NE would suppose, judging by the comments generally prevalent, that the Stock Market is influenced entirely by the war in South Africa, and that the poor success attending the British arms, explains its dullness. Of course, the war has its influence, and victory or defeat on one side or the other are things that professional traders use to direct sentiment whither they want it to go; but the real reason why our prices do not advance more, is the absence of speculation due to the occupation of the public in their legitimate pursuits. If there was any public in Wall Street, it would soon cut itself away from outside influences. Even in Europe, where the effects of the war are felt most directly they have moderate results, owing also to an inability of those who make the security markets active by their presence, to attend to speculation and the large business they are doing at the same time. The Bank of England and the Bank of France both reduced discount rates this week, though the remainders are not so low as to indicate absence of commercial demand. With us rates are low enough, the condition of business good enough, and that of corporations whose securities are traded in, prosperous enough to encourage speculation, if the moneyed public had not something better to do. As it is, prices hold fairly strong, the investment demand continues good, and there has been no fair and adequate reaction from the declines forced in the last half of the past year. It is reasonable to suppose from these facts that when the security market does become really active, it will be in an upward direction. There are those who foresee a renewal of the currency fight in the coming presidential election, and look askance at quoted securities on that account, but it will be early enough to take fright on that account when the nominations are made.

HERE is much to support the claim of architects and builders in the Bronx that there ought to be within that borough an office at which they can file their plans instead of having to make the long journey down to 18th street and 4th avenue for that purpose. The closing of the Bronx branch office of the Department of Buildings was a mistake and that the parties aggrieved thereby are now appealing to the Legislature for redress ought not to surprise any one. Nor should it be surprising that while about it they take the radical step of asking for the appointment of a separate Commissioner of Buildings for their borough. This, however, is opposed to the principle of consolidation, which the Charter embodies, and is, therefore, hardly likely to meet the approval of the municipal administration that may be said to have the deciding word on such matters. The claims of the Bronx people and the reasons with which they support them will be found in our news columns. It would be easy for the Department of Buildings to meet the worst complaint by reviving the facilities once given to Bronx builders and architects, and for whose withdrawal it is hard to imagine any just cause.

THE introduction of Senator Stranahan's Tax Bill has aroused a pretty lively discussion throughout the State. As a result more bills are being introduced to direct the effects of the first away from particular interests. The agriculturists

have procured the introduction of a bill to exempt from the proposed mortgage tax farm mortgages. It need not be pointed out that the effect of this would be to correspondingly increase the tax burdens of the cities. Another bill, that of Assemblyman Roberts' is good in intention, but unlikely to be satisfactory in execution. The intention is to make the mortgage tax fall upon the mortgagee, but the means proposed to do this are quite inadequate, as, in fact, any legislation means would be; because, that matter will be controlled by economic and not legislative laws. For a time the operation of the former may be obstructed, but eventually they must prevail, and the more they are obstructed the greater will be the injury that will finally result from that fact.

#### As Viewed by Brokers.

FAVORABLE FEATURES OF THE OUTLOOK FOR SPRING BUSINESS.

HE brokerage news, measured by the budget of last week, is disappointing. There are no items of first-rate importance, and the sum of the reports hardly reached seasonably normal proportions. Nevertheless, considered with reference to the preceding autumn and winter months, the sales at private contract constitute a substantial body of business. The real estate market, though not so conspicuously as last week, developed evidence of sympathetic activity induced by easier conditions in the general money market. The resumption of dealing in vacant lots and antiquated premises is sufficient proof that building loan operators and speculative builders are preparing for an active spring season. Apart from the movement occasioned by the renewal of purchasing for improvement, the real estate market disclosed little disposition to shake off the lethargy of recent months. Still, it is worthy of note that there was not the total absence of transactions in mercantile property which has come to be accepted as an ordinary rather than an extraordinary oc-

Indeed, brokers say that they find it easier to obtain consideration for offers of investment property than they did a very short time ago. The conviction is gaining ground that intrinsic conditions in real estate have assumed a posture attractive to outside capital. Everybody admits that, after years of liquidtion and after a rise in constructional cost, all that is required to give the upward impetus to realty values is the merest hint of a disposition on the part of the public to buy improved property, and few doubt that, were the uncertainty as to the financial market removed, this disposition would logically follow. Brokers have every advantage of argument—rents are rising, fee values are low, and a period of rising quotations is anticipated.

These considerations are strongly reinforced by the prospect for rapid transit. There is every reason to suppose that the tunnel road will be constructed within from three or five to ten years; if Mr. McDonald does not build it, some other contractor will, or else the municipalty. It was observed when the elevated roads were built that there was little rise in lot values between the commencement and completion of the work of construction; a very considerable part of the speculative rise had been discounted before the constructional work began. But as soon as the lines were completed land values doubled and trebled, in advance of the influx of population. The conclusion is inevitable that it would be impossible to err now in buying improved property. Even a 5-story single flat in Harlem would net a savings bank interest on the investment, and at the end of from three or five years to ten, at the utmost, it would command a very handsome unearned increment. The building up of the island north of 155th street, taking the East and West Sides as precedents, will be accomplished in a very few years, once rapid transit is realized, when the district between 59th and 125th streets would stand in the same relation to the city's residential and shopping center that the section between 14th and 59th streets does now. According to D. Phoenix Ingraham, lots on the south side of 125th street, between 8th and 7th avenues, were selling at \$4,000 when the elevated road was under construction, while lots in other streets, between the same avenues, were bought for \$1,500 and \$1,200. Certainly these lots, particularly if improved and carrying themselves, proved at those figures the most brilliant investments that ever combined safety with profit. Real estate is in precisely the circumstances, local and general, making for a rise in values, that obtained in 1879, which year inaugurated a decade of extraordinary and almost uninterrupted prosperity. In short, the intrinsic merits of the real estate situation, brokers say, are so apparent that, with prospect of a protracted period of normally low interest rate on money, we ought to see a movement in improved property every bit as impressive as that which we witnessed last spring in vacant land.

#### Mortgage Tax.

ON WHOM WOULD IT FALL—LOANER OR BORROWER?—PRES-ENT, TENDENCY OF RATES—SOME EXPERT OPINIONS.

The discussion on the Tax Bill in realty circles centres largely on the incidence of the mortgage tax if one should be levied. On one point, that the borrower would pay the tax, there is very little difference of opinion, but there is considerable diversity of view on another, whether an increased demand for mortgage investments would bring down interest rates sufficiently to offset the tax. It was pointed out in these columns some time ago that the tendency of interest on mortgages was to decline, but that tendency does not now continue. On the contrary, there is a hardening of rates that is not unnatural in view of the condition of the money market for the past few months. Had the tax bill been introduced in 1893 or 1894, when capital was idle in large volume, this argument could have been used to better effect. But the movement of investment-seeking capital has been arrested by the commercial demand, and is not so eager the low investment returns that it once was. In the last half of 1898, 18% of all the money loaned on real estate in this city was loaned at 4%, and 27% at  $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ ; in the next half-year percentages corresponding were 19 and 21, respectively, and in the half-year that closed December 31st last, 20% of the total was loaned at 4%, and 18% at  $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ . On the whole, then, rates were rather higher in the later period than in the two former. The amounts of money loaned at different rates below 5%, given separately for the Manhattan and the Bronx, are as follows:

This showing does not meet entirely the claim set up in support of the tax on mortgages, that a fixed moderate rate, vice the danger of a heavy tax (as personalty), will give realty mortgages a different status in the investment market than they now have. Regarding this, Senator Stranahan, who introduced the Tax Bill into the Legislature, says: "No principle of finance is better understood than that capital, when seeking investment, desires to know the exact amount which may be realized therefrom. For this reason the fixedness of this low rate will make mortgage securities, in the State of New York, next to securities absolutely exempt from taxation, the most desirable of any obtaina-ble, and will turn capital into real estate for investment." In reading this, it should be borne in mind, that with probably 25% of all the mortgages on realty in this city exempt from taxation, as assets of savings and trust institutions, with more exempt as property of non-residents, and with no systematic attempt having been made to reach other such mortgages as personal property, about 60% of these loans are made at rates of from 5% to 6%. It will be seen, then, that the demand must be very much increased indeed to lower rates one-haif of 1% all round. This point is further discussed in the following interviews and communica-

Mr. Geo. De Forest Barton said: "While the proposed law in regard to taxation would be an advantage to me personally, I think it would be an injury to the smallest class of real estate owners, for the reason that, if the mortgagee is obliged to pay a tax on the mortgage, just as surely as night follows day, the interest of the mortgage will be raised. The theory of the bill is that by just as much as is raised by taxation on the mortgage, would the taxes on real estate be reduced, and that, therefore, if the borrower pays the additional half per cent., he will save that half per cent. on the taxes on his real estate. The theory is attractive, but I believe the borrower would be disappointed. He would have staring him in the face a positive half per cent. to be paid annually, and would have to take his chances of a re-duction in his tax rate. If the result should prove a fairly equal one for the first year or two, there is scarcely any probability, but that every municipality would find it necessary to increase the rate of taxation in order to carry out some pet project, and the unfortunate borrower would then find himself saddled with a greater aggregate tax than when he paid to the county alone, and if complaint was made to the county officials, they would naturally say: we have nothing to do with the State tax. influx of new capital brought by the change, if any, would in my opinion not be sufficient to offset the enormous amount held by life insurance companies, savings banks and trust companies, which would be liable to tax. Agitation of this matter has already had its influence in the fact that loaners are insisting upon the insertion of a clause that if any change is made in the method of taxing mortgages, the mortgage shall become due and payable. The advantage to the rich owner, if the theory of the bill should work, would be a saving in the amount of taxes, and large holders of real estate like the Astors, Rhinelanders, Goelets and others would be very large. The bill seems contrived to keep away foreign capital from this State, and that would be a great disadvantage to real estate in this city. My theory has always been that the entire tax should be raised from real estate and franchises, and that this city should be made as attractive as possible to men of means, so that they would come here to live. More houses would then be required, more lots

built on, more grocers and butchers, and more everything would be required. As it is now, many persons of large means are driven from the city, and others who are inclined to come are deterred from taking up their residences here. This may seem radical for a real estate broker, but it is my earnest conviction. The bill is founded on a theory with but one cold fact in it, and that fact is, the needy borrower will have to pay one-half per cent. additional interest for his loans, the rest of the bill is purely theoretical."

Mr. B. Avmar Sands, of Bowers & Sands, who place a very large amount of money annually on New York City realty, favored the bill. He said, in his opinion, the result of the bill, if passed, would be to enlarge the field of realty mortgage investments. There was a large class of investors who would not invest in mortgages because of the publicity of the records and the consequent danger of being caught in the tax lists. If these knew that they would only have to pay a tax of one-half of one per cent. they would be willing to loan their money on bond and mortgage, and take a lower rate of interest than is now generally He did not anticipate the dire results predicted in some quarters from the operations of the law. Those mortgagees who were protected by tax clauses in the mortgage would make arrangements with the mortgagors in regard to the tax without much difficulty, or the latter would obtain new loans to replace the old. He had always thought that a small personal tax collected without discrimination or exemption whatever, would be more satisfactory and realize more than a large tax which could only be collected in particular cases, and in such worked the greatest hardship. Where there was a danger of the collection of a tax of 21/2% investors would avoid mortgage investments, but with the tax small and the return on the investment left greater than could be obtained on Government bonds, investors would prefer them; they would also favor them in preference to city bonds for the reason that there was such a poor market for the latter that they were not easily sold when there was a desire to realize on the investment. Realty mortgages would also find favor at intervals as the phases of the various markets made that for mortgages more favorable for the time being than that of other investments. In illustration of this, he quoted the case of a fire insurance company, that had a large portion of its funds invested in certain bonds and stocks, which it could just new sell at an advantage. If they did sell and invest the proceeds in mortgage loans the result would be that they would have to pay a tax of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. to the city. This would reduce the earning capacity of the money to too low a margin for any fire insurance company. If there was one definite tax on mortgage loans, the company would be able to dispose of its bonds and stocks, then invest in real estate loans, and later, if it saw that an advantage could be gained, reinvest in the other securities when they were lower.

Register Isaac Fromme calls our attention to a typographical error in our interview with him last week. He says: "You make me state that the work will involve the examination of 400,000 libers, instead of mortgages. This would mean 40,000,000 mortgages instead of 400,000 mortgages, as the fact is. The next sentence, that only 200,000 mortgages would require to be abstracted is correct."

#### To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

As a real estate owner, I cannot conceive of the proposed tax on mortgages, if enacted into law, as falling eventually on anyone except the owner of the equity, as the experience of Massachusetts, leading to the repeal of such a law, has shown.

The argument that the certain rate proposed would "bring out" further funds, now held by individuals in a fiduciary capacity, and thus reduce interest rates," takes no account of the fact that in this city such rates are now virtually controlled by two classes of corporations, whose mortgage investments are exempt, and which would continue to be preferred to individual lenders for reasons known to every owner. Would it be too much to assume that the very limited approval of the measure has been based chiefly on the prospective profits of the "stirring up" process necessitating shifting of loans and consequent expenses to owners, on the adoption of such a tax?

Then, again, taxation for State purposes has no limit, so long as our rural friends, during the few years of control that remain to them, think they can benefit themselves at our expense. The inheritance tax, at first collateral only as to both realty and personalty, is now also direct as to personalty; if extended to direct realty, the Legislature might thereafter be readily brought to the suggestion of an Assemblyman from Senator Stranahan's own county, quoted in your issue of December 9th last, to have this city pay all the State expenses.

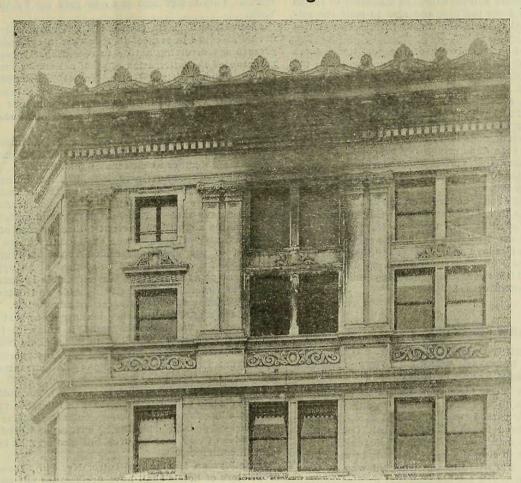

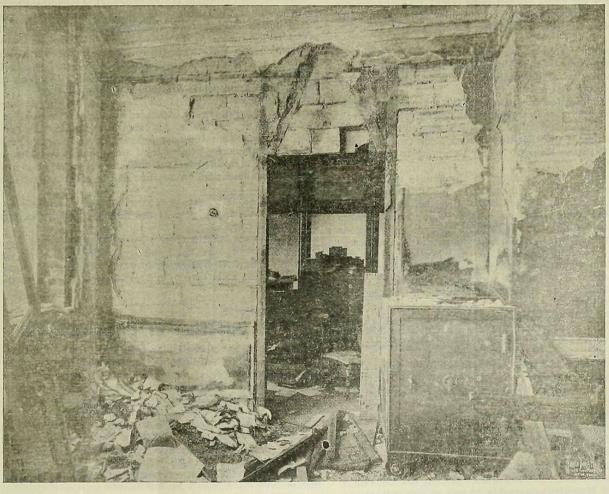
#### THE POPULAR SCIENCE MONTHLY.

### Townsend Building Fire.

The recent fire on the 11th floor of the Townsend Building, corner 25th St. and Broadway, is of more than passing interest, as it demonstrates what has often been claimed for first-class fireproof construction—that a fire can be practically confined to a single room, without damage to the structural parts of the buildings, when properly protected by fire-resisting materials. The fire (the results of which are here illustrated) occurred

The fire (the results of which are here illustrated) occurred on the morning of New Year's Day, and was of more than usual severity, owing to the fact that the upper part of the building was unoccupied for the day, and the fire gained great headway before it was discovered.

The room in which it occurred is 14 ft. wide by 30 ft. deep, with

two windows, divided by a mullion. This room was subdivided into three small rooms to suit the tenant, by the introduction of two hardwood and glass partitions, which supplied, in addition to the desks, pamphlets, cabinets and shelving, furniture, etc., crowded into small spaces, an unusually compact amount of inflamable material.

The fire, as near as can be determined, started in a desk in one of these rooms, and had been burning for at least one-half hour when discovered; and while prompt action on the part of the house service brought two streams to bear upon it from the stand pipe system in the building, it had gained such headway that it could not be controlled until the fire department took charge.

Sufficient heat was generated to warp an iron safe, burn off all plaster, and flake off the stone work of the front at the windows; also to crack glass transoms and partitions in a number of rooms a considerable distance from the fire, and also to melt the soldering of the ornamental work in the copper cornice two stories above.

With the exception of the woodwork of the partitions, doors and glass transoms, and the damage by smoke and water in the rooms immediately adjoining, no other damage was done to the interior of the building. The fireproofing around the columns, the fireproof partitions, arches of the floor above, and the floor beams, remained intact, and will not require to be replastered.

The cost of repairing the damage is estimated at less than \$4,000, one third of which amount is for re-decorating and painting where damage had been done principally by smoke and water; one-third for repairing the exterior stone work and cornice, and the balance for replacing the plaster and woodwork of the room in which the fire occurred.

As much has been said about the limits of height to which the Fire Department can go in controlling fires in tall buildings, it may be of interest to mention here that the elevators in the Townsend Building are supplied with an electric pump, so that they can be operated on Sundays and holidays for just such contingencies, and that the Fire Department had no difficulty in gaining access to the 11th floor, and controlling the fire with great promptness and effectiveness.

#### Law Making.

THE TAX BILL—TO EXEMPT FARM MORTGAGES—BRIDGE COM-MISSION—SEWAGE DISPOSAL WORKS—LATEST LEGISLA-TIVE NOVELTIES FROM LABOR SOURCES.

Albany, Jan. 25.—New York legislation moved forward in a slight degree this week in the Legislature. To-day both the Senate and the Assembly passed the bill brought here by Comptroller Coler, and approved by the Rapid Transit Commission and the city authorities, making it clear that the Municipal Assembly has no authority to stop the issue of bonds in aid of the construction of a rapid transit railroad. The bill was at once rushed off to Mayor Van Wyck for his approval or disapproval. Governor Roosevelt may give a hearing on the bill; since Assemblyman Tralnor, of New York, expressed the opinion to-day that the contractor for the rapid transit road might make \$1,000,000 if the bill should become a law. Comptroller Coler may come up here to defend the bill before the Governor from this last attack.

Senator Stranahan stated to-day that he was receiving a large number of letters regarding the bill revising the taxation laws of the State and taxing mortgages. He added that a good many hearings would be given on the bill.

The Assembly Committee on Cities will give a hearing on Tuesday next on Assemblyman Demarest's bill repealing the Charter of the Ramapo Water Company, and upon Assemblyman Fallow's bill prohibiting the authorities of New York from entering into a contract with the Ramapo Water Company to supply the city with water.

The following bills were introduced in the Senate this week: Senator Elsberg (Intro. No. 222), and Assemblyman Weeks (Intro. No. 427), Amending Section 612 of the New York Charter in relation to the general powers of the Park Commissioners by providing that "subject to the general rules and regulations established by the Board, each Commissioner shall have power to authorize and regulate the erections and projections on and determine the line of curb and the surface construction of all

determine the line of curb and the surface construction of all streets and avenues lying within any park, square or public place in his jurisdiction, or within a distance of 350 feet from the outer boundaries thereof."

Senator Norton (Intro. No. 243), Amending the Charter of New York (Section 568) by providing for the construction of sewage disposal works or plants or appurtenances and providing for the payment of the cost thereof by local assessment.

Senator Norton (Intro. No. 242), Applying the provisions of the New York Charter in regard to the construction of lateral sewers "to each and all of the Boroughs of the city of New York."

Senator Elsberg (Intro. No. 259), and Assemblyman Davis (Intro. No. 436), Authorizing the authorities of New York to expend more than \$2,500,000 in the construction of the Public Library at 42d st. and 5th av, and toward "the grading and terracing of the land about said building."

Senator Stranahan (Intro. No. 275), Amending the Charter so as to deprive the Municipal Assembly of any apparent authority over the issuing of bonds in aid of the construction of a rapid transit road.

The following were offered in the Assembly:

Assemblyman Brennan (Intro. No. 353), Authorizing the Governor to appoint six citizens of New York as a commission to construct permanent suspension bridges over the East River. One of the bridges is to be constructed across the East River from Brooklyn to New York, the site in Brooklyn to be "between the Fulton Ferry and the Navy Yard"; the New York site is not defined. The cost of the bridge is to be paid by the city of New York. The same commission is authorized "to construct a bridge

or tunnel over or under the East River between the Boroughs of Manhattan and Queens, between the two ends of Blackwell's Island. This bridge also is to be paid for by the city of New York

Assemblyman Davis (Intro, No. 357), Amending the Code of Civil Procedure in respect to receiving in evidence in actions on proceedings involving a title to real property certain testimony perpetuated in anticipation of such actions or proceedings.

Assemblyman Prince (Intro. No. 410), Providing that in an action brought in the Municipal Court by a laborer to recover for wages, if the plaintiff recovers a sum not exceeding \$50, the judgment shall provide that the defendant shall be liable to arrest and imprisonment upon execution.

Assemblyman Burnett (Intro. No. 388), Amending the real property law authorizing aliens to acquire and convey real estate in the same manner as citizens of this State.

Assemblyman Egan (Intro. No. 392), Amending Section 18 of Chapter 415 of the Laws of 1897 in regard to scaffolding for the use of employes by declaring that "all such scaffolding or staging shall have attached thereto proper and suitable mechanical contrivances adapted to prevent falling in case of failure of ordinary means of suspension; such contrivances to consist in addition to the usual suspension ropes of auxiliary ropes to pass around the scaffold and be secured at an upper window or equivalent point above to a bar extensible by means of a turnbuckle and securing devices attachable and detachable at successive windows or equivalent points below, after passing around the scaffold, all in such manner as to best secure the desired result." The bill also makes it unlawful to suspend the scaffold from derricks attached to the window frame.

Assemblyman Guider (Intro. No. 443), Incorporating the Fidelity Mutual Title Insurance Company to guarantee titles to real estate.

Assemblyman Phillips (Intro. No. 452), Amending Section 21 of Chapter 418 of the Laws of 1897 in reference to building loan contracts by providing that such contracts, "either with or without the sale of land" shall be in writing and filed in the Register's office of any county. The bill also applies to modifications of such contracts.

Assemblyman Harburger (Intro. No. 446), Directing that the proprietors of hotels shall have fire-escapes put on the outside of their buildings, extending on the outside along the entire length of such buildings.

Assemblyman Graham (Intro. No. 442), Amending Section 1532 of the Code of Civil Procedure relative to actions for partitions by including "any person owning a vested life estate in said premises."

Assemblyman Harburger (Intro. No. 444), To establish a home for the aged poor of the counties of New York, Kings, Queens, Suffolk, Richmond, Westchester, Nassau and Rochland county—the State to appropriate \$100,000 for this purpose.

Assemblyman Roberts (Intro. No. 494), Making it lawful for any person holding real estate and upon which there is an incumbrance by mortgage, judgment, mechanics lien or otherwise "to deduct on the first interest or principal payment day after the payment of taxes from the interest on principal then payable, the amount of taxes such persons has paid more than should have been paid on account of the indebtedness upon such estate."

Assemblyman Fitzgerald (Intro. No. 493), Setting apart for recreation purposes a pler at the foot of East 62d st (Manhattan) East River,

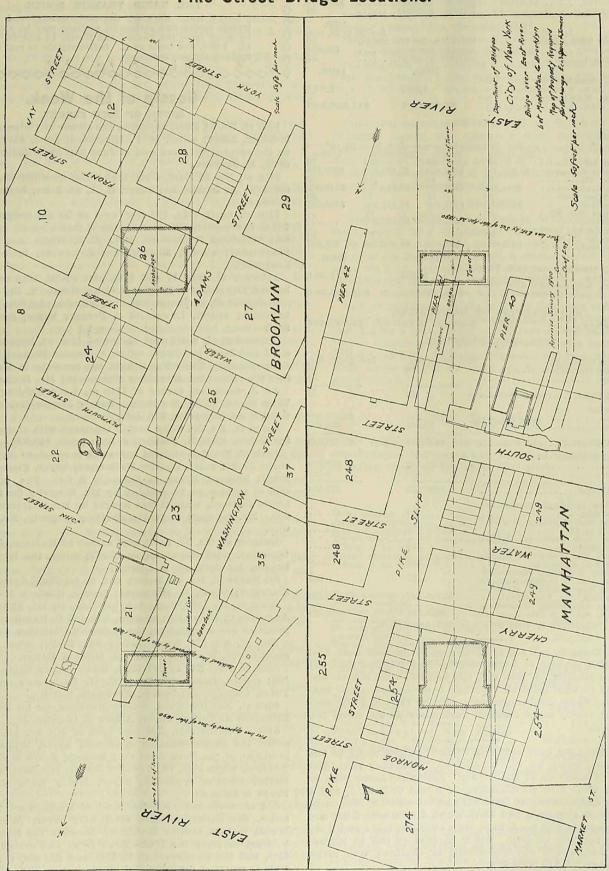
Assemblyman Martin (Intro. No. 481), Exempting from taxation "a mortgage or bond with mortgage given as collateral thereto on agricultural lands situated within this State which bears interest at a rate of not exceeding \$5 upon \$100 for the year"

#### A Question of Encroachment

A suit that has a particular interest to the building world in these days of big buildings and deep foundations, and the probable influences of great excavations on buildings in their vicinity. occupied Justice Lawrence in the Supreme Court for three whole days of this week. The suit was brought by George Crocker, the owner of No. 70 Broadway, 25.9x119.4, running back to New st, to compel the Manhattan Life Insurance Co. to vacate a portion of his lot on which he claimed they were trespassers. The case resolved itself practically into one of the preponderance of surveying testimony on one side or the other. Measurements for the complainant placed the respondent's building from 3 to 5% inches over the former's lot on Broadway, the projection ending in nothing on New st. Opposed to this it was stated that when the Manhattan Life Building, which occupies Nos. 64, and 68 Broadway, reached the surface, it was found that the building, subsequently purchased by Mr. Crocker, extended over respondent's lot 3 inches, it being claimed that this was due to pressure by the shifting of the Union Trust Building; that their building was built 3 inches away from their own northerly line as laid down by their own surveyor, and brought forward again when the respondent's building was cleared; consequently, that complainant really encroached 3 inches from his foundation to roof on respondent's property. As to the building, it was denied on the testimony of well-known surveyors that it leaned over at

all. The overhanging band course and two large projecting cornices on the Manhattan Life Building were admitted to be invasions of Mr. Crocker's areal easement, and as such would be removed as he built up to them. There was a mass of expert testimony on each side. Wm. J. Freyer and Charles Sooysmith were called for the defending company. As to values, Wm. M. Ryan, estimated the Crocker property at \$500,000, and the loss by the encroachment, if proved, at \$5,000. Another witness for the company, testified that the odd inches would not be con-Counsel sidered in appraising the rental value of office space. were given until Feb. 14 to put in briefs. The Court's decision will be of much interest.

#### Pike Street Bridge Locations.



This map showing the location of the proposed bridge between Pike st, Manhattan, and Washington st, Brooklyn, was submitted by the Department of Bridges to the Board of Public Improvements. It should be added that the approach on the Manhattan side, which is 160 feet wide, goes back 2,600 feet from the bulkhead line, or 2,430 feet wide, goes back 2,000 feet from the balk-head line, or 2,430 feet from the west side of South st to Canal st and Bowery, and takes in about half of the block bounded by Bowery, and Christie and Bayard sts. The Brooklyn approach is also 160 feet wide, and extends back from the bulk-head line, 5,600 feet to De Kalb av. No field work has been done. The Manhattan approach to the proposed Blackwell's Island bridge as laid down on the tentative map takes in all the prop-

bridge, as laid down on the tentative map, takes in all the property between 59th and 60th sts, back to 2d av, and the fronts of the two blocks on the west side of the same avenue, between 58th and 60th sts, to a depth of about 150 feet.

The Municipal Council Committee on Bridges and Tunnels began a public hearing yesterday afternoon on the Blackwell's Island bridge. About fifty representatives of real estate associations were present to oppose the construction of the bridge on the ground that it was unnecessary at this time, and would add \$15,000,000 or more to the debt of the city.

#### Water Charges.

PROPOSED AND PRESENT RATES COMPARED.

For a long time past, the Department of Water Supply has been endeavoring to frame a new scale of water charges to apply to the whole city, wherever there is a municipal supply. Last summer a new proposed schedule was reported in these columns, but it was not acted upon. Recently another such schedule has been reported to the Board of Public Improvements, and will be considered by that body next Wednesday. The proposed rates are in a majority of instances much higher than those now in force, in Manhattan at any rate, and in many instances where fixed charges are now made it is proposed to substitute a special agreement with the Commissioner of Water Supply. The latter include those of bakeries, barber shops, extra bath tubs, etc. in private houses, dining-rooms, fish stands, laundries, saloons, steam engines, etc. The following is the suggested schedule to be considered next week:

The apportionment of the regular frontage rates upon dwelling houses is on the basis that but one family is to occupy the same, and for each additional family, one dollar per year shall be charged.

Building Purposes: 10 cents per 1,000 brick. All masonry at same rate, 500 brick being equal to 1 cubic yard.

Plastering: 40 cents per 100 square yards, openings not included. Baths: All baths \$3 per annum.

Water Closets and Urinals, of every description, that are supplied with water from a masonry tank or system from which only a limited quantity can be drawn, viz: about 3 gallons at each pull, \$2.00. When supplied with water from a tank, other than a measuring tank, from which an unlimited quantity can be drawn by holding or fastening the valve open, or when the supply is received direct from the water supply, \$5.00. One closet and one bath in each house supplied free of charge.

Meter Rates: For all stores, work shops, hotels, manufactories, office buildings, public edifices, or wharves, ferry-houses, stables and places not enumerated, the rate shall be 10 cents per 100 cubic feet.

Where the whole or part of a building is occupied for business purposes, the whole supply shall be metered.

Where water is obtained by pumping from wells, or by purchase from other parties, all buildings shall be metered at a rate of 10 cents per 100 cubic feet.

Meters will be placed on all houses where there is an extra use of water; where required to ascertain the amount used, and where waste of water is found, and they will be charged at rates fixed for all water passing through them.

All charges not herein mentioned or fixed are reserved for sp cial contracts by and with the Commissioner of Water Supply.

### Harlem Property Owners Organize.

A movement has been started among large property owners in Harlem to repress, or lesson, some of the evils which have been felt by those who own flats, apartments, and houses for investment. One of the customs, almost peculiar to Harlem, is that of the demand on the part of tenants for "free rent," not only for the unexpired portion of the month in which they have moved, but for one, two or three months in addition. While in other parts of the city an allowance free of rent for a short time is occasionally granted by owners or builders desirous of receiving immediate returns, in Harlem and especially in the central and western parts of that section, and on Washington Heights the custom has grown to such an extent that tenants now make an absolute demand for free rental even after the rent has been fixed at a low figure. Some property owners have yielded to the pressure, greatly to their own loss, and it is estimated that several hundred thousand dollars a year is lost in rental in that section of the city through the adoption of this custom.

Several property owners, among whom were the representa-

tives of several of the large estates and some of the most important agencies controlling up-town property, held a meeting on Wednesday afternoon at 7th av and 125th st and decided to organize an association to examine into the financial standing of tenants, to oppose the continuance of the free rent system, and to take other steps to protect the landlords from the losses from which they have suffered from these and similar causes for many years past.

Paul Mayer, of 251 West 135th st, who represents the Bernheimer interests, was chosen Chairman of the Committee to organize the movement. E. R. Van Winkle, of McVickar & Co., was elected Secretary of the Committee. Ex-Judge James P. Davenport, of 150 Nassau st, is counsel for the organizers of the proposed association. Steps will be taken to secure the active support of a large number of property owners who have expressed their approval of the movement.

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#### BUILDING MATERIAL MARKET.

The market is quiet all along the line, but decidedly firm. Deliveries of cement and brick have been small. Consolidations are still in vogue, the announcement having been made of the formation of a corporation with two million dollars capital to take over a large part of the lime business in Rockland County, Maine, with the following officers: President, Hon. Fred. E. Richards, of Portland; Treasurer, Joseph Renick, of Boston. The fiscal agents of the new corporation are Kidder, Peabody & Co., of Boston. The company will be known as the Rockland-Rockport Lime Company, and are now ready to do business.

"The sales of iron during the week closing," said Major H. W. Adams, "have been large for this season of the year; and the prices have held fairly firm. I know of one sale of 15,000 tons at prices quoted in your paper, while between five and ten thousand tons of less known iron sold a little below the price; but suffi-ciently near to be called firm." The report also goes out that while the Birmingham furnaces are blown in, the orders are entirely for foreign shipment, so that it will not prove an over-supply, and consequently prices will remain firm. The report comes from London, that the small stocks of foreign cement on hand at the beginning of the season kept the price high, while the unusual demand both for home and export use caused the advance, neither side of the Atlantic going ahead of the demand; consequently all mills were busy throughout the season. The profit was not so large as might have been expected, the increased cost of production eating into the price very materially. The exports from Great Britain to the United States shows a falling off of over 10,000 tons over the year 1898. It is thought that the English mills have reached their maximum output during the past year, and for that reason, should the demand be as great as expected, prices will undoubtedly advance.

During ten months of last year, the imports into the United States of German cements increased over 30,000 tons over the imports for 1898.

Belgium shipped to us 102,000 tons of native cement, which was a little short of the previous year's business.

Of our own market we can say, that while the full reports are not in, still we can give the following in round figures: American Portland Cement, 500,000 barrels, and Rosendale Cement, manufactured in the Rosendale district, 3,500,000 barrels.

Oil and Paint are still firm with brisk business. Of the price of paint for the coming season, we are informed that all the materials increasing as they are in price, will cause a big advance in the price of the manufactured product.

Tin was a little stronger, with prices about the same as last week.

BROKER'S COMMISSION.

To the Editor of THE RECORD AND GUIDE:

Will you kindly inform me if I am entitled to a commission as a broker from a sale of property sold under the following circumstances. S. owns a piece of vacant property. S. sells the property to K. three months ago with a bullder's loan from M. (M. is a broker.) K. refuses to go ahead with the building operation and deeds back the property to S. S. still has the building loan from M. S. places the property in the market again for sale. L. (a broker) gets the property for sale from S. and offers it to F., and F. makes an offer to L. to submit to S., and S. refuses to accept it owing to the terms demanded by F. Therefore, in order to comply with the requirements of S. in regard to terms, etc., F. went to see M. about the building loan. M. told F. that he would not make the loan unless he, M., sold the property to him. In the meantime L. had made an appointment with S. to meet F. to see if terms could not be arranged between themselves. on hearing that F. was about to buy the property through L. went to see S. and told him that he would not make the loan unless he sold the property to F. S. and F. meet at the office of L. as per appointment made by L. The matter was talked over and left to F. to see M. and try and arrange some adjustment between M. and L. Both F. and S. admitted that L. was the real broker in the transaction as far as it went, and if sale was made to F., L. was entitled to the commission, but as M. refused to make the loan under the circumstances nothing was done in the matter until a month after. In the meantime, L. notified S. by letter that if he sold to F., L. would hold him for the commission. Finally, M. buys the property himself from S. and sells to F. with a loan.

Answer-I think L. is entitled to a commission.-Law Editor.

### Plumbing, Lighting and Ventilation.

DEPARTMENT OF BUILDINGS' RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR PLUMBING, DRAINAGE, WATER SUPPLY AND VENTILATION OF BUILDINGS FRAMED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE BUILDING CODE.

The Department of Buildings has begun the publication of the new regulations for plumbing, lighting, ventilation, etc., framed in accordance with the provisions of the Building Code, which requires that such rules and regulations, and any change thereof, shall be published in the "City Record" on eight successive Mondays before the same shall become operative. As publication of the following was begun last Monday, they will become operative March 12th, if publication is regularly maintained on each Monday until that date, as it doubtless will be. The rules and regulations are:

Once in each year every employing or master plumber carrying on his trade, business or calling in The City of New York shall register his name and address at the main office of the Department of Buildings in said city, under such rules and regulations as the said Department shall prescribe, and as provided by section 141 of the Building Code of The City of New York.

#### FILING OF DRAWINGS, DESCRIPTIONS, ETC.

- 1. Drawings and triplicate descriptions, on forms furnished by the Department of Buildings for all plumbing and drainage, shall be filled in with ink and filed by the owner or architect in the said department. The plans must be drawn to scale in ink, on cloth, or they must be cloth prints or such scale drawings, and shall consist of such floor plans and sections as may be necessary to show clearly all plumbing work to be done, and must show partitions and method of ventilating water-closet apartments.
- 2. The said plumbing and drainage shall not be commenced or proceeded with until said drawings and descriptions shall have been so filed and approved by the Commissioner of Buildings.
- 3. No modification of the approved drawings and descriptions will be permitted unless either amended drawings and triplicate descriptions, or an amendment to the original drawings and descriptions, covering the proposed change or changes, are so filed and approved by the Commissioner of Buildings.
- 4. Plumbing, Drainage and Repairs thereto—I. The drainage and plumbing of all buildings, both public and private, shall be executed in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Buildings.
- 5. Repairs or alterations of plumbing or drainage may be made without filing drawings and descriptions in the Department of Buildings, but such repairs or alterations shall not be construed to include cases where new vertical or horizontal lines of soil, waste, vent or leader pipes are proposed to be used.
- 6. Notice of such repairs or alterations shall be given to the said department before the same are commenced in such cases as shall be prescribed by the rules and regulations of the said department, and the work shall be done in accordance with the said rules and regulations.
- 7. Where repairs or alterations ordered by the Board of Health for sanitary reasons includes cases where new vertical and horizontal lines of soil, waste, vent or leader pipes are proposed to be used or old ones replaced, drawings and descriptions must be filed with and approved by the Commissioner of Buildings before the same shall be commenced or proceeded with.
- 8. Repairs and alterations may comply in all respects with the weight, quality, arrangement and venting of the rest of the work in the building.
- 9. It shall not be lawful to commence work on said plumbing and drainage or on any part thereof until the plumber who is to do the work shall sign the specifications and make affidavit that he is duly authorized to proceed with the work. Affidavit must give the name and address of owner and plumber, etc.
- 10. One set of specifications will be received for not more than ten houses, and then only when on adjoining lots and houses are exactly alike.
- 11. Written notices must be given to the Commissioner of Buildings by the plumber when any work is begun, and from time to time when any work is ready for inspection. All notices required must be sent in on blank forms furnished by the Department of Buildings.

#### DEFINITION OF TERMS.

- 12. The term "private sewer" is applied to main sewers that are not constructed by and under the supervision of the Department of Sewers.
- 13. The term "house sewer" is applied to that part of the main drain or sewer extending from a point two feet outside of the outer wall of building vault or area to its connection with public sewer, private sewer or cesspool.
- 14. The term "house drain" is applied to that part of the main horizontal drain and its branches inside the walls of the building, building vault or area and extending to and connecting with the house sewer.
- 15. The term "soil-pipe" is applied to any vertical line of pipe extending through roof, receiving the discharge of one or more water-closets, with or without other fixtures.
- closets, with or without other fixtures.

  16. The term "waste-pipe" is applied to any pipe, extending through roof, receiving the discharge from any fixtures except water-closets.
- 17. The term "vent-pipe" is applied to any special pipe provided to ventilate the system of piping and to prevent trap siphonage and back pressure.

#### III.

#### MATERIALS AND WORKMANSHIP.

- 18. All materials must be of the best quality, free from defects, and all work must be executed in a thorough, workmanlike manner.
- 19. All cast-iron pines and fittings must be uncoated, sound, cylindrical and smooth, free from cracks, sand holes and other defects, and of uniform thickness and of the grade known in commerce as "extra heavy."
- 20. Pipe, including the hub, shall weight not less than the following average weights per linear foot:

- 21. The size, weight and maker's name must be cast on each length of the pipe.
- 22. All joints must be made with picked oakum and molten lead and be made gas-tight. Twelve (12) ounces of fine, soft pig lead must be used at each joint for each inch in the diameter of the pipe.
- 23. All wrought-iron and steel pipes must be equal in quality to "standard," and must be properly tested by the manufacturer. All pipe must be lap-welded. No plain black or uncoated pipe will be permitted.
- 24. Wrought-iron and steel pipes must be galvanized, and each length must have the weight and maker's name stamped on it.
- 25. Fittings for vent-pipes on wrought-iron and steel pipes may be the ordinary cast or malleable steam and water fittings.
- 26. Fittings for waste or soil and refrigerator waste-pipes must be the special extra heavy cast-iron recessed, and threaded drainage fittings with smooth interior water-way and threads tapped, so as to give a uniform grade to branches of not less than one-fourth of an inch per foot. All fittings for wrought-iron or steel pipe must be galvanized.
- 27. All joints to be screwed joints made up with red lead, and the burr formed in cutting must be carefully reamed out.
- 28. Short nipples on wrought-iron or steel pipe, where the unthreaded part of the pipe is less than one and one-half inches long, must be of the thickness and weight known as "extra heavy" or "extra strong."
- 29. The pipe shall not be less than the following average thickness and weight per linear foot:

- 30. All brass pipe for soil, waste and vent pipes and solder nipples must be thoroughly annealed, seamless, drawn, brass tubing, of standard iron-pipe gauge.
- 31. Connections on brass pipe and between brass pipe and traps on iron pipe must not be made with slip joints or couplings. Threaded connections on brass pipe must be of the same size as iron pipe threads for same size of pipe and be tapered.
- 32. The following average thicknesses and weights per linear foot will be required:

- 34. One and one-half inch ferrules are not permitted.
- 35. Soldering nipples must be heavy cast-brass or of brass pipe, iron pipe size. When cast they must not be less than the following weights:

36. Brass screw caps for cleanouts must be extra heavy, not less than ½ of an inch thick. The screw cap must have a solid square or hexogonal nut, not less than one inch high, with a least diameter of one and one-half inches. The body of the cleanout ferrule must be at least equal in weight and thickness to the calking ferrule for the same size of pipe.

37. Where cleanouts are required by rules and by the approved plans, the screw cap must be of brass. The engaging parts must have not less than six threads of iron pipe size and be tapered. Cleanouts must be of full size of trap up to four inches in diameter, and not less

than four inches for larger traps.

38. The use of lead pipes is restricted to the short branches of the soil and waste pipes, bends and traps, roof connections of inside leaders. "Short branches" of lead pipe shall be construed to mean not more than:

5 feet of 11/2-inch pipe.

4 feet of 2-inch pipe.

2 feet of 3-inch pipe.

2 feet of 4-inch pipe.

39. All connections between lead pipes and between lead and brass or copper pipes must be made by means of "wiped" solder joint.

40. All lead waste, soil, vent and flush pipes must be of the best quality, known in commerce as "D," and of not less than the following weights per lineal foot:

- 41. All lead traps and bends must be of the same weights and thicknesses as their corresponding pipe branches. Sheet lead for roof flashings must be six-pound lead and must extend not less than six inches from the pipe and the joint made water-tight.
- 42. Copper tubing when used for inside leader roof connections must be seamless drawn tubing, not less than 22-gauge, and when used for roof flashings must be not less than 18-gauge.

IV.

#### GENERAL REGULATIONS.

- 43. The entire plumbing and drainage system of each building must be entirely separate and independent of that of any other building.
- 44. Each building must be separately and independently connected with a public or private sewer, or cesspool.
- 45. Every building must have its sewer connections directly in front of the building, unless permission is otherwise granted by the Commissioner of Buildings.
- 46. Where there is no sewer in the street or avenue, and it is possible to construct a private sewer to connect in an adjacent street or avenue, a private sewer must be constructed. It must be laid outside the curb, under the roadway of the street.
- 47. Cesspools and privy-vaults will be permitted only after it has been shown to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Buildings that their use is absolutely necessary.
- 48. When allowed, they must be constructed strictly in accordance with the terms of the permit issued by the Commissioner of Buildings.
- 49. Cesspool must not be used as privy-vaults. Cesspools and privy-vaults must be at least twenty-five feet from any building and should be on the same lot with the building for which its use is intended. Cesspools and privy-vaults when constructed of brick must be eight inches thick; of stone, twenty inches thick. All cesspools and privy-vaults must be made water-tight.
- 51. As soon as it is possible to connect with a public sewer, the owner must have the cesspool and privy-vault emptied, cleaned and disinfected, and filled with fresh earth, and have a sewer connection made in the manner herewith prescribed.
- 52. All pipe-lines must be supported at the base on brick piers or by heavy iron hangers from the cellar-ceiling beams, and along the line by heavy iron hangers at intervals of not more than ten feet.
- 53. All pipes issuing from extension or elsewhere, which would othewise open within thirty feet of the window of any building, must be extended above the highest roof and well away and above all windows.
- 54. The arrangement of all pipes must be as straight and direct as possible. Offsets will be permitted only when unavoidable.
- 55. All pipes and traps should, where possible, be exposed to view. They should always be readily accessible for inspection and repairing.
- 56. In every building where there is a leader connected to the drain, if there are any plumbing fixtures, there must be as least one four (4) inch pipe extending above the roof for ventilation.

V.

#### YARD, AREA AND OTHER DRAINS.

- 57. All yards, areas and courts must be drained.
- 58. Tenement-houses and lodging-houses must have their yards, areas and courts drained into the sewer.
- 59. These drains, when sewer-connected, must have connections not less than three inches in diameter. They should be controlled by one trap—the leader trap if possible.
- 60. Cellar drains will be permitted only where they can be connected to a trap with a permanent water seal.
- 61. Subsoil drains should discharge into a sump or receiving tank, the contents of which must be lifted and discharged into the drainage system above the cellar bottom by some approved method. Where di-

rectly sewer-connected, they must be cut off from the rest of the plumbing system by a brass flap valve on the inlet to the catch-basin, and the trap on the drain from the catch-basin must be water-supplied, as required for cellar drains.

62. Floor or other drains will only be permitted when it can be shown to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Bulldings that their use is absolutely necessary and arrangements made to maintain a permanent water seal in the traps.

#### VI. LEADERS.

- 63. All buildings shall be kept provided with proper metallic leaders for conducting water from the roofs in such manner as shall protect the walls and foundations of said buildings from injury. In no case shall the water from said leaders be allowed to flow upon the sidewalk, but the same shall be conducted by pipe or pipes to the sewer. If there be no sewer in the street upon which such buildings front, then the water from said leaders shall be conducted by proper pipe or pipes below the surface of the sidewalk to the street gutter.
- 64. Inside leaders must be made of cast-iron, wrought-iron or steel, with roof connections made gas and water-tight by means of a heavy lead or copper-drawn tubing wiped or soldered to a brass ferrule or nipple calked or screwed into the pipe.
- 65. Outside leaders must be of sheet metal, but they must connect with the house-drain by means of a cast-iron pipe extending vertically 5 feet above the grade level.
- 66. Leaders must be trapped with cast-iron running traps so placed as to prevent freezing.
- 67. Rain-water leaders must not be used as soil, waste or vent pipes, nor shall any such pipe be used as a leader.

VII.

### THE HOUSE SEWER, HOUSE DRAIN, HOUSE TRAP AND FRESHAIR INLET.

- 68. Old house sewers can be used in connection with the new buildings or new plumbing only when they are found, on examination by the plumbing inspector, to conform in all respects to the requirements governing new sewers.
- 69. When a proper foundation, consisting of a natural bed of earth, rock, etc., can be obtained, the house sewer can be of earthenware pipe.
- 70. Where the ground is made or filled in, or where the pipes are less than three feet deep, or in any case where there is danger of settlement by frost or from any cause, and when cesspools are used, the house sewer must be of extra heavy cast-iron pipe, with lead-calked joints.
- 71. The house drain and its branches must be of extra heavy castiren, when underground, and of extra heavy castiron or galvanized wrought-iron or steel when above ground.
- 72. The house drain must properly connect with the house sewer at a point two feet outside of the outer front vault or area wall of the building. An arched or other proper opening must be provided for the drain in the wall to prevent damage by settlement.
- 73. If possible, the house drain must be above the cellar floor. The house drain must be supported at intervals of ten feet by eight-inch brick piers or suspended from the floor beams, or be otherwise properly supported by heavy iron-pipe hangers at interval of not more than ten feet. The use of pipe hooks for supporting drains is prohibited.
- 74. No steam-exhaust, boiler blow-off or drip-pipe shall be connected with the house drain or sewer. Such pipes must first discharge into a proper condensing tank, and from this a proper outlet to the house sewer outside of the building must be provided. In low pressure steam systems the condensing tank may be omitted, but the waste connection must be otherwise as above required.
- 75. The house and drain sewer must be run as direct as possible, with a fall of at least one-quarter inch per foot, all changes in direction made with proper fittings, and all connections made with Y branches and one-eighth and one-sixteenth bends.
- 76. The house sewer and house drain must be at least four inches in diameter where water-closets discharge into them. Where rainwater discharge into them the house sewer and house drain up to the leader connections must be in accordance with the following table:

- 77. Full size Y and T-branch fittings for handhole cleanouts must be provided where required on house drain and its branches.
- 78. An iron running trap must be placed on the house drain near the wall of the house, and on the sewer side of all connections, except a drip-pipe where one is used. If placed outside the house or below the cellar floor, it must be made accessible in a brick manhole, the walls of which must be eight inches thick, with an iron or flagstone cover. When outside the house it must never be less than three feet below the surface of the ground.

The house trap must have two cleanouts with brass screw cap ferrules calked in.

79. A fresh-air inlet must be connected with the house drain just inside of the house trap, where under ground it will be of extra heavy cast-iron. Where possible it will extend to the external air, and finish with an automatic device, approved by the Department of Buildings, at a point just outside the front wall of building. The fresh-air inlet must be of the same size as the drain up to four inches. For five and six-inch drains it must be not less than four inches in diameter. For seven and eight-inch drains not less than six inches in diameter, or ita

equivalent, and for large drains not less than eight inches in diameter, or its equivalent.

The curb inlet and the return bend inlet are hereby prohibited.

#### VIII.

#### SOIL AND WASTE PIPES.

- 80. All main, soil, waste or vent pipes must be of iron, steel or
- 81. When they receive the discharge of fixtures on any floor above the first, they must be extended in full calibre at least one foot above the roof coping, and well away from all shafts, windows, chimneys or other ventilating openings. When less than four inches in diameter, they must be enlarged to four inches at a point not less than one foot below the roof surface by an increaser not less than nine (9) inches
- No caps, cowls or bends shall be affixed to the top of such pipe.
- 83. In tenement-houses and lodging-houses wire baskets must be securely fastened into the opening of each pipe that is in an accessible position.
- 84. Necessary offsets above the highest fixture branch must not be made at an angle of less than 45 degrees to the horizontal.
- 85. Soil and waste pipes must have proper Y-branches for all fix-
- 86. No connection to lead branches for water-closets or slop-sinks will be permitted, except the required branch vent.
- 87. Branch soil and waste pipe must have a fall of at least onequarter inch per foot.
- 88. Short TY-branches will be permitted on vertical lines only. Long one-quarter bends and long TYs are permitted. Short one-quarter bends and double hubs, short roof increasers and common offsets, and bands and saddles are prohibited.
- 89. The diameters of soil and waste pipes must not be less than those given in the following tables:

#### IX.

#### VENT-PIPES

- All traps must be protected from syphonage and back-pressure, and the drainage system ventilated by special lines of vent-pipes.
- 91. All vent-pipe lines and main branches must be of iron, steel or brass. They must be increased in diameter and extended above the roof as required for waste pipes. They may be connected with the adjoining soil or waste line well above the highest fixture, but this will not be permitted when there are fixtures on more than six floors.
- 92. All offsets must be made at an angle of not less than 45 degrees to the horizontal, and all lines must be connected at the bottom with a soil or waste pipe or the drain in such a manner as to prevent the accumulation of rust scale.
- 93. Branch vent-pipes should be kept above the top of all connecting fixtures, to prevent the use of vent-pipes as soil or waste pipes. Branch vent-pipes should be connected as near to the crown of the trap as possible.
- 94. Earthenware traps for water-closets and slop sinks must be ventilated from the branch soil or waste pipe just below the trap, and this branch vent-pipe must be so connected as to prevent obstruction, and no waste pipe connected between it and the fixture. Earthenware traps must have no vent-horns.
- 95. No sheet metal, brick or other flue shall be used as a vent-pipe. 96. The size of vent-pipes throughout must not be less than the following:

For main vents and long branches, two inches in diameter; for waterclosets on three or more floors, three inches in diameter; for other fixtures on less than seven floors, two inches in diameter; three-inch vent-pipe will be permitted for less than nine stories; for more than eight and less than sixteen stories, four inches in diameter; for more than fifteen and less than twenty-two stories, five inches in diameter; for more than twenty-one stories, six inches in diameter; branch vents for traps larger than two inches, two inches in diameter; branch vents for traps two inches or less, one and one-half inches in diameter.

For fixtures other than water-closets and slop sinks and for more than eight (8) stories, vent-pipes may be one (1) inch smaller than above stated.

#### TRAPS.

- 97. No form of trap will be permitted to be used unless it has been approved by the Board of Buildings.
- 98. Every fixture must be separately trapped by a water-sealing trap placed as close to the fixture outlet as possible.
- 99. A set of wash travs may connect with a single trap, or into the trap of an adjoining sink, provided both sink and tub waste outlets are on the same side of the waste line, and the sink is nearest the line. When so connected the waste-pipe from the wash trays must be branched in below the water seal.
- 100. The discharge from any fixture must not pass through more than one trap before reaching the house drain.
- 101. All traps must be well supported and set true with respect to their water levels.

- 102. All fixtures other than water-closets and urinals must have strong metallic strainers or bars over the outlets to prevent obstruction of the waste-pipe.
- 103. All exposed or accessible traps, except water-closet traps, must have brass trap screws for cleaning the trap placed on the inlet side, or below the water level.
- 104. All iron traps for house drain, yard and other drains and leaders must be running traps with handhole cleanouts of full size of the traps when same are less than five (5) inches. All traps underground must be made accessible by brick manholes with proper covers.
- 105. Overflow pipes from fixtures must in all cases be connected on the inlet side of traps.
- 106. All earthenware traps must have heavy brass floor plates soldered to the lead bends and bolted to the trap flange, and the joint made gas-tight with red or white lead. The use of rubber washers for floor connections is prohibited.
- 107. No trap shall be placed at the foot of main soil and waste-pipe
- 108. The sizes for traps must not be less than those given in the following table:

Traps for other fixtures	1½ "

Traps for leaders, areas, floor and other drains must be at least 3 inches in diameter.

#### XI.

#### SAFE AND REFRIGERATOR WASTE-PIPES.

- 109. Safe and refrigerator waste-pipes must be of galvanized iron, and be not less than one (1) inch in diameter, with lead branches of the same size, with strainers over the inlets secured by a bar soldered to the lead branch.
- 110. Safe waste-pipes must not connect directly with any part of the plumbing system.
- 111. Safe waste-pipes must either discharge over an open, water supplied, publicly placed, ordinarily used sink, placed not more than three and one-half feet above the cellar floor.
- 112. The safe waste-pipe from a refrigerator must be trapped at the bottom of the line only and cannot discharge upon the ground or floor. It must discharge over an ordinary portable pan, or over some properly trapped, water supplied sink, as above. In no case shall the refrigerator waste-pipe discharge over a sink located in a room used for living
- 113. The branches on vertical lines must be made by Y-fittings, and be carried up to the safe with as much pitch as possible.
- 114. Lead safes must be graded and neatly turned over bevel strips at their edges.
- 115. Where there is an offset on a refrigerator waste-pipe in the cellar, there must be cleanouts to control the horizontal part of the
- 116. In tenement-houses and lodging-houses the refrigerator wastepipes must extend above the roof, and must not be larger than one and one-half inches, nor the branches smaller than one and one-quarter
- inches. These branches must have full-size, accessible traps.

  117. Refrigerator waste-pipes, except in tenement-houses, and all safe waste-pipes, must have brass flap-valves at their lower ends.
- In tenement-houses, lodging-houses, factories, workshops and all public buildings, the entire water-closet apartment and side walls to a height of sixteen inches from the floor, except at the door, must be made waterproof with asphalt, cement, tile, metal or other waterproof material as approved by the Board of Buildings.
- 119. In tenement-houses and lodging-houses the water-closet and urinal apartments must have a window opening to the outer air, except that tenement or lodging-houses three stories or less in height may have such window opening on a ventilating shaft not less than ten square feet in area.
- 120. In all buildings the outside partition of such apartment must extend to the ceiling or be independently ceiled over, and these partitions must be air-tight. The outside partitions must include a window opening to outer air on the lot whereon the building is situated, or some other approved means of ventilation must be provided. When necessary to properly light such apartments, the upper part of the partitions must be made of glass. The interior partitions of such apartments must be dwarfed partitions.
- 121. The general water-closet accommodations for a tenementor lodging-house cannot be placed in the cellar.
- 122. No water-closet can be placed outside of a building.
  123. The closets must be set open and free from all inclosing wood-
- 124. Where water-closets will not support a rim seat, the seat must be supported on galvanized iron legs, and a drip-tray must be used.
- 125. Every earthenware closet in all new work and in all alterations where it is not impossible to use it because of water-pipes or other obstructions, must be set on a natural stone slab. Sand or artificial stone or tile will not be allowed.
- 126. All water-closets must have earthenware flushing rim bowls, "pipe-wash" bowls or hoppers will not be permitted.
- 127. Pan, valve, plunger, offset-washout and other water-closets having an unventilated space, or whose walls are not thoroughly washed at each discharge, will not be permitted.
- 128. Long hoppers will not be permitted, except where there is an exposure to frost.

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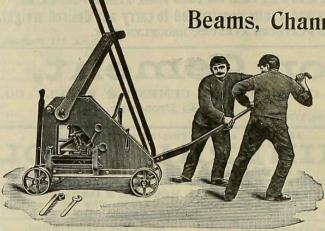

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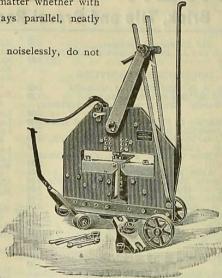

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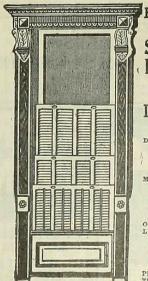
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BIRD'S-EYE PERSPECTIVE.

If it be desired to show the objects immediately below the spectator so as to give a distant view of the tops of buildings so situated, and of parts that would otherwise be concealed from sight, recourse must be had to bull's-eye perspective. This is the reverse of that employed for ceiling-pieces, termed di sotto in su; for as there objects are fore-shortened as seen from below, so in the bird's-eye they are fore-shortened, as if viewed from above. This species of "bird's-eye" might therefore with great propriety be distinguished by the name of prone perspective, or looking downwards, and the di sotto in su by that of supine perspective, or looking upwards. In like manner as in ceiling perspectives the plane of the picture becomes parallel to the natural horizon instead of vertical, so does it in a proper bird's-eye view; with this difference, that in the former case the eye is beneath the picture and looking up to it; in the latter over it, and looking down upon it. At least if not exactly horizontal the plane of the picture must be more or less inclined, accordingly as the eye is supposed to look down more directly or obliquely, because the plane of projection or picture must be assumed as perpendicular to the central ray from the eye. The relative position of objects to each other and to the picture, and of the picture to the eye, are the same in this as in ordinary perspective, the sole difference being that of the spectator's own situation. This will be apparent if we look into a hollow cube, or box, open on one side; it matters not whether it be open on one of the upright sides or on the top. . In either case the planes or sides perpendicular to the open side, and the one parallel to or facing it, will have the same perspective appearance; only in the one case the plane facing the spectator will be vertical, in the other horizontal. In a picture or drawing this will depend entirely upon the artist-whether he chooses to represent the plane parallel to the picture as horizontal that is the ground or floor, and the other planes perpendicular to the ground, or that parallel plane and two of the adjoining planes upright and the other two horizontal. Again, were a hole bored through the ceiling of a lofty room, a person looking down through it would have a perfect or proper bird's-eye both of the apartment and its furniture. Hence, it is obvious that in such representation the floor would answer to what in the common mode of perspective would be the side or end of the room facing the spectator; also that the vertical lines of the sides of the room, of doors, windows, legs of chairs, &c., would vanish to some point in the line or plane passing through the eye, exactly as the horizontal lines would do if they were seen according to the usual position. For unless the lines in this case intended to represent upright ones were made to vanish, those planes or walls would not be foreshortened; and unless that were done they could not be viewed, but the whole would be reduced to a mere plan of the room, just as a common upright view would be reduced to a section or geometrical elevation, if the planes representing the other two walls with the ceiling and floor were not shown perspectively or fore-shortened. Yet, although such perspective or bird's-eye view would be correct in itself, it would seem too fanciful and unnatural, if not positively distorted, because the objects would be shown under such very different circumstances from those according to which they are really seen, consequently such kind of views would be quite unpictorial, and merely matters of curiosity. or walls would not be foreshortened; and
