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N a period of such extreme dulness as this, there are few notable changes in the market. The interest aroused by the break in the steel rail pool has about wholly died out and there is nothing to take its place. Possibly the inauguration of President McKinley will be used to stir matters up somewhat, but until the power of the administration to induce Congress to assist it in carrying out its announced tariff and currency policy is made manifest, the change in the occupancy of the White House can have only a moderate effect. The good and the bad features of the situation are to-day the same as they were a week ago, with the former, we think on a calm review of all, more predominating. We are nearing the season for renewed agricultural and commercial activity, when a change for the better in all lines may be naturally looked for. The waiting attitude of the stock market under adverse circumstances is especially significant of the hopeful feeling prevalent.

Y ERY little more than a year ago the world was denouncing "Dr. Jim" for his unwarranted raid into the Transvaal; to-day the same world is applauding King George of Greece for an equally unwarranted raid into Turkish territory, the Island of Crete, without the preliminary courtesy of a declaration of The oppression of a kindred people was the excuse in each case, but it does not have the same force in the one as in the other. Singularly, too, those who are now raising an outcry against the interference of the Great Powers with the Grecian raid, are those who are generally found glib and voluble on the subjects of the barbarity of war and the beauties of peace. If these people restrained their hysteria and thought for a moment, they would see that Europe would very soon be plunged into war, if any little country that thinks or pretends it has a mission to save distressed peoples acts in defiance of custom and usage, established to give some form of decency to national quarrels. For instance, the ambition of Greece is not confined to the acquisition of Crete; if it was it would have remained still, because the union of the island to the kingdom was certain to occur in a short time. The Athenian politicians who are throwing the firebrand that is now making Europe anxious, are no doubt disappointed that Macedonia and Thessaly are not now in a condition of rebellion against Turkish rule. In teaching Greece that crusades are dangerous and out of date the Great Powers are serving the interests of civilization in, as far as possible, avoiding the occasion for war, and it is utterly surprising that advocates of universal love and peace do not see this. Further, when the Greek has chastized the Turk and taken away as much of the latter's territory as possible, who is to keep the former in order. The modern Greek does not lead in civilization; he is as capable of atrocity as the Turk. Greece has produced some fine specimens of brigandage the horrors of whose doings thrilled the world not so many years ago, and to-day stands before the world as a repudiator of its debt. On the other hand, it is one of the best signs of the times that with the temptations that the present condition of Turkey presents for a sensational policy on the part of any one of the Great Powers, that their diplomacy is directed entirely to moderation and the maintenance of cordial relations. The result of this policy is being anxiously awaited, and until it is apparent there is not likely to be any change in the European commercial situation, which, however, is not bad in spite of the so-called war-cloud.

E XCOMMUNICATION by the Department of Street Cleaning is rather too severe a punishment for the quite venial crime of disagreeing with one of its wishes. This, however, is what is threatened to a large section of the West Side because of its refusal to sanction the establishment of a dump at West 96th street, and within the territory where dumps are expressly forbidden by act of the legislature. Colonel Waring, in de-

claring that ashes and refuse will not be collected in the offending district has, in view of all the circumstances including the act referred to, exceeded any privilege his office confers upon him. The Riverside Park and Drive were laid out at very large cost to the city to afford means of recreation to all its citizens, free from any annoyance or inconvenience. The special character that these gave the contiguous territory caused it to be built up in an expensive style and to be made the finest residence portion of New York, and as a consequence the largest contributor among the resident districts to the income of the city. For these reasons the position of the West End Association and of its President, Mr. Cyrus Clark, in declining to assist Colonel Waring in breaking up the exclusive character of this region and property by the placing of a dump midway of its length on the river, is perfectly proper and justifiable. The matter is simply one of a moderate increase in horse and man hire and the West Side can very reasonably ask that this be incurred. In protecting their own comfort and interest, the West Siders who oppose Colonel Waring are also protecting those of the very large public gathered from all parts of the city, who use the Drive and Park, because the fetid business of a dump cannot, no matter what is said to the contrary, be carried on at any point on the Hudson River front between 72d and 125th streets, without seriously and unpleasantly mitigating their pleasures.

#### Real Estate and The Auction Market.

OF late there has been an undercurrent of talk about a reconsolidation of the two real estate auction rooms. No official substantiation of the rumors is obtainable, probably because the reports of a reconcilation are anybody's and everybody's expression of the logic of the situation, and are not due in any degree to a contemplated change of policy by the administrations of the rival organizations.

Many a good thing, however, is not true, and these rumors ought to be correct. We all recognize that the "split" in the auctioneers' ranks has been a substantial injury to the whole real estate market, not to their interests alone, but to all others. Of course, too much must not be attributed to the division. Declining prices, small purses, few investors, in short, all the evils of these sad, bad days, would no doubt have come upon us had no dissension disturbed the peace of Liberty street. On the other hand, the present apathy of the auction market (which reacts upon other departments) is unquestionably the result in some measure of the loss of prestige and stability which befell the auction business when it was split into two warring camps.

The auctioneer's stand should be a sort of guarantee, an outlet or safety valve for real estate, where the market, whatever that market may be, for property may be quickly and definitely reached. Everybody recognizes that real estate to-day would be an infinitely more popular form of investment were it possible to trade in it quicker than existing machinery permits. The auction market is something of the needed ready outlet and obviously when that market was disorganized and disrupted, all real estate suffered thereby.

One may say: Investors don't care a rap where they buy the thing they want. Twenty auction rooms wouldn't hurt the auction business if there were plenty of buyers in the market. That is true-in a measure. But it isn't the whole case. The same line of argument could be used to prove that even the twenty auction rooms were not necessary, nor for that matter, the greater part of the existing machinery for dealing in real es-As a matter of fact, prestige and appearance and what goes therewith do count for a great deal in the affairs of men. Even the clearest headed are influenced by considerations which tested by a rough logic ought not perhaps to have any weight with them. So, although no doubt investors would buy real estate if they wanted it, wherever offered, still on the other hand it is equally true that they would buy all the more readily if not all the more largely, were the market concentrated, put, as it were, before them and maintained there conspicuously. Besides, in good times almost anything "goes." It is in dull, hard times like these, that the nicer calculations tell. A flourishing, imposing auction room, with an energetic, united membership, would be a public advertisement of the highest value for real estate in general. If this be doubted, look at the Stock Exchange. People might buy and sell as many bonds and stocks if it were disrupted and its present prominence cut into half by a factional division, but that they would is not at all likely. The securities traded in at that institution gain a great deal from the immense power the Exchange has for focussing the attention of people upon its doings and upon the particular things with which it is concerned. Real estate ought to be benefited in like manner by the Real Estate Exchange. It is not. The functions of the exchange are not as extensive as they should be, and the division of the auction market further minimizes its power to centralize public attention upon real estate. The exchange is sometimes talked of as though its chief office was to "get together" the brokers and other members of the profession. That, no doubt, is a most important and desirable and indispensable operation, but after all isn't the chief business of the institution this: To "get together" the public, interest them in real estate and keep it conspicuously before them as an advantageous form of investment. To this end, nothing is done at present. Instead, there is torpor, and where there is not torpor there is disunion, which gives us two auction rooms and a dwindling interest in the market. We wish, therefore, that there were some truth in the talk of reconsolidation. If it isn't true why not make it so?

W HAT kind of a job is this? Mr. H. T. Andrews is sponsor for a bill introduced into the Assembly authorizing the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to appropriate \$30,000 for the expenses of a commission to be appointed by the Mayer to revise the building laws of this city. The commission is to consist of five persons each of whom is to receive \$3,500 for his services. Do Mr. Andrews and the Assembly know that a committee of the most representative character has been at work for over a year revising the laws relating to buildings in New York, and that there has been no opportunity yet of considering its work? The report of this committee would have been embodied in a bill and sent to Albany this year, but for the fact that the ground covered was embraced in the jurisdiction of the Greater New York Commission, and it was felt that it would be unwise and inexpedient to offer it in opposition to any suggestions the Commission might make. The results of the Committee's work were placed at the disposal of the Committee on Draft, but that body very judiciously concluded not to embarrass itself with so complex and technical a thing as a building law and contented itself with suggesting the general lines for controlling building operations in the Greater New York, which have already been described in these pages. That material, however, is still in existence and can be obtained whenever a remodelling of the building laws of New York is necessary and timely. The new charter empowers the Municipal Assembly to appoint a Commission for revising and consolidating these laws, and, in view of this provision of the charter, and of the existence of the valuable report previously referred to, it would be a scandalous waste of money to create the commission provided for in Mr. Andrews' bill, before the new Municipal Assembly can act, or before the value of the report of the body known as the Committee on Revision of the Building Laws is established.

#### Work of the Law Makers.

Albany, Feb. 25.—The Senate and the Assembly Committee on Cities gave their first hearing to-day on the Greater New York charter; which was presented to the Senate and the Assembly on Monday night.

Speeches were made by Benjamin F. Tracy, ex-Mayor Thomas F. Gilroy and Seth Low, explaining and defending the document. Gen. Tracy defended the idea of having two legislative chambers on the ground that its members would have such tremendous responsibilities that it could not be believed that they would ever be bribed. If the \$60,000,000 budget of the city should be dispensed corruptly the Legislature could abolish that body of the local Legislature which had shown itself to be bribeable. Ex-Mayor Gilroy said that New York assumed the financial burdens of Brooklyn and Long Island City; which seemed to please the Senators and Assemblymen from these cities.

The chairmen of the Senate and the Assembly Committees on Cities say that several hearings will be given on the charter, and persons who have criticisms to offer upon it will be heard. New bills in the Senate, with the names of their introducers, are

New bills in the Senate, with the names of their introducers, are the following:

Senator Koehler.—Introductory No. 569, providing that a commission of six persons shall be appointed by the Mayor of New York to construct a permanent bridge over the East River, between New York and Long Island City, with the centre pier resting on Blackwell's Island. The commission is authorized to take by condemnation proceedings or purchase such land as it needs for the bridge in New York and in Long Island City. One-half of the cost of the bridge is to be borne by Queens County and one-half by the city of New York. Of course, the Commissioners are also authorized to buy any franchise for a bridge at this location.

Senator Guy.—Int. No. 593, providing for the construction of a viaduct between 132d street and the Harlem River, leading to the bridge across the Harlem River.

Senator Page.—Intr. 573, giving the Park Department jurisdiction over west side streets, mentioned last week in a similar measure in the Assembly.

Senator Guy.—Introductory No. 553, amending Chap. 57 of the Laws of 1896 to change the location of the Grand Boulevard and Concourse in some particulars. By this bill Parcel A is to begin at a point in the southern line of East 161st street, distant 656.52 feet

easterly from the intersection of the southern line of East 161st street with the eastern line of Jerome avenue. Parcel B begins at a point in the northern line of East 161st street, distant 719.21 feet easterly from the intersection of the northern line of East 161st street with the eastern line of Jerome avenue. Parcel C is to begin at the intersection of the northern line of East 161st street with the eastern line of Walton avenue, and Parcel C is described as beginning at the eastern line of Walton avenue with the southern line of East 161st street.

The important new bills introduced into the Assembly, with the names of their introducers, are:

Mr. H. T. Andrews.—Introductory 906, authorizing Mayor Strong to appoint five competent persons as commissioners to prepare and report a revision and consolidation of the building laws for New York City. Of the Commissioners one shall be an architect, one a builder, one an architectural engineer, one a lawyer and one a fire underwriter. The Commissioners are to report by Jan. 1, 1898, and \$30,000 is appropriated to pay their expenses. Each of the Commissioners is to receive a salary of \$3,500 yearly.

Mr. Austin.—Introductory No. 907, providing for the enlargement at an expense of \$500,000 of American Museum of Natural History.

Mr. H. T. Andrews.—Introductory No. 915, forbidding the placing of any high board fences, excepting open wood or picket fences, on the front of any lot or lots in the city of New York and to have all high board fences now standing removed before July 1, 1897. All advertising fences or signs placed on any lot of land are to stand at least 30 feet from the front of the lot.

Mr. H. T. Andrews.—Introductory No. 887, providing for the erection of enclosures around buildings faced with terra cotta or brick, while they are in course of erection, for the protection of pedestrians from falling tools or debris.

Mr. Mathewson.—Introductory Nos. 965 and 967, authorizing the alteration of sections 10 and 16 of the final maps and profiles of the 23d and 24th Wards.

Mr. Gilleland.—Introductory No. 948, vacating certain local assessments for constructing the westerly approach to McComb's Dam Bridge over the Harlem River and making the expenses a city charge.

Albany, Feb. 27.—Assemblyman Austin, Chairman of the Assembly Committee on Cities, said to-day: "After our hearing this week on the various bills to regulate the height of buildings in New York, at which the bills sent here by the architects and by the Board of Trade and Transportation, and introduced by Senator Page and myself were considered, I came to the opinion, judging by the observations of fellow members of the Legislature, that no high buildings act would be passed this year by the Legislature, but that this whole subject would be left for legislation by the authorities of Greater New York. The charter of Greater New York gives the local authorities control over the constuction of high buildings, and I think it can be safely left to them."

On Wednesday afternoon last the Committee on Cities of the Assembly gave an important and interesting hearing in the Assembly Chamber at Albany on several of the bills introduced in this session of the Legislature, relating to building matters in this city. There were present at the hearing and taking an active part in the discussion: Messrs. Floyd Clarkson, James W. Gerard, William J. Fryer, Cornelius O'Reilly, John P. Leo, Richard Deeves, Ernest F. Eidlitz, Charles H. Israels, J. Waldo Smith, Samuel McMillan and Julius Mayer, with his assistant, Mr. E. S. Hosmer, the two latter as attorneys representing the Building Department.

The first bill considered was one that has passed the Senate and is known as Senate bill No. 508, which proposes to increase the height for non-fireproof buildings to seventy-five ft. instead of the present limitation of seventy feet established last year. Mr. Leo asked that that bill be not reported by the Assembly Committee, but that the limitation of heights be restored to eighty-five feet, and that such change be incorporated in one of the other bills which proposes to regulate the heights of buildings. Mr. Deeves earnestly urged that eighty-five feet be made the limit for non-fireproof buildings of every description. Mr. O'Reilly argued that a height of eighty-five feet ought to be allowed when slow burning construction is used. Mr. Fryer urged that the Senate bill be agreed to, for the reason that the Mayor had approved last year of the seventy-foot limit, and that to attempt to restore the height to eighty-five ft. might bring the disapproval of the Mayor; while to change the height from seventy to seventy-five ft. would probably meet with Lis approval, and overcome the builders' objection to seventy feet a being an impracticable limit within which to get six stories with be heights of ceilings that are common in modern buildings, and also for the additional reason that eighty-five feet for non-fireproof buildings is higher than the limit ought to be. Mr. Fryer also showed that the limitation for non-fireproof buildings stood at seventy feet in 1885, then in 1887 was changed to eighty feet, again changed in 1892 to eighty-five feet, and last of all in 1896 changed to seventy feet. Mr. Mayer stated that the Building Department had no objections to the increase of height from seventy to seventy-five feet, but were opposed to any further increase for the height of non-fireproof buildings. No announcement was made as to the probable action of the Committee on this bill, as such matters are taken up in executive session at the close of a hearing.

The second bill considered was Assembly bill No. 391, which requires that buildings exceeding eighty-five feet or more in height shall have, during their construction, an enclosure of the front of same for the protection of pedestrians. Mr. Ernest Eidlitz, on behalf of the societies which he specially represented, opposed this bill, and asked for a postponement of the hearing on that bill, by reason of some misunderstanding that bills only relating to the heights of buildings were to be discussed at this hearing. Mr. Deeves opposed any postponement and defended the bill. The Chairman of the Committee refused to postpone the hearing, but agreed to accept a brief from Mr. Eidlitz before action was taken on the bill.

The third bill in order of hearing was Assembly bill No. 762, which proposes to increase the membership of the Board of Examiners in the Building Department by one representative from the Builders' League. The opposition to this bell came from Mr. Eidlitz, as representative of the Mason Builders' Association and the Building Trades' Club, and from Mr. Mayer, representing the Department of Buildings. Mr. Leo, as President of the Builders' League, defended his association, and explained why, in his judgment, it was better entitled to a representation than any of the organizations referred to by Mr. Eidlitz.

The fourth bill taken up was one introduced by Mr. Husted in the Assembly, No. 1049, which proposes to allow a greater height for dwelling houses and apartment houses than was established by the special Act of 1885, which put a limitation of height on dwellings and apartment houses of seventy feet upon streets not exceeding sixty feet in width, and eighty feet upon streets or avenues exceeding sixty feet in width. After a protracted discussion on the merits of this bill and an explanation of how the Court of Appeals had eliminated hotels from the operations of the law and how modern hotel-apartment houses were not subject to the restrictions of the law, and that therefore the law itself was practically a dead letter statute, except in its aplication to tenement houses and apartment houses proper, the Committee allowed a few amendments to be made to the bill. These amendments were to require two staircases in all tenement or apartment houses more than forty-five feet in width, one of which staircases must be remote from the elevator shafts; and another of the amendments being that such buildings should be in every way subject to existing laws relating to such character of buildings.

The remaining bills, the ones relating to the limitation of heights of buildings were then taken up, Mr. Austin's bill No. 17, which limits the heights of buildings to twenty times the square root of the width of the street, and bill No. 868, submitted by the Board of Trade and Transportation, which limits the heights of buildings to two hundred feet, were principally in evidence. Senate bill No. 170, which proposes to limit the heights of buildings to fifteen times the square root of the street, and a bill introduced by Assemblyman Andrews, a few days ago, for the appointment of a paid Commissioner to consider the subject of limiting the heights of buildings and report a suitable law was also referred to Mr. Waldo Smith, the President of the Board of Trade and Transportation, which formulated bill No. 868.

Mr. Clarkson opposed the enactment of any such restriction, on the ground that values of all property would be decreased, and therefore the taxable income of the city would be reduced, and would result in the territory outside of New York being called upon to enlarge their proportion of taxes to meet the expenses of the State. Mr. Clarkson further pointed out a defect in all of this year's building limitation Acts in that, while a building when situated on a corner formed by the intersection of two streets, one of which a narrower than the other, the front on the narrower street may be built up to the height of the front on the wider street to a distance of one hundred feet, yet when a building is situated in the center of a block and running through from a wide street to a narrower one on the rear, no provisions are made whatever for the height of the front portion to be carried through to the entire depth of the building.

Mr. Fryer called attention to the fact that Chapter II. of the new charter contains a section looking to the restriction of the height of buildings through the authority to be given to the Municipal Assembly to regulate and restrict the height of buildings, providing for public hearings in reference thereto, and further providing that no ordinance restricting the heights shall be passed, unless aproved beforehand by the Board of Public Improvements. He asked that, as New York was soon to be given home rule in the matter of building regulations, no action on restricting the heights be taken at this session of the Legislature and in any event, that any such law so passed should only be operative in the interim between the date of its passage and the coming in of the charter powers.


#### News in Brief.

Theodore W. Davis has been appointed a Park Avenue Commissioner in the place of Almerin H. Lighthall resigned.

Mayor Strong has approved the bill authorizing the building of a new Hall of Records, and it has now gone to the Governor, who, there is good reason to believe, will sign it without delay.

Forty-six assessors of Westchester County have been indicted for failing to assess personal property within their jurisdiction, whereby the burdens of the county have been unduly thrown upon real property.

by the owners of property and residents in the northwestern portion of the city.

The Fire Commissioners yesterday heard the objections of nearby property owners to the location of a hook and ladder company on West 74th street, between Columbus and Amsterdam avenues. The suggestions of the objectors were referred to Commissioner La Grange and Chief Bonner for report.

A movement is on foot to secure an improvement on the antiquated and inadequate station of the Manhattan Elevated railroad at 3d avenue and 129th street. It is expected that the Northside Board of Trade will take the matter up with the same success that they had last year in their agitation for through trains

The Board of Examiners, at their last meeting adopted a resolution presented by Mr. McMillan, expressing their deep regret "at the recent death of William P. Esterbrook, former Superintendent of Buildings, one of the most faithful, upright and competent officials ever in the service of the City of New York." The resolution signed by each member of the Board has been forwarded to the family of the deceased.

Col. Waring, comparing the efficient street cleaning in this city with the inefficient work in Brooklyn, remarked recently: "Consolidation would insure to Brooklyn these great improvements, and the New York member of the co-partnership would pay for it." Gen. Collis, discussing consolidation, said: "There has been too much sentiment and too little business in this whole thing."

Gen. Collis submitted to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment yesterday a plan for an approach to Third Avenue Bridge which calls for the taking of 80 feet on the east side of 3d avenue between 128th and 130th streets. The plan most favored takes strip from the west side, and makes a direct approach to the bridge. Mayor Strong said he favored a direct approach if one could be had. No action was taken.

Mayor Strong will give public hearings, commencing at 2 p. m. of Monday next on bills passed by the Legislature for the following purposes: Authorizing the laying out of a park in the 23d and 24th wards; relating to the office of Register in the County of New York; authorizing the Board of Revision and Correction of Assessments to determine and award damages for changing the grade of Vanderbilt avenue east from 179th street to Samuel street.

The Supreme Court-Appellate Division has held in the case of Louis Spero v. Catherine Schultz, an action to compel performance of a contract, that the rule of law does not go so far as to

require the owner of the land to assert exclusive ownership in a wall in order to prevent the rights of a beam owner from ripening into a title to the wall by adverse possession. The mere fact that a person inserts the beams of his house into his neighbor's wall does not thereby make it a party wall. There must be also permission or agreement to give presumptive right to the party use of the wall.

Augustus W. Cruikshank died on Tuesday last at the Hotel Majestic, and the news of his death was received with pronounced regret in realty circles. Mr. Cruikshank was born about 50 years ago, and may be said to have been all his life connected with the real estate business, having commenced his career in the house founded by his grandfather 100 years ago. His record in the profession is too well known to need mention here. He helped materially to maintain the Cruikshank record for business ability and integrity, and his death creates a void in the realty world which cannot be easily or readily filled.

Amended plans for the roof garden on the pier at the foot of East 3d street have been approved by the Dock Board. The original plans, which were sanctioned by the board, were thrown out by the Building Department, and alterations providing for an iron floor were made to meet the objections of Superintendent Constable. The new roof garden will be a steel and iron structure, 302x52 feet and two stories in height. It will cost \$60,000. Work on its construction will begin on April 15, and it is expected that the garden will be opened to the public on the evening of July 4. The work was designed by Architect E. H. Kendall, assisted by the well-known architectural engineer, Alex. Rice Mc-Kim, of No. 106 East 23d street.



# Correspondence.

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THE RELIABILITY OF STEEL. To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

Dear Sir:—In your issue of January 16th you have a letter from "Architect" on the "Reliability of Steel," which shows some lack of knowledge about what has been done and is being done to ascertain the quality of the steel going into many of the large buildings.

Specifications are carefully prepared by many of the architects, or by engineers associated with them, based upon results of tests made practically at the present time. "Architect" is probably not aware that there are engineering firms who have for the last decade made the testing and inspection of structural steel and iron their sole business, and by whom the steel of many of the large buildings is tested. Under this method, where every heat or blow of the steel is tested and every piece inspected at the mill and the workmanship is supervised constantly at the shop, the material received at the building is much more reliable than the wood or cast iron of former days.

I agree with "Architect" that it is not enough "to know we get the size," essential as that is, but, with proper precautions, we can know a great deal more. He says, "steel is practically new, has not had a fair trial and in reality the tests now made of it have failed." Compared with wood, it has been in use but a short time, but the number of tests made of steel exceed the num-

#### COMPO-BOARD,

Compo-board, as its name implies, is a composition board. It consists of narrow wooden slats, which are firmly held together by an air-tight cement, and are covered on each side with a heavy damp-proof building paper. These are firmly forced to-gether by an enormous pressure, so that the outside of the paper has a firm surface, which will take paint or stain as well as a pine board. It is used as a substitute for lath and plaster, but is also useful for various other purposes, such as partitions ing closets, pantries and the walls and ceiling of summer houses, cottages, camps, gymnasiums, also large factories or shops, as well as for lining barns, henneries, stables and outhouses to obtain greater protection from the cold and draught, and for various other purposes. All boards are 4 ft. wide and square on the edges, and the principal lengths are 8, 9, 10, 12 and 16 feet. thickness is only about 1/4 inch, and the board weighs about 1 pound to the square foot. With a single board from 32 to 64 square feet can be covered, and as each sheet forms a solid mass, it is possible to cover the walls and ceiling of an entire house at short notice, and the carpenter can contract for an entire frame house from foundation to roof. Houses may be occupied immediately.

The weight of a building is decreased about one-fourth; rooms are about 1 inch higher and 2 inches wider and longer, and there are no subsequent losses or damages same as are often caused by falling plaster.

#### ELECTRICAL WORK.

#### CERAMIC MOSAIC FLOORING.

A sample slab of ceramic mosaic flooring is now on view at the annual exhibition of the American Architectual League, No. 215 West 57th street. It is of rich design, blending colors both soft and brilliant, and each piece is perfectly round. In laying the floors the interstices surrounding the circles are filled with cement, so that when the floor is finished, each individual tile is firmly imbedded in the retaining material. With floors of ordinary encaustic or vitrified tiles, the bond is at the back alone, there being practically no cement between the joints, with the result that under heavy traffic the tiles soon loosen. Vitrified tiles are exceedingly slippery when much walked upon. In round tiles the joints impart sufficient roughness to the surface to insure a firm foothold, though the tiles themselves are harder than marble and equally smooth.

The circular tiles are made in more than 100 colors, affording unlimited opportunity for the production of pleasing and artistic effects. This is abundantly illustrated by the apparently endless variety of designs displayed in the warerooms of Messrs. Davis, Reid & Alexander, No. 18 East 15th street, who are the exclusive manufacturers of the circular ceramic tiles. The tiles are non-porous and more durable than marble or tiles, while cheaper

Among the architects who have specified this flooring for important buildings are Messrs. Jardine, Kent & Jardine, Ralph S. Townsend, Robert Maynicke, Hubert, Pierson & Hoddick, Stephenson & Greene and Detweller & Melendy. C. W. & A. A. Stoughton specified them for the Brooklyn City Hall, and W. Wheeler Smith used nearly 20,000 square feet in the Sloane Maternity Hospital, which was erected by the Vanderbilt family. The Springler Building on Union square, designed by W. H. Hume & Son, is being paved with them at the present time.

#### A BIG CONTRACT.

Henry R. Worthington has just been awarded a contract by the City of Chicago, covering six vertical triple expansion direct-acting high duty pumping engines, each of 20,000,000 gallons daily capacity. This contract amounts to \$437,600, and is the largest contract for water works' pumping machinery ever placed in this country. The above six engines each have a daily pumping capacity of 20,000,000 gallons, against a head of 150 feet, and will be supplied with steam at a pressure of 140 lbs. to the square inch. The engines will each be of 530 horse-power. This company is also building three vertical triple expansion direct-acting high duty pumping engines for the City of Brooklyn, N. Y., under a contract amounting to \$385,000. These engines each have a daily capacity of 20,000,000 gallons, to be delivered against a head of 168 feet, and the steam will be supplied at a pressure of 135 lbs. to the square inch, each engine being of 600 horse-power.

NEW YORK.

BRICKS.—As was expected the continued mild weather has opened navigation on the Hudson River so that it has been possible to bring several tows in from Haverstraw, the receipts for the week being in the neighborhood of 40 barges. Demand, however, has shown no material increase and of the number of barges arrived barely a dozen have been worked off. The deliveries of brick from barges under call have also been very moderate. No important changes have occurred in values. The sales made have been at \$4.50@4.75, and the quotation of \$5.00 has been dropped. There has been a steady market for pale brick. There have been arrivals from Jersey and Long Island, but as demand has been fairly good prices for desirable stock have been maintained, closing at \$2.25@2.50. Navigation has opened from Jersey and there has been an increased offering of supplies, resulting in decline of prices to \$3.75@4.25, according to quality.

At a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Consolidated Brick, held on Tuesday, Feb. 24, a complete change was made in the business management of the company. Mr. A. S. Staples, of Rondout, N. Y., was elected president and Mr. Geo. S. Shultz manager and treasurer. Mr. Shultz has long been connected with the brick market, having done bus ness as a commission merchant for a long number of years. Now that he has connected himself with the Consolidated Brick Company he has given up his former commission business, intending to give his entire attention to the affairs of the company.

HARDWARE.-The recent break in steel rails and the unsettled condition of the pig iron mar-ket which followed have had rather unfavorable ket which followed have had rather unfavorable influence upon the general market, inasmuch as it has had a tendency to cause a repressing of business, buyers showing a disposition to hold off and await further development. The competition among manufacturers for business, it is reported, has been quite sharp and on some lines of goods a weakening of prices has followed. Jobbers state that they have been having only a very moderate trade, although the recent mild weather has helped business to an extent; still buyers have shown a very conservative policy and have not been inclined to place orders of any magnitude. The result has been that some jobbers have shown and they are now selling some goods on rather narrow margins. Some complaint has been heard over collections.

We quote at \$12.00@13.00 for old iron rails; \$11.00@11.50 for No. 1 wrought scrap; \$9.50@10.50 for cast scrap; \$9.50@10.50 for old car wheels, and \$5.00@9.00 for borings, stove plate, etc. Latterly there has been an active market for steel rails. The rupture of Steel Rail pool resulted in a sharp break in prices to \$17. Subsequently the brisk demand both from the home trade and for export caused a recovery to \$20 f. o. b. mill and this price the market closed firm. It is estimated that the sales of steel rails since the break in the pool has amounted to about \$900.000, or more than was sold during the year of 1896. The sales include, so it has been stated, about 50,000 for export to England.

LATH .- There have been moderately large ar rivals during the past week, including 500,000 from Maine and about 1,800,000 from the provinces. The continued mild weather has stimulated demand to some extent so that the offerings have been fairly well absorbed and prices have held fairly steady. The sales made have been at \$1.60@1.65, closing with \$1.65 the asking price and \$1.60 bid.

LIME.—The market for the past week has been without changes or new developments of an important nature. There have been no arrivals of importance, but demand has been only limited and supplies held here have been sufficient to fill all wants. Prices have not changed, ruling steady at 65c. for common Rockland and 75c. for finishing do. A limited amount of business has been transacted in State Jointa lime at \$1.00, but there have been no offerings of common and the price quoted has been wholly nominal.

LUMBER.-The developments in the market for the week have not been of an important nor in-teresting nature. The volume of business tranteresting nature. The volume of business transacted from first hands has continued small, but sellers have shown no disposition to hurry trade, and there has continued a fairly good undertone to the market generally. Reports from the yards state the continued mild weather has had a beneficial influence upon trade with them and that they are having a slightly better runs of orders. A subject that has latterly attracted some attention is a proposed agreement among the dealers in yellow pine similar to the one in force among the dealers in Eastern spruce, with the exception that any schedule of 35,000 feet or more shall constitute a wholesale order. It is apparently meeting, however, with considerable objection.

Nothing of interest has transpired in the local market for Eastern spruce. There have been a few small arrivals, but they have been sold previous to arrival. Reports from Maine quoted firm market and advices from Bangor stated that English orders in the market for dealers amounted to 8,000,000 feet, all of which has been placed at full values. A local trade journal states that it is reported that the New York Building Department propose to adopt, at an early date, a rule compelling the use of spruce instead of hemlock joist in all frame buildings. It is claimed that this move is made with a view to securing greater strength and less inflammable material.

The markets for pine have not changed in any important particulars. There have been no trades of moment in white pine and while dealers are beginning to look for an increase to be shown on the part of buyers they show no disposition to hurry the market, and as supplies are limited, particularly of the better grades, prices have been well maintained. Yellow pine has been taken in only very moderate quantities, but a fairly good tone has dominated the market as regarded prices. Reports from the Southwest have been generally of a satisfactory nature and the export demand in the gulf districts has been reported as fairly good.

A firm market has been reported for hemlock. Demand has been reported as fairly good and the tendency of values has been to broaden and in some instances slightly better prices have been obtained. Cypress has moved slowly, but no changes have occurred in values.

The market for hardwoods has appeared to be in a fairly encouraging position. No rush of orders have been reported, still the tendency, of demand has been to increase and, as the season advances a good trade is anticipated. Oak at present is meeting with a fair trade and there has been some call for poolar. Mahogany has also been me

way of common trade oak sales are in small lots. Considerable ash at that point has been sold, because purchasers could buy it at concessions in price. At Buffalo there is a fresh movement in flooring. Oak is moving fairly. Orders are increasing at St. Louis. Caution, however, prevails among the large buyers, and few sizeable contracts are being placed at the mills. At Boston hardwoods are in a little better request.

The "Northwestern Lumberman" says of northern pine:

"The spring trade is slow in rising. In some of the larger cities building has revived to a degree, which has started up a new call for lumber. This is true of Chicago, St. Louis, Minneapolis and other western points. Tonawanda reports a slowly enlarging demand, mostly on small orders to tide over the interim prior to the opening of navigation. But trade throughout the east is not equal to the usual volume at this time in February, though weather conditions are mild and favorable to an early movement. Salesmen in the west are finding few and scattering orders. The country retail trade is not yet ready to buy. The late cut in rail rates from northwestern points to Missouri River was instantly taken advantage of to drum for orders, but the result was meager. Now that rates have been restored, the incentive is cut off. It seems as if neither reductions of rates or prices in this year a sufficient inducement for dealers to buy lumber unless they are in immediate need of it. At Minneapolis manufacturers are still holding firmly for prices in spite of lack of demand. At lake points a like disposition is manifest on the part of manufacturers. Wholesale dealers in this city and at Lake Erie points are unable to induce the mill men to budge from their position on the price question, and the dealers are equally determined not to pay the prices asked. The effect of this attitude on either side is to cause a dead lock in the bulk stock market. Few contracts for either logs or lumber are being made, and the market at mill points is stagnant.
