was a year ago. While there is a universal demand for lower reuts tenants are obtaining concessions only upon the higher-priced houses and apartments. For the class of houses ranging between \$1,200 and \$2,000 per year the demand is so great that no concessions are obtainable. Above these figures, however, the season is still backward, and owners are so timid that first comers are likely to obtain reductions of from 10 to 20 per cent. But, even as to this class of houses, it is stoutly maintained by many agents that the condition of the house itself determines the extent of the concessions.

Throughout the district south of 59th street the complaint of the agents is well-nigh universal that the great majority of the houses are in no condition for the habitation of wealthy people. The complaint is strongest against the sanitary conditions of the houses. Most of them, it is declared, have had no material repairs in from five to ten years, have the old systems of plumbing, with dingy bathrooms, zine-lined bath-tubs, hidden lead pipes, soapstone or even wooden tubs, old ranges and no dumb-waiters or butler's pantries. Within the period mentioned there has come over the system of house construction and interior finish a vast change for the better, and people who have seen the interiors of our modern West Side dwellings are no longer to be satisfied with the ancient equipments. They demand exposed plumbing,

tiled and tile-wainscoted bath-rooms, porcelain tubs, ceramic sinks and laundry tubs, and generally brighter interiors. The lack of these in the older houses places them out of competition with those which have been renovated, and makes it impossible to rent the houses at the old rates. The complaint is general among the agents that owners refuse to make these obviously necessary improvements while yet expecting the old rentals.

In this section, too, agents are met by some very strong arguments for lower rents on the part of tenants of the best possible kind. A well-known banker who has occupied a house for six years, paying \$5,000 a year for it, offered \$3,500 for a renewed term and said: "I don't see why it is that house-owners should expect as large incomes from their properties in these times as they receive in times of general prosperity. Prices are down in every other direction and I look over my books and find that the salaries of all my employes are down from 20 to 50 per cent and my own income is smaller in proportion. Why then should I make an exception of my landlord? Why shouldn't he come down in his prices as other people have done?" The broker thought that in the end the banker would be given a concession of 10 per cent on the old figures for the ensuing year.

On the West Side the renting of small houses is said by many brokers to be as good as ever, but for houses ranging over \$2,000 in rental up to a year ago it will from present appearances be necessary to make concessions of from 10 to 20 per cent in the rents in order to secure tenants. Many who would renew their leases under such concessions threaten to give up their houses and move into flats unless the concessions are made. Still it is admitted that the demand has only just begun for the better class of houses and another fortnight may show a considerable improvement upon former conditions. In this and the middle section of the city there are not enough small houses to meet the demands for them, and the apartment houses are accordingly reaping the benefit. In the renting of flats and apartments the agents who make that a specialty report a lively demand, that has been on the increase ever since the middle of August. Prices are fairly well main tained, though the most desirable tenants are met half way their demands for reduced rents. Altogether the concensus of opinion is that the renting season is later this year than usual by at least a fortnight; that small houses and moderate-priced fiats hold their own fairly well and that concessions of from 10 to 20 per cent are being made on the higher-priced houses, the larger discount applying to the higher rents; but matters are steadily improving, and another fortnight will doubtless disclose a still better condition of the renting season.

Collections in the Tenements

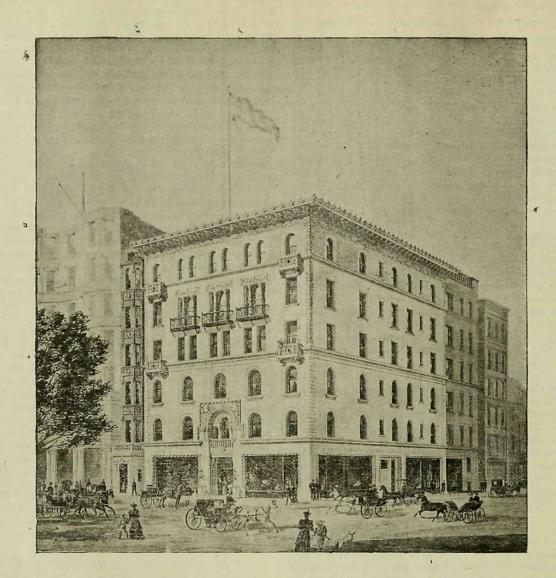
M. & L. Jarmulowsky, whose experience of East Side tenement property is too well known to need description, confirm the opinions previously given in The Record and Guide of the better results obtained from tenement property than other classes. In course of conversation with one of our reporters recently they stated that the poorest class of tenements were the easiest to let and produced the best results. Up town, while the tenants paid as well as down town, they asked more in the way of additions and repairs. For every \$25 collected up town about \$8 had to be spent for the benefit of the tenants, whilst down town such expenditures from the same amount of rent collected did not amount to more than \$3. As a consequence better net returns could be obtained from the down town houses. prove how well collections are kept up in the tenements they furnished the following figures, showing the amount received from a total of about \$4,000 per month, of which all but about \$200 was for tenements, at three different periods for the last five months:

Collections it will be seen are slow, the collector having to take his rent in installments as he can get it, but it nearly all eventually comes to his hand. There has been created considerable prejudice against tenement property by reports of the poverty of the people of the East Side tenement districts, but with the above figures as an example of what nearly all agents say is the case, it will be seen how misplaced this prejudice is.

How a Low Tax Rate is Made.

The tax rate for New York City this year will be \$1.79 on the hundred dollars of valuation. The Board of Aldermen so determined last week. This is the lowest tax rate the city has known for many years, and on its face bespeaks an economical and wise administration of the city's affairs. But no one's tax bills will be any less because of the lower rate, except those favored ones who have escaped an increase in the valuation of their properties for tax purposes. The reason the low rate is possible is that the assessed valuations were increased by over \$70,000,000.

But there is another view of this matter which has been overlooked, and which affords an explanation for the constantly decreasing tax rate. In 1886 the net bonded debt of the city was \$90,395,633.35, the lowest point it had reached since 1871. Then the total valuation of real and personal property was \$1,420,968.286 and the tax rate was \$2.29 per \$100 valuation. The tax levy for that year was \$32,421,550.15, and the total appropriations \$33,802,320.59, including \$7,456,184.37 of interest on the city debt, and \$4,199,606.15 for State taxes. That year, also, only \$2,250,000 was appropriated from the city's income from its franchises for the general purposes of the city. With an occasional relapse the tax rate has declined generally to the figure for this year—\$1.79.

But, in the meantime, the net bonded debt has been increased by over \$32,000,000, to \$122,778,073.21, and the assessed valuation for tax purposes has increased by over \$580,000,000. This year the tax levy is \$35,659,026.78 and the total appropriations \$38,664,257.69, including only \$5,134,199.59 for interest on the city debt and \$4,-112,266,62 for State taxes. This year, also, \$3,600,000 is appropriated from the city's income for general purposes. Deducting State taxes and interest on the city debt from the total appropriations and there remains for the general expenses of the municipal government \$22,146,530 in 1886, and \$29,417,791 for the current year, an increase of over \$7,000,000, or a steady yearly increase of a million a year for the last seven years.

It is manifest that by continuing the process revealed by these figures the city administration could juggle the tax rate down to a merely nominal figure. By continually issuing bonds, and out of their proceeds paying the expenses of the city government; by appropriating all the revenues from franchises, rents, licenses, etc.; by adding a few hundred millions to the assessed valuations—in effect, by carrying the process of the present and other recent city administrations a little farther, the tax rate could easily be reduced to \$1 per \$100 of valuation. But what about the future?

The "Steeple Building."

Unique in many respects, of scientific construction, at once a landmark and a trademark, is the latest addition to the new publishing and manufacturing district.

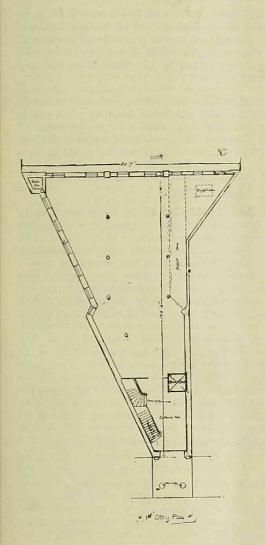
In no quarter of the city has rebuilding been so active during these two years as in the section between the wholesale and retail drygoods districts. That which was, within the lifetime of men still prominent in metropolitan affairs, the fashionable residence section of New York City, has been compelled to yield to the inexorable demands of trade and manufacturers and, beginning gradually, is now being rapidly rebuilt for mercantile and manufacturing purposes. Every month sees some new business establishment added to the many already permanently located there.

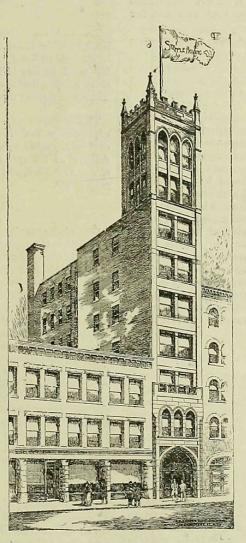
Manufacturers and publishers with their auxiliary branches began about five years ago to come together in the district between Broadway and 6th avenue and 10th and 16th streets, and are now there in such numbers as almost to create a new centre. As the process of reconstructing the lower wards goes on, printing offices, lithographers, publishing houses and clothing and other manufacturing establishments, released from their obligations as tenants in the old, dismal, comfortless and inconvenient structures, are finding new locations in this new district. One of the most satisfactory features of this trade migration is that it involves new and better, vastly better, sanitary conditions for the large army of operatives. Humanitarianism in its best and most practical phase finds no better example than in the new buildings devoted to industrial pursuits. Light, ventila-

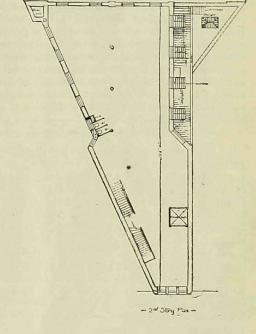
tinet advantage. With a frontage of 15 feet on 13th street, it runs back 116 feet 8 inches, by diverging side lines, to a rear line of 82 feet 7 inches, covering an area of more than 4,400 square feet.

The building was designed and built in the most solid and enduring manner as an investment, in conformity with the time honored adage "the best is always the cheapest." Its walls are thick and solid and of selected materials. The first floor is steel beams and girders, with fire-proof floor arches, and the other stories are of first-class mill construction, with double floors 3 inches thick. The massive beams, of selected dressed timber, in view, afford no lurking places for fire or vermin. The first layer of the floors is of dressed and matched 2-inch North Carolina pine, and between that and top layer (also of matched pine) is a double thickness of fire-proofing, just the sort of construction to carry machinery and heavy stocks. While the slow combustion construction will command the lowest rates of insurance, as additional safeguards, the building has been equipped with automatic sprinklers supplied with water from one of the large tanks in the tower, also with ironclad shutters at all rear and side windows.

It is equipped with two boilers of 300 horse power capacity and other modern furnishings and conveniences. Accompanying illustration shows the front elevation, which is of granite in the two lower stories with buff brick and stone above. A broad ornamental entrance leads to a spacious vestibule attractively finished with marble, wainscoted and asphalted floor. At the rear of vestibule is a spacious elevator, designed for both freight and passenger service,

tion and drainage that were in the former days matters of minor consideration, are the main factors in every new design. When a workman moves into one of these new buildings he moves into more wholesome conditions of daily employment, into better light and better air, and is a more cheerful and spirited man for the change. There the employer gets his benefit.

The most recently completed and one of the most striking of the new buildings that adorn this district is the new "Steeple Building" which Mr. Hearn of 14th street has built at No. 40 West 13th street, south side, between 5th and 6th avenues. At first glance it seems a nine-story pile devoted to secular purposes, but that is because of its altogether unconventional appearance. Messrs. J. B. Snook & Sons, the architects, have given us an example of the possibilities of Gothic art in a business structure, and the result is pleasant beyond belief. Perhaps, if they had had a lot of conventional rectangular shapes to deal with, the result might not have been so happy. As it is the "Steeple Building," so different in appearance from the neighboring structures, is so strikingly agreeable by contrast that it catches the eye and the attention as Grace Church does in Broadway. In its district it is destined to become just such a landmark. It is in substantial and important reality a model modern business structure, 122 feet high, seven stories above basement, exclusive of tower, from which it takes its name, the "Steeple Building."

Standing upon and conforming to a plot of extraordinary shape, which at first sight might have been considered a drawback, but which in the hands of skillful architects is found to have been a dis-

and on the opposite side the main stairway. The elevator shaft is fire-proof. Between it and the front is the tower or "Steeple" which on every story is specially adapted for office purposes. Each floor is equipped with steam heating pipes and two light toilet rooms, with exposed sanitary plumbing of the best quality. The building sets back from the lot line on every side and has from seventeen to nine-teen large windows on every floor, set clear to ceiling, a scientific improvement, insuring the best light and ventilation at all times. A permanent, broad, fixed iron escape with steps skirts the western wall, terminating on the roof of a one-story triangular extension. The basement, finished with concreted floor, is unusually light and available for business purposes. Besides the main chimney in one of the rear corners there are small flues at convenient intervals for gas stoves or bench forges or crucibles.

The "Steeple Building" is available for manufacturing and commercial purposes, and will be rented in whole or part. The supply is ample; most likely cut near place of manufacture, where logs can be turned out in dimensions to suit the local requirements.

The lady received!a check for \$10,000, signed by her neighbor. Can I claim my commission on that sale and for how much?

Obituary. SIMON STEVENS.

Simon Stevens, a well-known lawyer of this city, who was widely known in the real estate field as an authority on riparian titles and a manager of water-front properties, died Tuesday week at his residence, No. 37 East 20th street. Mr. Stevens was a native of Barnet, Vt., where he was born in 1825. He was a consin of Thaddeus Stevens, the famous jurist, under whose supervision he studied law and was admitted to the bar. After a period of residence and practice in Washington Mr. Stevens came to New York, which has been his residence nearly thirty-five years. He became an intimate friend of Horace Greeley, and the two formed a habit of breaking fast together on Sunday mornings-a custom observed during many years. About two years ago Mr. Stevens presented before the local authorities a proposition to fill up the Harlem River and convert it into a great boulevard. The scheme was elaborately presented, with maps and printed arguments, and attracted a great deal of attention at the time. Mr. Stevens was a member of the New York Historical Society, an honorary member of the American Society of Civil Engineers and of the Indiana Historical Society.

BERNHARD GRUNHUT.

Dr. Bernhard Grunhut's mysterious disappearance from the trans-Atlantic steamer Bothnia, a fortnight ago, while on the return voyage from Liverpool, has recalled in a startling manner the death of Ascher Weinstein under strikingly similar circumstances. Dr. Grunhut, who was about forty years old, gave up his medical practice about three years ago and began to dabble in real estate, first alone, and then, in a rather more extensive way, as a member of the firm of Sammet, Grunhut & Co., at No. 153 Broadway. The firm was supposed to be generally successful in its operations, and the cause of Dr. Grunhut's suicide, if such it was, is a mystery to his acquaintances, except as it may be explained by the fact that he was divorced about two years ago, and about a year after was married a second time to a woman with whom his relatives claimed no acquaintance. His health failed shortly after, and in the desire to regain it he went to Europe, as stated.

THOMAS GEARTY.

On August 26th, at his residence, No. 52 West 97th street, died Thomas Gearty, a well-known builder and contractor, in the 63d year of his age. Mr. Gearty first became identified with the building industries in the bluestone branch, many years ago, when he operated a yard at 2d avenue and 43d street. Later he engaged extensively in contracting on public and private works, and of late years turned his attention to building. He was buried on Wednesday, from the Church of the Holy Name.

JAMES S. CONOVER.

On Monday, at his home in Stratford, Conn., died James S. Conover, a pioneer in one of the important branches of the building industry in this city. Mr. Conover was born in Freehold, N. Y., in 1819. Twenty-five years later he established the firm in Canal street which in the after years became known throughout the country as a representative house in the manufacture and sale of ornamental grates and wood mantles. At first it was Conover & Wooley; then in 1870, on the admission of A. F. Conover to the firm, it became Conover, Wooley & Co.; in 1876 Mr. Wooley retired and the firm name became J. S. Conover & Co. It removed then to 28 and 30 West 23d street, where it continued until July, 1893, when under stress of the prevailing panic it was forced to assign. Mr. Conover's long business career in New York City brought him a host of friends among all classes, but chiefly among the merchants and business men of his own generation, who will be sorry to learn of his demise.

The widow and a son, Alonzo E., and a grandson, W. E. Conover, and James W. Conover are among the surviving relatives.

The sales of realty in the past few days were unusually well divided among the various uptown sections of the city. One transaction only is reported in property below 10th street. The purchases, however, include no parcels of special value, and compared with the business of the previous week, the market has apparently suffered a relapse. The week, to be sure, began with a holiday, but it does not seem as if that fact alone can be responsible for the sluggish condition that has prevailed since Tuesday. It may be the proverbial calm before the storm, in this instance storm meaning activity. Or it may be interpreted as demonstrating that there will be no ground this year for the upsetting of the tradition that September is

the dullest month of the year for real estate.

The September auction market opened on Tuesday with a noticeable increased attendance. Their summer outings having ended, the regular habitues of the salesroom were on hand in force with speculative instincts doubtless sharpened by a voluntary absence from the city for a month or two. There were also others present who made no secret of their desire to buy if bargains of the right sort could be had. But, alas! the properties offered not only on Tuesday but on the succeeding days as well failed to interest to any extent the would-be buyers. Laws Relating to Buildings in the City of Brooklyn.—The sections divided into paragraphs, with headings, marginal notes and colored engravings. I., The Building Law; II., Regulations of the Building Department; III., Plumbing and Drainage; IV., Water and Sewers; V., Classes of Buildings on Certain Streets; VI., Storage and Sale of Illuminating Oils; VII., Fire Limits, Edited by Wm, J. Fryer. One octavo volume, cloth; price, \$2.

Mr. Fryer's well-known efforts in the preparation of the New York, Brooklyn and general laws for the State, which were submitted to the Legislature last winter, assure us of a careful compilation and one that will be properly annotated and indexed. The work before us is a fit companion of the New York laws prepared by him last year. The subject of building laws has been a study of years with Mr. Fryer, and New York and Brooklyn are largely in debt to him for the carefelly drawn law passed the last session of the Legislature. This work, however, does not confine itself to this portion of the law. but is a comprehensive presentation of the law covering the whole subject, and placing in the hands of the architect, builder, contractor, lawyer and real estate owner the whole law as at present in forcethe regulations of the Building Department as to acceptance of plans and specifications, inspection, etc., requirements for elevators and fire escapes. On walls fourteen colored diagrams are given illustrating the construction required by the present law for dwelling houses and warehouse walls. In the section on skeleton structure, so much in vogue in large public and office buildings, a diagram illustrating the construction of curtain walls is shown, also diagrams showing the encasing of iron or steel columns with the use of fireproof materials. The work covers, in addition to what are known as strictly building laws, plumbing and drainage and the rules and regulations of the Health Department; the regulations of the Department of City Works, such as water and sewers, opening and retilling trenches. restoring street pavements, licensing of plumbers, scale of water rates, ordinances regulating the laying of sidewalks and construction of driveways, classes of buildings on certain streets, ordinance prescribing projection of bay windows, stoops, areas, etc.; storage and sale of illuminating oils, fire limits, Department of Buildings altogether furnishing just the information required by the architect, builder and contractor. The author has taken great pains in bringing this matter together to classify carefully, give side heads and furnish a complete index for ready reference. The work will be found one of the best and most convenient local references to building laws and the requirements of the various city departments ever

REVIEW AND RECORD.

BROOKLYN, SEPTEMBER 8, 1894.

Notes Gathered Here and There.

Owing to the question as to the ability of the trustees of the Brooklyn Tabernacle, under the new building law, to use the foundations and walls left standing in reconstructing the edifice, the \$100,000 insurance on the structure has not been paid. Deputy Building Commissioner Howell stated that there was nothing in the law to prevent the use of the foundations of a building damaged by fire or the side walls that are left standing, provided that on examination they are found intact and sufficiently strong to come within the requirements of the law for the building about to be erected.

City Works Commissioner White, after consultation with a committee of Wallabout Market men, has definitely accepted the design of Architect William B. Tubby, of New York, for the exterior of the new market building. The estimated cost of the most expensive block, that on the corner of Washington and Flushing avenues, will probably be about \$40,000. The whole cost, if the ground now occupied by buildings is improved according to the design, will be about \$200,000. Under the act the market men bear the cost of the new buildings. The present buildings are to be removed. Mr. Tubby's design, while ornamental, is not extravagantly so. The exterior will be of washed red brick, with Colabaugh brick triumnings.

Notice is given that the assessment for the cost and expense of constructing a sewer in Map F, District 11, Butler street, from Vanderbilt avenue easterly to the crown of the street between Underhill and Washington avenues, has been completed by the Commissioner of City Works. The said Commissioner will be at his office, Room 15, Municipal Building, on the 14th day of September, to hear objections to the said assessment.

Registrar of Arrears Hinrichs has just completed a list of the parcels of property he intends to sell at public auction in Justice Neu's court-room, on October 3d. The properties lie in the 5th, 6th, 8th, 9th, 16th, 19th, 21st, 22d, 24th and 25th Wards. In the 22d Ward there are 123 lots, nearly all of which belong to the Litchfield estate. Each parcel will be sold to the highest bidder for a sum not less than the amount remaining unpaid and interest from the date of filing the certificate at the rate of 12 per cent per annum.

Summons and complaint were served on Mayor Schieren on Wednesday in a suit brought by Henry P. Litchfield, who seeks to restrain the city from selling for arreas of taxes the 123 pieces of Litchfield estate, which Registrar of Arrears Heinrichs has advertised for sale on October 3d. Mr. Heinrichs has been served with a notice of an application for an injunction to restrain the sale. This is the second effort of the Litchfield estate made this year to stave off the sale of its properties for taxes. The estate was defeated in its last efforts.

BRICKS.-There does not appear to be much, if BRICKS.—There does not appear to be much, if any, real change in the position of Common Hards, certainly no gain. A somewhat unusual feature is the fact that the run of stock ordinarily considered the finest has really the weakest tone, although that is a result not difficult to account for. It has been a remarkably favorable season for production and the effect is now shown in the universally excellent quality of stock offering giving buyers a great advantage in matter of selection and inducing many of them to desert their regular fancy makes when there is an attempt to place a premium upon the stock. At \$4.50 we have a dead outside and the bulk of business is not done above the \$4.25 limit, with some tip-top goods at \$4 per M. Whether demand has diminished or arrivals increased is doubtful, as accounts disagree upon that subject, but there is no doubt that the accumulation here has been larger, and there is at the close a greater quantity unsold than last week. Production is gradually shutting down, although the percentage of working yards is greater than might have been expected in view of the threats made by manufacturers for a number of weeks past. Pales are dull and nominally unchanged. Fronts get indifferent custom only, and secure no chance for a stiffening of values. We learn that the Trenton manufacturers have a rather light stock of fronts on hand, but nevertheless have resolved to shut down on account of the heavy accumulation of unsalable rough brick which clogs the entire business. Very few contracts for fancy colored stock are making.

GLASS.—Since last writing advices have been received stating that Western manufacturers and their workmen had come to an agreement upon the wage question at a reduction of 22½ per cent, and were about starting their fires. It is further reported that the Eastern pots are likely to resume operations upon the same basis. The run of business at present doing is small and principally of a regular trade character, with nominally unchanged prices. As yet the effects of the changes in duty have not had an opportunity to demonstrate themselves, but there is an idea that the matter has really been pretty well discounted. According to dispatches received from Washington this week the Treasury Department has made an important ruling in relation to paragraph 91 of the earth, earthenware and glass schedule. After fixing the rates of duty, the paragraph provides "that unpolished cylinder, crown and common window glass, imported in boxes, shall be packed fifty square feet per box as nearly as sizes will permit, and the duty shall be computed thereon according to the actual weight." Secretary Carlisle has decided that the words "actual weight," and that therefore only 5 per centum of each gross importation must be examined in order to strike an average, unless where the actual weight of such proportion shows a material variation from the above standard. Glass exceeding 60 by 40 inches, however, must be actually weighed. The circular to which the Secretary refers, No. 11,099, declares that this method of ascertaining weight is a necessity, in view of the fact that 35,000 to 40,000 boxes of glass often arrive in one week in New York.

Consumption has failed to reach the proportions calculated upon as almost sure by this time, and with many dealers carrying a good stock from previous purchases they are in no humor for handling additions even at modified cost, and current arrivals are difficult to place. Some quotations are named at \$1.75 for small lots, but cargo rates stand at about \$1.65 at 1.70, the latter a little extreme. Only fair quantities are reported afloat, but probably quite as much as the market at present requires.
