WITH SUPPLEMENT.

A RRANGEMENTS have undoubtedly been made to afford some relief to the Treasury in supplying it with gold. These it is hoped will tide it over the time until the new Congress can be called together and act. The country has to pay a high price for this convenience, and the situation at the same time is not made wholly satisfactory. Congress is a very uncertain factor, and the nervousness of security holders will not wholly disappear until our currency methods are reformed. Moreover, while business is continually improving, it is not at such a rate as to justify any large rise in the prices of securities. Manufacturers all over the country are gradually increasing their working forces and thereby increasing the buying power of the working classes upon which, after all said and done, the prosperity of the country depends. There is room for believing that, if the relief the Treasury has obtained is substantial, and especially if it takes the form of bringing gold from abroad in a way that it cannot go back again by an early steamer, prices generally have not dis-counted the improvement in the situation that that will occasion. But other considerations will weigh heavily in special cases. For instance, it is hard to see how the Grangers can go back to figures prevailing a year ago until there are good indications that the results of the harvest of 1895 will be better than they were last year. General Electric is obviously in a bad way, presumably because developments will compel a readjustment of the capital account lessening the offsetting assets. It is not likely either that the company is doing any better than other manufacturing companies. The anthracite coal companies are still in a state of indecision in respect to an agreement to restrict production and to maintain prices. What this means was shown by the reports for 1894, issued by Lackawanna and Delaware & Hudson, both of which showed large losses in net earnings. Unless an agreement is soon arranged there will be a drop in the prices of coal stocks, because it is hardly possible that all the companies will be satisfied with present conditions for long and some may force the fighting to secure a better position when the inevitable readjustment of the percentages of output does come.

TT is a singular thing, but a fact, that the several countries of Europe have become apathetic on the subject of politics. The thrill which a great change generally imparts to a whole nation now seems to spend its force in the parliamentary chambers. This was seen when Prince Hohenloe supplanted Gen, Caprivi and M. Faure succeeded M. Casimir-Perier and only raised the public pulse of either Germany or France slightly and momentarily. The Giolotti scandal in Italy creates no great public excitement. England seems inclined to cast herself on the bosom of the Conservative party as she always does when inclined to take a political nap, and the best finance minister Hungary ever had gave his portfolio into untried hands without disturbing values in the least. Probably the universal necessity for looking after individual and private concerns occasions the collective indifference to public ones. Then, too, the collective thinking capacity is limited. It likes a few things at a time to occupy it, and just now the prices of iron and corn and other typical goods have the call on the public faculties to the exclusion of politics. Recently, Consols and other Government securities have shown signs of giving way from the abnormal quotations to which they have reached, but there are no fresh signs of a demand which will reduce the enormous holdings of money not only in Europe but even in India and other remote places, and the fact that we do not see rates for money advancing on a legitimate demand proves that there is no improvement in the business situation. If trade does not go backward its forward

movement is not of the most encouraging nature. The returns

of the foreign trade of Great Britain in 1894 illustrate this. In imports the quantity received was 9 per cent greater and the declared values 8 per cent lower than in 1893; the imports of raw material for manufacture and manufactured articles fell off in quantity 3 per cent and in price 2 per cent. The labor reports for December, however, indicate on the whole no increase in the numbers of the unemployed, but, if anything, a decrease. The budget of the Russian Finance Minister contains some figures which are interesting inasmuch as so little is known except in the vaguest way of the development of his country. These figures show that the production of pig-iron was in 1881, 546,000 tons, and in 1893, 1,416,000 tons; the production of steel 376,000 tons compared with 600,000 tons; the output of coal 4,180,000 tons against 920,000 tons. The Russian cotton industry now employs 200,000 looms and 6,000,000 spindles.

Sanity and Rapid Transit.

A T last we stand upon firm ground in this hitherto imbecile matter of Rapid Transit. The whole problem finally has been put beyond the voice of cranks, schemers and newspaper blatherskites. What would have been done under reasonable conditions at the very outset has now been accomplished. After trying for years to evolve a practicable system of Rapid Transit from the ferment of popular ignorance and editorial preaching, we have turned to experts competent to pronounce both upon the engineering and financial sides of the matter. Henceforth it will be crass presumption for persons qualified only by the intensity of their personal desires to propose new schemes. One must possess undoubted abilities to question without impudence the final judgment of a board of experts of real ability.

The outlook now, if not promising, is at least intelligble. Hitherto it has not been so. Everything, at last, is reduced to the point of action, and the question no longer is, "What are we going to do ?" but, "Are we going to do what we ought to do if we really want Rapid Transit?" The report of the Board of Experts must be pleasant reading for all well-informed and judicious citizens. It recognizes the fact that the city requires a system of transportation differing entirely from anything it now possesses. Our present machinery can only temporize with our difficulties. It offers no real solution to the Rapid Transit problem. An underground road is the only way out of the trouble. An overground system undoubtedly would be more comfortable and more popular with the people, but apparently it is not practicable, all existing conditions considered. The underground routes advocated in the report avoid as many difficulties as can be avoided without sacrificing the efficiency of the new system.

Best of all, in laying out the new transportation lines the Board of Experts was clear-headed enough to see that there are present emergencies to be met as well as future requirements provided for, and it proceeded to recommend the doing of what unquestionably should be done. THE RECORD AND GUIDE has been advocating for years the imperative necessity of increasing the facilities of the elevated roads. It is hard to say why the public have not made this demand upon the company long ago. The company is not to blame upon this point. It must not be forgotten that there was a time when the Manhattan people were ready enough to build additional tracks. They even went so far in the face of senseless popular opposition as to construct a third track along a considerable part of one of their lines. If people had known what was best for themselves at the time instead of falling into an attitude of opposition because of prejudice against Jay Gould, they would have supported the company in its efforts to give better service to its patrons. As it is now, the Manhattan Company, we believe, are not so anxious to make costly betterments. They have felt the pinch of competition of the cable roads. They are rather of the opinion, we judge, that there is more money in maintaining things just as they are than in changes and expansions.

The extra tracks recommended by the Board of Experts should, of course, be built. Steam power should be replaced by electric traction. Were this done we should not have, of course, a real rapid transit system adequate to meet the great and increasing requirements of the city, but we should have a very serviceable system sufficient in part to satisfy the needs of the moment. There is no city in the world that would tolerate for a day the 'hog method of transporting human beings which now prevails on the elevated lines. There is no excuse for it. It is beastly and uncivilized.

We trust that the Rapid Transit Commissioners will now proceed with the utmost energy to carry out the plan advised by the Board of Experts. Every decent man in New York City should co-operate with the Commissioners and assist them with his voice and influence. Rapid Transit has ceased to be an engineering matter. It has become a question of sanitation and morals, and in these affairs all good citizens should be interested.

Real estate men particularly have large financial interests bound up in Rapid Transit. The further expansion of New York City is impossible until people can travel very much faster and with much more comfort, from one end of the city to the other, than they can to-day. Rapid Transit and the next boom in real estate will be found conjoined.

THE Evening Post, in a recent editorial, endeavors to answer a very interesting question a very interesting question concerning American political life propounded by a professor in one of the English universities. "How is it," the professor asked, "that normally a professional politician lives when his party is out of power?" The Post gives a number of different answers to this question which do not concern us here. In the course of these answers, however, the editor institutes a comparison between our professional politicians and the condottiere of the Middle Ages, which is worth further elaboration. The extent to which this comparison can be carried is most curious and interesting. The following is a description of the mediæval mercenaries extracted from a history of Venice by Horatio F. Brown: "They formed a class by themselves; their own objects were never those of the masters they served; it was nothing to them who ruled in Milan, Verona or Padua, provided there was some one there with a large purse and an insatiable ambition. War alone, war for its own sake, was their sole interest, peace the one thing they dreaded." And so among themselves they began to develop a code of military usage which would favor their own special interests. Wars were not to be finished too rapidly; it was not to the captains' interest to conclude a campaign as long as the employers' pockets were full. Marching and counter-marching through well-stocked districts were their delight, and early retirement into winter quarters in some wealthy city was prescribed by etiquette. It does not take very much ingenuity to find a parallel for all these details in modern American political warfare. In effect the professional politicians of the two parties enter into a league or "deal," the purpose of which is to get the offices and emoluments of our governmental machinery for themselves, and to this end they make use of party names, party catchwords and popular party spirit. In truth, however, they "form a class by themselves;" their objects are never those of the rank and file of their respective parties. Year after year we are confronted by the fact that the victorious party, under the lead of its politicians, not only utterly fails to embody its promises in legislation, but is as incompetent and as indifferent to the public interests as the party which has just been defeated. The objects of these politicians are never those of the masters they serve; it is nothing to them whether Democrats or Republicans rule in Washington, Albany or New York. Their work is done when they arrange the details of fighting. The outcome of the election itself is comparatively unimportant, for, whoever wins, their comrades, the politicians of the opposing party, are always on hand to seize the fruits of the victory-just as Platt at the present moment is grabbing at the fruits of the victory over Tammany last fall. The important thing for them is to run the caucuses and "get the delegates," and they raise a famous outcry when, as in 1892, a national convention disregards the "unwritten law" of their game—the law, viz., that a candidate who does not "get the delegates;" from his own State is not ruled out on the final contest. Municipal politics is their fairest field; bi-partisan commissions one of their cleverest fictions, and underhand "deals" their chief means of support when out of office. The real fight is rarely between Democrats and Republicans; it is almost always between the professional politicians on one side and on the other the independent voters of the community.

Federal Architecture.

Mr. John M. Carrére has declined the appointment of Supervising Architect to the Treasury on the ground that the principles underlying the work of the office are radically wrong, and that the system should be changed. His course and reasons are approved by Messrs. Geo. B. Post, G. F. McKim, H. J. Hardenbergh, R. M. Hunt, Bruce Price, Warren R. Briggs, John Du Fals and Thomas Hastings, who all agree that the performance of the presumptive work of the Supervising Architect is a physical impossibility.

The Concourse Beyond the Harlem.

The bill introduced into the State Senate and Assembly to lay out and establish a grand boulevard and concourse in the 23d and 24th Wards, from 161st street and Mott avenue to Mosholu Park, is intended apparently to prevent the project and the affected property being tied up indefinitely. It requires the Commissioner of Street Improvements of those wards to lay out the boulevard and fifteen transverse roads, running underneath the boulevard, within six months of the passing of the bill. It then says that, it shall be the duty of the Counsel to the Corporation of the City of New York, upon written request from said Commissioner of Street Improvements and within four months from the date of such request, to take the necessary means and proceedings to acquire title on behalf of the city to all such real estate not owned by the City or extinguishable by pubic authority which shall be embraced within the lines of the boulevard and concourse and transverse roads as laid out and established by the Commissioner of Improvements. It will be remembered that a deputation from the North Side Board of Trade urged on Mayor Gilroy, in December last, that proceedings in condemnation should be taken in reference to the boulevard or concourse, the maps having been filed and the affected property tied up thereby. Mayor Gilroy did not care to act on a matter of so much importance just as his term of office was about to expire. This bill, if passed, will provide a way for accomplishing what the deputation desired, it being understood that Commissioner Haffen is in favor of putting the concourse through without unnecessary delay.

London Landlords, Tenants, Agents, Houses and Rates and Taxes.

NEW DWELLINGS—OLD ONES—POLICE PROTECTION OF ONE AND THE

OTHER—STRIKES IN THE BUILDING TRADE, ETC.

London, January 21, 1895.—None of Her Majesty's subjects are marked as prominently with patience and long suffering as are the London landlords and their tenants. Of course, Ireland is an exception. The London landlord, if not an absentee, is a present influence for good or for evil; but chiefly the latter, in the eyes of most tenants. Probably there is no civilized city that has as many bad, good and indifferent landlords as this great city of London exhibits. The late tendency is towards being a householder, in fee simple, by men who never owned an incomplete of freehold land or property in all their time. Consequently, there is an excess, over and above the past decade, of evil landlords and a less number of good ones; while the indifferent ones may be classed among the absentees. The good ones are good, considering all things—particularly when the tribulations of unreasonable complaining tenants are measured by meum et tuum. In no city in the civilized world are good landlords as much imposed upon as in this city.

In no city in any part of the world are "house agents" more despised and detested, as a rule, both by landlord and tenant, than are these tricky, dodging and mean middlemen of London. There are exceptions. The exceptions can be readily counted. The rule embraces endless numbers. To the methods of these agents and the mode of the indifferent landlords, may be attributed the fact that there are at this time 37,227 places of residence in the London district seeking occupants; and how many more are in quest of new tenants, while yet being occupied by the old ones, it is difficult to ascertain. Thirty-seven, perhaps forty thousand, dwellings in the market sounds like a little city being deserted, or suggests the basis of a big city to be reconstructed. But in the London district this number of dwellings "to let" does not appear to astonish the moving or the sedentary population of nearly 5,000,000 of plodding, pushing people, rich and poor, and paupers too.

The annual report of the Chief Commissioner of Police shows that during last year no less than 12,833 new houses were built in London, 101 new streets made of the aggregate length of 17 miles 1,291 yards. The number of new houses that have been built in the area the metropolitan police cover since 1849 down to last year is 572,830, whilst the new streets and squares formed are 11.888, the length of the new streets and squares being 1,986 miles 1,171 yards. The Metropolitan Police District has an area of 688 square miles, and the mean rateable value of the area for police purposes in the year 1893-4 exceeded £37,000,000, but the Commissioner observes that "of the enormous actual value of the property in charge of the police it is impossible to form any estimate." The police rate is fixed at nine pence in the pound, of which four pence in the pound is payable out of the Local Taxation Account under the Local Government Act of 1888. The total amount of police rate levied on the parishes for the year ended on March 31 in the present year produced £784,000, and the Local Taxation Account contributed nearly £624,000. The actual pay of the police was a little over a million and a quarter. The city, with all its enormous concentration of wealth in a space of little more than a square mile, is, of course, not included in the Metropolitan Police District. It has its own police force, and it does not appear that any material disadvantage occurs from having two organizations of this kind side by side. A spirit of honorable rivalry may exist, inducing each to aim at excelling the other, and, so long as the two forces are ready to combine their energies when necessary, there is no obvious reason why the present arrangement should be superseded. Does not this extract from the Police Commissioner of London-the unequalled city of Christendom -suggest something to your good Mr. Goff and the Lexow investigation.

I spoke of paupers. This weekly census of metropolitan paupers, taken at the instance of the Local Government Board, shows that on the last day of the first week of December there was within the metropolitan area a total of 103,579 paupers who were in the receipt of relief. This total compares with a return of 106,022 last year, and with 97,232 and 92,631 in the corresponding weeks of the years 1892 and 1891. Of this total 66,396 were indoor paupers, as compared with 65,979 so returned in 1893, and with 61,839 in 1892 and 59,181 in 1891. The number of outdoor paupers amounted to 37,183, as against 40,043 last year, 35,393 in 1892 and 33,450 in 1891. Besides there were 1,308 vagrants, consisting of 1,078 men, 214 women and 16 children, who on that same day received temporary relief. Paupers cared for; people taxed therefore! What a theme for a modern moral economist and monetary philosopher!

The last sale this year was held at Tokenhouse-yard (the real estate mart of London), and the rostrums will not be occupied for business purposes till the second or third day in the new year. On the whole it has been a fairly satisfactory year. The best demand was for small brick-and-mortar investments in the metropolis, a class of estate that has gone up in value ever since the panic among building society depositors. Building land sold very well, and so did ground rents. Business premises in the West End excited some good competition, but the market for town residences experienced a severe depression; indeed, but for the success that attended the private

efforts of the few reputable agents during the past few weeks, its condition would have to be put down as deplorable. Very little city property changed hands by auction, but here again the good advertisements obtained by the attempts to sell publicly brought about some very successful sales by private contract.

It may interest many New York readers familiar with English and London localities to have some details of these sales, particularly if it be true that American millionaires are eagerly sought as purchasers of landed property in the "old country," and, too, when ten times better speculative chances are before them in the new, yes, even in New York's old quarters.

On the whole this year, if not as good as 1893, must be put down as well up to the average. One of the first estates to be sold was Rothley Temple, Leicestershire, famous as the birthplace of Lord Macauley, together with the historical Knight Templars' Chapel and crypt and about 900 acres of land. A day or two later Lord Armstrong acquired Bamborough Castle, Northumberland, formerly a fortress of might, now a house of charity; and Princess Soltykoff the Beechwood estate at Slough. Then followed the sales of the Testwood Park estate of Colonel Bruce, near Southampton; large Coton estate, in Leicestershire; Oldbury Chase, Warwickshire; Overtown, Wilts, comprising 1,000 acres, for close on £11,000; Wrotham Hill Park, Kent; and Lechlade Manor, Gloucestershire, extending to over 400 acres. This brings us to May, and now we find the first important landed estate sold at auction. This distinction belongs to Presdales, Hertfordshire, the mansion and 65 acres fetching £8,100. A month afterwards Shortgrove, near Saffron Walden, was sold to Mr. Bailey for £30,000, and to this day this has remained the most important transaction in real estate effected at Tokenhouse-yard. About this time Lord Ashburton sold his Essex estates of 4,200 acres, which were announced for auction during the summer; and the same nobleman had the satisfaction last week of disposing of the lots withdrawn at auction of his Somerset estates early in the year. Mr. A. H. Brown, M. P., purchased Broome Hall, near [Dorking, and 750 acres; Mr. John Hollams, the fine Dere Park estate in Kent, comprising 615 acres, for close on £50,000; Mr. G. A. Brittain, The Lillies, near Aylesbury, for £30,000; Sir Westman Pearson, Paddockhurst, comprising mansion and 2,200 acres, for close on £100,000; Mr. Duffield, Mayor of Workington Tallantire Hall, comprising mansion and 1,150 acres, for £30,250, and Mr. Arthur Brooke, the Rookery estate, near Dorking, for over £20,000. Other estates sold include Pierremont Park, Broadstairs; Stagenhoe Park, near Hitchin, and 640 acres, for over £20,000; Highfield, Shoreham, comprising residence and seventy-five acres, for about £12,000; Steephill Castle. Ventnor. But by far the most important transaction of the whole year was the sale of the Elveden estate in Suffolk, to Lord Iveagh. Among the important estates offered and still in the market are The Hook, Northaw, Herts, the highest offer for the residence and 140 acres being £7,000; Studley, Warwickshire, and over 1,000 acres; Heaton Park, Manchester, for which there was only one offer, at the rate of £275 per acre, and the Hartpury estate, near Gloucester, the best bid for the residence and 1,125 acres being £30,000. As regards agricultural land, pure and simple, there has been a falling off in supply and demand as compared with last year. Prices could hardly have gone much lower in some of the eastern counties, but, on the other hand, a 'good average was sustained in some morthern counties, notably Yorkshire and Leicestershire.

And now as regards the metropolis itself. Is has been an excellent year for small brick-and-mortar investments; for ground-rents, good; for building land, very fair; for City property, middling, and for West End residences, bad. The official returns from Tokenhouseyard show a great falling off, but it is also a fact that disposals by private contract have been much more numerous than usual. We find chief among City estate sold No. 1 Basinghall street, for £8,500 or fourteen and a-half years' purchase; No. 38 Cheapside, for £9,300, or twenty-nine years' purchase; No. 78 Upper Thames street, for \$6,000. or forty years' purchase; No. 4 Fen court, Fenchurch street, for £4,350, or thirty-four years' purchase; the thirty years' lease of the "Poulterers' Arms." in Freeman's court, for £11,020; No. 97 Fleet street, for £3,850, or twenty-six years' purchase; 3,500 square feet in Cock lane, West Smithfield, for £5.500, or twenty.two years' purchase; the Fellowship Porters' Hall, for £4,200, or twenty years' purchase; 4,130 square feet, occupied by the Church of All Hallows the Great, Upper Thames street, for £13,100; 25,000 square feet in Jewry street, Aldgate, for close on £50,000; freehold ground-rent of £2,000, arising out of premises in Threadneedle street, for over £100,000, and the site of the "Old Catherine Wheel," in Bishopsgate street Without, at a price which has not transpired. In the West End the most important event was the attempt to dispose of the Crown lease (seventy-six years unexpired, at a ground-rent of £4,200) of the site of Her Majesty's Opera House. The best offer was £140,000, and the property is still in the market. In the matter of town mansions, although the year may fairly be put down as bad, there has undoubtedly been a marked improvement within the past few weeks, and there is every indication that this will continue.

There is an immediate future of agitation regarding the rateable, taxable value of real estate in London. All cities undergo local changes; and all real estate is subject to these changes. London and New York offer the most striking examples of these changes in certain city precincts.

A recommendation of the Local Government and Taxation Committee here proposes that, in view of the quinquennial valuation next year, a friendly communication should be addressed to the overseers expressing the willingness of the City Council to render help in the direction of securing uniformity was approved. It was stated that the Prime Minister had promised to receive a deputation

some time in January with reference to the report of the unification commission.

Something has to be considered, also very soon, in London, that may as well be considered and acted upon in New York. Let me explain:

When the Public Health Act (London) came into operation, on January 1, 1892, it was generally believed that the Legislature had provided a Sanitary Law so beneficent in its action that, at no distant date, every citizen of this vast metropolis would enjoy a healthy dwelling amongst healthy surroundings, and have none but sound and wholesome food, and that nuisances injurious to health would be no more. This, there can be no doubt, is the general intention of the Act; but the power of achieving such a desirable end has been placed in the hands of the Vestries and District Boards, who are constituted the Sanitary Authority under the Act, Section 107 of which provides that every Sanitary Authority shall appoint an adequate number of fit and proper persons as Sanitary Inspectors, who shall be persons qualified and competent by their knowledge and experience to perform the duties of their office; and Section 108 further provides that every Sanitary Inspector appointed after January 1st next shall hold a certificate from an examining body approved by the Local Government Board. The duties of a Sanitary Inspector are numerous and responsible, much more responsible, probably, than is generally understood; he must possess the faculty of a medical man in relation to infectious diseases and conditions injurious to health, the skill of a butcher in relation to diseased and unwholesome meat. the experience of a surveyor, a builder, and a plumber in relation to the dwelling, its structure, drainage, and sanitary arrangements, the expertness of a consulting engineer in relation to smoke consumption in furnaces, and the qualification of a lawyer in relation to the prosecutions under the numerous statutes he has to act upon. Amongst them are the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, the Margarine Act, the Sale of Horseflesh Act, the Canal Boats Act, the Factory Workshops Act, the Metropolis Local Management Act, the Public Health Act, etc. These duties bring the Sanitary Inspector into almost daily contact with infection, and the dangers from defective drains and sewers, and the effluvia from dangerous nuisances.

There is only one means by which the Public Health Act can be properly administered, and that is by appointing trained, qualified, and competent men as Sanitary Inspectors, giving them adequate remuneration and security in the tenure of their office. When Inspectors are so appointed and protected in carrying out their duties it will not only be an advantage to the officers themselves, but will also be an advantage to the public health, by insuring that the Sanitary laws are faithfully carried out and efficiently administered. It is to be hoped that public opinion will be so directed as to bring about a change in this direction, and thus recognize that "A nation's health is a nation's wealth."

Something also, not only in London but in other great cities and London, is to initiate the movement.

The certainty that a gigantic strike will take place in the building trade in May next is daily taking a more definite form. The notice to terminate the 1892 agreement given by the Central Association of Master Builders will expire in May, and both masters and men are preparing for the struggle. On behalf of the Building Trades' Federation, it is stated that the master builders, having abrogated the agreement now in existence, they propose to introduce amendments which, if persisted in, could have no other effect than to set the whole of the building trade workers by the ears, and, if successful. would render Trade Unionism in London powerless to protect those who have hitherto looked on it as their salvation. Hitherto, it is asserted, the building trade had stood fast for a minimum rate for all classes of workers. This was a rate below which it was impossible to go, and was practically the lowest that should be paid for the class of work performed. There is also a great friction owing to the masters insisting on free and unrestricted sub-contracting. The men further resent the proposal that during the winter months the men employed on outdoor jobs shall, during certain weeks, start work after breakfast instead of before, and that during those weeks there shall be a shorter dinner time. It is stated that the nonunionists, feeling that a defeat of the workmen is most likely to affect them are wheeling into line and are also likely to act on the defensive. The strike is likely to affect upwards of 50,000 men. and in face of a possible strike levies varying from 3d. to 1s. per week are being raised.

A prominent member of the Master Builders' Association, in the course of conversation, stated, that with regard to the termination of the agreement of 1892 on May 1st next, the masters gave notice to terminate solely because in the rules of the old agreement no provision was made for any alteration that might be deemed desirable on either side, and it was, therefore, the only way by which any fresh rules could be added. The masters have decided to take the present rules, and make such additions and alterations as they think advisable. They will then be willing, as on previous occasions, to meet representatives of the men and discuss the proposed changes The masters have received no intimation whatever that with them. a strike is likely to result from the proposed alterations. One of the changes likely to be discussed is that during the winter months men employed on outdoor jobs shall start work at 8 instead of 7.30, as at present, and so do away with the half-hour allowed for breakfast. The masters consider that this new arrangement of time would, in many ways, be more satisfactory. The light would be better, and no time would be lost by leaving for and returning from breakfast. The men complain that by this alteration they would be unable to avail themselves of workmen's trains, but the masters have expressed their willingness to assist in petitioning the railway companies to meet them on this matter. In the total amount of time worked it was shown by this change the men would be slightly the

gainers. The masters again insist on free and unrestricted sub-contracting, though many of the men are as equally opposed to the system, and will doubtless fight for the point, but, this master builder explained, it is absolutely necessary to give out some portions of the work, as for instance the ironwork, to firms who specially lay themselves out for that particular class of work, otherwise many of the jobs undertaken would result in a dead loss. The masters have no intention of lowering the men's wages. It is supposed that the men will, as on previous occasions, submit their fresh terms to the masters, who say they will be quite willing to meet them in any fair demands they may make. It is considered unlikely, should the masters and men be unable to come to any agreement, that the non-union men would throw in their lot with the unionists, as by such action they would be the losers.

This contemplated strike is identified with "Union Associations" in every chief city of the civilized globe, and must not be readily or at all pooh-pohed. Investors, contractors, buyers and sellers of house property would do well to make hay while the sun shines.

In my next letter I propose to exhibit the many houses that have never been occupied in London, though well and substantially built and in fashionable localities, with nothing against them but irresponsible silly agents and bamboozled owners.

I will also exhibit the crass ignorance in the antique and comic methods of advertising house property for rental or sale in the London press by these agents. A more roaring farce than these advertisements has never been put upon the comic stage.

To illustrate some of the petty practices of certain London agents and auctioneers, I submit the following. In New York an auctioneer convicted of similar practices or methods would be summarily expelled from the Estate Exchange and marked as an impostor before the general public.

"Sir," said an experienced London investor to me, "Will you allow me, without entering into the question of County Council and Vestry fees, to say a few words on the subject of poor landlords, and cottage or tenement property in London?

"I have it on the authority of owners of both well and ill-managed property of this description in a very poor quarter, that the profit obtainable is not more than from 1½ to 3½ per cent. At the moment when this was said some of the worst houses in the district, dilapidated and insanitary, were put up to auction through a respectable firm, with a statement in their printed notice that these houses would bring from 10 to 12 per cent. I went to the auctioneers and represented that such a percentage could only be approached by encouraging overcrowding and neglecting repairs; they did not dispute the fact, but said 'it was usual' to ell such property on such terms.

"It is now a common practice for very small tradesmen and wage-earners who can scrape together a little money to invest their savings in poor leasehold property, with the sole desire of screwing out of it the largest possible profit. Such owners keep their houses at the lowest level of dilapidation, and any repairs absolutely unavoidable are scamped with cheapest material and workmanship. This is not always from deliberate wrong intention; the owner, when the call comes, may be quite unable to meet the necessary expense, especially if, as so often happens, the property has fallen into the hands of a widow, and is the sole provision left by her husband. Under such circumstances, local authorities and magistrates hesitate to enforce sanitary orders which, if properly executed, would involve the ruin of the owner. Then, sooner or later, as has actually proved to be the case in the houses to which I have alluded, a serious outbreak of infectious illness follows, causing heavy expense to the ratepayers, not to mention the sufferings of the victims.

"The poorest areas are the starting point of infectious disease, and it would be greatly to the interest of the community if there were fewer poor landlords to foster such areas. The way to accomplish this is so diligently to enforce sanitary laws that very small capitalists will cease to look upon poor house property as the most profitable investment for their earnings. With regard to statements that tenants become indifferent about damaging property, my experience is that nothing so improves the habits of the people as careful enforcement of sanitary regulations; but it must not be expected that low-class tenants will improve where landlords neglect their duty."

The Legislature at Albany.

ALBANY, Jau. 31.—The Assembly Committee on Cities gave a push to the bill taking back the legal sales from No. 111 Broadway to No. 65 Liberty street at 6 o'clock to-night by voting to report favorably to the Assembly to-morrow.

This action was preceded, however, by one of the liveliest hearings upon a bill ever seen in the Assembly parlor, where the Committee on Cities meet to consider such measures. Those who favored the bill were represented by ex-Assemblyman James R. Sheffield, George De F. Barton, Richard V. Harnett, Cornelius Luyster and H. H. Cammann. The opponents of the bill were represented by ex-Governor Hoadly, of Ohio, but now of the firm of Hoadly, Lauterbach & Johnson, of New York; ex-Assemblyman James L. Wells and Morris Wilkins. Peter F. Meyer, Richard Croker's partner, was present.

A half an hour's argument was given to each side. Mr. Sheffield made the chief argument for the friends of the measure. He gave a history of the transfer of the legal sales from No. 65 Liberty street to No. 111 Broadway, and then said the latter was in a basement, was dark, poorly ventilated and wholly unfitted in every respect for the purposes of an auction of the city. The rooms of the Real Estate Exchange at No. 65 Liberty street were well lighted and well ventilated, and were obviously a fit place in which to hold such sales.

Originally at No. 111 Broadway, the Real Estate Exchange itself had moved to No. 65 Liberty street. Then some of the members seceded from the Exchange and went to Pine street. This was a losing speculation. Afterward these dissatisfied people went to No. 111 Broadway and then got the legal sales transferred to that place by the action of judges. This was done against the protest of such eminent lawyers as Joseph H. Choate and Elihu Root. The sales could only be transferred back to the Real Estate Exchange by legislative action. The people of the State were interested in the matter, since the 111 Broadway concern was a speculative one and only a small proportion of the private dealings in real estate took place there. Those who were opposing a transfer of the sales back to Liberty street were doing so for seltish reasons, because their fees were concerned and they had a pecuniary interest in No. 111 Broadway.

"Is there any statute which will permit of legal sales at 65 Liberty street?" inquired Samuel J. Foley, Tammany Hall Democrat.

"There is not," replied Mr. Sheffield.

"Were sales conducted at 111 Broadway before Richard Croker became a partner?" asked Assemblyman McKeown, McLaughlin Democrat, of Brooklyn.

Democrat, of Brooklyn.

Mr. Sheffield replied: "I know but little about that, but I do know that almost as soon as the seceders went to 111 Broadway it was given out that Mr. Croker was a partner."

Ex-Assemblyman James L. Wells followed with a long speech in opposition to the bill. He exhibited great feeling against the bill. He said he was President of the Auctioneers' Association, but outside of that he represented James L. Wells. Mr. Sheffield had assumed to represent all the auctioneers and to know all about the real estate business and legal sales, but he, Mr. Wells, after twenty-six years of life in the real estate field, would have to acknowledge that he had heard but little of Mr. Sheffield in that field, and indeed nothing. The bill was a highly objectionable one. It was intended to break up all sales of real estate at 111 Broadway and concentrate them at 69 Liberty street. Last year 1,100 judicial sales were held at 111 Broadway. This only brought in \$2,200, which would not make any one rich. Mr. Wells then argued that customers could buy real estate on better financial terms at 111 Broadway than at Liberty street. The auctioneers who did the largest real estate business had been driven out of 69 Liberty street by the unreasonableness of the charges. Lots sold in Liberty street would cost \$300, whereas, if sold at 111 Broadway would cost only \$50. Besides, the leasing of the room of the Real Estate Exchange to the sellers of building materials prevented at certain hours of the day the selling of land sold at legal sales.

After an hour's debate the Committee resolved to report the bill favorably.

The political bills affecting New York are still unacted upon by the Legislature, owing to Mayor Strong's refusal to make any promises of patronage to the politicians who control the movements of the bill here. The chief of these bills, which authorizes Mayor Strong to remove all the heads of departments and appoint successors to them, has been amended after passing the Assembly for the obvious purpose of preventing it reaching Governor Morton and any action upon it by him. In the meanwhile constant attempts are made to persuade Mayor Strong to give pledges of patronage. Thus far Mayor Strong has stood upon his rights as Mayor, and refused to give any political "boss" or his lieutenants the indirect power of making bis appointments. If Mayor Strong is firm he will win in this conflict, for the Legislature cannot forever "hang up" the Power of Removal Bill.

Action also is lagging upon the other important bills relating to New York; upon the bills relating to the reorganization of the police force, for instance. Mr. Thomas C. Platt, the leader of the Republican party in this State, insists upon the appointment of the Police Reorganization Commission by the Governor and the State Senate. This is contrary to all doctrines of "home rule," or self-government. Mayor Strong naturally desires to appoint the Reorganization Commission. Governor Morton is said to desire him to have this power. There will be a hearing upon this bill and also upon the bill continuing the present irresponsible four-headed Commission at the head of the Police Department on Wednesday next.

A hearing was given, to-day, by the Senate Judiciary Committee upon the bill of the Committee of Seventy abolishing the present Board of Police Justices, and a hearing was also given upon the several bills which have been introduced reforming the Board of Education. Added to this Senator O'Connor and Assemblyman Pavey have introduced bills dividing the Department of Charities and Correction into two departments, one to have charge of the city asylums and the other of the city prisons. It is also expected that some important bill may be introduced here soon amending the Rapid Transit Act. It is hinted that the Rapid Transit Commissioners wish some amendments made to it.

Senator Cantor has introduced a bill authorizing the city to sell \$5,000,000 additional of school bonds.

Assemblyman Nixon, of Chautauqua County, has introduced the following bill, which may interest loaners of money upon real estate:

"SECTION 1. Section 4 of title 1, chapter 13, of part 1 of the revised statute, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new subdivision to be known as subdivision 12, and .o read as follows:

"2. Money loaned on interest at a rate not exceeding 1 per centum per annum less the legal rate of interest, and secured by mortgage on real property in the State of New York. If money shall hereafter be loaned on interest at a rate exceeding 1 per cent less than the legal rate of interest secured by mortgage on real property in this State, the mortgagor shall be entitled to deduct annually from the amount due on such mortgage 1 per centum thereof.

"SEC. 2. This act shall take effect immediately."

Assemblyman Gleason has introduced a bill providing that the expense of removing snow and ice from sidewalks or gutters in front of houses or vacant lots shall be added to the taxes of the persons owning the property, if the work is done by the city authorities.

The Assembly killed, to-day, Mr. Wild's bill prohibiting the use of 5th avenue for the transportation of merchandise, between 25th and 59th streets, between the hours of 2 and 7 P. M., from October 1st to June 1st. The Committee on Cities reported the bill unfavorably and then the Assembly killed it.

The Assembly Committee on Cities, on February 5th, will give a hearing upon Mr. Niles' bill incorporating the New York Zoological Society, and Assemblyman Lawson's Dock Department bill. The Senate Committee on Cities will give a hearing upon the Greater New York bill and the bills of the Tenement House Commission on the same day, February 5th.

The Senate Committee on Cities have reported favorably Senator Bradley's bill regarding the trustees of the Brooklyn Bridge, so amended that in thirty days after its passage the Mayor of Brooklyn shall appoint two and the Mayor of New York City one trustee, and with the Mayors and Comptrollers of both cities, ex-officio, to form the Board of Bridge Trustees.

The Assembly has passed Mr. Bell's bill prohibiting the use of garbage of any description to fill in any lands above water or under water. This act says, as passed:

water. This act says, as passed:

§ 540a. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons, incorporated or unincorporated, to fill in any lands under or above water, within the limits of the City and County of New York, or on any of the islands situated within said limits and under the jurisdiction of said city and county, with garbage, dead animals, or any portions thereof, decaying matter, or any offensive and unwholesome material, or with dirt, ashes or other refuse, when mixed with such garbage, dead animals, or portions thereof, decaying matter, or offensive and unwholesome material. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, on conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, or imprisonment not exceeding six months, or both. The Board of Health is hereby empowered to institute prosecutions and suits for penalties for the violation of the provisions of this act in the name of the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of New York. All acts and parts of acts, inconsistent with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.
§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

The Senate has passed Senator Guy's bill fixing the price of gas in

The Senate has passed Senator Guy's bill fixing the price of gas in New York at \$1.25 per thousand feet. This will bring down the price of gas in the Annexed District to a level with that in the remainder of the city.

The Proposed Board of Registered Brokers.

The Committee of Five appointed by the Board of Directors of the Real Estate Exchange to confer with counsel on the report of the Committee of Fifteen, and whose names were given last week organized by electing Mr. Geo. De Forest Barton, President of the Real Estate Exchange, Chairman, and has since held several meetings. The Committee expects to report in a few weeks suggestions which will meet the wishes of the outside brokers without being in conflict with the laws governing such corporations as the Real Estate Exchange.

Real Estate Notes.

The University Athletic Club, now at No. 55 West 26th street, has entered the field as a probable purchaser of a site for a new clubhouse. President George A. Adee and others have been appointed a committee with that object in view.

The High Bridge Improvement Organization has elected officers as follows: President, Edgar Ketchum; Vice-President, Charles Hilton Brown; Corresponding and Financial Secretary, C. H. Dannewitz; Recording Secretary, Henry S. Clark, and Sergeant-at-Arms, Stephen E. Brown.

West Side lots in abundance will be offered at auction in the Broadway Salesroom on March 7th. The Bernheimer property, on 108th and 109th streets and Columbus avenue, comprising eighty-two lots, will be disposed of on that date by Richard V. Harnett & Co. under a decree in partition.

The sale of a house, this week, on 89th street, between Central Park West and Columbus avenue, must give an atom of encouragement to the builders and operators who own the unsold new dwellings in that street, between the avenues mentioned. There are no less than thirty-two of them on both sides of the way and they are owned by six different individuals or firms.

John R. Foley, who, as a loyal member of the Seventh Regiment, assisted in protecting the property interests of Brooklyn citizens and corporations during the recent strike, has doubtless acquired a valuable knowledge of real estate in our sister city. It should enable him to put through a future deal that will more than recompense him for the hardship experienced while on duty.

There must have been some mistake in the recent announcements of costly improvements to be made in the former Hotel de Logerot property, at 5th avenue and 18th street. A sign on the corner building informs the passer-by that studios, rooms, etc., are for rent, and on the adjoining avenue building, formerly the hotel annex, which is now owned by the Messrs. Sachs, a sign displayed states that it will be leased and alterations made to suit tenants.

City Court Judge James M. Fitzsimons has for some time been an almost daily attendant at the Broadway Salesroom and has closely

watched many of the legal sales, apparently with a view of securing a bargain to his liking. The Judge, who is an extensive property-owner and familiar with real estate values, was seemingly unable to purchase to his satisfaction until Wednesday. On that day he bought under foreclosure the dwelling No. 143 West 131st street, for \$17,050.

Justice Van Brunt, of the Supreme Court, has appointed ex-Judge Charles H. Truax guardian of the children of Mary Fiske Paget (Lady Paget), the daughter of Mrs. Marietta R. Stevens, to protect their interests in a pending action by their grandmother for the sale of the property No. 244 5th avenue and No. 3 East 23d street. property is held in trust by Charles G. Stevens, as executor, for the benefit of Mrs. Stevens during her life under the will of her husband, Paran Stevens, with the remainder over to her children. The grandchildren reside in London, England.

The Church of the Annunciation, on West 14th street, 199.6 feet east of 7th avenue, will be offered under foreclosure on the 19th inst. As stated in The Record and Guide on January 5th, the church and rectory cover a plot 100x103.3, which the trustees value at \$160,000. The indebtedness is over \$41,000. The property will be sold by Auctioneer Andrew L. Soulard, of the new firm of Petty, Soulard & Walker. Mr. Soulard was formerly President of the German-American Real Estate Title Guarantee Co., and on the date mentioned will make his debut as an auctioneer.

The Mutual Life Insurance Co. is reported to have acquired from the Equitable Life Assurance Society, by purchase or exchange, the ownership of No. 22 Liberty street, an old building, on lot 25.6x 76.10xirreg., next but one to the corner of William street, reported sold last week by J. M. Levy. The latest purchases by the Mutual Life Insurance Co. are links in the chain that the company is silently forging and which is intended to eventually embrace all the property contained in the block bounded by Nassau and William, Liberty and Cedar streets, with the possible exception of the Stokes building on the latter.

A Sheriff's jury recently found two verdicts for \$1,000 each, with costs, in suits brought against Frederick Roth by John N. Bajart as administrator, who, in April last, while occupying with his family, apartments in the tenement No. 769 Amsterdam avenue, between 97th and 98th streets, lost two children, whose death it was alleged was caused by the defective condition of the plumbing of which it was claimed the defendant had been notified and failed to have repaired. Roth, who it will be remembered, was formerly associated with a builder named Bornkamp, made no defence, and had previously, on January 2d, transferred the property for a nominal consideration, to Anna C, wife of Otto Wessell.

A sale of three lots on the south side of 119th street, 100 feet west of Manhattan avenue, to John Shields was reported a few days ago. Investigation shows that the buyer filed plans, on January 18th, for three flats to be erected on the lots. An impression prevails that it is necessary for an affidavit of ownership to be attached to applications for permits filed with the Department of Building, and it is difficult to understand how an affidavit could be properly made in this particular case, when no transfer of the property had apparently been made. None has yet been recorded. This is not the only instance noticed of late, where plans have been filed for buildings to be erected on property weeks before title has been passed.

Real Estate Market.

The other sales of vacant land made public, including parcels on which old buildings are standing, show additional purchases amounting to about \$500,000. Combining the two amounts, a total investment is indicated of \$750,000, preliminary to building improvements in the spring and summer. The dwellings sold inimprovethirteen for a total of about \$375,000, bought for occupancy by the purchasers, and six others, exclusive of the Manhattan Railway's investment in 128th street, that can be classed as trades or speculations. This is doubtless a better showing than residence property has made in a mid-winter week for several years and, according to brokers who almost make house selling a specialty, the outlook is excellent for future busines. Prices, it must be admitted, are low, but that does not detract from the fact that there are numerous buyers in the field. Flat and tenement property has done fairly well, but the sales of business parcels embrace but one of importance, that of Nos. 10 and 12 Ann street.

Legal sales only, comprised the week's business at the Broadway Salesroom. Outsiders, however, succeeded in almost equally dividing the honors as buyers with the plaintiffs and other parties interested in the various foreclosures. On Thursday the sale of Nos. 359 and 361 West 117th street was again adjourned by Bryan L. Kennelly, this time to the 14th inst.

At the Real Estate Exchange, on Wednesday, Geo. R. Read withdrew from sale the dwelling No. 212 West 59th street, and the stable No. 213 West 58th street, adjoining in the rear, which were offered as one parcel at public auction. On the following day Richard M. Montgomery made a futile effort to sell the seven-story brick factory and loft building Nos. 224 to 232 Canal street and Nos. 118 to 126 Walker street. Bidders were few and the property was withdrawn on a final bid of \$177,000 offered by a representative of the owners. The auctioneer had previously announced that an offer of \$210,000 for the property at private sale had been refused not many months ago.

REVIEW AND RECORD.

BROOKLYN, FEBRUARY 2, 1895.

The Water Front Deal.

The transfer of practically the entire Brooklyn water front, from above Fulton Ferry to and including the Erie Basin, made on Tuesday to the Brooklyn Wharf and Warehouse Company, by the survivors of the old families of Brooklyn and their representatives, was a memorable one in real estate annals. The parties met in the office of the United States Mortgage Company, at 59 Cedar street, which was to advance in behalf of itself and others, the money on the purchase money mortgage for \$17,500,000, made by the new corporation to secure its bonds. J. S. T. Stranahan was there, representing the Atlantic Dock Company; John T. Martin, Franklin Woodruff, the Pierreponts, William Remsed, David Dows and W. S. P. Prentice were there to part with properties which had been for years in their respective families. Cornell University and the Equitable Life Assurance Society, the McLean Estate, the Beards, Christopher R. Robert, the Nesmiths, Laimbeers, Watsons, Brookmans and others, were present in person or by attorney to deliver their deeds.

The president of the new Warehouse Company, with its attorneys,

Messrs. Bowers & Sands and Davies, Stone & Auerbach; the president of the United States Mortgage Company, with its counsel, Wheeler H. Peckham; the president and solicitor of the Title Guarantee & Trust Company, which was to insure the title to the bond-holders, and William A. Nash, Esq., representing the Corn Exchange Bank, had their hands full to take care of their respective interests and carefully close the great deal. After the deeds had been examined and approved the trust mortgage was delivered, the policy of title insurance handed to the trustee, and its check for \$12,278,000 on the Corn Exchange Bank was delivered to Mr. Thomas A. McIntyre, who had caused the property to be conveyed to the Warehouse Company, and who in turn split up this large sum and handed it to the various vendors with such bonds and preferred stock as they had agreed to take in part payment. The checks were certified by the Corn Exchange Bank, and by a quarter to two the biggest transaction of the kind on record was quietly completed, with much less trouble than is often involved in closing a \$5,000 trade, and the distinguished company dispersed.

Brooklyn in the Legislature.

Senator Reynolds has introduced a bill authorizing the Commissioner of City Works to sewer and otherwise improve the Wallabout Market property at a cost not to exceed \$50,000.

Assemblyman Wray has presented a bill exempting New York avenue, between Fulton and Butler streets; Lewis avenue, between Broadway and Fulton street and Fort Hamilton avenue, from occupation by any railroad without the consent of a majority of the property owners, and providing for the removal of the railroad now occupying Fort Hamilton avenue.

By the provisions of the bill presented by Assemblyman Rockwell, no factory, foundry, engine room or electrical station in the city of Brooklyn shall use soft coal for fuel, under the penalty of a fine of \$100 for each offense.

Assemblyman Rockwell has also presented a bill prohibiting the operation of a railroad on Bedford avenue.

The New Institute Building.

Gen. John B. Woodward, president of the Brooklyn Institute of Arts and Sciences, has been informed by Mayor Schieren that the city is prepared to issue bonds to the amount of \$295,000, as authorized by law, for the erection of the first section of the Museum of Arts and Sciences, in Institute Park, on Prospect Hill. As a condition of the beginning of the work the Mayor stipulates that the architects shall demonstrate beyond all doubt that the section can be erected at a cost within the amount appropriated. The section to be erected will be 210 feet long by about 50 feet deep, three stories and basement in height, constructed of sandstone and brick and absolutely fire-proof. The first story will be occupied by collections showing the history of architecture, sculpture, archæology and kindred arts and sciences. On the second story will be located the scientific collections and the rooms of the departments of the Institute. The third story, which will be lighted from the roof only, will contain the galleries for the exhibition of pictures, engravings, paintings and other works in color and in black and white. The basement will be occupied as a receiving room, etc. Park Commissioner Squier will grade the lands preparatory to the erection of the building.

Notes Gathered Here and There.

The Common Council Committee on Grading and Paving has recommended that the following work be done: Repaving with Belgian blocks at the several costs stated—Park avenue, from Hudson avenue to Broadway, \$128,000; Schenck avenue, from Atlantic to Dumont avenue, \$52,500; Snediker avenue, from Liberty to Arlington avenue, \$29,500; Cleveland street, from Arlington to Atlantic avenue, \$7,600; Hart street, from Wyckoff to St. Nicholas avenue (second-hand Belgian blocks), \$4,200; with asphalt—4th street, from 6th to 7th avenue, \$9,000; St. Mark's avenue, from Bedford avenue, where already done, to the railroad track on Rogers avenue, \$1,500.

The Law Committee reported favorably a resolution that the city lease of the American Sugar Refinery Co., the owner, the pier at the foot of South 5th street, for five years, at a rental of one dollar a year.

Sealed proposals will be received by the Board of Education until Tuesday, February 5, at 4 P. M., for the construction of Public School No. 108. Arlington avenue, corner of Linwood street, and No. 109 Dumont avenue, between Powell and Sackman streets; also for heating and ventilating new school buildings, Nos. 106, 107, 108 and 109.

BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

NEW YORK.

BRICKS.—There is still an absence of features of important character in the general market. Erratic weather conditions make actual consump-Erratic weather conditions make actual consumption very uncertain, and during the period under review it has been light, with operations on many jobs entirely suspended until storms and cold shall be less frequent and annoying. In many cases, too, consumers are fortified with a supply of stock fairly balancing present wants, and that still further reduces an already small demand upon first hand offerings. Again about the only arrivals have been from Keyport, with sales at \$5.25.25\$, probably a fraction better. Long Island makers do not like the ruling rate, and still refuse to ship, and the Hudson River yards remain shut off by the ice. From the covered barge lots available at this point we hear of no sales, and holders are understood to be still asking \$6\$. There is said to be some little demand for a good class of Pales, with buyers ready to pay about the rates ruling for some time past, but they will not put up with any inferior stock.

LATH .- The market is working back into better form again. It is known that all the stock pointform again. It is known that all the stock pointing in this direction was not blown forward by the late easterly gale, but the amount coming is said to be small, and liaving nicely cleaned up the last arrivals, receivers now commence to feel more independent and take a firmer stand, with \$2.00 about a general asking rate. The chances are that it can be sustained and possibly raised a trifle if the market is supplied moderately and slowly with stock, but the majority of the receivers are noticeably indisposed to commit themselves to positively buoyant predictions, because of the disappointments that have followed recent attempts of a similar character. It is thought that very few round wood taths will be offered this year.

LIME.—There is a very natural and commendable effort to take as hopeful a view of the situation as possible, and as matters stand operators are as possible, and as matters stand operators are unable to present much of a really encouraging character. Actual consumption is small; many dealers have sufficient stock to meet current wants and a casual cargo dropping in now and then keeps a supply in first hands, which can be depended upon in case of necessity, while competition is close enough to develop ready sellers whenever buyers put in an appearance, and also to lead to a little drumming for custom that is not calculated to improve the current tone. There are the usual contradictory statements regarding price, with more or less paternal advice as to how the market should be quoted, but 80 and 85 respectively for the two grades are full enough, and for net cash, buyers have been getting accommodations at 5c. per bbl. less.

LUMBER.—A winter lumber market as usual does not amount to much, either in wholesale or retail way. Stuff goes from yard only upon orders

tion. Over bulk parcels negotiations of a satisfactory character are in some instances noted, yet there is less doing than usual at this season, and particularly so in the matter of making engagements for next season's deliveries. Every one is anxious to feel hopeful regarding trade, and there are many who undoubtedly do entertain good ideas of what is to be accomplished during the coming season. Yet there is a certain check of conservatism about entering upon obligations that has a tendency to keep the line of actual operations comparatively narrow.

White Pine of higher grade has been contracted for to a moderate extent, mostly by parties who have a regular run of trade wanting a sort of special selection, and as they were enabled to perfect engagements upon about a basis of last year's rates, it was deemed judicious to close without much delay. Over box and shippers sellers are finding some trouble, not because of any objection to valuation, but in consequence of an uncertain feeling among buyers as to what extent they can fairly commit themselves. Evidently, there is no space ulation in the market since their stock is said to be ocasionally selling, but principally to custom knowing what it is buying and having found a way of using it to advantage.

Yellow Pine seems to have the merit of being in no worse condition, and there is a pretty good idea that the market is right in line to make a gain in full pace with any general improvement of trade. There is special faith expressed in better management of affairs at primal points, and local operators are strongly in hopes that additional encouragement will be found in the character of demand from all ordinary sources.

Hemlock seems to be irregular, some operators complaining while others not only report a very good trade but also an advance of 25 m50c. on some of the recent business accomplished for deliveries within this market boundary. Most dealings are in small lots to satisfy immediate wants. Carolina Pine of high grade still encounters rather indifferent

GENERAL LUMBER NOTES.

THE WEST.

The Northwestern Lumberman presents a partia₁ report of the white pine lumber and shingle pro duct for 1894. Of the districts given the Mississ, ippi river is the most important as affecting market conditions, but the whole may be taken as an indication of the general condition as compared with the preceding year. Speaking in round numbers, the seven districts show a decrease in lumber cut as compared with 1893 of 200,000,000 feet, or a shrinkage of less than 10 per cent. On stocks on hand there is a very slight variation, there being 5,000,000 feet more this year than last, out of a total of 1,500,000,000 feet. In shingles the cut is 775,000,000 last year as against 965,000,000 in 1893, while stocks on hand are 350,000,000 as against 300,000,000 the previous year. On the Mississippi river, the Chicago, St. Paul, Minneapolis & Omaha, and Wolf river, detailed reports of a few mills are missing, but careful estimates have been received, and while these are not published they are considered in the above recapitulation. Figuring on the same basis for the other districts the total cut for 1894 is not far from 7.000,000,000 feet, or the lowest amount since 1885. However, as the reports given include the lower Mississippi river, where several large mills have Igone out of commission, and a large part of the district burned over last summer, the ratio of decrease in the remaining districts will probably be less and the total cut heavier than estimated above.

The effects of the forest fires are especially noticeable on the line of the Chicago, St. Paul, Minneapolis & Omaha, where there was a decrease in the cut as compared with 1893, of about 37,000,000 feet, and about the same shortage of stocks on hand.

On the Mississippi River, including Minneapolis and points above, there was an increase of about 50,000,000 feet in stocks on hand, which indicate hat mill men at Minneapolis have hustled pretty report of the white pine lumber and shingle pro duct for 1894. Of the districts given the Mississ.
