THE DEWEY HOLIDAYS.

In consequence of the Dewey Holidays Friday and Saturday next week, and the closing of the city offices, the Record and Guide will be issued on Thursday morning.

N OW that the Stock Market has had its break and the healing rise has come to prevent panic, the question to be considered is what is the outlook for the near future? The break itself and its peculiarities will be found fully treated in another column. Generally, a smashing of prices in any direction is followed by a rapid reactionary rise, and it in turn by a slow decline which is sometimes more severe in its effect than was the first break. At the moment the excellent condition of the country's business and the probability that it has not yet developed itself to its fullest extent may make the after effects of this break less severe than that of others has been. Certainly the events of the past week or two will discourage speculation for some time to come. As money will, in all probability, be fairly dear for the balance of this year that will be another obstacle to activity in the Stock Market. By far the best feature in the situation is found in the many instances in which securities are now giving returns to their holders which a couple of years ago were among the nonproducing class. This gives the market as a whole an extent of sustaining power that it has not possessed for a good many years. Still the great sustainer is money, and unless that is readily forthcoming values are sure to shrink. In this connection it is pleasing to note that this country has renewed its ability to draw supplies from Europe, and that Europe recognizes this fact and is prepared to see it operate. That exchange brokers make light of the small shipment that has already been arranged for is easily explained on the theory that no man wants to lay bare his own business. It is not so much what we are about to immediately receive as what we apparently can obtain in an emergency that is significant.

REYFUS has been relieved of the consequences of a crime all the world, less a small fraction, believes he did not commit, and General Gallifet has officially "closed the incident." may do for the French army, but the world at large will give the injured man the chance to prove his innocence that his country refused him. For all his Podsnappian vigor, Gen. Gallifet and the French army will have to hear a good deal of Dreyfus yet. Still, the guns refuse to go off in South Africa, and latest reports suggest that President Kruger is demonstrating to his people their complete isolation from outside help in an endeavor to bring them to see the necessity of a yielding compromise. From the confusion of statement regarding the Transvaal contention it has been almost impossible to discover an ethical side to the British position, but looking through the dust raised by the contentients it appears to be this: That in the Boer attitude there is an obstacle to the merging and intercommunication of the people of South Africa that is absolutely necessary to the progress of the country as a whole, and which if not removed must inevitably produce trouble and the shedding of blood. From that point of view it as much as if Mormonism, leaving out its polygamy, had been allowed to maintain Utah as territory exclusive to the populations pressing around it. Whatever exception may taken to the justice of the British case, as thus stated, it is certwinly held by the best minds that support the demands on the Transvaal. Turning to European business, the impression is obtaining corrency that it is now at high-water mark, and speculation is engaged in determining when the turn of the tide will come. The return of British government revenue for the year 1898-9 were most satisactory; income tax alone, notwithstanding

a generous scale of abatements in several classes, produced nearly a million sterling more than it did in the previous year. number of other interesting figures are available, but for which, however, we cannot find space in a summary review like this. Agitations for increase of pay among workpeople are as noticeable abroad as they are here; shipping interests in England and coal mining in France are particularly affected by these. prospects for money in Germany are creating as much anxiety as they did at this time last year, with the hope of aid from this side of the Atlantic, which existed for good reasons then, now absent. To relieve the acuteness of the demand for manufacturing iron and steel a temporary suspension of the duties thereon has been suggested by the protectionist "Kolner Volks Zeitung." It is stated that the union of manufacturers of half-finished iron and steel have been able to promise only 38% of the amount of metal required by customers for the first half of 1900. In Austria a good harvest has brought about a change in favor of the textile industries of the country. The Argentine proposal in relation to the currency is to convert paper into gold at a rate equivalent to a premium of 1274 on the latter. If adopted, the date of conversion is to be fixed by decree. Australian affairs have been improved by needed rains in New South Wales and the Melbourne (Victoria) Exchange reports an increase in business on the bull side.

WHAT CAUSES THE NOISE?

HERE are a great many people in this city to whom a building law is not a new thing, and there are a great many people to whom it is. The former class are rather puzzled to know why the latter are making such an extraordinary uproar about the new code. They can't quite make out why this particular document has excited the pious, the sentimental, the partisan and the officious to walk the streets waving their hands and getting up a general uproar. The experienced ask one another, "What has happened? What new and dreadful thing has been thrust upon us?" They then turn to the new code itself and find that it is pretty much the same law that has governed building operations in New York City for many years past. There is no change in it that is at all radical, no dynamite that will bring all our houses down on our heads, neither are there any new burdens proposed by its regulations that will be found onerous by an honest builder who has to deal with practical and not theoretic conditions. It does not vary from the law it is intended to replace any more than that law varied from the law preceding it. Our building laws have all been compromise measures, in which a sort of average has been struck between conflicting interests that must be dealt with, and between the theoretic and the practical conditions under which building is carried on in a big city like New York. Everyone knows a compromise measure can never be "perfect," but it can be even better-it can be workable, and the Experienced are ready to affirm, without hesitation, that any attempt to make a building law from the point of view held by nine-tenths of those who are now criticising the proposed code, will be either futile or disastrous. The probability is, we should have a law that would be largely disregarded in practice.

When people clamor for a building law which shall not confer discretionary power upon officials, and shall, at the same time, not favor any particular set of material men, they are demanding the impossible. A building law must either specify materials and define methods, or it must leave these matter to the discretion of some official—having, of course, formulated a standard for him to adhere to. Both courses have their evil. One course produces an inflexible code which does not admit the use of new discoveries and improvements, and the other course puts great power for extortion or tyranny in the hands of dishonest officials. Hitherto our building laws have steered a middle course between these two rocks.

The noise regarding the present code springs from obvious causes. First of all, our building laws have hitherto been passed in Albany, not in New York, and distance perhaps has deterred the public and the press from giving much attention to them. One extraordinary thing about the present agitation is that it aims to throw back the making of our building laws to Albany. In other words, the first use we make of home rule is to strive to abolish it. The building law is a very important home measure, and the charter very properly considered it a matter that could be better attended to in New York City than up in Albany; yet, the opponents of the present code don't hesitate to say that they are now "fighting for time," in order to relegate the subject to the State legislature when it convenes next January. who base their opposition to the code on a belief that there are "politics" in it, must see that this is a very admirable way to purge the code! In Albany there are no "politics."

Another source of trouble is the tenement house sentimentalists. We have often referred to this impracticable crowd, most

of the members of which are absolutely ignorant of real estate conditions or building. Sometime ago these people acquired an idea that the tenement houses of this city ought to be very much better than they are, and ever since they have been running about. They rush into legislation without giving any consideration to the practical consequences of their actions. Their belief, apparently, is that the builders and real estate owners of this city object to putting up a high class of apartments and, consequently, the Reformers desire to force them by legislation to use better plumbing, increase light and ventilation, to build fireproof, etc. They cannot understand that the real estate owner and builder are really not perverse, or that they are merely practical men, who, being in the business of providing housing accommodations, supply the kind that people demand and are able to pay for. If all people were able to pay for suites like those in the Dakota, there would be nothing else in the city. It will not seem absurd to most of our readers, as it does to the Reformer, if we assert that the Real Estate Owner or Agent or Builder is a much better judge of what people can pay for than the philanthropic agitator. These paternal good people object to the building code because it does not sufficiently increase the cost of tenements, so that rents will be either a heavier burden on the poor people, or a tax quite beyond their means.

Another element of the agitation is the political. Many newspapers and individuals are having a fling at the building law because it is poor policy ever to forgo a partisan occasion. The whole mass of opposition, however, to the code is more noisy than formidable, and there is very little doubt that the code will be adopted shortly.

APITAL that is already looking askance at building because of the rise in the price of material will be further estranged from that industry by the demands that are cropping up in all directions from labor, especially when they are as unreasonable as those made by the striking carpenters in this city, as they are stated in another column. We think working people are being badly advised, and hope they will give a little more attention to the situation than they appear to have done. If they will think a little and apprise themselves of the facts, they will see that with the cost of construction increased by from twenty-five to thirty per cent. and taxation, in this city, by twenty per cent., building operation stand in sufficient danger of contraction, and, consequently, the workmen's means of obtaining a livelihood'correspondingly curtailed, without anything more. Wages were maintained on a generous scale during all the hard times that followed the financial trouble of 1893, and wage earners may with reason be expected to wait until building has shown whether it can stand the increased burdens already laid upon it, before putting forward any claims they may possess, or think they possess, and which, whether in direct pay or shortening of hours, would, if granted, increase those burdens. It is not cheering, either to observe how patriotic and political sentiments are brushed aside for so purely selfish reasons as those that animate the stonecutters who are obstructing the arrangements for laying the corner stone of the Chicago Federal building, or the carpenters employed on the Dewey celebration decorations. Can it be that those who say: "Dooey done good" really believe what they say as much as those who express the same sentiment with better accent and more grammatical phrasing.

REAL estate men, at least, are waking up to the fact that immigration and rents are not entirely unconnected. A few years ago we were adding every year to the population of the country the equivalent of a first-class city. The rest of the world envied us. Abroad it was recognized that, commercially speaking, human beings are a commodity of value, and that the ability of the United States to attract full-grown population was equivalent to attracting so many gold dollars without giving anything for them in return. All other forms of wealth we had to pay for, We had to ship away our wheat, our cotton, or something eles if we desired the foreigner's products, but the foreigner himself, with his capacities, experience and wealth-producing powers, we could get for nothing. Our papers and legislators came to the conclusion that this was a bad thing for us; so they campaigned against it and advertised to the world that we were inhospitable in immigration. In some measure we were taken at our word; at any rate, from this and other causes immigration declined. When people don't know a good thing when they have it, the best corrective is to let them do without it. Supply impoverishes the average man's power of appreciation. In many quarters now a lively estimate is forming of what this country has lost by the loss of immigration. On the East Side of this city property owners see some of the effects of our ill-advised agitation against immigration in their buildings and in the slower pace at which population fills up vacancies. They are crying now for greater immigration, but the cry comes late, for the tide has been, in some measure, diverted to more hospitable shores.

THE UPHEAVAL IN WALL STREET.

HE steady decline for a matter of ten days or so, and the final break in certain securities while others stood comparatively firm, is a phenomenon in stock market affairs that deserves a little attention. Nothing like it for concentration of bearish efforts and influence can be found in the annals of the Street. except the raid on all the Industrials that accompanied the collapse of the Cordage in 1893. But in this case it was not a class of stocks that was raided, but a group composed of various stocks predicated on widely differing industries, on which the late Governor Flower had pledged his business judgment and which had been advanced on the prestige of his name. Three typical cases represented severally new organizations in the traction, steel and paper business. The comparatively brief period that saw their rise conferred varying results in operation, but the least disappointing suffered proportionately, if not equally with the rest.

There are those who profess to see in this attack on the Flower stocks something like a conspiracy, excusable in the lax ethics of the Street, to get possession of the traction property with the object of enjoying the great profits which it is said to promise in the future. If there is anything in this idea it will soon show itself. As the matter stands the break in prices is explainable by natural causes and without the suggested predetermination of the Kidds and Morgans of our financial centre. There is no doubt that speculation in these issues was over-confident and overdone. So long as money was easy and the public believed all the bright predictions for the future made for the stocks it was easy to keep up their prices; but the revelation of true conditions brought out in reports and the hardening of the money market invited bear attacks and forced liquidation with the natural result of a shrinkage in quotations. It is the old story with the old moral, buy with your eyes shut and you will have to sell when they open. This proceeding often requires the selling to be done at as much under as the buying was at over value.

While stress ought to be laid upon the moral just given, it would be unfair to present conditions not to go further and show the more pleasing reverse of the picture. The public have had their attention drawn to the big declines in the issues that suffered recently so much that the unthinking are apt to believe that everything went by the board. As a matter of fact, and as has been previously stated, this was not so. The majority of the issues listed on the Stock Exchange were only moderately affected by the selling movement. Where anything of merit came upon the market it was easily taken, although, of course, there was a general sympathetic movement, at comparatively small concessions. This was not only the case with the best classes of investment issues, but also with those still considered speculative, though often comparatively new and in all instances having participated in the general advance of the past three years. Illustrations of this fact will be found in the following table showing the rise and present status of some bonds, which have made large advances in the past three years:

The Realty Market.

PROSPECTS FOR THE FALL BROKERAGE BUSINESS.

I N any just forecast of the fall real estate market the preceding renting season would, of course, receive first consideration. This year, however, developments in the renting business are being noted with usually close attention. For two years the real estate market has been supported chiefly by the professional element, whom experience has taught to lock for a reflux of investment capital into real property as soon as a definite term shall have been put to the general rise of prices in the Stock Exchange. Capital, especially investment capital, is constantly seeking a rising market. That stocks and bonds are to experience a further material advance seems unlikely. There has been no general advance in realty values, although in isolated localities prices have taken an upward turn as a consequence of the anticipatory activity of professional operators. Other circumstances remaining unchanged, the rising cost of construction is certain to enhance the value of every existing building. So far, therefore, indications point to the inception of a considerable investment movement in the fall. But this very movement, which is apparently now in sight, has been for some years discounted by speculative builders and building lcan operators. The average annual building statistics for Manhattan since 1895, inclusive, have been the heaviest in the history of the island. The development of trolley transportation has made vast tracts of suburban land accessible for improvement with cheap housing, housing calculated to draw population from the more expensive residential centers. Health Board's legal-tenement census, including the inhabitants of apartments and flats, as well as common tenements, shows that an unusual shifting of population is in progress in Manhattan, and, further, directs attention to a consequence which was expected to result from the readjustment of taxation incident to consolidation, namely, that the outlying boroughs are gaining at the expense, in part, of Manhattan. The actual effect of the multiplication of new houses, of higher taxation, and of suburban emigration can be discovered only by a careful study of the renting market, for the economic laws which govern real estate are so complicated and for the most part so obscure that the seen may be completely offset by the unseen. Indeed, it is not only possible, but probable, that the slight decrease in population noted in the Health Board's census implies a larger demand for housing. In hard times the unemployed flock to the cities. "Roomers" become numerous, while two or more families occupy apartments intended for one. With the return of prosperity part of the transient population returns to the smaller manufacturing towns or leaves the city to work on new lines of railway, while the other part remains to establish separate homes, thus augmenting the demand for house room. At any rate, with rising prices in realty and a prospect of falling or stationary prices in the Stock Exchang, if the renting season now drawing to a close proves to have been satisfactory, we shall undoubtedly have a fall market for real estate investments better than any since the panic of

The test of the renting market in its relation to investments will be furnished by the newer houses, of which the majority are apartments in Harlem and on the West Side. Most of the offerings that demand a prompt disposition consist of new speculative buildings. If these find tenants, they will find ready purchasers, and their withdrawal from the market create a demand for other property. Last week, it was learned, agents in Harlem pretty generally report a brisk demand for cheap and medium-priced flats and dwellings, which grades prevail in the district. The new housing in Harlem, however, is compacted into a comparatively small area, and it may be argued that tenants are attracted to the district in geometrically increasing numbers, somewhat on the same ground that half a dozen department stores in a given locality will attract a disproportionately larger number of shoppers than an isolated store. But a careful canvas made this week likewise discloses an excellent demand for cheap and medium-priced apartments, as well as all grades, perhaps, of dwellings on the West Side, where constructional work has been considerably more scattered.

It is not by accident that medium-priced and cheap apartments rent unusually well. During the past eighteen months or two years speculative building in Manhattan has been directed more especially to the production of elevator apartments. Meantime the demand for accommodations in modern five-story flats has practically overtaken the supply. The rents in elevator apartments are still so high as to affect hardly any but the most expensive non-elevator flats and private houses. As regards elevator flats, bachelor apartments and apartment hotels are ap-

parently enjoying prosperity. The new apbe made in the bor-Orleans, for example, at Columbus avenue and at the appeal right this week under a ten-year lease to A. W. Eisting of the three dozen suites vacant. This class of apartments petes more particularly with the regular hotels.

But the popularity of apartment hotels is unquestioned, and it is hardly less doubtful that they will be able to show a profit with rents considerably lower than those which now nominally obtain, say, \$900 up, both of which facts will have due weight with investors. Finally, the majority of the new houses for sale consist of non-elevator flats and dwellings, and as it is the demand for these that will give the tone to the market for real estate investments, the fall outlook is decidedly encouraging.

The following were among the statements obtained from representative agents on the West Side. W. Willard Babcock, of Rusher & Babcock: "We have rented double the number of apartments and houses that we did last spring. Dwellings between \$1,200 and \$1,800 go fast. So do apartments between \$40 and \$60. We have also rented many expensive flats. We have few vacancies in apartments below \$60. There has been little building of late in this grade of flats.'

A. E. Gibbs, of Ware & Gibbs: "Apartments from \$20 up rent well. The call is for apartments from \$40 to \$75, and for dwellings between \$1,200 and \$1,800. We have not had such an active season in five years."

Chas. S. Kohler: "Flats under \$25 and over \$40 rent well. The rest are not doing as well as they ought to. Renting is better than it was this spring, but not so good as in former years."

H. C. Senior: "This is the best season I've had in four or five years. Have hardly anything left. Rented my last store last week. Old houses and flats went first, because cheapest."

F. R. Wood, of Jesse C. Bennett & Co.: "Flats under \$50 rent well, the best demand being for those between \$25 and \$30. Builders have been putting up too many elevator apartments. All our houses were filled up during late spring and summer. There is a good demand for private houses up to \$2,000."

James Van Dyck Card: "There are too many high-priced apartments—at \$1,500 to \$2,500. Never showed so much and closed so little, althrugh I think many leases will be effected before the middle There is a good demand for apartments at \$50 and less."

Frederick Zittel: "The demand is pretty good for houses from \$1,000 to \$3,000. Flats under \$60 also rent well. Flats from \$1,500 up are not doing so well."

Mr. Hobbs, of Slawson & Hobbs: "Apartments from \$600 to \$1,800 rent best; private houses, from \$1,200 to \$3,000. The season is better We are renting more houses and apartments. Rents are no higher, although it is a little easier to get asking prices. are giving no free rent, either in houses or flats, except broken months. We are doing a better business than ever before."

UR dear boys of the daily press have a passion for what may be called pedestalizing a particular individual at a particular time. Just now it is Comptroller Coler they are elevating, by laying out for him a programme of reform work that no ten men could carry out. In their mistaken zeal we are in danger of having to vary on the title of a recently popular play: "Too much Coler." Of course the Comptroller is not responsible for what the space writers say of him, and is too shrewd and practical a man to make himself responsible for all the promises they have made on his behalf, or to forget the rule of one thing at a time. For instance, this week we have been told that he is to revolutionize the process of acquiring property for public improvements in order to cheapen it to the public. Property owners are always glad to hear of anything that will reduce their burdens, but those of them who have built upon this report ought to be reminded that before such a change can be brought about an amendment of the state constitution will be necessary. This document says: (Article I., Section 7.) "When private property shall be taken for any public use, the compensation to be made therefor, when such compensation is not made by the State, shall be ascertained by a jury, or not less than three commissioners appointed by a court of record, as shall be prescribed by law." Further accompanying this section in the constitution as officially published, is a decision given in Cruger v. Hudson R. R., which says: "The 'jury' referred to means a body drawn in the ordinary mode, but whose decision may be pronounced by a majority." So it appears that until the constitution is amended, estimates must be made by a commission according to the present practice, or a jury, and we think there are very few who would wish to see the many hundred condemnation proceedings now going on thrown into the courts in their present congested condition. THIS brings us to consider the claim of the Corporation Counsel that the property required to carry out any plan of municipal rapid transit, should be condemned through his office. His suggestions regarding the practical scope of the work physically and its technical details we would prefer to refer to the Rapid Transit Commission, and their engineer. But in the matter of the legal details we are inclined to sympathize with his views, with the proviso that he can demonstrate that the results would be better if the work were in his hands than in those or a special commission for instance. The case is capable of practical demonstration, and it ought to be decided upon that rather than on what appears to be the only other argument that certain "reform" elements fear Tammany more than they love their Maker. It must be borne in mind that Mr. Whalen makes his claim for his office rather than for himself personally. Doubtless he has sufficient professional pride to desire to have the carrying out of this work, but as it is likely to be protracted and the personnel of the office is subject to electoral mutations, he is speaking as much for his successor, who may be of different political complexion, as for himself. The policy of the charter makers in regard to the legal business of the city was to concentrate it in the Corporation Counsel's office, and that office already possesses the experience and machinery necessary for acquiring property for public use. Unless it can be demonstrated that this machinery is clogged by influences that militate against the prospect of satisfactory results, where is the sense of creating other, and probable also new delays, for the purposes of rapid transit?

THE DRAFT BUILDING CODE.

An opportunity to present objections to the proposed Building Code was afforded at a public hearing given by the Joint Committee on Affairs of Boroughs of the Municipal Assembly yesterday. Representatives of the Tenement House Committee of the Charity Organization Society, the City Club and of the Social Reform Club made statements most directly affecting the tenement house clauses, or the absence of tenement house clauses that were suggested by the first organization. A number of individuals also addressed the Committee in opposition to various provisions of the code. As a whole the code had defenders in well-known builders, as, for instance, the representatives of the Builders' League and others, including ex-Mayor Cooper, John O'Rourke, F. C. Moore and others. Owing to its length and the closeness of the time of the hearing to that of going to press it is impossible to give the discussion either in substance or in detail. Generally, the speakers went over well-trodden ground. The architectural associations were conspicuously absent from the gathering. The Commission on Building Code was represented by Wm. J. Fryer, Cornelius O'Reilly and others.

Below will be found the completion of the summary of the code sections begun two weeks ago:

PART XXI.

PUBLIC BUILDINGS, THEATRES AND PLACES OF ASSEMBLAGE.

Sec. 108 (old §499).—Public Buildings. Department stores and other business and manufacturing buildings, where large numbers of people are congregated, have been included in the list of buildings in which the halls, doors, stairways, passageways, and aisles shall be arranged as the Department of Buildings may direct to facilitate egress in case

or accident or are.

Sec. 109 (old \$500).—Theatres and Places of Public Amusement. The most important change to the great theatre section is that which includes within its requirements all buildings hereafter erected for public entertainments of any kind for the accommodation of more than three hundred persons—thus including concert halls, except very small ones. A number of minor changes have been made in the reading of the old section.

PART XXII.

IRON AND STEEL CONSTRUCTION.

Sec. 110 (old §485).—Skeleton Construction. Eight inches of brickwork must hereafter be placed on the outer surfaces of skeleton columns, and not less than four inches on their inner surfaces, and the sides of girders must have not less than four inches of brickwork on the outside, but the flanges may project to within two inches of the outer surface. Girders for the support of the inclosure walls must be placed at the floor line of each story.

Sec. 111.—Steel and Wrought-Iron Columns. In thickness such column shall be not less than one-quarter inch. Its unsupported length shall not exceed forty times its least lateral dimension or diameter, except as specially allowed. This section contains much detailed matter.

Sec. 112.—Cast-Iron Columns. None shall have a less diameter than five inches. The least thickness shall be three-quarters of an inch. The greatest unsupported length shall not exceed twenty times the

least lateral dimension or diameter, except as modified by other secitions, and except the same may form part of an elevator inclosure or staircase, and also except by special permission of the Department of Buildings. Much detail is contained in this section.

Sec. 113 (old §485).—Double Columns. wording as old section. Substantially the same

Sec. 114 (old §485).—Party Wall Posts. No material change from

Sec. 115 (old §485).—Plates Between Joints of Open-Back Columns. Same wording as in old section.

Sec. 116.-Steel and Iron Girders. Details relating to manufacture.

Sec. 117.—Rolled Steel and Wrought-Iron Beams Used as Girders. To be bolted together and separators used not more than five feet. apart.

Sec. 118 (old §484).—Cast-Iron Lintels. Not allowed for spans exceeding sixteen feet

Sec. 119 (old §485).—Plates Under Ends of Lintels and Girders. Cutstone or granite blocks at least ten inches thick, or upon cast-iron plates, and when opening is less than twelve feet the stone blocks may be five inches thick, or cast-iron plates of equal strength, and in all cases by the full size of the bearings.

Sec. 120.—Rolled Steel and Wrought-Iron Floor and Roof Beams-All such beams to be of full weight, straight and free from injurious defects. Tie rods to be used. Beams to be anchored when pearing on walls.

Sec. 121 (old §484).—Templates Under Ends of Steel or Iron Floor Beams. Instead of saying, as formerly, that templates shall be eight inches wide in twelve-inch walls, and in all walls of greater thickness, the templates shall be twelve inches wide, and in no case less than two and one-half inches thick nor less than twelve inches long; the new section says that templates shall be of such dimensions as to bring no greater pressure upon the brickwork than is allowed elsewhere in the code. When iron floor beams, not exceeding six inches in depth, are placed at not more than thirty inches on centres, no templates shall be required.

Sec. 122 (old §484)—Framing and Connecting Structural Works Sec. 121 (old §484).-Templates Under Ends of Steel or

Sec. 122 (old §484).—Framing and Connecting Structural Work. Descriptive details.

Sec. 123.—Riveting of Structural Steel and Wrought-Iron Work. Descriptive matter.

124.—Bolting of Structural Steel and Wrought-Iron Work. Details.

Sec. 125.—Steel and Wrought-Iron Trusses. To be so designed that the stresses in each member can be calculated. Other details in this section.

Sec. 126.—Riveted Steel and Wrought-Iron Trusses. Sec. 127.—Steel and Iron Pin-Connected Trusses. Details.

Sec. 128 (old §485).—Iron and Other Metal Fronts to be Filled in. All cast-iron or metal fronts must be backed up or filled in solid with masonry of the thickness required for brick walls of corresponding. heights

Sec. 129 (old §487).—Painting of Structural Metal Work. All structural metal shall be cleaned of scale, dirt and rust, and be thoroughly coated with one coat of paint. Cast-iron columns must not be painted until after inspection by the Department of Buildings. Where surfaces of riveted work come in contact they must be painted before assembling. After erection all work must be painted at least one additional coat. All iron or steelwork used under water must be inclosed with concrete. with concrete.

PART XXIII.

FLOOR LOADS-TEMPORARY SUPPORTS.

Sec. 130 (old §483).—Floor Loads. The live or variable loads shall consist of all loads other than dead loads. For dwellings houses, apartment houses, tenement houses, hotels or lodging houses, not less that sixty pounds upon every superficial foot of floor surface; for office purposes, not less than seventy-five pounds above the first floor, and for the latter floor 150 pounds; for schools and places of instruction, not less than seventy-five pounds; for places of public assembly, not less than ninety pounds; for ordinary stores, light manufacturing and light storage, not less than 120 pounds; and for stores where heavy materials are kept or stored, warehouses, factories, and for other manufacturing or commercial purposes, not less than 15.0 pounds upon every superficial foot. For determining the carrying capacity of columns in dwellings, office buildings, stores, stables and public buildings, when over five stories in height, a reduction of the live loads shall be permissible, as follows: For the roof and top floor the full live loads shall be used; for each succeeding lower floor the live load may be reduced by five per cent. until fifty per cent. of the live loads fixed by this section is reached, when such reduced loads may be used for all remaining floors.

Sec. 131 (old §483).—Load on Floors to be Distributed. Substan-

See, 131 (old §483).—Load on Floors to be Distributed, tially the same wording as in old section.

Sec. 132 (old §483).—Strength of Existing Floors to be Calculated. In the main the section remains the same as the old one. Varying parts of each floor can be posted.

Sec. 133 (old §483).—Strength of Temporary Supports. same as old section.

PART XXIV.

CALCULATIONS-STRENGTH OF MATERIALS.

Sec. 134 (old §483).—Safe Load for Masonry Work. For brickwork, when lime mortar is used, eight tons; when lime and cement mortar mixed is used, eleven and one-half tons; and when cement mortar is used, fifteen tons per superficial foot. For rubble stonework, when Portland cement is used, ten tons; when cement, other than Portland is used, eight tons; when lime and cement mortar mixed is used, seven tons; and when lime mortar is used, five tons per superficial foot. The safe bearing load to apply to concrete when Portland cement is used, shall be taken at fifteen tons; and when cement other than Portland is used, eight tons per superficial foot.

Sec. 135 (old §483).—Weights of Certain Materials. Average weight of stone was given in the old section at 160 pounds. In this new section it is 170 pounds per cubic foot.

Sec. 136 (old §483).—Computations for Strength of Materials. Old

Sec. 136 (old §483).—Computations for Strength of Materials. Ol section referred to rules given in Haswell's "Mechanics" and Engineers' Pocket Book." New section says according to rules given i

Sec. 137 (old §483).—Factors of Safety. As one to four for metals subject to tension or transverse stress; as one to six for timber; as one to ten for brick or stone masonry. Whenever working stresses are prescribed in code, they shall be used.

Sec. 138—Strength of Columns. Tables are given for the working stresses per square inch of section, after dividing the length of a metal column by the least radius of gyration. Steel and wrought-iron have been given exalted values, and cast-iron greatly reduced values. For wood posts the length divided by the least diameter, and multiplied by the working stresses per square inch of section, as given in a table, determine the safe load to be applied.

Sec. 139.—Working Stresses. The safe carrying capacity of various materials used in construction is to be determined by a list, which is given in this new section, of working stresses in pounds per square inch of sectional area.

Sec. 140.—Wind Pressure. All structures exposed to wind shall be designed to resist a horizontal wind pressure of thirty pounds for every square foot of surface thus exposed from the ground to the top. In buildings under 100 feet in height, provided the height does not exceed four times the average width of the base, the wind pressure may be disregarded. be disregarded.

PART XXV.

PLUMBING AND DRAINAGE.

Sec. 141 (old §501).—Plumbing, Drainage and Repairs Thereto. To the former short section, there has been added a law passed in 1896, entitled "An act in relation to plumbing in the City of New York," for the reason that, unless the said law is included in the new code, it would, in common with other laws relating to buildings in the City of New York, cease to have any force or effect when the new code is established by the Municipal Assembly. In including the plumbing act several changes in the same have been made.

PART XXVI.

BUILDINGS RAISED, LOWERED, ALTERED OR MOVED.

Sec. 142 (old §496).—Buildings Raised, Lowered, Altered or Moved. The old section has been liberalized so that when increasing the height of buildings to forty feet the entire area covered by the building may be raised to a uniform height. Reasonable extensions to such buildings are also provided. If any block situated within the fire limits has ninety per cent. of the buildings located thereon constructed of frame, any vacant lot situated therein may have a frame building placed thereon, provided the same be not more than two stories and basement in height, and is to be used for residence purposes only. These provisions have more application to the other boloughs than to Manhattan.

PART XXVII.

FIRE LIMITS.

Sec. 143 (old §495).—Fire Limits. No frame or wood structure shall be built hereafter within limits set forth in the code. In the Borough of Manhattan, briefly, the line starts on the North River, at West 165th St., and runs easterly to Broadway (old Boulevard), as it formerly did, and runs thence northerly with Broadway (old Kingsbridgeroad) to the Harlem River, including all the territory between Br adway and the Harlem River. The entire territory west of Broadway and above 165th St. is outside of the fire limits.

In the Borough of the Bronx, briefly, the line commences on the Harlem River, at the Central Bridge, or about 158th St., and follows the tracks of the N. Y. C. R. R. and Harlem Railroads around to Webster Ave., thence northerly to Tremont, crossing to the east along 177th St., and then southerly by Main St. and Westchester Ave. to 149th St., and thence eastwardly to the East River, thus including the Port Morris district.

In the Borough of Brooklyn the fire line is an extensive one. In a portion of the 29th Ward detached frame dwellings may be erected.

In the Borough of Queens (Long Island City) the fire line remains unaltered.

In the Borough of Richmond, no fire line has been provided-it was deemed unnecessary.

PART XXVIII.

FRAME BUILDINGS.

Sec. 144 (old §495).—Frame Structures Within the Fire Limits. In this section much of the old section is recited, and considerable new matter is added. Sheds of wood shall not cover a lot area exceeding 2,500 square feet, except by special permission. Sky-signs, or any device in the nature of an advertisement, announcement or direction, supported upon or above or attached to any building is the subject of restrictions. restrictions.

Sec. 145 (old \$497).—Frame Buildings Damaged. Substantially the same wording as in old section.

Sec. 146.—Frame Buildings Outside of Fire Limits. This section is a lengthy one, and elaborately provides for the construction of frame buildings. Outside the fire limits, when any brick or stone building is to be erected of a class that could, under the code, be constructed of wood, the Commissioner of Buildings having jurisdiction is authorized and directed to allow reasonable modifications of the provisions of the code relating to brick buildings, in consideration of incombustible material being used for walls instead of wood.

material being used for walls instead of wood.

Sec. 147.—Frame Buildings where Streets are not Established. Within such portions of the city where streets have not been established, and are outside of the prescribed fire limits, no building or structure, other than small outhouses, shall be erected without first filing plans and detailed statements of the proposed construction, and obtaining an approval therefor. Only so much of the requirements, regulations and restrictions contained in the code shall apply as in the opinion of the Commissioner of Buildings having jurisdiction may be necessary for safety and health. The purposes of this section is to permit greater freedom in construction, and in plumbing and drainage of buildings in the outlying and undeveloped portions of the city, than in those portions where a street system has been established.

PART XXIX.

APPEALS AND MODIFICATION OF LAW.

Sec. 148.—Board of Buildings. The object of this section is simply to call attention to the provisions contained in Section 650 of the Greater New York Charter.

Greater New York Charter.

Sec. 149 (old \$504).—Board of Examiners. This section merely makes some provisions for meetings of the Board of Examiners. Section (49) of the Greater New York Charter provides that when a Commissioner of Buildings rejects or refuses to approve the mode, manner of construction or materials proposed to be used in the erection or alteration of any building, or when it is claimed that the rules and regulations of the Board of Buildings, or the provision of law or ordinances do not apply, or that an equally good and more desirable form of construction can be employed in any specific case, an appeal

from the decision of the said Commissioner can be made in the boroughs of Manhattan and The Bronx to the Board of Examiners, but in the boroughs of Brooklyn, Queens and Richmond the appeal must be made to the Board of Buildings—the latter consisting of the three Commissioners of Buildings.

PART XXX.

VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES—COURTS HAVING JURISDICTION.

Sec. $150 \ (\text{old } \$505)$.—Violations and Penalties. Substantially the same wording as in old section.

same wording as in old section.

Sec. 151 (old \$506).—Courts Having Jurisdiction. Wording of old section is repeated, with a few changes added thereto. A lis pendens may be filed against a piece of property by the Commissioner of Buildings having jurisdiction when "he deems the same to benecessary, or is satisfied that the owner of the property is about to transfer the same to avoid responsibility for having violated the provisions of this code, or some one of its provisions."

Sec. 152 (old \$507).—Notices of Violation of Code; Service of Papers. Substantially the same wording as in old section.

PART XXXI.

UNSAFE BUILDINGS, SURVEYS, COURT PROCEEDINGS.

153 (old \$509).—Unsafe Buildings. Substantially the same section.

Sec. 154 (old §510).—Surveys on Unsafe Buildings. Wording of old section is repeated, but a few necessary changes made. The New York Chapter of the American Institute of Architects appoints one surveyor in an unsafe proceeding in the boroughs of Manhattan, The Bronx and Richmond; and the Brooklyn Chapter of the American Institute of Architects appoints the surveyor in similar cases in the boroughs of Brooklyn and Queens.

Sec. 155 (old §511).—Court Proceedings. Substantially the same wording as in old section.

Sec. 156 (old §513).—Application for Orders to Remove Violations and to Vacate Buildings. Substantially the same wording as in old

PART XXXII.

RECOVERY OF BODIES UNDER FALLEN BUILDINGS.

Sec. 157 (old \$502).—Recovery of Bodies Under Fallen Buildings. This section contains substantially the same provisions as the old section, and in addition the Department of Buildings in certain cases to order and require the inmates and occupants of a building to vacate the same forthwith; and said Department may, when necessary for the public safety, temporarily close the sidewalks and streets adjacent to a dangerous building. public safety, tempora a dangerous building.

PART XXXIII.

FUND FOR USE AND BENEFIT OF THE DEPARTMENT BUILDINGS.

Sec. 158 (old \$515).—Fund for Use and Benefit of the Department of Buildings. Substantially the same wording as in old section.

PART XXXIV.

SEAL-OFFICERS OF DEPARTMENT MAY ENTER BUILDINGS.

Sec. 159 (old §4 of '92).—Seal. The Board of Buildings may adopt a seal and direct its use in the Department of Buildings.

Sec. 160 (old §516).—Officers of Department May Enter Buildings. As far as it may be necessary in the performance of their duties, officials of the Department of Buildings may enter any building or premises upon showing their badge of office.

PART XXXV.

EXISTING SUITS AND LIABILITIES—INVALIDITY OF ONE SECTION NOT TO INVALIDATE ANY OTHER.

Sec. 161 (old §45 of '92).—Existing Suits and Liabilities. Code not to affect any suit or proceeding now pending in any court, or any rights acquired or liability incurred, nor any cause or causes of action accrued or existing under any act or ordinance repealed; nor shall any right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by

Sec. 162.—The Invalidity of One Section Not to Invalidate Any Other. The title expresses the meaning of the text.

PART XXXVI.

ORDINANCES REPEALED; DATE WHEN ORDINANCE TAKES EFFECT.

Sec. 163.—Repealing Inconsistent Ordinances. All ordinances of the former Municipal and Public Corporations consolidated into The City of New York, affecting or relating to the construction, alteration or removal of buildings or other structures, and all ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

Sec. 164.—Date When Ordinance is to Take Effect. This shall take effect sixty days after its approval by the Mayor. This ordinance

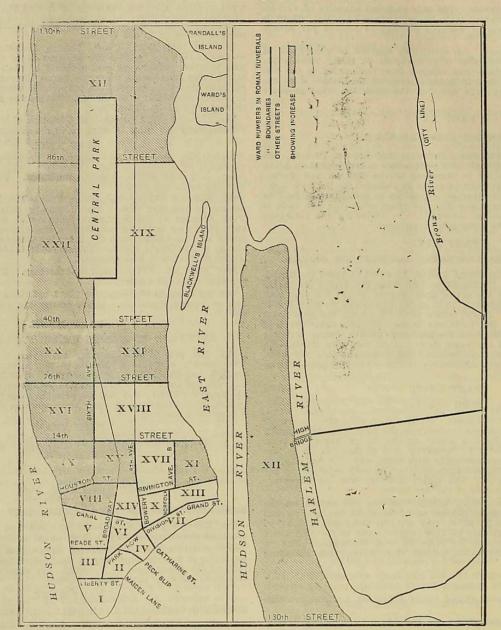

HI FTING CENTERS OF SPECULATION IN TENEMENT PROPERTY.

The publication of the Health Board's legal-tenement census has had the excellent effect of pointing out more or less clearly the localities where activity in tenement property is likely to develop next. It makes public speculative tendencies which were

properties rather than build a tenement on land which may in a few years be more profitably improved with a factory."

Other brokers whose opinion was solicited confirmed the view expressed in these columns last week that the loss in tenement population on the East Side, below 14th street, but especially below Houston, was due to a dispersal of the unemployed working people who congregated in the city during the war period, and

formerly perceived only by a very few operators. The situation was summed up this week as follows by Harris Mandelbaum, of Mandelbaum & Lewine: "I am not surprised to find that there has been an increase of population in the 11th Ward, on the East Side, and in the 8th and 9th, on the West Side. The price of lots has gone up so in the 10th and 7th Wards that there is no room left for profitable building operations, particularly now that the cost of construction is also rising. In the 10th Ward inside lots have been selling for \$22,000. In the 11th Ward lots are still comparatively cheap. The activity now on the East Side is confined chiefly to the 11th and 13th Wards. The constructional work in progress elsewhere is mostly on lots bought many months ago, and under building contracts made about the time of the purchase. In my opinion we shall see presently considerable activity in the 8th and 9th Wards. Into the former business is extending westward from Broadway. In both wards, near the river, warehouses are certain to multiply as a consequence of improvements to the dock front. Both of these circumstances will serve to attract population to the West Side, and we are picking up all the bargains there that we can discover."

George J. Kenny, in speaking of the shifting of population on the East Side, said: "Rents, as well as the price of lots, are higher in the 7th, 10th and 17th Wards than in the 11th. We notice a tendency on the part of tenants to move from the first two wards especially, into the new buildings in the 11th, as far north as 8th street. Others leave the lower East Side altogether, going to Harlem, Bronx and Brooklyn. The displacement of population in the 14th Ward is due to the encroachment of business. The section bounded by Crosby, Mulberry, Canal and Houston streets is already a well-defined factory district. The probability is that the entire section from Broadway to Bowery will eventually be devoted to business. Consequently, there are few tenements being erected west of Bowery. Owners are content to receive for the time being $2\frac{1}{2}$ and 3 per cent. from antiquated

who constituted a temporary abnormal addition to the permanent tenantry. The loss of this transient population, mostly roomers, has produced few vacancies in apartments, and has not in the least affected rents; the landlord's income remains the same whether his apartment is occupied by a family with one boarder, or by a family with several. At any rate, the tenements on the lower East Side are better filled to-day than those in any other part of the city.

THE CARPENTERS' STRIKE.

EMPLOYERS FIRM IN THEIR POSITION.

In spite of reports to the contrary the Master Carpenters' Association stand out firmly against the demands of their employees for: An increase of from \$3.50 to \$4.00 per day pay; a half-holiday each Saturday, and payment of all wages at noon of each Saturday on the job. Some of the contractors of Dewey celebration work have been compelled to make concessions in order to save their bonds, but those not hampered in any such way are a unit in resisting the demands of the men. At a meeting of the Master Carpenters' Association, held on the 13th inst., resolutions were passed under which the following letter was dispatched to the Joint Committee of the Carpenters' organization of New York City:

The employers informed the unions' committee that the association could not accede to the men's demands, as the condition of the trade did not warrant it, and called the attention of the men to the losses and sufferings that they would endure by a prolonged strike. The members of the unions' committee said that they had no authority to make a settlement with the employers except on the basis of the demands, but would report back to their unions. An adjournment was then taken until Friday afternoon.

The Master Carpenters' Association then held a meeting, which reaffirmed the decision taken at the previous session. Resolutions passed by the Builders' League of New York and the Master Cabinet Workers' Association, sympathizing with and endorsing the position of the association, were received, and Secretary Herrman was instructed to make suitable acknowledgments.

Secretary Herrman, of the Master Carpenters' Association, says that good feeling prevails between the employers and the men, but that the former could not afford to surrender. They have not tried to get new men in the places of the strikers, and they do not believe it will be necessary, because the old men will be sure to return to their senses.

Thursday and yesterday committees from both sides were in session and finally a compromise was arrived at on the following basis: The men to receive 47 cents an hour, the day to be an eight-hour day as at present and the men to quit work each Saturday at 12 noon; a committee of arbitration to be appointed composed of representatives of each side, to consider and determine matters in dispute between the employers and employees for next year. The impression was that each committee was authorized to act for their principals, and this was a fact so far as the Master Carpenters' committee was concerned, but not in regard to the unions, which refused the compromise and reiterated their original demands. To this the Masters' Association replied that they stood by the agreement made by the Joint Committee and could not consider any other.

STREET PLANS FOR THE SUBURFS.

Three important preliminary street maps have been practically completed in the Topographical Bureau, and will be submitted presently to the Board of Public Improvements for confirmation. One of these maps provides for a modification of the street system of Long Island City; another substitutes a general street plan for a group of some thirty independent village lay-outs east of Long Island City, in the former town of Newtown; and the third is a lay-out of part of Staten Island. The first two maps, which are complementary to each other, will be submitted so soon as the approaches to the two projected bridges, over Randall's and Blackwell's Islands, to Long Island City, have been determined. The Staten Island map probably will be ready for submission by the end of this month.

The present street system of Long Island City, according to Louis A. Risse, chief engineer of the Topographical Bureau, is defective, in that the principal thoroughfares run north and south, between Newtown Creek and Flushing Bay, whereas the stress of travel is destined to be west and east. The proposed modification has been planned with a view to facilitating communication between the East River and the 79,000 square acres

of more or less undeveloped land in the interior of Queens Borough, east of Long Island City. In the new map a system of primary avenues has been superimposed on the old city plan, and the following thoroughfares have been widened to 100 feet: Vernon avenue, the Boulevard, Meadow street, Van Dam street, Laurel Hill avenue, part of Borden avenue, Rogers street, Jane street, Payntar avenue, Graham avenue, Broadway, Jamaica, Grand, Newtown, and Flushing avenues, Woolcott avenue east of Debevoise street, and Winthrop avenue. Public squares and circles are provided for at salient points, and a system of parkways connects the two East River bridges with proposed parks in Long Island City, Newtown and Flushing. The bridge over Randall's Island, it will be recalled, is to have two approaches from the west, one from Manhattan and the other from Bronx.

The Newtown map embraces the villages and settlements of Glendale, St. James' Park, Ridgewood Heights, Evergreen, Wyckoff Heights, Metropolitan, Fresh Pond, Lincoln Hill, Melvina, Maspeth, Berlinville, Laurel Hill, Woodside Heights, Woodside, Charlotteville, North Woodside, Hyatt Heights, Locust Grove, Winfield, Mt. Pleasant, Maspeth Heights, Middle Village, Newtown Heights, Nassau Heights, Newtown, Elmhurst, Corona Park, Corona Heights, Corona, Louona Park, and North Beach. This map contains about 350 miles of streets, 81/2 miles of parkways, 290 acres of parks, and 6 miles of canals and basins, and its adoption will stimulate a considerable building movement which has taken rise at Newtown, Winfield, Elmhurst, and The principal feature of the map is a trunk sewer con-Corona. necting Newtown Creek with Flushing Creek, which will serve the double purpose of purifying Newtown Creek and affording a tidewater outlet for the sewage between Jamaica and Long Island City, without crossing the latter. The district is now wholly dependent upon cesspools. It will be remembered that the most discussed form of relief from the Newtown Creek nuisance is the proposed canal from Newtown and Maspeth Creeks to tidewater. The Topographical Bureau, however, have concluded that an open canal would be impracticable on account of a deep cut crossing its proposed bed at Winfield. Besides, it would interfere with the railways, and require much outlay for bridges, despite which it would nevertheless cut the borough in two, arresting westward development. The Bureau's plan permits navigation on Flushing Creek as far as Nassau Heights and on Newtown Creek as far as New Calvary Cemetery, which two points are connected with a great underground sewer, provided with tide-gates. The Newtown map also shows a park along the shore of Flushing Bay, between College Point and Long Island City.

The Staten Island map lays out a system of parks and driveways embracing the hilly and undeveloped, but extremely picturesque interior, as well as the shore. Wherever practical the shore down to the water's edge has been reserved as public park or beach. One section of the map, namely, the section covering Clifton, Rosebank, Ft. Wadsworth, Arrochar, and Concord, is being worked out in detail for immediate permanent adoption, so as to permit the introduction of a sewerage system, the absence of which has been productive of numerous complaints from the Board of Health.

Answer.—Unless there is an agreement to the contrary, an architect's fees are due and payable when his work is done satisfactorily to his employer.—Law Editor.

COMMISSION FOR RENTING.

To the Editor of the RECORD AND GUIDE:

Please answer the following question in regard to renting store and basement for two years and ten months: A, tenant; B. broker. A comes to my office and wants a place; I take and show him store and basement and telephone to the parties in charge of said place: "I have a tenant for said store and basement." They telephoned to me the rent. A makes me such a ridiculous offer for the first year that I, as broker, would not think of submitting it to the parties in charge. But I gave the tenant the name and number of the party and told them to submit offer themselves. Now said parties have rented same premises to these tenants, who come and tell me that I am entitled to my commission; also, they give me a letter to that effect that I am the person that got said tenant. Now the parties refuse to pay commission on the grounds that I did not introduce them, although I have sent in my bill for commission before lease was signed. I have presented a copy of said letter from tenant and hold a copy. Am I entitled to commission, and at what percent use of commission am I entitled to charge? I only charge one per cent. on total rents.

Answer.—You are entitled to a commission of two and one-half per cent. on the first year's rental, according to the rules and regulations of the Real Estate Exchange.—Law Editor.

What is the commission a broker is entitled to who rents a private dwelling for two years and eleven months?

Answer.-Two and a half per cent. on first year's rental.-Editor Record and Guide.

Delancey T. Smith, broker and agent, has a commodious, handsomely-furnished, well-equipped and centrally-located office at No. 1519 Broadway, near 45th st. Mr. Smith has recently closed several sales, and reports a good outlook for an active realty business this fall. Wm. N. Tuthill, for years with the former firm of Fitzsimons & Smith, is now connected with Mr. Smith's office.

Two mortgages or deeds of trust were filed this week, one by The Johnson Cement Coating Co. to Howard R. Payne trustee to secure gold bonds for \$50,000, due in 20 years; the second one, by The New England Cement Coating Co., to Howard R. Payne, trustee for a similar amount and term. No specific real property is mentioned, but mortgage is to cover secret formula for making cement, property assets, etc.

Henry H. Rogers is the buyer of No. 578 Madison av, which is located on the west side of that thoroughfare, 75.5 north of 56th st. It is a 4-story dwelling, on lot 25x75; the revenue stamps on the deed show a consideration of \$75,000. In May this property was reported sold to Francis S. Kinney, who is erecting a 12-sty hotel on the plot adjoining it on the south; Mr. Rogers owns and occupies the fine dwelling at the southwest corner of Madison av and 57th st, and probably bought this property to protect his residence.

The Armory Board this week approved the site suggested by Colonel Duffy and Major-General Roe for the Sixty-ninth regiment armory, in the block bounded by 25th and 26th sts and 4th and Lexington avs. The size of the plot is 197.8x425. The buildings now on the block are 3 and 4-sty dwellings. This is the fourth site selected for this armory since a new site was discussed about seven years ago. The one most in favor until recently was the plot on which the University of the City of New York and some contiguous dwellings now stand.

The Republican Club, at a meeting held this week, decided to accept the offer of the Astor estate to build a new club-house at 5th av and 55th st. The terms of the offer are that the Club shall lease the ground for twenty years for a rental of \$205,000 for the whole term, with the privilege of two renewals of twenty years each at the same figure, the estate to erect a club house costing \$80,000, taking a mortgage for one-half at five per cent.

The Mutual Life Insurance Co. has made a loan of \$950,000 for

three years at 4 per cent. on the stable property at 32d and 33d streets, 4th and Lexington avenues and 85th and 86th streets and Madison avenues. The two pieces contain in the neighborhood of 130,000 square feet. The mortgage is made by Oren Root, Jr., representing the Metropolitan Street Railway Co. They paid \$1,350,000 for the property. The signing of the deed is said to have been one of the last official acts of the late Cornelius Vanderbilt as President of the Harlem R. R. Co.

In view of the rapid multiplication of elevator apartments uptown, with the inevitable depressing result on rents, it will be interesting to builders to learn of the unqualified success of an experiment with a 7-story building of this nature in Washington Square, north. The house, the interior of which is only just receiving its finishing touches, contains 21 apartments. All but three have already been rented, and for these propositions have been received. The average rent is \$1,200 for 8 rooms and bath.

Two handsome 6-story apartment houses have just been completed at No. 338 to 344 West 85th st, near Riverside Drive, by Builder Edward W. Kilpatrick. The apartments are sensibly and comfortably planned, the rooms being large, light and airy to an unusual degree, due to the open court separating and detaching the buildings. They are built much on the same lines as the two houses on the northwest corner of Madison av and 95th st, erected recently by Mr. Kilpatrick, and which were quickly and fully tenanted, a fact that speaks well for the prospects of the 85th st houses.

The City National Bank will not take title to the old custom house site until the United States is ready to give possession of the property. This, it is expected, will be early in 1902. The title was searched and guaranteed by the Title Guarantee and Trust Co., and the abstract of title to the property fills three large volumes. The Title Guarantee and Trust Co. also guarantees the title of the 4th avenue and 33d street and Madison avenue and 86th street parcels recently sold by the Harlem Railroad Co. to the Metropolitan Street Railway Co. for \$1,350,000, which is also the amount of the policy of title insurance issued.

The Republican Club has voted to accept the offer of the John Jacob Astor estate to construct for its use a club house on the southeast corner of 5th avenue and 55th street. The offer provides that the club shall lease the ground for twenty years, and have the privilege of two renewals for like periods. The estate will erect a club house that shall cost \$80,000, and it will take a first mortgage on half this investment, with interest at five per cent., the club to raise the other half on second mortgage bonds. The ground lease will be on the basis of four per cent. interest on the value of the site. Work will begin on the house at once

The Belmont Taxpayers' Association, organized for the purpose of protecting the interests of the taxpayers within the district bounded by Webster av, 180th st, Southern Boulevard and Pelham av, has issued a call for membership in order to strengthen the work commenced, viz.: To have the time for the payment of assessment levied in this district regulated and extended in such a manner as to allow every property owner an opportunity to pay these assessments without sacrificing his home or other interests. Other matters of like importance are discussed and acted upon. Meetings of the Association are held on the second Saturday evening of each month, at 8 o'clock, in the basement of Anderson Memorial Church, corner East 183d st and Monroe av. The dues are trifling, simply 25 cents per quarter. Ladies are invited to attend. Emil Ginsburger is the President and H. J. Tiffin the Secretary of the Association. The latter's address is 183d st and Hughes av.

The idea was suggested by a broker in Columbus av, near 60th st, that it might prove profitable for some builder to construct in that neighborhood a number of flats for the use of colored people, flats renting at from \$18 to \$25 a month. There are, he said, many negroes who wish to get away from the unsavory tenement surroundings, which, in the absence of other provision, they have now generally to put up with. Flats in respectable localities would fall within the means of a growing body of colored people-dressmakers, milliners, runners for banks, sleeping-car porters, barbers, etc. Even laundresses would do better if their customers did not have to invade the slums to reach them. In support of his suggestion the broker in question instanced the success of two flats, No. 115 and 117 West 60th st, where an experiment had been made with colored tenants. When occupied by whites, these houses were never more than threequarters full. They were, not long since, leased for five years by a man who sublets to negroes. The buildings are now constantly full, and the landlord has a long waiting list of applicants.

It is almost skin. transparent, and any degree of toughness can be imparted to it; it can be shaped into any desired form and treated any convenient manner to produce articles of commercial value. It is almost incombustible, and can be used in place of celluloid, horn, and wire, and can be used in electrical work to replace hard rubber, being cheaper and more durable.-Invention. A Choked Sewer Opened by Rats.-Tom Maguire is a genius. He is a yard foreman at the Laclede Gas Company's plant. sewer-pipe leading from one of the buildings to the river bank, 160 feet away, became clogged. The pipe was sixteen feet below the surface. Maguire had been thinking about a plan for several days. One night he caught two big grey rats, and these he determined to put into the sewer. They were taken to the mouth of the river bank and released. The opening was then closed securely behind them, leaving the animals with only one chance of life. That was to go straight ahead. And they did. Several more rats were caught and turned into the sewer, until a dozen were gnawing away at the pipe. The morning after the last detachment joined the main army, water began to trickle from the pipe. Iron rods and steam were applied. In ten minutes the sewer was clear.—St. Louis Post-Dispatch.

Bullet Holes in Church Doors .moval of thick incrustations of dirt and varnish from the old woodwork above the outer central doors of the northern porch of Westminster Abbey, prior to polishing up for Easter, shows that the wood is thickly penetrated with a great quantity of small shot, and bears bullet marks. The old doors beneath were removed about three years ago to admit of a freer method of egress, and they were riddled in a similar manner. The Abbey workmen engaged in cleaning the woodwork say it is four or five hundred years old. It is very thick oak and is studded with large iron bolt-headed nails, and it and the old doors have filled a space about fifteen feet in height by seven feet in width. The oaken doors of the Church of St. Clement Danes in the Strand have been riddled in much the same manner. Surmise can only be ventured upon to account for strange marks on the old doors of ecclesiastical edifices, many of which were sanctuaries. From the earliest Saxon times the sanctuary of Westminster-or, as Stowe calls it, "The Abbey Church Sanctuary," which he specified as "the church, churchyard, close, etc."-formed a place of refuge for offenders of all kinds, until it was suppressed with all other sanctuaries, in the reign of James I. "But the right of asylum," says Dean Stanley, "rendered the whole precinct a vast 'Cave of Adullam' for all the distressed and discontented of the metropolis who desired, according to the phrase of the time, 'to take Westminster.' Sometimes, if they were of higher rank, they established their quarters in the great northern porch of the Abbey, with tents pitched

and guards watching round, for days and nights together. Sometimes they darted away from their captors to secure the momentary protection of the consecrated ground." Thus some of the nimble-footed ones occasionally lost their lives, and perhaps now and then a little lead that was meant for them went astray. Long after the suppression the neighborhood of the Abbey was a hotbed of iniquity and vice, and it may be that during this period, if not before it, the woodwork of the northern porch suffered from over-free firing.-London News.

Compressing Liquid Steel-In casting steel in large ingots for heavy ordnance or armor plates it is usually found that the upper portion of the mass is iess dense that the lower part. The weight of the molten metal itself in the mould produces this effect. Unequal density, however, is highly undesirable. It has been customary, therefore, to cut off about one-third of the ingot at the top and reject it, using only the more compact and uniform part of it. Within a few years, however, it has become the practice at three or four of the great gun-making establishments of the world to subject the molten metal to pressure with powerful hydraulic apparatus. The compressor which was set up in 1896 at Creusot, France, for this purpose was recently described by "Engineering." The mould is strengthened to meet the extra strain put upon it. The metal is poured in from a 35-ton ladle, or 65-ton ladle, or from both. Greater pressure is employed with a big ingot than with a small one. But the maximum never exceeds two and three-quarter tons to a square inch. Not only guns and armor, but also a great variety of other forgings for naval purposes, notably shafts, are now made from steel which has first been subjected to this treatment, Messrs. Schneider & Co., at whose works is situated the press just mentioned, supply many private manufacturers who do not care to make their own castings; as well as the French Army and Navy, with steel .- N. Y. Tribune.

Inebriety in Responsible Positions.-Perhaps a record fine for drunkenness has been put on record. The Manchester Ship Canal Company was awarded £12,987 19s. 2d. damages against the owners of the steamship "Harold," which ran into and smashed the Latchford lock gates on the canal, in consequence of her engineer, who was intoxicated, not having reduced the high rate of speed. Plaintiffs originally claimed £13,701, and the master allowed £10,846, and on plaintiffs' appeal the amount was raised to the sum above stated.-Invention.
